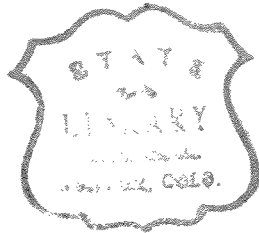

DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE

Legal Basis: Created by statute in 1941; 1953 CRS 3-7; 1960 Perm. Supp. 3-7; 1963 S.L. Chs. 31-38.

Director of Revenue: John H. Heckers

Offices: The main office is in the Capitol Annex Building, 14th Avenue and Sherman Street, in Denver. Motor Vehicle Administration is located at 120 West Sixth Avenue. There are also 14 district offices.

Composition and Classification: The Department of Revenue is operated through the Director of Revenue who is appointed by the Governor with confirmation of the Senate. He serves at the pleasure of the Governor.

Organization: The Director is authorized by statute to create within the Department of Revenue such departments, divisions and sections as are necessary for efficient functioning of the Department and shall appoint all heads thereof subject to civil service regulations. The Director is bonded for \$200,000. Total number of employees as of June 30, 1966 was 887.

General Purpose: To collect income, sales and excise taxes, licenses and other fees due the State under a single unified tax collection system, and administer and enforce specifically enumerated tax laws and the various motor vehicle laws.

Functions: 1. To advise the Governor and General Assembly in matters of collection of taxes and the enforcement of taxing and licensing laws.

2. Administer and enforce specific tax laws, including sales, use, income, and withholding taxes, motor fuel tax, gross ton-mile tax, etc.

3. May deputize other State agencies to collect for the Department of Revenue and may require bond of such deputized agencies.

4. Deposit daily with the State Treasurer all monies received, and render to the State Treasurer on the first day of each month an account of the working capital of the Department.

5. Maintain a division of taxation for the establishment of delinquent deficiency assessments by a single unified audit for all tax liabilities.

6. Title and register motor vehicles, conduct examinations for operators' and chauffeurs' licenses in Denver, and, either directly or through county clerks as agents of the Department, to administer

throughout the several counties of the State the titling and registration of motor vehicles and the examination and licensing of operators and chauffeurs.

7. To maintain a central agency for payment of penalty assessment notices served upon violators for highway traffic violations and to receive the State's share of all fines collected throughout the State for violations of specific articles of the motor vehicle laws.

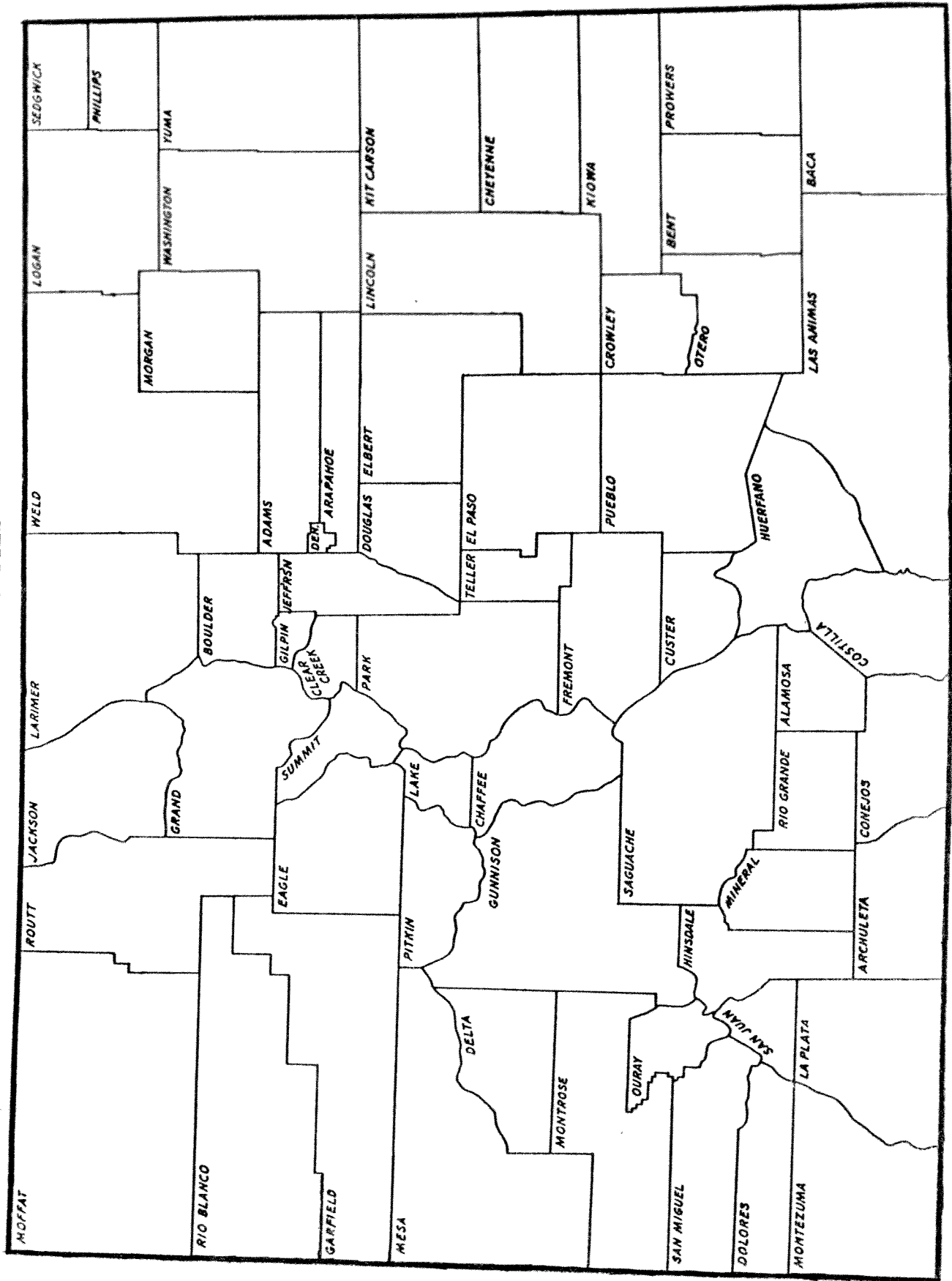
8. Maintain highway accident records for the enforcement of the financial responsibility law and motor vehicle licensing laws.

9. Administer Motor Vehicle Inspection Station laws.

10. Maintain and administer Port of Entry system in Colorado.

11. Administer Motor Vehicle Dealers' licensing laws.

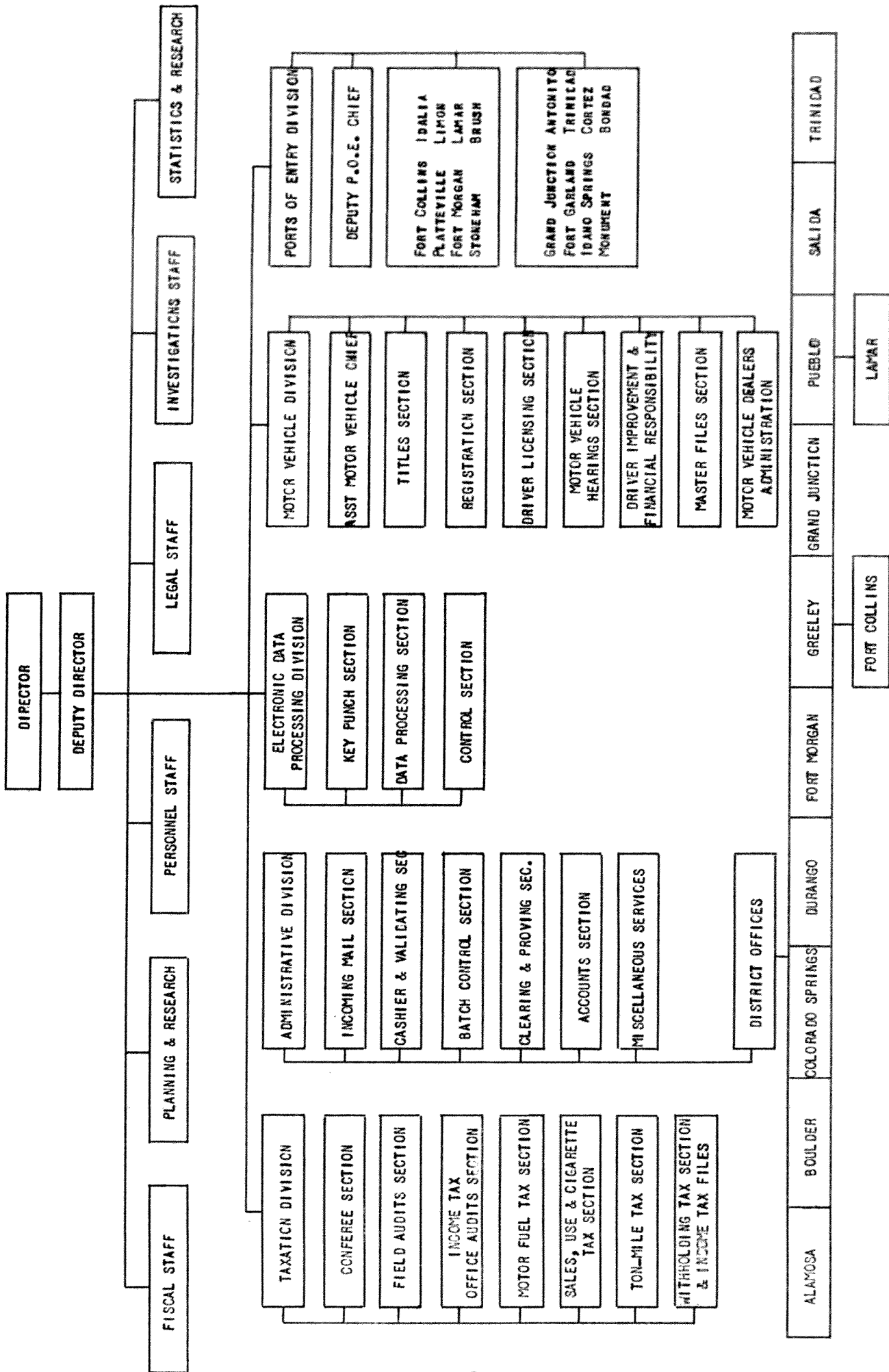

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

The COLORADO DEPARTMENT of REVENUE operates and administers taxes and fees under authority of the following major statutory provisions:

Summary of recent Senate and House bills pertaining to taxes collected and/or administered by the Department of Revenue.

Bills enacted by the Forty-Fourth General Assembly (1964 - Second Regular Session.)

Income Tax CRS 138-1-1, et seq.

H 1003 - Effective January 1, 1965

Income tax. Rewrites substantially all of the income tax article, defining Colorado adjusted gross income as the federal adjusted gross income with the following modification: Add the interest, if any, on obligations of a state or any subdivision thereof (except on obligations of this state which are exempt from the state income tax), state income taxes, federal net operating loss deduction, and federal income tax refunds; and subtract interest income on obligations of the United States or any agency thereof, amounts received from certain pensions, the gain or loss on the disposition of property having higher adjusted basis for Colorado income taxation than for federal taxation purposes, income previously taxed under the income taxes of this state, the Colorado net operating loss deduction, and certain depletion allowances for oil shale production.

Specifies that the itemized deductions shall be the federal itemized deductions with the following modifications: Add the federal income tax liability for the same taxable year, and any income taxes to any foreign country claimed as a credit on the federal return; and subtract the income taxes imposed by this state or any other taxing jurisdiction.

Other important changes are: The dividend exclusion and the "more than six months" holding period for long-term capital gains will apply in the determination of Colorado income taxes. The two thousand dollars exclusion for military pay and the deduction for travel to and from work have

been repealed. The drug and medical deductions will be the same as for federal returns. Alimony paid by an ex-husband shall be a deduction from his adjusted gross income and shall be included in the adjusted gross income of the ex-wife. Does not provide for split income advantages if a husband and wife file a joint return. Requires declaration of estimated tax only in cases where the estimated tax exceeds forty dollars.

Bills enacted by the Forty-Fifth General Assembly (1965 - First Regular Session.)

Cigarette Tax CRS 138-8-3

H 1120 - Effective June 1, 1965

Cigarette tax. Imposes additional tax at the rate of two cents on each pack of twenty cigarettes, making the total tax five cents per pack. Reduces the discount granted on cigarette tax stamps sold to licensed wholesalers from 10% to 6% of the face value of such stamps.

Motor and Special Fuel Tax CRS 138-2-1, et seq.

H 1270 - Effective July 1, 1965

Motor fuel tax - special fuel tax. Defines "special fuel" to include kerosene, diesel fuel, liquefied petroleum gases, and other combustible gases and liquids usable in motor vehicles, except those defined as "Motor fuel". Provides alternate method of collecting special fuel tax on liquefied petroleum gases by permitting owners or operators of motor vehicles using such gases to obtain special fuel dealers' licenses. Each such licensee shall post a surety bond of not less than \$500 nor more than \$10,000 and shall pay that tax on such gases monthly. Eliminates requirement of such owners or operators to obtain permit for each such vehicle. Deletes exception as to reporting sales or deliveries of special fuel in amounts of ten gallons or less and used for lighting or heating.

Sales and Use Tax CRS 138-5-6

H 1119 - Effective June 1, 1965

Sales and use tax. Increases sales and use taxes from two per cent to three per cent, effective June 1, 1965. Imposes sales and use taxes on sales of fermented malt beverages, and on malt, vinous and spirituous liquors, and exempts therefrom all sales of drugs dispersed under prescription and all sales of prosthetic devices. Provides for inclusion of tax in sales price of malt, vinous, or spirituous liquors by the drink. Effective July 1, vendors may deduct only three and one-third per cent instead of five per cent of taxes remitted to the state. Vendors of property through coin-operated vending machines shall be subject to the three per cent sales tax on all sales of items with a sales price in excess of ten cents each.

CRS 138-1-18

Allows credit or refund of food sales taxes equal to seven dollars per person, to be recovered by resident individuals as a credit against their income taxes or as a direct refund to persons not having taxable income, but for the first taxable year ending after June 1, 1965, and before January 1, 1966, the credit or refund shall be reduced by one-half.

Bills enacted by the Forty-Fifth General Assembly (1965 - First Extraordinary Session).

Motor and Special Fuel Tax CRS 138-2-2(1)(a) and (3)(a)

H 1002 - Effective August 1, 1965

Motor fuel tax - special fuel tax. Imposes an additional tax, for the period beginning August 1, 1965 through August 31, 1966, at the rate of one cent per gallon or fraction thereof, making the total tax seven cents per gallon or fraction thereof.

Bills enacted by the Forty-Fifth General Assembly (1966 - Second Regular Session).

Motor Vehicles CRS 13-3-30(1)

S 7 - Effective February 21, 1966

Motor vehicles - additional registration fee. Extends the additional \$1.50 registration fee for vehicles through 1967.

Motor and Special Fuel Tax CRS 138-9-12(3)

H 1035 - Effective March 8, 1966

Taxation - gasoline gallonage reports. Amends law permitting publication of statistics from various tax returns, to permit the release of information by the department of revenue for the periodic publication of gasoline gallonage reports based on motor fuel tax returns and reports, and containing summaries of quantities of motor fuel marketed in this state, specifying the suppliers, distributors, and consumers of such fuel, and other information concerning the motor fuel tax.

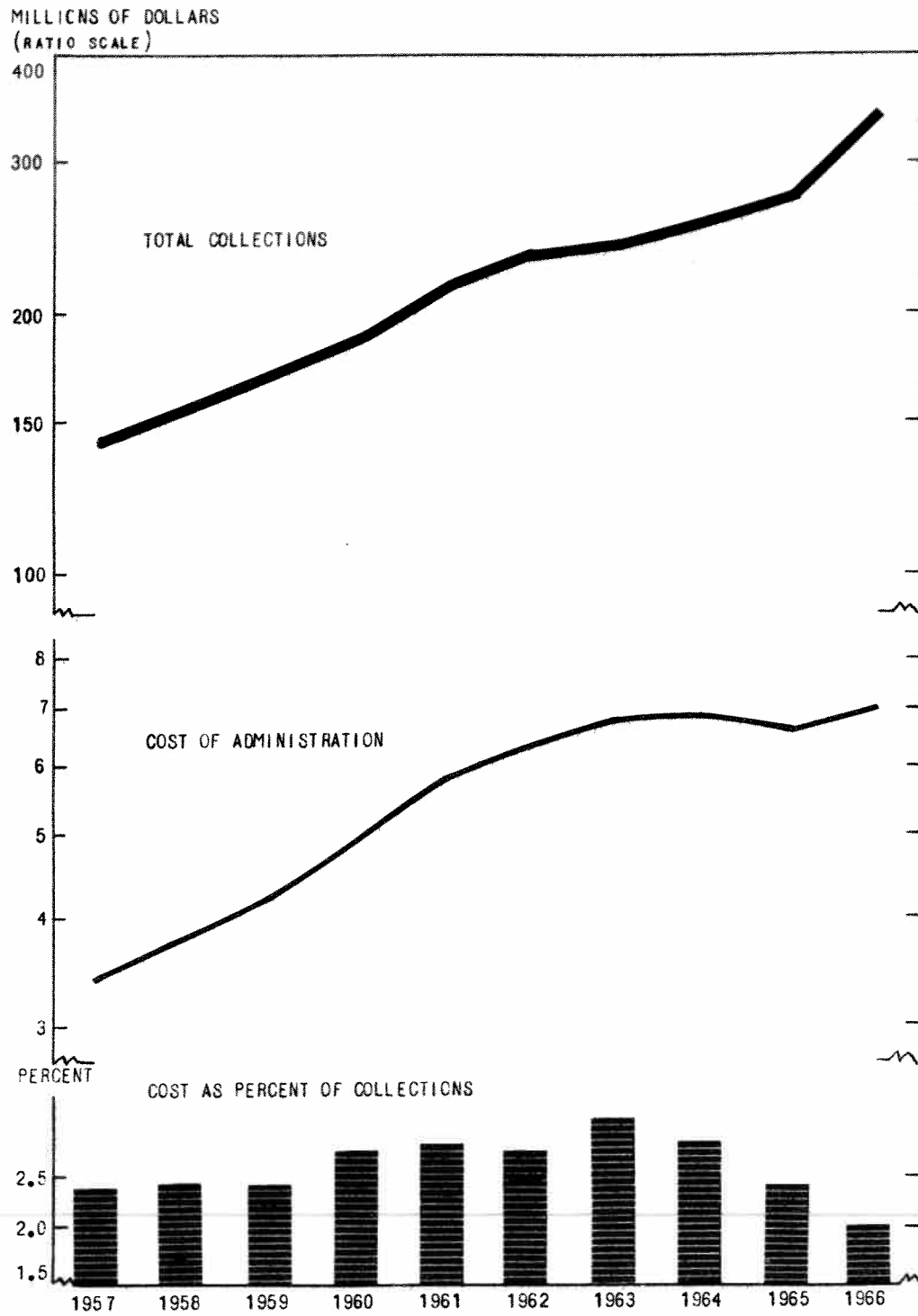

The effect of this credit is to lower certain statutory brackets by 1/2 of 1%. The rate with the tax credit is the rate structure used on the income tax forms.

CORPORATION INCOME TAX RATES

Corporations other than banks are taxable at the rate of 5% of their net income, banks and similar corporations at the rate of 6% of their net income which is specially determined.

OIL AND GAS PRODUCTION TAX RATES

Rates on gross income from oil and gas production: income under \$25,000, 2%; between \$25,000 and \$100,000, 3%; between \$100,000 and \$300,000, 4%; over \$300,000, 5%. Ad valorem taxes paid during the taxable year on oil and gas royalty or leasehold interests are allowed as a credit against the tax due.
