Under Colorado Law, children under the age of 16 are required to be in safety seats when riding in a motor vehicle. In addition, drivers and front seat passengers must wear safety belts.

County Roads often provide access to communities, and to scenic and recreation areas. Motorists planning travel in remote areas, particularly on unpaved roads like the one over Cottonwood Pass west of Buena Vista, are advised to make local inquiry concerning road conditions. On the state highway system, U.S. 34 (Trail Ridge Road) in Rocky Mountain National Park is closed in winter as S.H. 82 east of Aspen over Independence Pass.

Snow Tires or Chains frequently are required for use during winter storms or when roads are icy or snow covered. FOUR WHEEL DRIVE VEHICLES with adequate tires for the existing conditions also are acceptable. Colorado State Patrol troopers, highway maintenance personnel or regulate signs may inform motorists when these requirements are in effect. Transportation Department SNOWPLOWs now display BLUE LIGHTS in addition to amber lights.
