


This issue presents data on Colorado restaurant sales for the third quarter 2011. Sales are presented for each of the seven Denver metro area counties; El Paso, Larimer, Pueblo, and Weld counties; and sales by restaurants in the rest of the State. For comparison, restaurant sales for the United States as a whole are also shown for the same time period. Data in this report represent sales by businesses whose primary activity is food preparation for on-premises consumption.

Colorado restaurant industry sales in the third quarter 2011 increased 5.4 percent, to about \$2.3 billion, over the second quarter last year. Sales for the entire United States increased 3.9 percent, to \$123.9 billion, over the same period. As shown on the next page, all of the counties showed positive growth with Denver County leading with a 9.3% increase. Pueblo County had the lowest increase of only 1.1% while the counties not individually selected had a combined increase of 2.1%.
