

This issue presents data on second quarter 2012 Colorado restaurant retail sales for each of the seven Denver metro counties and the counties of El Paso, Larimer, Pueblo, Weld, and sales by restaurants in the rest of the state. For comparison, restaurant sales for the United States, as a whole, are also shown for the same time period. Data in this report represent sales by businesses whose primary activity is food preparation for on-premises consumption.

Colorado restaurant industry sales in the second quarter of 2012 increased 5.7 percent, to about \$2.3 billion, over the second quarter last year. Sales for the entire United States increased 7.63 percent, to \$135.6 billion, over the same period. As shown on the next page, all counties but one showed positive growth. Leading was Adams County and Douglas County with increases of 7.2% and 6.9%, respectively. Pueblo County was the only county that had a decrease in sales with a decrease in sales of 0.4%. Increases in sales for the selected counties ranged from El Paso County's 4.4% and the 7.2% increase in Adams County.
