2016 ANNUAL LOCAL VALE REPORT (January 1 – December 31, 2016) Introduction

In 1984, the General Assembly approved legislation to establish the Assistance to Victims of and Witnesses to Crimes and Aid to Law Enforcement Act (VALE). As currently enacted, the Act mandates a surcharge equal to 37% of the fine imposed for felonies, misdemeanors, juvenile offenses, and class 1 and 2 traffic offenses or a standard surcharge, whichever is greater. The standard surcharges that may be imposed are as follows: felony convictions \$163.00, misdemeanor convictions \$78.00, class 1 misdemeanor traffic offenses \$46.00, class 2 misdemeanor traffic offenses \$33.00, and class A and B traffic offenses as outlined in C.R.S. §24-4.2-104. The Act has been amended several times since its original passage in 1984. The funds collected are used for grants to agencies that provide services to crime victims within the local judicial district in which the monies are collected.

C.R.S. §24-4.2-108 mandates that each of the local VALE boards submit to the Division of Criminal Justice an annual report detailing: 1) the amount of funds granted to agencies; 2) the number and type of agencies applying for grant funds; and, 3) the projects and services for which grants were awarded. This is the twenty-fifth year that such a summary has been completed by the Division of Criminal Justice.

The graphs and summarizing data in this report provide an overview of the types of grants that were awarded by local VALE boards. The report also breaks down the percentage of funds supporting each victim service and law enforcement category. A detailed chart of each judicial district's awards is also included in the report.

LOCAL VALE BOARDS

The Act provides for a five-member board (appointed by the Chief Judge) in each judicial district. Each local board accepts applications and makes decisions regarding the use of VALE funds in that judicial district.

FUNDING SOURCE

Of the total fees collected by each local VALE program, a maximum of 10% may be used in each district for administrative costs to implement the statute and for the preparation of victim impact statements. After the allocation of administrative expenses, 13% of the remaining collections are deposited with the State Treasurer for state administrative expenses and for the State Victim Assistance and Law Enforcement (State VALE) competitive grant program. Overall, 88.3% of all collections are used for grants in each of the local districts.


GRANT AWARDS

During 2016, 311 grants and 688 scholarships were awarded to various organizations by local Victim Assistance and Law Enforcement boards. These grant awards and training scholarships totaled \$12,663,197.

PRIORITY FUNDING AREAS

There are two priority areas for VALE funding. One priority establishes funding for programs that implement the Victim Rights Act (C.R.S. §§24-4.1-302.5; 24-4.1-303; and 24-4.1-304). The other priority is funding for victim and witness services which are listed in C.R.S. §24-4.2-105(4). These include, but are not limited to, crisis intervention services, referrals of victims to appropriate community services and victim compensation programs, translator services, and counseling.



2016 Local VALE Grant Awards and Scholarships Percent of Grand Total Graph 1



STATEWIDE GRANT AWARD AND SCHOLARSHIP TOTALS BY YEAR 2006 - 2016



The financial report that follows is a snapshot of a single year of revenue to the VALE fund. These figures include the maximum statutory allocations for administrative funds and the State Treasury. The State Court Administrator's Office provides the revenue information.

The financial report has some limitations that should be noted when reviewing the information. It does not record fund balances, actual expenditures of administrative funds, or any refunds to the fund when grant awards are not fully expended.

Despite these limitations, the financial report offers a statewide look at monies collected and deposited to the VALE fund during the period of a single year.

A table is included that reflects the amount of VALE dollars collected in each Judicial District since 2009. This table illustrates that collections have decreased slightly over the last year.
