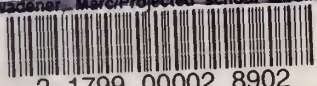

To His Excellency,  
JULIUS C. GUNTER,

Esteemed Sir: In presenting to you my biennial report for the years 1917 and 1918 I desire to briefly call your attention to some of the needs of the office and the reasons therefor.

In the first place, it is absolutely necessary that more room be provided for the transaction of business in this department. During the biennial period of 1915 and 1916 the grand total receipts of the office were \$613,775.13. The grand total during the biennial period of 1917 and 1918 was \$1,224,594.61—double the previous two years. This will give you an idea of the rapid growth of the business in this department.

The motor vehicle bureau is showing such decided growth that new legislation for its control is imperative. For this reason I have prepared an enactment for presentation to the legislature. This proposed new law is based on what I consider the best features of the best laws in the other states. I will take pleasure in transmitting a copy of same within the next few days. During the 1915 and 1916 biennial period, the total collections in the motor vehicle department were \$320,096.00. During the biennial period just closed, the total receipts were \$673,142.00—or more than double the previous two years.

The receipts in the flat tax or annual corporation license tax department totaled \$85,994.00 for the 1915 and 1916 period. During the years 1917 and 1918 I collected in revenues from this source \$245,836.00; other bureaus in the department of Secretary of State have shown marked increases.

It would be a waste of your valuable time for me to go into the matter of the increased cost of living during the past two years. This is merely to call your attention therefore to the relatively small salaries paid to the employees in this department. I therefore earnestly urge and request your aid in having these salaries adjusted to an equitable basis.

There is an almost universal demand for an equitable corporation law that will give protection to the investor and to honest capital alike. I have had prepared a so-called "Blue Sky" law which I think will meet all demands. This proposed measure has been carefully scrutinized by leading attorneys and by many experts. I will take pleasure in transmitting a copy of same to you within a few days. With highest personal regards,

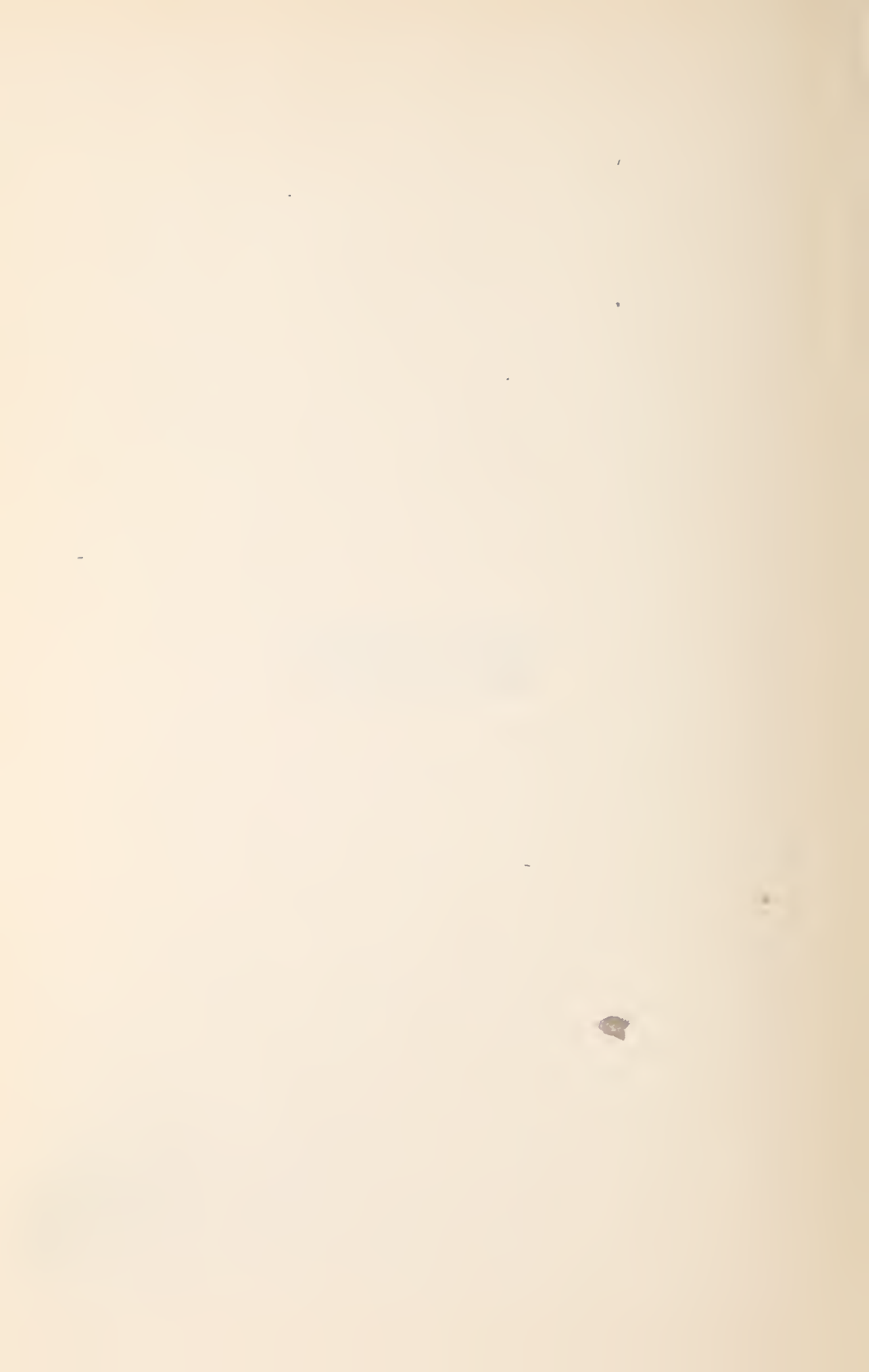
