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Licensing Data

Medical Infused Product Manufacturer

The largest increase in the number of active licenses for a single license type was a 16% increase in Medical Infused Product Manufacturers.

Retail Product Manufacturing Facilities






2015 vs 2016 Monthly Average

• On average, there were an additional 225,917 plants cultivated per month in 2016 compared to the first six months of 2015.

Plants by County

- Denver County accounted for at least 60% of the total plant count in the state on the last day of each month except June when they accounted for 59% of the total plant count.
- During the first six months of 2015, Denver accounted for 61-63% of the total plant count in the state.




Volume Sold to Consumers

Flower Sales

 Medical sales accounted for 52% of the total volume of flower sold to consumers during the first six months of 2016. In the first six months of 2015, medical sales accounted for 58% of the total volume of flower sold.

Edible and Non-Edible Sales

 Medical sales accounted for only 25% of the total units of edibles and 31% of the total units of non-edibles sold to consumers in 2016. In the first six months of 2015, those percentages were 32% and 42% respectively.




