


This issue presents data on third quarter 2012 motor vehicle retail sales for each of the seven Denver metro counties and the counties of El Paso, Larimer, Pueblo, Weld, Fremont, Garfield, La Plata, and Mesa. In addition, the graph below compares sales of new and used cars and trucks for the United States as a whole to total sales of the counties listed above for the same period.

Sales of motor vehicles in the counties reviewed increased 9.4 percent to \$3.8 billion in the third quarter of 2012 over the same period in the previous year. Nationally, sales of motor vehicles increased by 30.2 percent over the same period last year to about \$228 billion. Overall the annual change in Colorado building material sales in the selected counties was positive; however in a few counties sales was negative. Mesa County showed a decrease in sales with a 10.9% decrease in sales, Fremont County showed a decrease in sales of 6.6% and Garfield County showed a decrease of 1.6% in sales. Douglas County led with a 20.4% increase in sales. Arapahoe and Jefferson counties showed increases in the double-digits in comparison to the prior year with increases of over 15.7% and 12.8%, respectively.
