2004 ANNUAL LOCAL VALE REPORT (January 1 – December 31, 2004)

In 1984, the General Assembly approved legislation to establish the Assistance to Victims of and Witnesses to Crimes and Aid to Law Enforcement Act (VALE). As currently enacted, the Act mandates a surcharge on fines imposed for felonies, misdemeanors, juvenile offenses, class 1 and 2 traffic offenses, and certain traffic infractions. A flat fee, rather than a surcharge, is collected on cases where fines are not imposed; except that traffic infractions are not subject to a flat fee in cases where the Court does not impose fines. The funds collected are used for grants to agencies that provide services to crime victims within the local judicial district in which the monies are collected. The Act has been amended several times since its original passage in 1984.

In 2003, the Colorado Legislature passed Senate Bill 271 (SB 03-271), which increased the surcharge that may be imposed for individuals convicted of felony, misdemeanor, and traffic offenses. The surcharge for the following class of criminal convictions was increased as follows: felony convictions rose from \$125.00 to \$162.50, misdemeanor convictions rose from \$60.00 to \$78.00, class 1 misdemeanor traffic offenses rose from \$35.00 to \$45.50, and class 2 misdemeanor traffic offenses rose from \$25.00 to \$32.50. The portion of the surcharge attributable to the increase enacted in 2003 was deposited into the General Fund. Approximately \$1,150,000 was collected for the General Fund.

Section 24-4.2-108 of the VALE statute mandates that each of the local VALE boards shall submit to the Division of Criminal Justice an annual report detailing: the amount of funds granted to agencies; the number of agencies applying for funds; and the projects and services for which grants were awarded. This is the nineteenth year that such a summary has been completed by the Division of Criminal Justice.

The graphs and summarizing data in this report provide an overview of the types of grants that were awarded by local VALE boards. The report also breaks down the percentage of funds supporting each victim service and law enforcement category. A detailed chart of each judicial district's awards is also included in the report.

LOCAL VALE BOARDS

The Act provides for a five-member board (appointed by the Chief Judge) in each judicial district. Each local board accepts applications and makes decisions regarding the use of VALE funds in that judicial district.

FUNDING SOURCE

Of the total fees collected by each local VALE program, a maximum of 10% may be used in each district for costs related to the administration of the Act and for preparation of victim impact statements. After allocation of administrative expenses, 13% of remaining collections are deposited with the State Treasurer for state administrative expenses and for the State VALE competitive grant application process.

GRANT AWARDS

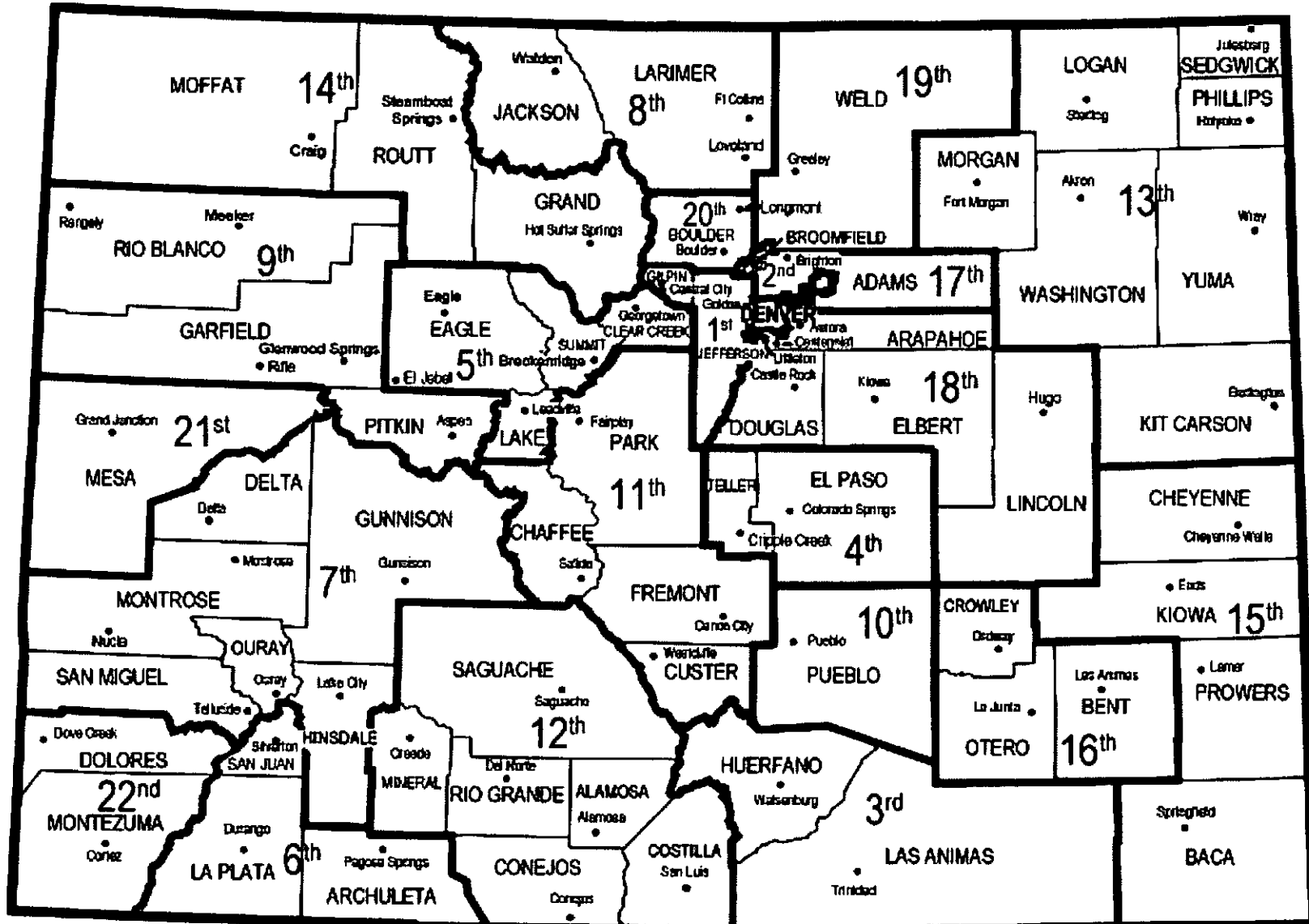
During 2004, 384 grants and 412 scholarships were approved by local Victim Assistance and Law Enforcement boards. These grant awards and training scholarships totaled \$9,125,368.

Since 1986, 10,472 grants and scholarships totaling \$104,804,727 have been approved for funding by local VALE boards.

PRIORITY FUNDING AREAS

There are two areas of equal priority for VALE funding. One priority established funding for programs that implement the Victim Rights Act (CRS 24-4.1-302.5; 24-4.1-303; and 24-4.1-304). The other priority is funding for victim and witness services which are listed in the CRS 24-4.2-105(4). These include, but are not limited to, crisis intervention services, referrals of victims to appropriate community services and victim compensation programs, translator services, and counseling.

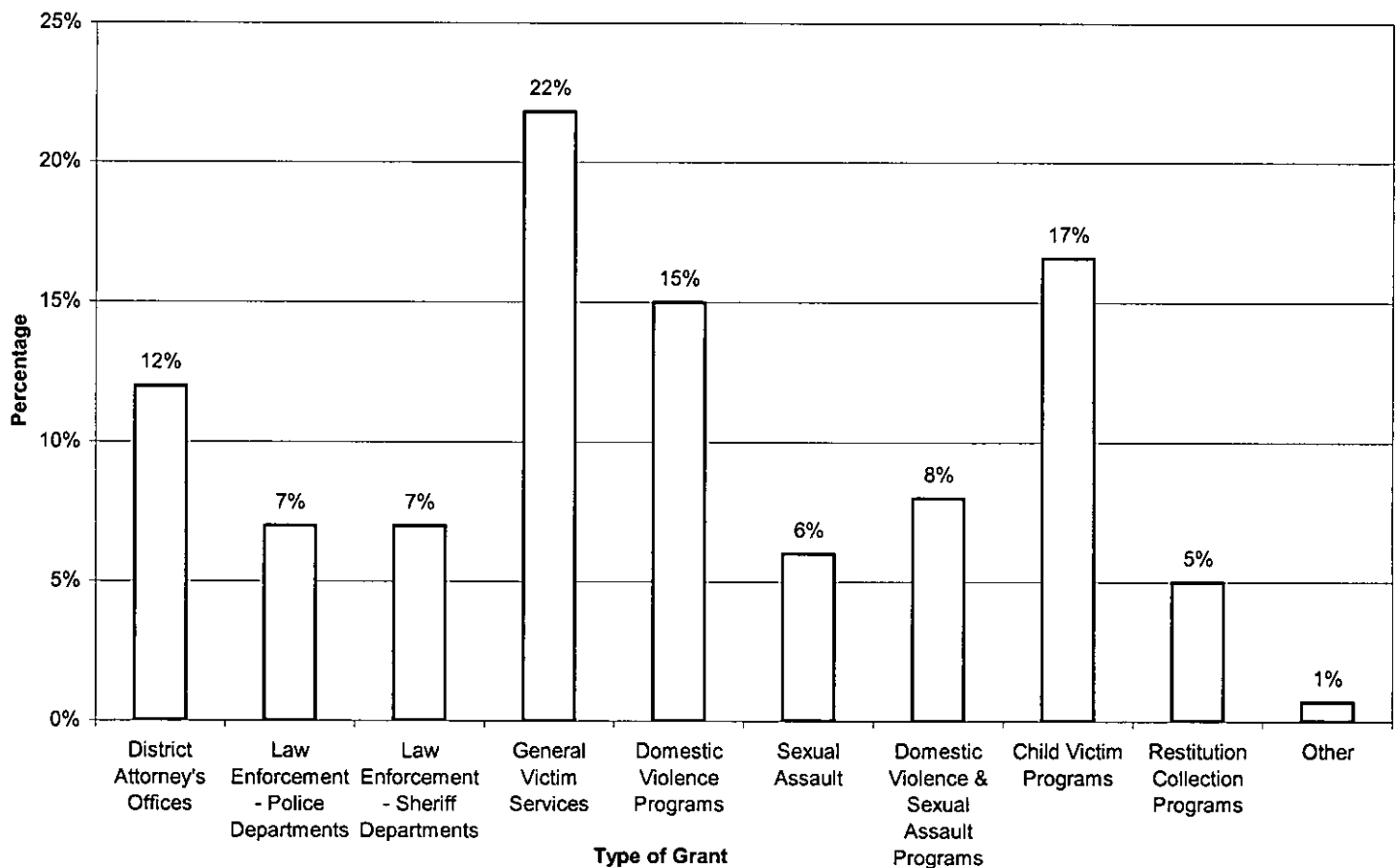

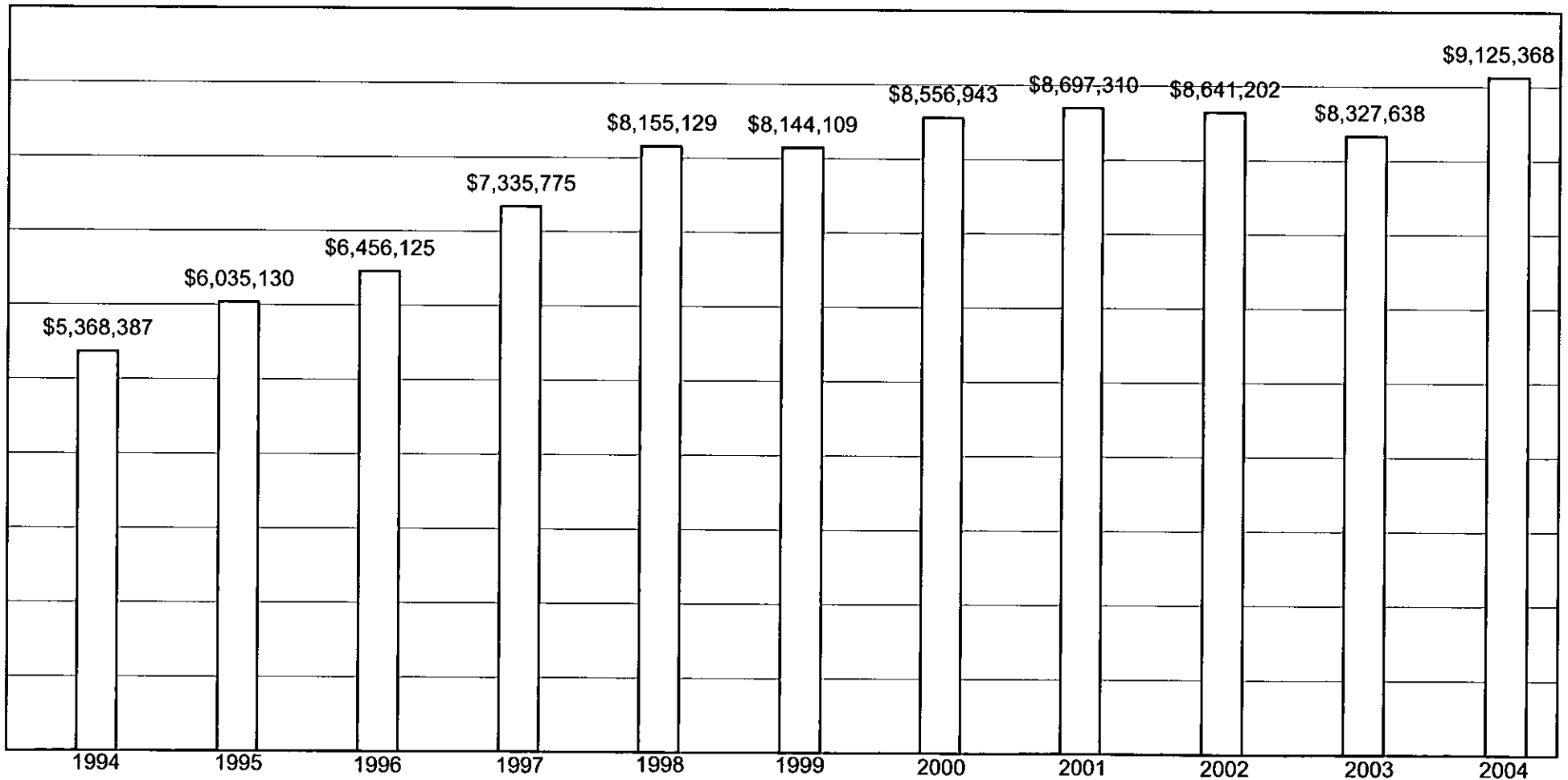

Statewide Total Awards by Year Graph 2

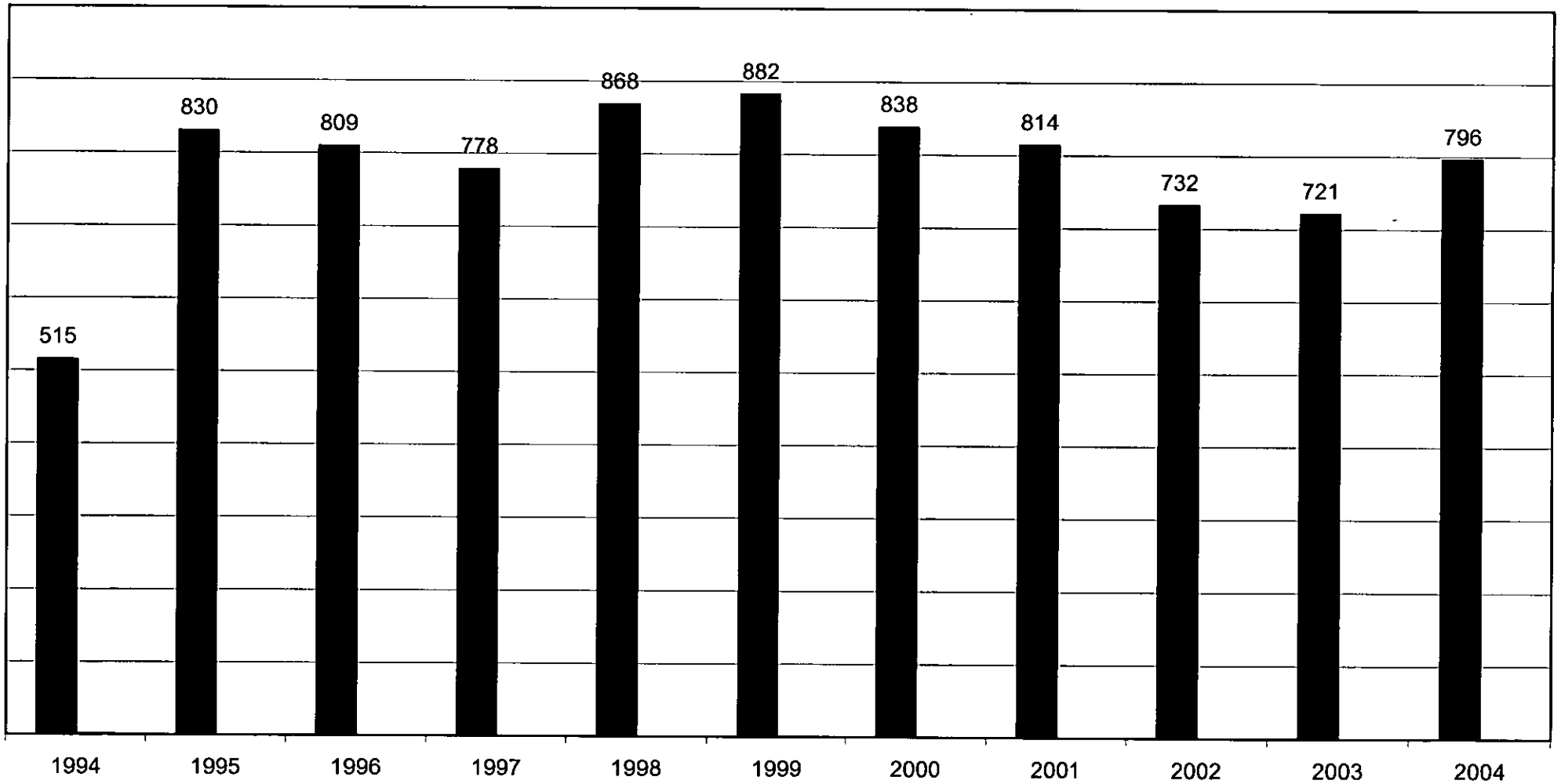
This graph provides an overview of Local VALE grant award activity since 1994. In 1993, the VALE surcharges were increased and allowed grant awards for victim services to increase by 52% between 1994 and 1998. However, this graph reflects a general leveling off of collections. Although grant awards for 2004 appear significantly higher than in previous years, this may be attributed to more Judicial Districts implementing a funding philosophy of awarding funds based upon projected collections.

Some boards designate any grant monies that relate to services for victims of crime be drawn from the Victim Assistance portion of the fund. Some boards designate any grant monies that relate to law enforcement or the District Attorney's Office be drawn from the law enforcement portion of the fund, even if the dollars are to be spent on a victims' program. Because interpretations are varied, a disproportionate amount of money in either fund does not necessarily indicate that victims or law enforcement are being less significantly served by this legislation.

Financial Report on the VALE Fund by Judicial District

Table 8: Collections, Administrative Set-Aside, Allocations to State, Other Revenue, and Funds for Grant Program

The financial report by Judicial District that follows is a snapshot of a single year of revenue to the VALE fund, with the statutory allocations for administrative funds and the state treasury included. The State Court Administrator's Office supplies revenue information, and each District Administrator has an opportunity to review and modify the data, if indicated, to more accurately reflect changes to the financial information. Many Judicial District Administrators do so; however, these figures are not an accounting statement and may not be exact in every instance. In particular, there is some variation across Judicial Districts that supercedes the formulas used to calculate this report. Where there is a difference, DCJ has recorded the Judicial District's calculations.

The financial report has additional limitations that should be acknowledged in the review of the information. The report does not fully describe the status of the VALE fund in each district; it does not record fund balances, actual expenditures of administrative funds, or any refunds to the fund (e.g. a grant award that is not fully expended).

Despite these limitations, the financial report offers a statewide look at collections to the VALE fund during the period of a single year that may be useful to VALE Boards and Administrators.
