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LETTER FROM DANA FRANZEN

Welcome to the Colorado Lottery Annual Report for FY11. This report will provide you with an overview of the history of the Colorado Lottery as well as important sales and proceeds information from the past fiscal year. The principle mission of the Colorado Lottery and the Colorado Lottery Commission is to generate essential funding for our proceeds partners, Great Outdoors Colorado (GOCO), the Department of Local Affairs-Administration of Conservation Trust Fund and Colorado Parks and Wildlife. As mandated by the state constitution, distribution of Lottery proceeds goes to our partners for the preservation, protection, enhancement and management of key elements of Colorado’s vital tourism and recreation economy – wildlife, park, river, trail and open-space heritage.

We are proud that more than \$2.3 billion has been returned to the state for parks, recreation, open space, conservation education and wildlife projects since the Lottery started in 1983. It should also be noted that when the Colorado Lottery joined Powerball in 2001, the proceeds distribution formula changed to include funding for school health and safety issues. Lottery spillover funds now go to the Building Excellent Schools Today (BEST) Program administered by Colorado’s Public School Capital Construction Assistance Fund.

In addition to maximizing proceeds, the Colorado Lottery and Colorado Lottery Commission continue to focus on providing an enjoyable and responsible gaming experience and ensuring we are delivering our games with the utmost operational integrity.

Due to the precarious economic environment, Lottery management and staff continue to monitor developments and uncertainties and adjust business plans and strategies accordingly. Our customers and supporters have shown continued appreciation this past year for our new games and strategies – as evidenced by our historic sales year – a record \$518.9 million in FY11! This support enabled the Colorado Lottery to contribute \$113.4 million to our proceeds partners.

The Colorado Lottery and Lottery Commission are already working hard to achieve the objectives of the new fiscal year. The support of our players, retailer community and proceeds partners enables us to focus on our mission: continuing to improve the quality of life in Colorado and enhance our most valuable natural resource – Colorado’s great outdoors. Thank you.

LETTER FROM ABEL TAPIA

Fiscal year 2011 proved to be yet another incredibly busy and prosperous year for the Colorado Lottery. The Lottery achieved \$518.9 million in sales, a three and a half percent increase over FY10 and our best year ever. This achievement was largely driven by a significant increase in Scratch sales, which grew five percent over FY10 and comprised 66.5% of total sales. Jackpot game sales, which accounted for 33.5% of total sales in FY11, came to \$174 million.

Thanks to our loyal players and retail partners, the Colorado Lottery provided \$113.4 million to our proceeds partners. Through the allocation of these funds, improvements are continuously being made to Colorado that include the preservation, protection, enhancement and management of our state’s natural beauty and expanded recreational opportunities all across Colorado.

Here’s the breakdown of allocation of these funds for FY11:

- Great Outdoors Colorado: \$56.0 million
- Department of Local Affairs (DOLA), Administration of Conservation Trust Fund (CTF): \$45.3 million
- Colorado Parks and Wildlife: \$11.3 million

We also returned \$662,230 to the Public School Capital Construction Assistance Fund, which funds the Building Excellent Schools Today (BEST) program. Along with Colorado Department of Education grants and matching district funds, the Lottery has assisted with funding capital construction projects around the state. For fiscal years 2009–2011, the Colorado Lottery has contributed \$6.3 million, impacting 226 schools throughout Colorado through the BEST program.

While the total dollar amount of proceeds returned to the state in FY11 exceeded the prior year, the percent of sales returned to proceeds was not as high as it had been historically. This was primarily due to the balance of sales coming from Scratch games vs. Jackpot games. Scratch games are less profitable overall than Jackpot games. Additionally, Jackpot game sales remained relatively flat despite the presence of two new Jackpot offerings – Mega Millions and MatchPlay, and our Millionaire Raffle games, which were introduced in FY11. While our initial Millionaire Raffle game sold out completely, the second Raffle did not, making the Raffle category not as profitable as we had projected it would be.

Our biggest partners, comprised of more than 3,100 retailers across the state who sell our products, earned \$34,531,189 in commissions in FY11. Payments in retailer bonuses in FY11 were \$5,267,198.

It is our mission to stay true to the core values of the Department of Revenue: To provide graceful customer service and retail support in an elegant manner, to continue our commitment to deliver impactful products and maintain solid business practices through our effectiveness and utilizing our valuable resources that we have at the Lottery with our resolute use of efficiency. We are proud of the accomplishments we have made in FY11. We look forward to the coming year and are grateful for your support as we continue to give back to our customers, community and the great outdoors.

- Increased MyLottery membership to its highest level ever at 190,210. This represented 50,081 new MyLottery accounts.
- Averaged 2.5 million emails per month to MyLottery members, equaling 30 million total correspondences.
- Averaged 1.1 million visitors per month to the Lottery website.
- Distributed more than 90 press releases, garnering local and national coverage for winners, new games and other Lottery milestones.
- Executed Protect Your Prize education and awareness campaign.
- Renovated the Pueblo, Fort Collins and Grand Junction claims offices.
- Executed 15 large-scale events in communities around the state, reaching more than 5,270,000 people across Colorado.

Multi-Game Second-Chance Drawing – The campaign supported the multi-game second-chance drawing which offered every non-winning Scratch ticket a second chance to win great prizes. Comprised of television and radio spots, online banners, outdoor signage, point-of-sale materials, website presence, and local sports team sponsorships, the marketing efforts were so well received that entries for the program saw an almost 300% increase over the previous year, with over 52,000 new unique participants.

HOW THE LOTTERY OPERATES

The Colorado Lottery is a division of the Department of Revenue and is an enterprise fund that receives no money from the State General Fund. Tax money does not support our operation in any way. In fact, we fund our entire operation – salaries, infrastructure, retailer commissions and prizes – through the sale of our games. Thanks to our loyal players and retail partners, we are able to give back to the state of Colorado through all of our ticket sales for Powerball, Mega Millions, Lotto, MatchPlay, Cash 5, Millionaire Raffle, Bonus Millionaire Raffle and Scratch. All Lottery proceeds are directed to Great Outdoors Colorado (GOCO), Department of Local Affairs-Administration of Conservation Trust Fund and Colorado Parks and Wildlife. In the event that the money directed towards GOCO exceeds its annual cap, portions of the proceeds are directed to underfunded public schools for capital improvements. The Colorado Lottery operates with the integrity and security expected of a state agency, takes pride in the services provided to the people of Colorado, and works hard to earn and maintain the public trust.

MISSION

The Colorado Lottery creates and sells Lottery games of chance that are held to the highest standards of integrity, entertainment and efficiency, in order to maximize proceeds for the people of Colorado.

VISION

The Colorado Lottery will be an industry leader, built on strong relationships with our customers, partners and co-workers. We will deliver superior products, operate with innovative and efficient processes, and demonstrate a commitment to excellent customer service.

COLORADO LOTTERY COMMISSION

REPRESENTING OUR CONSTITUENTS

The Colorado Lottery Commission plays an important role in the oversight and governance of the Colorado Lottery and in fulfilling our fiduciary duties with regards to all Lottery games. Its mission is to ensure that all of our games are implemented with the security and integrity of the organization; and, to ensure that all Colorado Lottery games are representative of the values of the State of Colorado and its citizens.

The Commission is composed of five members who are appointed by the Governor with the consent and approval of the Colorado Senate. At least one member of the Commission must have been a law enforcement officer for at least five years; one member must have been a Colorado practicing attorney for at least five years; and at least one member must be a certified public accountant who practiced accountancy in Colorado for at least five years.

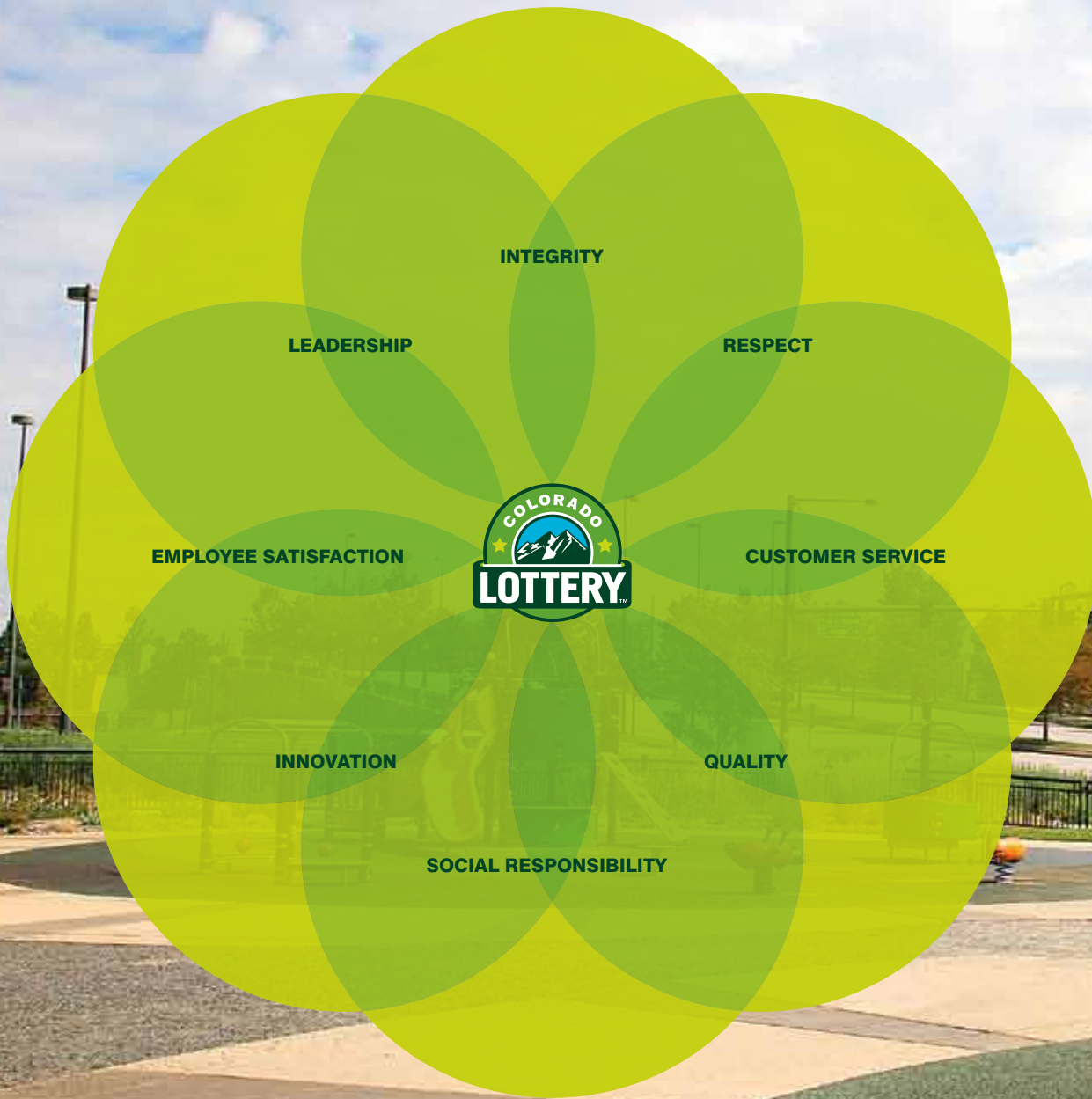
In addition, two Commissioners must be members of the public.

COMMITMENT TO PLAYING SMART

We love to play. We strive to create games that are fun and engaging, while helping to fund places for all Coloradans to play across the state. But as much as we like to play, we also help shoulder the responsibility when playing stops being fun and develops into an addiction. The Lottery includes a “Play Responsibly” message in our advertising, public relations efforts, website and on the back of every ticket we sell.



In FY11, we reminded customers to “Play Smart,” urging them to only play for fun and to seek help when it becomes a problem or if they are spending more than they can afford. The Lottery also funds the Problem Gambling Hotline, which directed 330 people with various gambling addictions to treatment options in Colorado in FY11. We are active in the Problem Gambling Coalition of Colorado, serving on the board and advisory council. We also work with the Center for Dependency, Addiction and Recovery (CeDAR) and the University of Denver to sponsor a conference on problem gambling in Colorado that helps train therapists to deal with the issue.



Our players come first and an integral part of this mission is to always protect them. Every day, criminals and con artists are finding new ways to scam our players out of their hard-earned money or good fortune. Whether consumers are playing Colorado Lottery games or simply checking their mail, it's important that they are aware of these scams and know how to protect themselves. We have strong internal measures in place to guarantee that fair and equitable games are offered to the playing public. As part of this effort, the Colorado Lottery has developed an ongoing awareness campaign called “Protect Your Prize.” The goal of the campaign is to educate players to be aware of potentially fraudulent activity, what to do if they suspect wrongdoing and enlist them to provide the best protection when it comes to winning Lottery prizes – a signature on the back of the ticket. This campaign ensures that we are protecting and reaching our players by sending this message through our retailer point-of-sale signage, brochures, pens, Scratch and Jackpot tickets. Additionally, the campaign continues this message through the Colorado Lottery website, ongoing compliance investigations and media tours.

CUSTOMERS AND COMMUNITY FIRST

We take our partnerships with our retailers seriously. The Lottery helps these businesses increase traffic to their stores and earn commissions and bonuses on the tickets they sell. With more than 3,100 retail partners throughout the state, the Lottery maintains a presence in every corner of Colorado – from Alamosa to Yuma and Denver to Durango. Not only can people play the Lottery in nearly every community in Colorado, but they can also find park, trail or open space projects funded with help from Lottery proceeds seemingly everywhere they look.

Our retailers range from large grocery stores to convenience stores, gas stations, independent liquor stores, “mom and pop” shops and restaurants. Retailers earn a commission for every ticket they sell and every prize they pay out. In FY11, our retail partners earned \$34,531,189 in commissions. The cash payments in retailer bonuses in FY11 were \$5,267,198.

AUTO RE-ORDER SCRATCH TICKET COURIER SYSTEM IMPLEMENTATION FOR OUR PLAYERS AND RETAILERS

In July of 2010, the Colorado Lottery implemented a new way for retailers to receive their tickets – through the Lottery's new Scratch ticket delivery system. The goal of the new distribution system was to increase Scratch sales and proceeds for our beneficiaries.

Since the inception of the Colorado Lottery 28 years ago, Lottery sales representatives took Scratch ticket orders and delivered tickets by hand to our retailers. However, this new courier system creates Scratch ticket orders through a computer-automated program and orders are delivered via UPS the very next business day to our 3,100 retailers across the state. This has allowed our high-demand Scratch tickets a faster time-to-market for our players.

PLAYER INTERACTION

In addition to providing fun games to play, we also interact with our players in a variety of different ways to continue enhancing our great relationship. Last year, we answered 3,684 emails from players and the general public.

We sent an average of more than two million emails per month with jackpot alerts, new Scratch game notices and promotional information to our 190,210 MyLottery members, with more than 50,000 new members in FY11.

We also maintain a social media presence on Facebook, Twitter and YouTube and have ongoing interactive contests and campaigns on Facebook. This effort grew our Facebook fan base to more than 3,230 fans and followers in FY11 and has been a wonderful opportunity to join our players and the general public in a conversation about the Lottery and how we're improving the quality of life in Colorado.

The Colorado Lottery showed a renewed commitment to getting out into our communities and having fun with our players across the state in FY11. We partnered with organizations to sponsor community events including the Colorado State Fair, Wild Wild West Fest, Olathe Sweet Corn Festival, A Taste of Colorado, Colorado Rockies games, Get Outdoors Day, REI Bike to Work Day, Chili and Frijoles Festival, and Country Jam.

Our Speaker's Bureau allows us to go out into communities and speak to civic organizations about the Lottery and how we're improving the quality of life in our state. In FY11, we visited over 42 municipalities to spread the word about how proceeds are allocated and utilized.

FAVORABILITY RESEARCH AND PLAYER FINDINGS

In an effort to continually measure our performance, the Colorado Lottery conducted several research studies in FY11. We wanted to know how the general public and our players perceive us as an organization, what kind of games our players are interested in, and the general demographics of our players.

WHAT DID WE LEARN?

- In FY11, 70% of the survey respondents were either strongly (33%) or somewhat (37%) in favor of the Colorado Lottery. Of those, 24% were neutral and 6% were somewhat negative.
- 65% of Colorado residents believe in the overall positive benefits of having a Lottery in the state of Colorado while 27% remain neutral.
- 39% of Lottery players in Colorado make a salary of \$35,000 or less, 49% make between \$35,000 and \$100,000, and 8% make more than \$100,000 per year.
- 51% of our players are male, 49% are female.
- Colorado players between the ages of 18 and 34 make up 28% of our player base, 44% are between the ages of 35 and 54, and 28% are over 55 years of age.
- When we asked a group of our players what games they had played throughout the past year, 63% said they played Scratch games, 58% played Powerball, 45% opted for our Lotto game, 28% played Cash 5, 16% played MatchPlay, and 8% played our Raffle games.

EVERYDAY PLAYERS

Who likes to play? Our independent research affirms that Lottery players represent a cross-section of Coloradans, a group that reflects the makeup of Colorado in general. Here is a snapshot of the average Colorado Lottery player:

- Is between 25 and 54 years old
- Has a household income of more than \$50,000
- Has at least some college education

WINNERS & WINNINGS



EVERYDAY WINNERS

At the Colorado Lottery, we meet winners – with payouts both big and small – every day. It's one of the true joys of the job. We love hearing about the lives of our players and the circumstances that led to their Lottery dreams coming true. Many of them speak of an initial disbelief, followed by the slow (and happy) realization of their good fortune. Despite a common misperception, most of our winners have very reasonable plans for their money: pay a few bills and maybe buy a new house or car. Throughout the year we got to meet the winners and talk to them about their good fortune and the new lives they had planned for themselves. Winners took home a total of \$328,325,432 in FY11, bringing the total prizes paid since the Lottery's inception in 1983 to over \$5 billion.

FACTS

- For jackpot games, Colorado had six Lotto millionaires, two Powerball millionaires, two Raffle millionaires and two Mega Millions millionaires.
- For Scratch games, we had a total of eight \$1 million winners and one \$1 million winner in a Second-Chance drawing.

SCRATCH

There is something exciting about the rush of knowing that you could win in an instant – that the next moment could change your day, your month or even your life. That’s why Scratch games are our most popular game, accounting for the majority of Lottery sales and proceeds in FY11. We introduced 53 instant games with an average payout of 67%. Sales from Scratch games topped \$344.9 million in FY11 and returned \$54.9 million to proceeds.

SECOND-CHANCE DRAWING PROMOTIONS

For most of our Scratch games, the Lottery offers a second chance to win for non-winning Scratch tickets. Players can go online and enter the unique number located on their ticket to be entered into a Second-Chance drawing for top cash prizes or other promotional prizes. In FY11, there were 16 game-specific drawings with prizes ranging from \$5,000 up to \$1,000,000. Two of the 16 games had \$1,000,000 top-prize Second-Chance drawings.

As part of this Second-Chance drawing lineup, we brought a multi-game promotion to market in FY11 that included a total of 46 different Scratch games. Unlike most of our Second-Chance drawings, this program allowed all of our tickets to be eligible (including \$1, \$2, \$3, and \$5 tickets), giving players another opportunity to win. Enhancements

to the program created even more opportunities to win; each dollar spent equaled one point/entry into the drawing (e.g., entering a \$5 ticket awarded five points/entries). The promotion ran for three months and included 12 weekly drawings for \$500 VISA gift cards and a final drawing for \$100,000. By the end of the promotion, we had received 2,567,800 ticket entries for a total of 6,273,859 points entered by players. These were staggering numbers, we were thrilled, and our players loved it.

POWERBALL

Played in 44 jurisdictions, including Washington D.C. and the U.S. Virgin Islands, Powerball holds the distinction of being Colorado's most popular Jackpot game. Powerball jackpots are always huge and can change a person's life in an instant with a starting jackpot of \$20 million. Powerball tickets cost \$1 and are available at most Colorado retailers. For those that add the Power Play multiplier for an extra \$1 per line of play, their winnings are multiplied by up to five times the original amount (excluding jackpot). The Power Play multiplier option (2, 3, 4 or 5) is drawn before the Powerball winning numbers, and drawings happen twice a week on Wednesday and Saturday.

In FY11, the Colorado Lottery sold \$70.0 million in Powerball tickets, awarded \$33.5 million in prizes and contributed \$27.4 million to proceeds beneficiaries across the state. Sixteen Powerball jackpots were claimed in other states during FY11, the lowest of which was \$25 million in the state of Massachusetts on June 8, 2011, and the highest in Indiana for \$221.7 million on April 6, 2011. Overall, there was an average Powerball jackpot of \$100.6 million in FY11.

Although Powerball is sold in multiple states, proceeds from the sale of Powerball tickets in Colorado stay right here, helping to make our state more beautiful every day.

- We had 88 \$1,000+ winners in FY11 in Colorado (not jackpot winners).
- We had two \$1 million winners, awarded in December 2010 and May 2011.
- Since Colorado began selling Powerball in 2001, the game has generated approximately \$925 million in sales.
- More than \$351 million of Powerball sales have gone to Colorado parks, recreation, open space, conservation education and wildlife projects, key elements of Colorado's vital tourism and recreation economy.
- Colorado Powerball players have won more than \$225 million in prizes playing Powerball since it was first offered in our state in 2001.

MEGA MILLIONS

Mega Millions is another multi-state Jackpot game offered in Colorado and is played in 41 states. Mega Millions is also \$1 per play and drawings are held on Tuesday and Friday each week. The jackpot starts at \$12 million and continues to grow until there's a winner. The Megaplier option gives players a chance to multiply their winnings and win an easy \$1 million without winning the Jackpot.

In FY11, Mega Millions resulted in \$25.1 million in sales, \$12.5 million in prizes and \$8.2 million in proceeds contributions. Throughout all 41 states, there were a total of 12 jackpot winners. The lowest jackpot won in FY11 was \$25.6 million on November 9, 2010, in Ohio, and the highest jackpot was \$355 million on January 4, 2011. The high jackpot was unique because it was won by two players - one in Idaho and the other in the state of Washington. The average jackpot won over the course of the year was \$113.3 million, and in Colorado, there were a total of 47 winners at various prize levels.

Mega Millions complements Powerball (the other multi-state game offered in Colorado), and just like Powerball, proceeds from the sale of Mega Millions tickets in Colorado stay in our state.

- We had 47 \$1,000+ winners in Colorado in FY11 (not jackpot winners).
- We had 11 winners in January 2011 and the two largest Colorado jackpots were for \$1 million in August 2010 and March 2011.

LOTTO

Lotto, fondly referred to as “Colorado’s game,” celebrated its twenty-second year of play in FY11. In that time, it has created more than 392 millionaires. Lotto is Colorado’s original Jackpot game, giving people in the state the chance to become an instant millionaire with the best odds of any growing Jackpot game to win more than a million dollars. The Lotto jackpot starts at \$1 million annuity value and increases after each drawing when no ticket matches all six numbers drawn. The game has a “rolling” jackpot, one that grows with each drawing. Drawings are held on Wednesday and Saturday every week.

In FY11, Lotto saw sales of \$39.3 million and contributed \$13.4 million to our beneficiaries. Six jackpots were won over the year, averaging \$5.7 million. The lowest jackpot won was \$1.3 million and the largest jackpot reached \$11.2 million.

- There were three consecutive monthly millionaire winners: one in July 2010 for \$11.2 million, one in August 2010 for \$1.5 million and another in September 2010 for \$1.3 million.

MATCHPLAY

Introduced in FY10, MatchPlay is one of the newer games for the Colorado Lottery. With a \$2 price point, players get three lines of numbers per play – a slightly different play style than our other Jackpot games. Each line is an opportunity to win the jackpot and the numbers matched on all lines can also be added up to win a prize. Jackpots start at \$100,000 and grow until they are hit on the game’s drawing days – Tuesday and Friday.

In FY11, six total jackpots were hit. The average jackpot won was \$356,888, the largest jackpot was \$635,874, and the lowest was \$100,000.

- We had 101 winners (not jackpot winners).
- Matchplay had back-to-back jackpot winners in the month of January. One player won \$635,924 on January 20, and one week later we had another player win a starting jackpot of \$100,000.
- In October of 2010, there were eleven winners and nine in January of 2011.

With drawings seven nights a week, you'd expect Cash 5 to be a lucky game, and indeed it is. Since we started selling the game in 1996, Cash 5 has given players the chance to win \$20,000 every night of the week, creating more winners than any other Jackpot game. For only \$1 per play, players can pick 5 numbers out of 32, play multiple drawings, and purchase up to 13 weeks (91 draws) in advance. Players love Cash 5 because it's easy to play and gives them immediate results that they can check daily!

- We had 97 \$20,000 winners in FY11.
- February was the luckiest month, with 14 jackpots hit.
- We averaged 8.1 jackpots each month.
- Cash 5 generated \$19.2 million in sales and \$6.1 million for our beneficiaries.

MILLIONAIRE RAFFLE

During FY11, the Lottery offered two versions of a raffle game. Our first game, called "Millionaire Raffle," kicked off September 19, 2010, and ran until December 31, 2010. The price of each Raffle ticket was \$20, each containing a single six-digit Raffle number. Only 280,000 tickets were available, each offering a shot at one of the 509 exciting prizes available.

BONUS MILLIONAIRE RAFFLE

The second raffle game was similar to the first in that each ticket was \$20, ran for three months, and had 280,000 tickets available. However, Bonus Millionaire Raffle offered even more prizes to our players. We conducted four bonus drawings throughout the duration of the game, each generating ten lucky winners of \$2,000 each (40 total winners for the bonus drawings alone). Overall, we awarded 613 players with Bonus Millionaire Raffle prizes.

PROCEEDS BENEFICIARIES

Every person in Colorado is a Lottery winner. That's because proceeds from Lottery sales are used to create, improve and preserve parks, recreational facilities, open space, trails and wildlife in every community across the state. The profits from the Lottery have created or enhanced more than 1,000 community parks, provided wildlife education for more than half a million children, built or maintained more than 700 miles of hiking and biking trails and protected more than 810,000 acres of beautiful Colorado wilderness. Since we began in 1983, we've returned more than \$2.3 billion (make that \$2,327,139,548 to be exact) to the people of Colorado. In FY11, \$113.4 million was returned to Colorado for projects across the state. The recipients were:

GREAT OUTDOORS COLORADO TRUST FUND (GOCO)

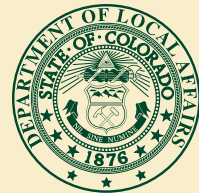

Great Outdoors Colorado gives money to projects that impact communities across the state. Lottery proceeds have helped preserve, protect, enhance and manage Colorado's wildlife, park, river, trail and open-space heritage. The Colorado Lottery is GOCO's only funding source, and gives GOCO 50% of proceeds, up to a \$35 million cap in 1992 dollars, adjusted for inflation. If this percentage exceeds the adjusted cap, the remainder goes to under-funded public school districts to address facility safety issues. In FY11, the distribution to GOCO was \$56.0 million.

DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS (DOLA), ADMINISTRATION OF CONSERVATION TRUST FUND (CTF)

Local parks and recreation providers receive money from the Department of Local Affairs-Administration of Conservation Trust Fund in proportion to their population. Every town, city, county and qualifying special district in Colorado benefits from Lottery funds. We distributed more than \$45.3 million through the fund in FY11 for open space and land acquisition, equipment purchases, facility development, park maintenance and renovation of local facilities.

Colorado's 42 state parks use Lottery money for trail construction and maintenance, land acquisition, equipment and facility purchases and maintenance of state parks facilities. The Lottery improves the state park experience for more than 12 million annual visitors. In FY11, \$11.3 million was distributed directly to state parks.

PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION ASSISTANCE FUND (CCA) – BUILDING EXCELLENT SCHOOLS TODAY (BEST) PROGRAM

Any proceeds money beyond the GOCO cap is directed to the Colorado Department of Education's Public School Capital Construction Assistance Fund-Building Excellent Schools Today Program and is used to address health and safety issues in public schools. In FY11, \$662,230 was distributed to improve conditions in Colorado's under-funded schools.

BENEFICIARY SUCCESSES OF FY11

GREAT OUTDOORS COLORADO (GOCO)

In FY11, the Great Outdoors Colorado Board awarded \$52.9 million in Lottery funds for 189 projects in 51 counties. Projects preserve land, including wildlife habitat, provide new and enhanced community outdoor recreation areas, protect wildlife species, improve existing facilities at state and local parks and expand the state's trail system. Included in the total amount GOCO awarded in FY11 is a \$1 million grant to the Colorado Youth Corps Association that created 400 land stewardship jobs statewide for youth and young adults at no cost to taxpayers. Because of the GOCO/Lottery grant, youth corps crews are working to maintain and help develop trails, parks, open space and wildlife habitat projects throughout Colorado.

GOCO GRANTS AWARDED IN FY11 HELPED TO:

- Protect more than 20,680 acres of open space in perpetuity, including land along river corridors and in mountain valleys, land for wildlife habitat, agricultural land, and land in urban areas.
- Create or enhance 54 community parks and outdoor recreation areas including skateparks, ball fields and playgrounds. Fifteen of these grants were to small communities to assist them with projects costing \$60,000 or less.
- Construct, maintain, plan and design trails throughout the state by helping to fund 10 trail projects through GOCO's continued partnership with the Colorado State Trails Program.
- Create 400 outdoor land stewardship jobs throughout Colorado for youth and young adults at no cost to taxpayers through a \$1 million grant to the Colorado Youth Corps Association.
- Support Colorado wildlife by funding 14 projects for non-game species, habitat protection and opportunities for Coloradans to watch and learn about the state's vast wildlife.
- Support Colorado's state parks by funding 45 projects to enhance facilities, provide quality experiences for visitors, and expand environmental education opportunities.
- Advance 17 efforts that help communities produce plans to protect and enhance open space, wildlife habitat and parks.

DEPARTMENT OF LOCAL AFFAIRS (DOLA), ADMINISTRATION OF CONSERVATION TRUST FUND (CTF)

- A total of \$43,721,135 was distributed, with a per capita amount of \$8.70.
- 466 local governments received Department of Local Affairs (DOLA), Administration of Conservation Trust Funds (CTF).
- 100% of the entities were reviewed for compliance during the year, based on staff review of status and spending reports.
- 32 local governments were randomly selected for an in-depth review.
- A total of 61 projects were reviewed for compliance, totaling \$1,201,390 worth of Department of Local Affairs (DOLA), Administration of Conservation Trust Funds (CTF) expenditures.

COLORADO PARKS AND WILDLIFE

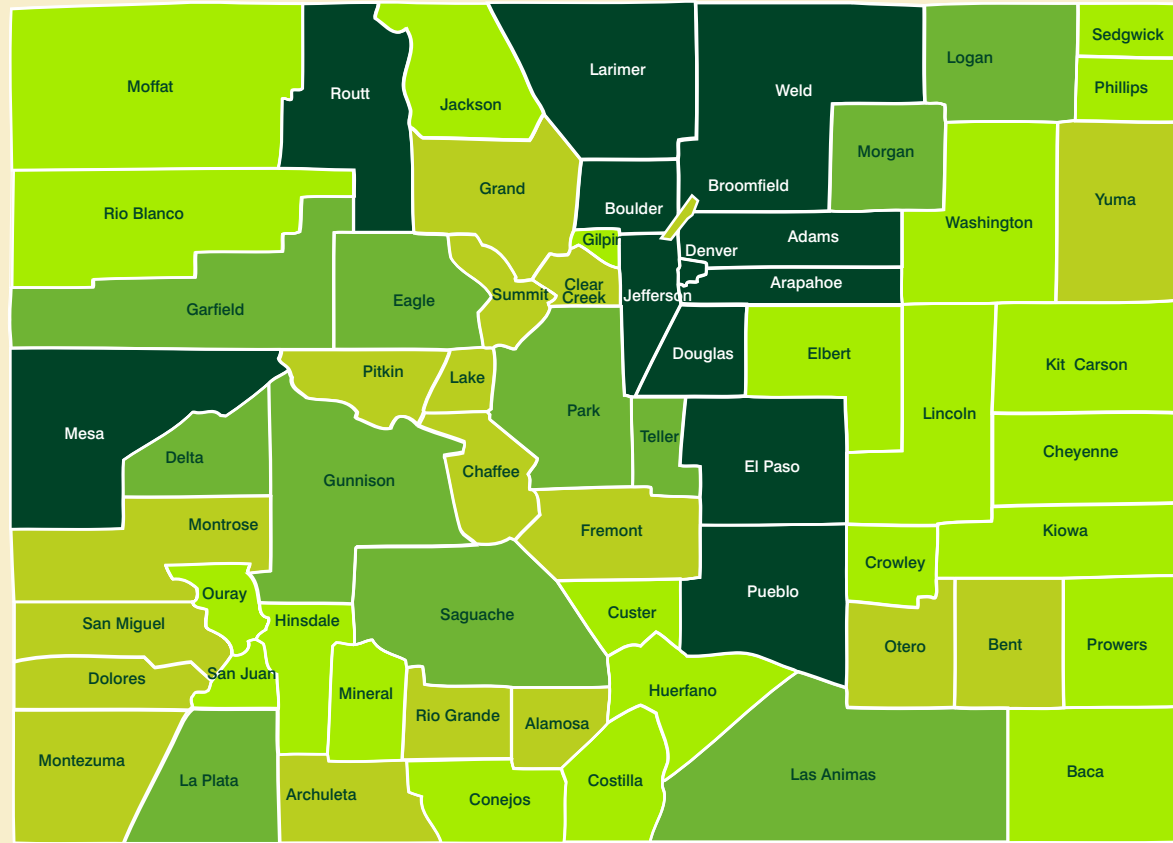
- Safe drinking water at Lake Pueblo State Park is available to all the facilities in the park including the visitor center, two marinas, restrooms, campgrounds and camper services. Lake Pueblo State Park also benefitted from other improvements at the park, and a retro-fit of existing facilities to increase accessibility to the public facilities such as an ADA accessible campsite, picnic area and playground. A total of \$4.6 million in Lottery funding has aided in making this park one of the most loved parks in the state system.
- The Hecla Junction boat ramp at Arkansas Headwaters Recreational Area is one of the busiest boat ramps in the nation that serves whitewater rafters. In addition, drainage sediment into the Arkansas River was depleting fishing habitat and degrading the natural environment downstream. This Lottery - funded project (\$28,207) dramatically improved the circulation for the hundreds of large vehicle raft takeouts per day and mitigated the sediment discharge while diminishing future flood damage.
- Visitors will soon be able to explore additional opportunities for fishing and boating at St. Vrain State Park. The Blue Heron water delivery system (\$700,000) at the park will enable water owned by the division to be transferred into the Blue Heron reservoir. Once filled, this new lake will greatly expand the acreage of surface water within the park.
- Golden Gate State Park, nestled in the foothills of Denver and enjoyed by half a million visitors, needed some upgrades to its campground water treatment system. The new facility (\$1.6 million) will allow the thousands of annual campers who visit Reverend's Ridge Campground to continue to have hot showers, flushing toilets and laundry facilities. Keeping the campground open with the amenities visitors have come to expect is an important factor in generating \$288,000 in annual camping reservations that contributed to the park's bottom line.

PUBLIC SCHOOL CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION COLORADO ASSISTANCE FUND (CCA) – BUILDING EXCELLENT SCHOOLS TODAY (BEST) PROGRAM

Since Colorado school districts started receiving money from this program, spillover funds from the Colorado Lottery, along with Colorado Department of Education grants and matching district funds, have assisted with funding capital construction projects around the state. In 2008, the CCA modified its funding model and developed the Building Excellent Schools Today (BEST) program. With no new taxes, the BEST program leverages proceeds from the School Trust Lands and additional Lottery proceeds to raise capital that assists in the repair of hundreds of existing schools and the construction of many new ones. Over fiscal years 2009-2011, the Colorado Lottery has contributed \$6.3 million, and last year alone, the Lottery distributed \$662,230 to this project. Two hundred twenty-six schools throughout the state have been impacted through the BEST program through July 2011.

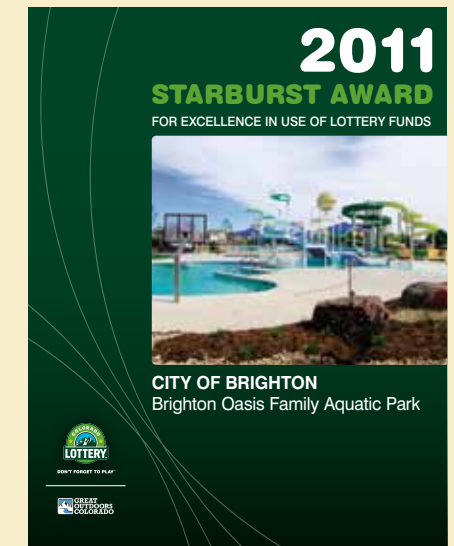
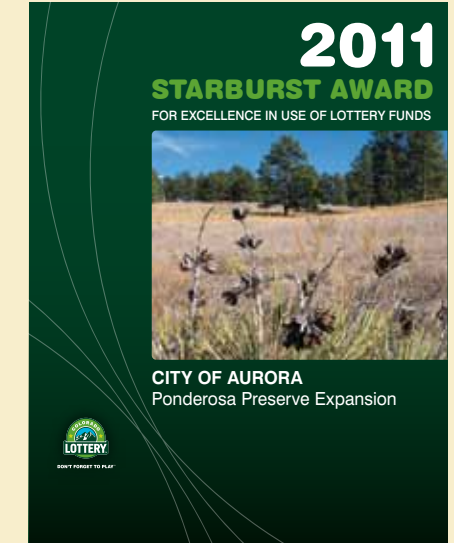
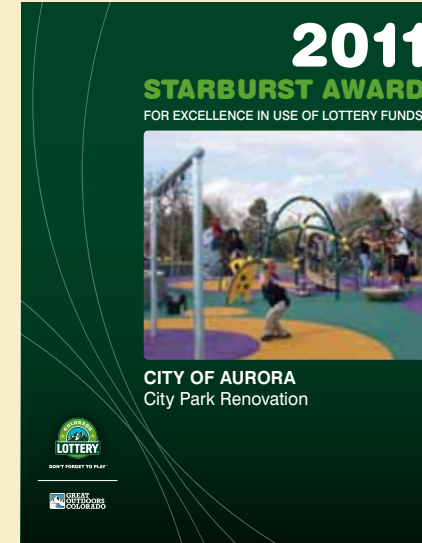
MAP OF COLORADO COUNTIES

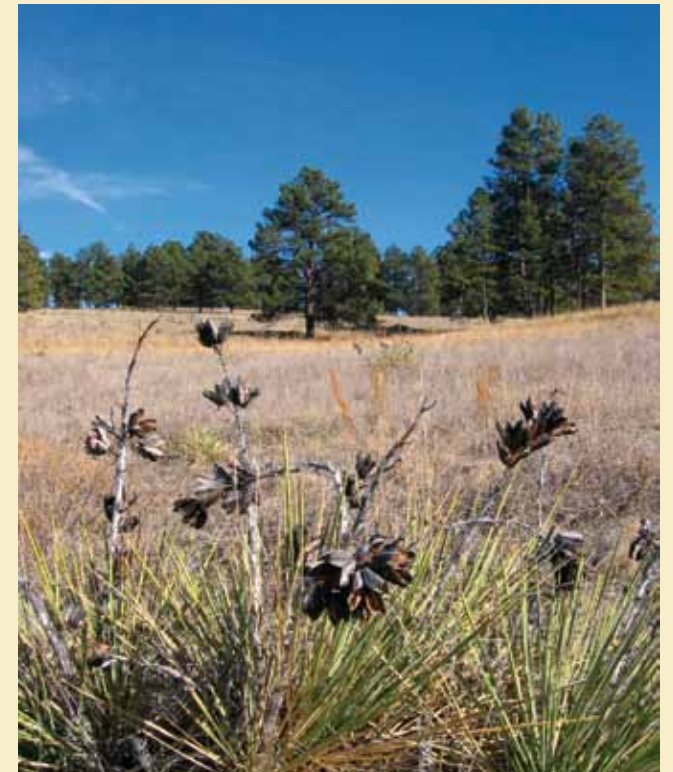

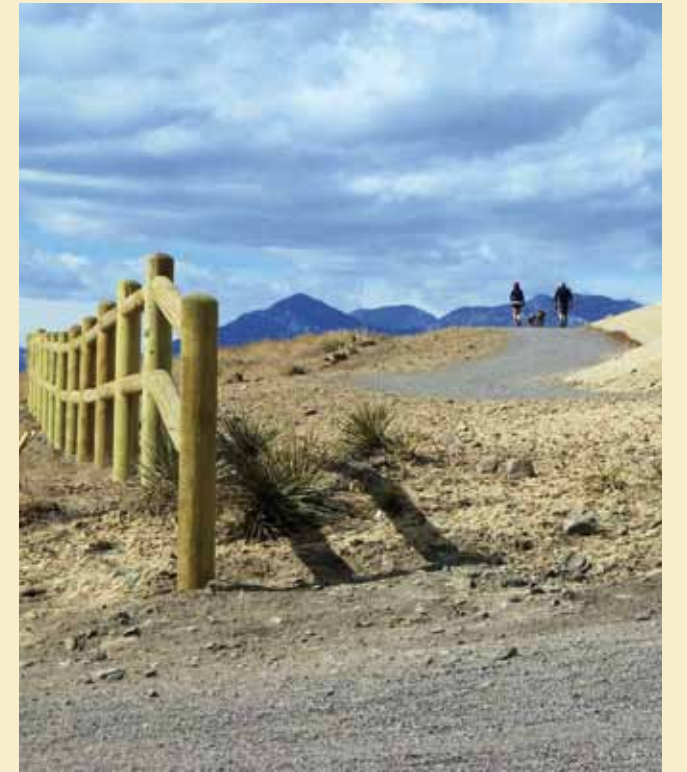

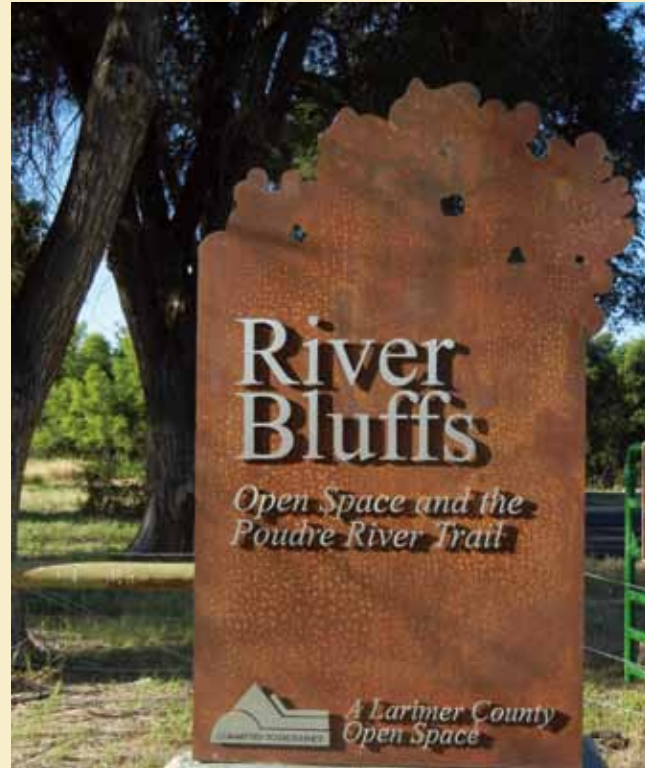

Independent Auditor's Report

Members of the Legislative Audit Committee

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of the major fund and remaining fund information of the Colorado Lottery, an enterprise fund and private purpose fund of the State of Colorado as of and for the years ended June 30, 2011 and 2010, which collectively comprise the Colorado Lottery's basic financial statements as listed in the table of contents. These financial statements are the responsibility of the Colorado Lottery's management. Our responsibility is to express opinions on these financial statements based on our audits.

We conducted our audits in accordance with auditing standards generally accepted in the United States of America and the standards applicable to financial audits contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States. Those standards require that we plan and perform the audits to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free of material misstatement. An audit includes examining, on a test basis, evidence supporting the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. An audit also includes assessing the accounting principles used and significant estimates made by management, as well as evaluating the overall financial statement presentation. We believe that our audits provide a reasonable basis for our opinions.

As discussed in Note 1 – Nature of Operations and Summary of Significant Accounting Policies, the financial statements of the Colorado Lottery are intended to present the financial position and the changes in financial position and, where applicable, cash flows for only that portion of the financial reporting entity, the State of Colorado, that is attributable to the transactions of the Colorado Lottery. They do not purport to, and do not, present fairly the financial position of the State of Colorado as of June 30, 2011 and 2010, and the changes in its financial position, or, where applicable, its cash flows, for the years then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

In our opinion, the financial statements referred to above present fairly, in all material respects, the respective financial position of the major fund and remaining fund information of the Colorado Lottery as of June 30, 2011 and 2010, and the respective changes in financial position and cash flows, where applicable, thereof for the years then ended in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

Our audits were conducted for the purpose of forming opinions on the financial statements that collectively comprise the Colorado Lottery's basic financial statements. The accompanying supplementary information as listed in the table of contents is presented for purposes of additional analysis and is not a required part of the financial statements. Such information has been subjected to the auditing procedures applied in the audit of the basic financial statements and, in our opinion, is fairly stated, in all material respects, in relation to the financial statements taken as a whole.
