COLORADO CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION PROGRAM OVERVIEW

In 1981, the Colorado General Assembly passed legislation creating the Crime Victim Compensation Program. The legislation (C.R.S. 24-4.1, Part 1) created a funding mechanism to assist crime victims with actual expenses incurred as a result of criminal acts that are not reimbursed by another source. The statute outlines service categories which may be considered for payment related to specific crimes committed after July 1, 1982. The legislation also established crime victim compensation programs in each of Colorado's 22 judicial districts. This created a decentralized funding and service delivery structure. Each judicial district is responsible for the administration, financial management, and decisions regarding its victim compensation funds.

The Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) of 1984 provided federal grant funding as well as state level responsibilities to the Colorado Crime Victim Compensation Program. Colorado has received federal (VOCA) CVC grant funds to supplement state crime victim compensation program CVC fund disbursements since 1985. Federal CVC funds are administered by the Office of Victims Programs, located in the Division of Criminal Justice, Colorado Department of Public Safety. The application process for federal CVC grant funds is non-competitive. Federal CVC grant awards are based upon an actuarial based formula used to determine the target fund balance of each judicial district. Federal CVC grant funds are passed through, or sub-granted, by OVP to local judicial district Crime Victim Compensation Programs.

The Crime Victim Services Advisory Board (Advisory Board) is responsible for the development of, revisions to, and compliance with the *Standards for the Administration of Crime Victim Compensation Programs (Standards)*. The *Standards* were established in 1992 and have been amended periodically.


In 2015, the Colorado General Assembly amended a number of sections in the Crime Victim Compensation Act (House Bill 15-1035). Changes to the statute went into effect on March 30, 2015.

COLORADO CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION APPLICATION PROCESS

Colorado's decentralized system establishes a separate Crime Victim Compensation (CVC) program in each of the state's 22 judicial districts. Per Colorado statute, victims are eligible to file an application for compensation assistance in the judicial district where the crime occurred.

In Colorado, out-of-pocket expenses directly related to a crime that are not covered by a victim's insurance or other collateral sources may be considered for payment by CVC programs up to a maximum of \$30,000. Pursuant to both state and federal statutes, CVC programs are the "payer of last resort." For that reason, CVC programs require that victims apply for all other sources of payment available to them prior to receiving Crime Victim Compensation funds.

Some CVC programs are not able to provide crime victim compensation funds up to the \$30,000 statutory limit. This is due to the significantly high number of applications for assistance received by the program, as well as the finite revenue collected in the judicial district. COLORADO CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION STATUTORY GUIDELINES

Compensable crimes outlined in Colorado statute, include, but are not limited to:

Assault

Child Abuse

Robbery

Arson

Homicide

DWI/DUI

Terrorism

Sexual Assault

Stalking

Kidnapping

• Other violent crimes including some vehicular crimes

Those eligible for Colorado CVC fund assistance include ¹ any person victimized by a compensable crime in the state of Colorado, ² any person who is a resident of Colorado and is a victim of a crime that occurred outside of the state, where the crime would be compensable if it had occurred in Colorado and the state or country where the crime occurred does not have a crime victim compensation program for which the person would be eligible, ³ and residents of Colorado who are injured or killed by an act of international terrorism.

Additionally, persons applying for CVC must meet the following requirements:

- ❖ Have been the victim of an eligible crime, which occurred on or after July 1, 1982;
- Have reported the crime, or the crime was reported, to law enforcement within 72 hours;
- Have an out-of-pocket financial loss directly related to the reported crime;
- Filed for crime victim compensation assistance within one year of the crime; (within six months for eligible property crimes);
- Demonstrate cooperation with the law enforcement investigation and prosecution of the case;
- Injury and/or death was not substantially attributable to the victim's involvement in a wrongful act and/or substantially provocative at the time of the crime.

Note: C.R.S. §24-4.1-108 (2) allows a Board to waive any of these requirements in the interest of justice.

CVC funds may be approved up to \$30,000 for out-of-pocket expenses not covered by a victim's insurance or other collateral sources. Many, but not all, local judicial districts may also approve up to \$2,000 for emergency assistance. Losses that are verified to be directly related to the compensable crime are eligible for payment to a service provider and/or reimbursement for out-of-pocket expenses. These losses may include:

- Medical and dental expenses;
- Mental health expenses;
- Economic support (lost wages; loss of support to dependents);
- Funeral/burial expenses;
- Repair or replacement of doors, locks and/or windows of residential property.
- Rekeying of a motor vehicle or other locks necessary to ensure a victim's safety.

COLORADO CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION FUNDING SOURCES

STATE CRIMINAL FINES and SURCHARGES

Crime Victim Compensation Programs in Colorado's 22 judicial districts receive funding from fines and surcharges collected at both the state and federal level. State funding refers to fines and surcharges collected, and disbursed, at the local judicial district level. State CVC funds are collected from offenders who are convicted of, or receive a deferred sentence for, crimes and/or traffic offenses classified as follows:

Felony	\$163.00
Misdemeanor	\$ 78.00
Class 1 Misdemeanor Traffic Offenses	\$ 46.00
Class 2 Misdemeanor Traffic Offenses	\$ 33.00

Class A or class B traffic infraction – as delineated in C.R.S. §24-4.1-119 (f)(I) and C.R.S. §42-4-1701 (4). (Fees vary as to the type of infraction.)

RESTITUTION

Restitution is based on monetary losses suffered by the victim as a result of the crime. At the time of sentencing, the court may order a defendant to pay restitution to any person(s) who have documented a financial loss as a result of the crime. Since a case must reach a final disposition for the court to order restitution, victims may not be awarded restitution for a year or more. Crime Victim Compensation Programs are usually able to provide tangible, financial assistance to crime victims to meet immediate needs within 45 days of receiving a completed CVC application.

The Court may order an offender to repay the Crime Victim Compensation fund for expenses paid to a victim or service provider on behalf of the victim. In effect, the offender is reimbursing the CVC fund for some or all of the dollars awarded to assist the victim. This holds the offender accountable for his/her criminal actions.

It is important to note that the majority of CVC claims handled by local judicial districts will not result in a criminal case conviction as the CVC statute does not require an arrest, prosecution and/or conviction in order to assist a victim with financial losses related to a crime.

Restitution varies as a revenue source for CVC programs in Colorado. Differential funding of local judicial district collection programs have a significant impact on the amount of restitution received by CVC programs.

OTHER REVENUE SOURCES

Each year judicial districts receive additional revenue to their crime victim compensation fund in the form of interest earned on the state dollars collected, refunds from collateral sources and donations to the fund. Local judicial districts may also receive a portion of restitution payments made by defendants and not claimed by the intended recipient (Unclaimed Restitution) pursuant to C.R.S. §16-18.5-109(3).

FEDERAL GRANT FUNDS

Federal grant funds refer to Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) crime victim compensation (CVC) grant funds which are awarded to the states by the U.S. Department of Justice, Office for Victims of Crime. Federal CVC grant funds come from fines and penalties levied upon federal criminal defendants. Pursuant to state statute, the Division of Criminal Justice administers federal crime victim compensation grant funds as "pass through" funds to local judicial districts through a sub-grant process. Recipients of federal grant funds are determined based upon an individual judicial district crime victim compensation programs' financial need and spending patterns. Historically, the number of local judicial districts eligible to apply for and receive these monies has been limited.

COLORADO CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION FEDERAL (VOCA) CVC GRANT FUNDS OVERVIEW

Federal CVC grant funds are distributed to each state from the Crime Victims Fund established by the 1984 Victims of Crime Act (VOCA). Each year, millions of dollars are deposited into this fund from criminal fines, forfeited bail bonds, penalty fees and special assessments collected by U.S. Attorney Offices, U.S. Courts and the Bureau of Prisons. A percentage of these funds are allocated to state crime victim compensation programs by the Office for Victims of Crime (OVC) situated in the U.S. Department of Justice (DOJ). The federal fiscal year time period begins October 1 and ends September 30.


Federal CVC grant funds receive fluctuate from year to year, depending upon the total amount of state CVC funds spend by local judicial districts. OVC determines Colorado's federal CVC grant award by calculating 60% of total allowable state CVC funds spent from the federal fiscal year two years prior to the current federal fiscal year. Expenditures for doors, locks and windows are not included in the OVC formula. There is one-year delay between OVC approval and receipt of federal grant funds by Colorado. For instance, the FFY 2017 grant award was calculated based upon allowable total FFY 2015 state CVC expenditures; FFY 2017 federal grant funds were approved by OVC on 10/01/16 and disbursed to OVP on 10/01/17.

In Colorado, federal CVC grant funds are utilized to supplement the statutory criminal conviction surcharge fees collected in individual local judicial districts for crime victim compensation fund disbursement. Supplemental federal CVC grant funds are available to all 22 local judicial districts through a non-competitive application and award process. The Office for Victims Programs (OVP), located within the Colorado Division of Criminal Justice (DCJ), serves as the state department designated to administer federal CVC grant funds to local judicial districts. OVP is required to submit an annual application to OVC for federal CVC grant funds. In order to remain eligible to receive federal CVC grant funds, OVP is also responsible for submitting quarterly reports that adhere to the reporting requirements and procedures established by OVC. Federal CVC grant funds administered by OVP are regularly monitored by OVC as well as audited routinely, by both internal and external entities.

CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION FEDERAL (VOCA) CVC FUNDS OVP APPLICATION AND AWARD PROCESS

The application and award process for federal CVC grant funds is non-competitive for local judicial districts seeking supplemental monies. The request to apply for federal CVC grant funds begins by the CVC Administrator at the local judicial district level contacting OVP. A local judicial district may contact OVP at any time to make inquiry regarding the availability of, and to initiate the application process for, federal CVC grant funds. This generally happens when a local judicial district CVC program fund balance has decreased based upon the difference between the dollar amount of compensation funds being collected and the dollar amount of compensation funds being expended over a period of time. It may also happen when a local judicial district experiences an incident of mass violence resulting in the need for compensation assistance that exceeds, or will exceed, available CVC funds.

Federal CVC grant funds are considered and approved for a local judicial district CVC program utilizing the following information: ¹⁾ the CVC program's actual fund balance at the end of a reporting quarter, ²⁾ the CVC program's target fund balance calculated by weighted expenditure patterns for previous federal fiscal years, and ³⁾ the CVC program's total revenue and expenditures for previous federal fiscal years.

OVC has put in place steps that ensure fair and equitable access for all judicial district CVC programs to apply for, and receive, federal CVC grant funds. These steps are followed for both the initial determination of a federal CVC grant fund award as well as requests for continued funding of a current award. OVP moves forward applications for supplemental federal CVC grant funds when a local judicial district CVC program's verified actual fund balance falls below the calculated Target Fund Balance (TFB). OVP approves allocation of federal CVC grant funds for local judicial district applicants in an amount that will bring the district to their TFB (and not above) and is consistent with the difference documented between state revenue and CVC program expenditures reflected in the FFY Chart.


The dollar amount sub-granted to a local judicial district during a FFY may not equal the total of federal grant fund expenditures spent in the FFY, as federal VOCA CVC grant funds may be carried over into the next fiscal year.

Federal grant funds may also be considered for short-term and/or emergency stabilization of CVC funds in a local judicial district, such as a mass critical incident or significant decrease in collections. The Department of Justice Office for Victims of Crime also offers Antiterrorism and Emergency Assistance Program (AEAP) federal grant funds to supplement available resources and services to communities responding to terrorist attacks and mass violence. CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION TOTAL COLORADO EXPENDITURES FFY 2017

In FFY 2017, Colorado's local judicial district CVC programs paid a total of \$17,161,083 for tangible financial losses incurred by victims of crime. This is an increase of 18% from FFY 2016. Nationally, Colorado is ranked 8th in total amount of CVC funds disbursed while being 21st in state population (Source: OVC federal grant formula chart). This means that *Colorado local judicial district CVC programs assist more victims than 42 other states across the country*.


TEN YEAR COLORADO STATE TOTAL CVC FFY EXPENDITURES



COLORADO CRIME VICTIM COMPENSATION PROGRAMS

The following table outlines how CVC expenditures and CVC state revenue collected fluctuate from one federal fiscal year to the next. There have been incremental increases of collections during the past ten years, however, expenditures have also increased and continue to significantly exceed revenue available.

Over a ten year period, annual state revenue for CVC Programs has been adequate to fund only 40% to 64% of tangible financial losses incurred by victims in Colorado. Federal VOCA CVC grant funds have been critical to supplement local judicial district revenue.


