GAMING INDUSTRY BULLETIN

May 14, 1993

The Colorado Limited Gaming Control Commission on May 12, 1993, approved certain regulation changes authorizing poker tournaments and multiple action blackjack. The Commission also approved various regulation changes affecting regular poker play. All changes are effective immediately.

New Colorado Gaming Regulations 47.1-1050 through 1059 provide comprehensive rules for poker tournaments, including rules on calculating AGP, entry fee and buy-in limits, the length of tournaments, conducting the tournament and notifying the Division of Gaming at least five days in advance of tournament rules. A copy of new internal controls and the forms to be used are included with this bulletin.

Revised Colorado Gaming Regulations 47-1.1213 and 1214 provide the specifications for tournament chips.

New Colorado Gaming Regulation 47.1-833 provides the rules for multiple action blackjack. The Commission approved the multiple action blackjack game previously copyrighted and patented by Four Queens Hotel & Casino in Las Vegas. Casinos contracting with Four Queens must have the table layout approved by their local Division of Gaming office prior to implementing play of multiple action blackjack.

The Commission also approved changes to regulations affecting the deal of cards in poker.
