This program makes federal funds available to State, Local and Tribal Governments to implement and sustain cost-effective measures designed to reduce the risk to individuals and property from natural hazards, while also reducing reliance on Federal funding from future disasters. FEMA has announced PDM program availability for this year. A State application, including sub-applications, was submitted to FEMA on August 28, 2015. The application is pending.



**Program Update** 

The State is currently working five disasters that involve HMGP funding: DR 4067, 4133, 4134, 4145, and 4229. A breakdown of projects by disaster is below:

FEMA continues to review project applications. Only three projects remain in the initial FEMA review queue due to extended project analysis, technical feasibility, environmental, historical, cultural review/studies and/or project phasing deliverables. The majority of projects have been awarded and the state continues to coordinate projects still under review.



#### PDM 2015 Award

The Mitigation team notified Ouray County recently on their FY2015 PDM wildfire project grant award of \$122,432. The approved wildfire mitigation project will implement defensible space activities through the removal of hazardous fuel around 100 acres of land on approximately 50 homes in the Log Hill Fire Protection District.

#### PA 4145 (2013 Severe Storms, Flooding, Landslides and Mudslides)

- In the last four weeks, 53 requests for reimbursements (RFRs) were submitted, and 61 RFRs have been recommended for payment. The total amount of RFRs is now at 2,217 of which 1,551 are recommended for payment and 260 were returned to the sub-grantees for additional information. The remaining 406 are in progress. The total amount requested is \$245.5 million, and \$215.7 million is considered initially eligible. \$144.7 million has been recommended for payment, \$32.4 million has been returned to sub-grantees for additional information, and \$38.6 million is still in progress.
- Eleven requests for scope changes were submitted in the last four weeks, and two were completed or deferred to closeout. The total amount of scope change requests is now 461 of which 342 are completed or deferred to closeout, and 65 were returned to the sub-grantees for additional information. The remaining 54 are in progress.
- There have been 87 payments made in the last four weeks for a total of \$4,198,046.71.
- 341 small projects have been closed by FEMA and another 30 have been submitted to FEMA for closeout review.
- 30 Large Projects have been closed by FEMA and another 25 have been submitted to FEMA for closeout review.
- The next 4145 PA call will be June 30, 2016 at 1:30 p.m. Call in information and presentation will be sent out prior to the call.

#### PA 4229 (2015 Severe Storms, Tornadoes, Flooding, Landslides, and Mudslides)

- To date, 121 RFRs have been submitted and 108 RFRs have been recommended for payment, nine have been returned to the sub-grantees for additional information. The remaining four are in progress. The total amount requested is \$2.75 million, and \$2.57 million is considered initially eligible. \$1.5 million has been recommended for payment, \$780 thousand has been returned to sub-grantees for additional information, and \$277,164.08 is still in progress.
- To date, 16 requests for scope changes have been submitted, and 5 have been completed or deferred to closeout. Three Scope Change Requests have been forwarded to FEMA for review and the remaining 8 are in progress.
- There have been 163 payments made to date for a total of \$5,597,176.84.
- The next 4229 PA call will be June 30, 2016 at 1:30 p.m. Call in information and presentation will be sent out prior to the call.
