State Treasurer and Members of the Colorado Lottery Commission:

Pursuant to CRS 24-35-204, the Colorado Lottery is required to furnish monthly "a complete statement of lottery revenues, prize disbursements and other expenses."

The financial performance for the two quarters ended December 31, 2010 depicts total revenues of \$253.5 million, which includes gross ticket sales of \$253.0 million. Net income before proceeds distributions is \$59.3 million with an increase in net assets of \$0.5 million. Accordingly, a total of \$58.8 million in distributions will have been made by March 1, 2010 in the following manner; \$29.4 million to the Great Outdoors Colorado Fund, \$5.9 million to the Division of Parks and Outdoor Recreation, \$23.5 million to the Conservation Trust Fund, for distribution to cities and other local government agencies.

The attached financial statements for the two quarters ended December 31, 2010 have not been audited. They have been prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, using established accounting and internal control procedures. These procedures include, but are not limited to, documentation and accounting estimates, which support the production of reliable financial statements. As with any system of accounting and internal control procedures, there are inherent limitations, and the procedures cannot be relied upon to completely eliminate the occurrence of discrepancies, error or omissions, but should reduce that risk to a relatively low tolerable level.




