

## COLORADO DEPARTMENT OF REVENUE



## **Perspective**

New internal leadership, expanded responsibilities and voter-approved limitations on revenue collection and distribution brought change and challenge to the Department of Revenue in Fiscal Year 1993.

In August 1992, Gov. Roy Romer appointed former State Representative Renny Fagan Director of Revenue, effective September 1. Drawing upon his experience as an elected official, Mr. Fagan brought to the department his insight into public attitudes toward government service — along with six years experience in fiscal policy and strong commitments to innovation, conflict resolution, customer service, and cost-saving efficiency.

Among the projects launched or implemented were

- Improved Service. Enhancements to external and internal service delivery were essential to the achievement of Department goals. For this reason, DOR staff members took a new looks at service delivery and processing procedures through formation of Continuous Improvement Process (CIP) teams. Already, these teams have offered new analyses and recommendations that will improve efficiency. One CIP team won the Governor's Quality and Excellence Award for its efforts to improve general telephone information response.
  - In addition, the Motor Vehicle Division won the Rocky Mountain Quality Service award for its express network of driver's license kiosks throughout the state. This is the first time the award has been presented to a public service agency. Previous winners include Kodak Co. and Teledyne Corp.
- Electronic Filing. More than 13,000 accounts found payment of wage withholding tax by Electronic Funds Transfer a convenient alternative to paper transactions. During the year Colorado qualified as a participant in the Internal Revenue Service program for electronic filing of state individual income tax returns. A limited pilot project will be conducted in 1994 before the option is offered to the general public in January 1995. The department is also exploring the potential of filing sales tax returns by Electronic Data Interchange and plans to conduct a pilot project in 1994.
- Reorganization of the Division of Racing Events. Using results of an extensive management audit, the department implemented changes in staffing and other procedures that improved operations and accountability while effecting General Fund savings of more than \$396,000.
- Information Colorado. Five kiosks offering information from the Departments of Revenue, Natural Resources and Social Services were installed as a pilot project in Colorado Springs, Grand Junction, Fort Collins, Craig and Denver. The touch-screen kiosks provide the public answers to frequently asked questions in a convenient accessible format. If widely accepted, the Information Colorado network will be expanded.

Cooperative efforts with public/private agencies. The exchange of information
and electronic data as well as shared responsibility for a variety of projects benefited all participants. For example, Taxpayer Service Division established cooperative ties and exchanges of information with local jurisdictions and with the Colorado Municipal League.

The Secretary of State's office and the Motor Vehicle Division's Data Processing Section initiated an effort to consolidate telecommunication systems that will eventually combine motor voter, voter registration and distributive data processing functions at substantial savings to both agencies.

Similar joint projects involve Motor Vehicle and the state's county clerks, establishment of a joint port of entry with New Mexico and construction of a model port of entry at Trinidad in cooperation with the Department of Transportation.

• Collections and Compliance. Refinements to auditing systems and vigorous enforcement of state statutes brought big dividends to the state. The expanded refund offset program collected approximately \$1 million in tax owed by delinquent taxpayers who were also due refunds in later years. (Refunds were intercepted to discharge earlier liabilities.)

Further expansions of taxpayer data bases allowed revenue agents to select potential audits more reliably.

In the largest fuel tax fraud case in state history, the Department seized assets of Max Oil Co. and its subsidiaries for non-payment of fuel taxes. Sale of these assets grossed more than \$5 million, much of which will be used to recover the unpaid liabilities. This case sends a message that the Department will vigorously enforce fuel tax laws.

A "Cop in Shops" enforcement program, instituted by the Liquor Enforcement Division, was used to detect and arrest underage persons using false identification to purchase liquor.

#### A LOOK TO THE FUTURE

The Department of Revenue views the challenge of change as an opportunity to meet customer expectations, renew our commitment to excellence and explore increasingly sophisticated technology for the benefit of all Coloradans. We are committed to using all our resources to meet these challenges.

In our ceaseless search for improvement, we welcome innovation but adhere to proven models by which we measure our performance.

We set and persistently strive to meet high standards of **competence**, **reliability**, **integrity**, **dedication**, **quality**.

### **Productivity**

The Colorado Department of Revenue processes state sales, fuel, motor vehicle, gaming, liquor and income taxes. It also oversees the collection of funds, provides licensing and enforcement of state laws and regulations as mandated by the legislature, and conducts comprehensive programs of information and education to serve the public and encourage voluntary compliance.

The following is a brief summary of some DOR activities during FY93.

#### SERVICE TO TAXPAYERS

Over 853,000 telephone calls were received from taxpayers about sales, fuel and income taxes (50 percent handled through pre-recorded information on voice mail.)






## SOURCES AND DISPOSITION OF MAJOR TAXES: MOTOR VEHICLE FEES AND TAXES

Calendar Year 1992 (dollars in millions)




#### SOURCES AND DISPOSITION OF MAJOR TAXES: MILEAGE/FUEL TAXES

Fiscal Year 1993 (dollars in millions)




#### SOURCES AND DISPOSITION OF MAJOR TAXES: INCOME TAXES



Imposed upon cigarette wholesalers who sell or offer for sale cigarettes in the state; tobacco product distributors/first receivers collect and remit taxes imposed on the distribution, sale, consumption, or handling of the products.

Cigarette tax is paid by wholesalers who purchase tax stamps and affix them to the packages or who use a DOR-approved metering machine which imprints/impresses a payment stamp upon the packages. Distributors remit tax by the 10th day of the month subsequent to purchase; they receive a 4% discount from the stamp's face value for collection expense. Tobacco product distributors file quarterly returns, paying the tax by the 20th day of the month which follows the end of a quarter. Distributors deduct 3 1/3% of the tax due as payment of their expenses of collection and remission.

#### Estate:

#### Title 39, Article 23.5

Amount equal to state death tax credit allowed by federal estate tax regulations.

Imposed upon a decedent's estate when death occurred on or after January 1, 1980. When the filing of a federal estate tax return is not required, a state return is similarly not required. Colorado inheritance tax is imposed on the right to receive property by descent or testamentary gift from a decedent's estate. Colorado gift tax is imposed on gratuitous property transfers that occurred on or before December 31, 1979.

Return requirements are annual, in general, and are due on the 15th day of the 4th month following the tax year's close. Other requirements are imposed for withholding and estimated tax payments.

If no sales tax is paid, the buyer must remit use tax to DOR. Sales and use tax also applies to certain defined services (e.g., telephone service). In the case of the tourism tax, imposition/collection/ remission is as above. Taxable items include ski lift service, entertainment admission, lodging, restaurant food/drink sales, rental autos, and similar items. Sales tax returns are due monthly (if tax liability is \$300 or more) or quarterly (if tax liability is less than \$300 on a monthly basis. Wholesalers file annually. Vendors are given a discount of 3 1/3% from tax due to cover collection expense. Tourism tax vendors must file quarterly and pay tax by 25th day of month subsequent to the quarter's end.

Note: The tourism tax was subject to sunset effective July 1, 1993. A resolution to reinstate the tax was rejected by voters in the November 1993 election.

## LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

Following is a brief description of legislative initiatives approved in the second regular session of the 58th Colorado General Assembly. These particular changes impact programs administered by the Colorado Department of Revenue. Effective dates appear in parentheses.

#### **ADMINISTRATION**

#### SB 74

Fiscal policies - implementation of section 20 of article X of the state constitution. Enacts statutory provisions for implementing section 20 of article X of the state constitution, which imposes limitations upon the spending and taxing authority of state and local governments. (6/6/93)

#### HB 1212

Contracts for personal services - privatization. Authorizes personal services contracts to achieve increased efficiency in the delivery of government services if the state personnel director determines that both qualitative and quantitative conditions are met. (4/7/93)

#### **ESTATE TAX**

#### **SB 64**

Authority to consolidate and divide trusts. Allows the court to consolidate separate trusts and to divide a single trust into separate trusts if the consolidation or division is not inconsistent with the settlor's or testator's intent. (7/1/93)

#### SR 222

Construction of wills and trusts - formula marital deduction clauses. Directs that a clause in a will or trust of a decedent created before September 12, 1981, which sets forth that the decedent's spouse is to receive the maximum amount of property qualifying for the federal marital deduction refers to the unlimited marital deduction allowed by federal law after 1981. (4/21/93)

#### **INCOME TAX**

#### **HB 1020**

Income tax - action older American volunteer check-off program. Effective for income tax years on or after January 1, 1993 but prior to January 1, 1996, permits taxpayers to designate on their Colorado income tax return a contribution to provide financial support for older American volunteer programs. (7/1/93)

#### **HB 1107**

Income tax - apportionment of taxable income - partnerships and limited liability companies. For taxable years beginning on or after January 1, 1994, extends certain state corporate income tax policies to partnerships and limited liability companies. (6/6/93)

#### HB 1120

Tax returns and other tax documents - preparation and filing - alternative procedures. Allows the executive director to prescribe voluntary alternative methods for the filing, signing, transmitting, and storing of tax returns or other tax documents. Authorizes the executive director to contract for communications services and requires such contracts to contain statutory language concerning liability for disclosure of information. (4/19/93)

#### HB 1121

Income tax - changes in withholding procedures. On and after January 1, 1994, provides that the definition of "wages" for withholding tax purposes shall be the same under Colorado law as under federal law. Authorizes the executive director to promulgate rules and regulations concerning remittance of tax withheld on wages, the filing of withholding tax returns, and tax payment due dates. (1/1/94)



#### LIMITED GAMING

#### SB 12

Limited gaming - confidential information - disclosure - penalty. Establishes that any person who discloses confidential information of the Colorado limited gaming control commission is guilty of a class 1 misdemeanor. Provides that if such person is a present employee of the state such person shall be liable for treble damages to any injured party in any civil action and shall be subject to dismissal. (7/1/93)

#### **SB 110**

Limited gaming - disqualification for licensure - limited gaming impact fund. Requires the limited gaming control commission to preestablish criteria governing performance of its agreements with other governmental entities. Establishes new criteria related to criminal activity for disqualification for licensure. Directs the state treasurer to make distributions from the contiguous county limited gaming impact fund to counties whose boundaries are contiguous to Indian lands on which gaming activities are being conducted in addition to counties adjacent to Teller and Gilpin counties. (5/10/93)

#### SB 235

Limited gaming - licensed manufacturer or distributor may operate linked progressive slot machine system. Allows a licensed manufacturer or distributor of slot machines to establish and administer funds for the operation of a linked progressive system without obtaining an operator license so long as the administration of the fund is subject to supervision, and machines are placed only in licensed premises. (6/9/93)

#### **LOTTERY**

#### HB 1327

State lottery division and Colorado lottery commission - enterprise status. Designates that the state lottery division and the Colorado lottery commission are an enterprise for purposes of section 20 of article X of the state constitution. Authorizes the commission to issue revenue bonds in an amount not to exceed 10 million. 6/6/93

#### **MOTOR VEHICLES & DRIVERS' LICENSES**

#### SB 48

**Revocation of driver's license - counterpart municipal offense.** Extends the mandatory revocation of a driver's license for alcohol-related offenses to any counterpart municipal charter or ordinance offense. (7/1/93)

#### SR 109

Habitual traffic offenders - reckless driving - violations of municipal ordinances. Adds offenses for driving a motor vehicle in a reckless manner to those offenses that, for purposes of the habitual traffic offender statute, include convictions under ordinances that conform to state motor vehicle statutes. (7/1/93)

#### SB 148

License plates - special plates for purple heart recipients - design. Eliminates the requirement that special license plates on motor vehicles owned by purple heart recipients have a blue background with white lettering. (1/1/94)

#### **HB 1006**

Express consent law - driver's license revocation hearing - scheduling. Allows an express consent hearing to be scheduled beyond the 60-day limit when the hearing officer is unavailable because of medical reasons, a law enforcement emergency, another court or administrative hearing, or any other legitimate just cause. (3/19/93)

#### HB 1012

Reclassification of certain traffic offenses to traffic infractions. Reclassifies certain misdemeanor traffic offenses to class A or B traffic infractions. Changes the class 2 petty offense involving handicapped parking privileges to a class B traffic infraction. (7/1/93)

#### **HB 1026**

Motor vehicle records - certification by department of revenue. Clarifies the procedures to be used by the motor vehicle division in certifying the authenticity of motor vehicle records. (7/1/93)

#### **HB 1065**

**Public entities - minimum insurance requirements.** Revises the minimum general liability insurance requirements for public entities that operate as motor vehicle carriers but are exempt from regulation as public utilities. Requires that public entities maintain a certificate of self-insurance on file with the public utilities commission. (3/31/93)

#### HB 1219

Mailing requirements and methods of service for notices and orders. Requires that all documents mailed pursuant to the motor vehicle laws utilize first-class mail. Provides that any notice or order of the department under the motor vehicle laws shall be presumed to have been received if the department maintains a copy of the notice or order and a certification of mailing. (7/1/93)

#### **HB 1255**

Election code - miscellaneous changes. Beginning July 1, 1994, requires an authorized employee of the department to indicate on the driver's license of an applicant for voter registration at an examination facility that the bearer registered to vote at such a facility. (7/1/94)

#### **HB 1301**

Salvage vehicles - designation - disclosure requirements on sale or transfer. Establishes a method for determining whether a damaged vehicle should be designated as a "salvage vehicle". Requires the owner of a vehicle rebuilt from salvage to prepare a disclosure affidavit prior to sale or transfer stating that the vehicle was rebuilt from salvage. Requires the words "rebuilt from salvage" to appear in bold print on each such affidavit. (7/1/93)

#### **HB 1340**

Motor vehicle emissions control - enhanced emissions program - basic emissions program. Revises the Colorado AIR program to comply with the requirements of the federal "Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990" by creating the "enhanced emissions program" and the "basic emissions program". Specifies that the basic emissions program will be a continuation of the current emissions inspection program using inspection and readjustment stations. Specifies that the enhanced emissions program will involve the use of independent service providers to operate inspection-only centers in the enhanced emissions program area. (7/1/93)

#### **HB 1341**

Voter and motor vehicle registration - consolidated data processing system. Creates the consolidated data processing system for voter and motor vehicle registration. Requires the department to establish and maintain computer services within the system for the purpose of maintaining a network which provides access by the offices of county clerk and recorders to the master list of registered electors. (7/1/93)

#### PORT OF ENTRY

#### **HB 1018**

Port of entry weigh stations - powers and duties of personnel - display of flag. Authorizes port of entry personnel to require the driver of a vehicle to stop and submit to a weighing of the vehicle when the officer has reason to believe that the vehicle and load exceed lawful weight limits. Authorizes port of entry personnel to enforce the statutes concerning drivers' licenses. Permits the flag of any adjacent state to be displayed with the Colorado state flag at joint state ports of entry weigh stations. (7/1/93)

#### **RACING EVENTS**

#### **HB 1034**

Racing - enforcement of regulations. Directs the commission to promulgate rules on licensing and registration of persons employed in the racing industry. Authorizes the issuance of letters of admonition in addition to the currently authorized fines, suspensions, and revocations of licenses. (7/1/93)

#### HB 1268

Racing - regulation - revision of statutes - licensing and enforcement procedures. Amends and reorganizes the racing statutes. Directs the commission to determine by rule which occupational categories are subject to licensure and which are



subject to registration. Authorizes the division to investigate violations and refer cases for prosecution. Makes division personnel level III peace officers. Sets standards for licensing, requiring disqualification of applicants with a history of gambling-related crimes. Requires applicants to waive confidentiality and submit to background checks in connection with license applications. (7/1/93)

#### **SEVERANCE TAX**

#### SB 82

Severance tax - allocation of revenues. Extends through fiscal year 1993-94 the allocation to the state general fund of severance tax revenues. (2/16/93)

#### SB 173

Severance tax - allocation of revenues to uranium mill tailings remedial action program fund. Credits severance tax revenues for fiscal years 1994-95 through 1996-97 to the uranium mill tailings remedial action program fund up to specified limits. (4/19/93)

#### **MISCELLANEOUS**

#### **HB 1088**

Various changes to statutes relating to prosecution of criminal laws. Reduces the penalty for failure to pay controlled substances tax from ten times the amount of the tax to three times the amount of the tax. Makes the violation of compulsory motor vehicle insurance laws a class 1 misdemeanor traffic offense. (6/6/93)

#### **HB 1318**

Solid waste - disposal alternatives - waste tire fee. Creates statutory provisions concerning waste diversion and recycling of motor vehicle waste tires. Imposes a recycling development fee on specified motor vehicle waste tires at the time the tire is delivered to a retailer for disposal. Creates a waste tire recycling development cash fund. Makes moneys in the fund available to finance projects for the development of waste diversion strategies. (6/12/93)









#### COLORADO LIMITED STAKES GAMING

The Division of Gaming regulates limited stakes gaming in the three mountain towns of Cripple Creek, Central City and Black Hawk. Pursuant to the Constitutional Amendment, passed in November of 1990, gaming became legal in licensed establishments on October 1, 1991.


Before any monies are distributed from the Limited Gaming Fund, the administrative expenses of the Division of Gaming must be paid and the law requires two months of operating expenses for the administration of Gaming to be held in escrow at the end of the fiscal year. The division operates on the revenue generated from the gaming tax, application and license fees and any fines levied by the Division.

#### COLORADO LOTTERY

In its eleventh year, the Colorado Lottery distinguished itself with another year of record sales in fiscal year 1993. Innovative marketing, administration, and technological advances paved the way for increasing success especially in Scratch game ticket sales. Sales of Scratch game tickets nearly doubled from the previous year: ticket sales increased from \$58.8 million in FY 1992 to \$117.3 million in FY 1993.

Ticket sales for all three Lottery games — Lotto, Keno, and Scratch, totaled \$263.4 million. Lotto ticket sales made up \$136.6 million; Scratch games, \$117.3 million; and Keno, \$9.5 million of the total. These record sales allowed the Lottery to return the second largest amount of annual proceeds, \$73.5 million, to the four recipient funds: the Conservation Trust Fund, the Colorado Division of Parks and Outdoor Recreation, the Capital Construction Fund, and the newly formed Great Outdoors Colorado Trust Fund. Cumulatively, the amount of proceeds returned to the state through Lottery funds, as of the end of FY 1993, was \$480.1 million.

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



The Colorado Racing Commission has been regulating horse and greyhound racing since 1949. As of July 1, 1992 and in compliance with HB 1206, the Division of Racing Events and the Colorado Racing Commission were transferred from the Department of Regulatory Agencies to the Department of Revenue.

During calendar year 1992, two facilities were added to the number of race tracks the Division regulates. Arapahoe Park and Pikes Peak Meadows re-opened their tracks for pari-mutuel wagering on horse races. Wagers were accepted strictly for simulcast races at Pikes Peak Meadows; Arapahoe Park accepted wagers for both live and simulcast races. In total, the division regulated seven racetracks and two off- track wagering facilities during 1992.



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#### SALES AND USE TAX GLOSSARY OF TERMS

**Gross Sales:** 

Total receipts for all sales and services, both taxable and nontaxable, from Colorado retail sales tax

returns.

Wholesale Sales:

Sales to other licensed dealers for purpose of resale.

Retail Sales:

Gross sales less wholesale sales.

**Total Deductions:** 

Sales of services or tangible personal property that are not subject to tax. The following, while not all inclusive, represent major nontaxable items: wholesale sales; interstate commerce sales; sales to governments, religious or charitable organizations; admissions; lodgings over 30 days; gasoline; cigarettes; food for off-premises consumption; prescription drugs and prosthetics; certain machinery and machine tools; certain livestock and livestock feed; seed; newspapers; and residential fuel used for

light, heat, and power.

Net Taxable Sales:


Gross sales less total deductions.

Filing Requirement:

Returns are due monthly if sales tax liability is \$300 or more per month. If sales tax liability is under \$300

per month, returns are due quarterly. Wholesale businesses only may file annual returns.

#### COLORADO NET SALES TAX COLLECTIONS Fiscal Years 1983 to 1993






