Report to the Joint Budget Committee and the Joint Finance Committees of the Colorado General Assembly

**April 1, 2015** 

This report is submitted in accordance with C.R.S. §12-43.4-104 (6): On or before April 1, 2014, and on or before April 1 each year thereafter, the State Licensing Authority shall submit a report to the Joint Budget Committee and the Finance Committees, or any successor committees on:

#### (a) The Progress that the State Licensing Authority is making in processing licenses;

To date, the Division has met the statutory mandate to take final action (approve, deny or the applicant has voluntarily withdrawn an application from consideration) on all Retail Marijuana Establishment License applications within 90 calendar days of date of submission.

The Division has issued 16,900 active Medical Marijuana Occupational Licenses allowing the individual license holder to work within either the Medical or Retail Marijuana industries.

The Division has issued nine Retail Marijuana Occupational Licenses to individuals who may only work within the Retail Marijuana industry due to less stringent occupational licensing requirements in the Retail Marijuana Code.

## (b) An overview of the Retail Marijuana and Retail Marijuana Product markets, including but not limited to actual and anticipated market demand and market supply;

As of the date of this report, 63 Local Authorities (42 towns or cities and 21 counties) are allowing Retail Marijuana Facilities to operate within their jurisdictions.

The MED 2014 Market Size and Demand Study, published July 9, 2014, estimated the total demand for both Retail and Medical Marijuana in Colorado to be approximately 130.3 metric tons.

The MED Annual Update published February 27, 2015, reports that Retail Marijuana accounted for only 26% of the flowering marijuana sold in Colorado in 2014.

Conversely, Edible Retail Marijuana Products made up 59% of the total marijuana infused edibles sold in the state.

Finally, Retail Marijuana Infused Non-Edibles made up 47% of the total non-edible market in Colorado during 2014.

### (d) The number of applications for conversion from Medical Marijuana licensees to Retail Marijuana establishments;

We have received 76 applications for full conversion of a Medical Marijuana Business to a Retail Marijuana Establishment; 26 Centers to Stores, 48 Cultivations and two Infused Product Manufacturers to Product Manufacturers.

### (e) The number of persons who have filed a Notice of Intent to apply for licensure pursuant to subparagraph (I) of paragraph (b) of subsection (1) of this section, and;

On or before June 30, 2014, 419 individual owner applicants filed 330 Notices of Intent to apply for a MED Retail Marijuana Establishment License. The notices included 183 Stores, 115 Product Manufacturers, 274 Cultivations, and five Testing Facilities (577 potential licenses in total).

In accordance with C.R.S. 12-43.4-104 (2) (b) (II) (A) these applicants were given preference and were the only entities provided application submission appointments between July 1-28. 2014. During this time period 78 business entities that had filed a Notice of Intent elected to set an appointment with the MED to submit their applications. Once the Division had contacted each individual that had filed a notice and provided them an appointment or confirmed that they did not want an appointment, it began accepting applications from persons that had not filed a Notice of Intent.

### (f) The Enforcement measures taken against persons licensed pursuant to this article for violation of regulations promulgated pursuant to this article.

The Division is tasked with regulation of both Medical Marijuana Businesses and Retail Marijuana Establishments. The table below represents enforcement measures administered by the Division that include due diligence and complaint investigations. A more detailed accounting of these investigations may be found in the 2014 MED Annual Update.
