
Colorado Motor Vehicle Sales

Selected Counties

Second Quarter of 2014

This issue presents data on second quarter 2014 motor vehicle retail sales for each of the seven Denver metro counties and the counties of El Paso, Fremont, Garfield, La Plata, Larimer, Mesa, Pueblo, and Weld. In addition, the graph below compares sales of new and used cars and trucks for the United States as a whole to Colorado retail sales for the same period.


Colorado sales of motor vehicles increased to \$3.34 billion, a gain of 10.5 percent in the second quarter of 2014, compared to the same period in 2013. Nationally sales of motor vehicles increased to \$237.3 billion, a gain of 9.7 percent in the second quarter of 2014, compared to the same period in 2013. Several of the larger counties in Colorado showed an increase in the double digits, including Adams (+16.1%), Boulder (+13.4%), Douglas (+12.2%), Larimer (+15.8%), and Weld (+13.6%). The county in this report with the largest increase was Garfield (+30.1%).
