

Annual Report to the House and Senate Judiciary Committees January 29, 2010

Fiscal Year 2009 (FY09) was the second year in which SB318 funds were available. The Legislature appropriated 2.2 million dollars, which was allocated to the districts based on a formula that took into account the number of drug offense filings and population. Each judicial district received a minimum of \$25,000 to implement project plans developed by their local Drug Offender Treatment Board, members of which are located in Attachment A. Attachment B includes the formula for distribution of the funds.


As seen in Attachment C, the districts expended 91% of the fund, a total of \$1,802,313.64, in FY09. There were a total of 2,311 treatment admissions through SB318 funded services. Drug Court clients, adult and juvenile, made up 16.9% (391) of all new admissions. Figure 1 displays new client admissions for FY09. Of new admissions, 88.8% (2,053) of services were rendered to adults and 11.2% (258) to juveniles. For adult admissions, 74.6% (1,531) were male and 25.4% (522) were female; whereas, 81.4% (210) of juveniles receiving services were male and 18.6% (48) were female.

Success rates by group are displayed in Figure 2. For all groups, except juvenile males, over 84% of clients completed their treatment episode successfully. Adult males had the best success rate (88.4%) with 1,184 of 1,339 successfully completing treatment. Juvenile and adult females had the next best rates at 85.7% and 84.2%, respectively. Although juvenile males did not fare as well, the majority of them still completed their treatment successfully. Of the 150 juvenile male terminations, 83 of them, or 55.3%, completed their enrollment successfully.

Successful Treatment Completion Rates


Figure 3 displays the breakdown of the 1,902 treatment completions this year. Drug Court clients, adult and juvenile, made up 12.4% (201 not pictured) of all successful completions. Of all completions, 84.9% (1,615) were successful. Within the successful completions, 93.4% (1,508) were adult and 6.6% (107) were juvenile. The adult successes consisted of 78.5% (1,184) male and 21.5% (324) female clients. The juvenile successes included 77.6% (83) male clients and 22.4% (24) female.

As seen in Figure 3, of the total completions, 15.1% (287) were unsuccessful. Within the category of unsuccessful discharges, 75.3% (216) of the clients were adults and 24.7% (71) were juveniles. Of the unsuccessful adults, 71.8% (155) were male and 28.2% (61) female. In contrast, 94.4% (67) of the unsuccessful juveniles were male and 5.6% (4) were female.

In addition to all the treatment completions this year, another 409 clients, who were counted as new admissions, remained in treatment at the end of the fiscal year. In other words, there were 2,311 new admissions, of which 1,902 completed treatment and 409 remained in treatment.

Regarding type of treatment, weekly outpatient was used more than any other treatment type. A total of 63.6% of all new admissions accessed weekly outpatient treatment with SB318 funds, while intensive residential, enhanced outpatient, and intensive outpatient treatment were accessed the most by the remaining 36.4% of the new admissions. A small percentage of clients (40 of 2,311) utilized SB318 funding to enroll in therapeutic communities or transitional residential placements.

It should be noted that 1,326 more offenders in FY09 accessed services via SB318 funds than in the previous year. In addition, 1,605 more offenders completed treatment in FY09 than in FY08. In sum, 2,311 adult and juvenile offenders received treatment that they may not have been able to access without the availability of SB318 funds.

Lastly, as required by statute, Attachment D includes all agencies that received funds from SB318, as well as the amount and the target population, detailed on the Report to the ITFT and Judiciary Committees form.
