Alpine Loop Back Country Byway - Connecting the towns of Lake City, Ouray, and Silverton. PORTIONS OF THIS ROUTE REQUIRE FOUR-WHEEL-DRIVE VEHICLES.

Cache la Poudre-North Park Byway - Between the historic towns of Fort Collins and Walden.

Colorado River Headwaters Byway - Between Rocky Mountain National Park and State Bridge via Granby and Kremmling.

Flat Tops Trail - Connects the towns of Yampa and Meeker.

Frontier Pathways - Between the city of Pueblo and the towns of Westcliffe and Colorado City.

Gold Belt Tour - Between Florissant, Cripple Creek, Victor, Florence and Carion City. PORTIONS OF THIS ROUTE REQUIRE FOUR-WHEEL-DRIVE VEHICLES.

Grand Mesa Byway - Between I-70 and Cedaredge.

Guanella Pass Byway - Between the historic towns of Georgetown and Grant.

Highway of Legends - Linking Trinidad, La Veta, and Walsenburg.

Los Caminos Antiguos - Between Cumbres Pass and the city of Alamosa via Antonito, San Luis, and Great Sand Dunes National Monument.

Mount Evans Byway - Extends from Idaho Springs to the summit of Mount Evans.

Pawnee Pioneer Trails - Between the towns of Sterling, Fort Morgan, Grover, and Ault.

Peak to Peak Byway - Between Estes Park and Black Hawk.

San Juan Skyway - Connects the communities of Durango, Ridgway, Telluride, and Cortez.

Santa Fe Trail - Between the Kansas state line near Holly and the New Mexico state line at Raton Pass.

Silver Thread Byway - Stretching from South Fork to Lake City.

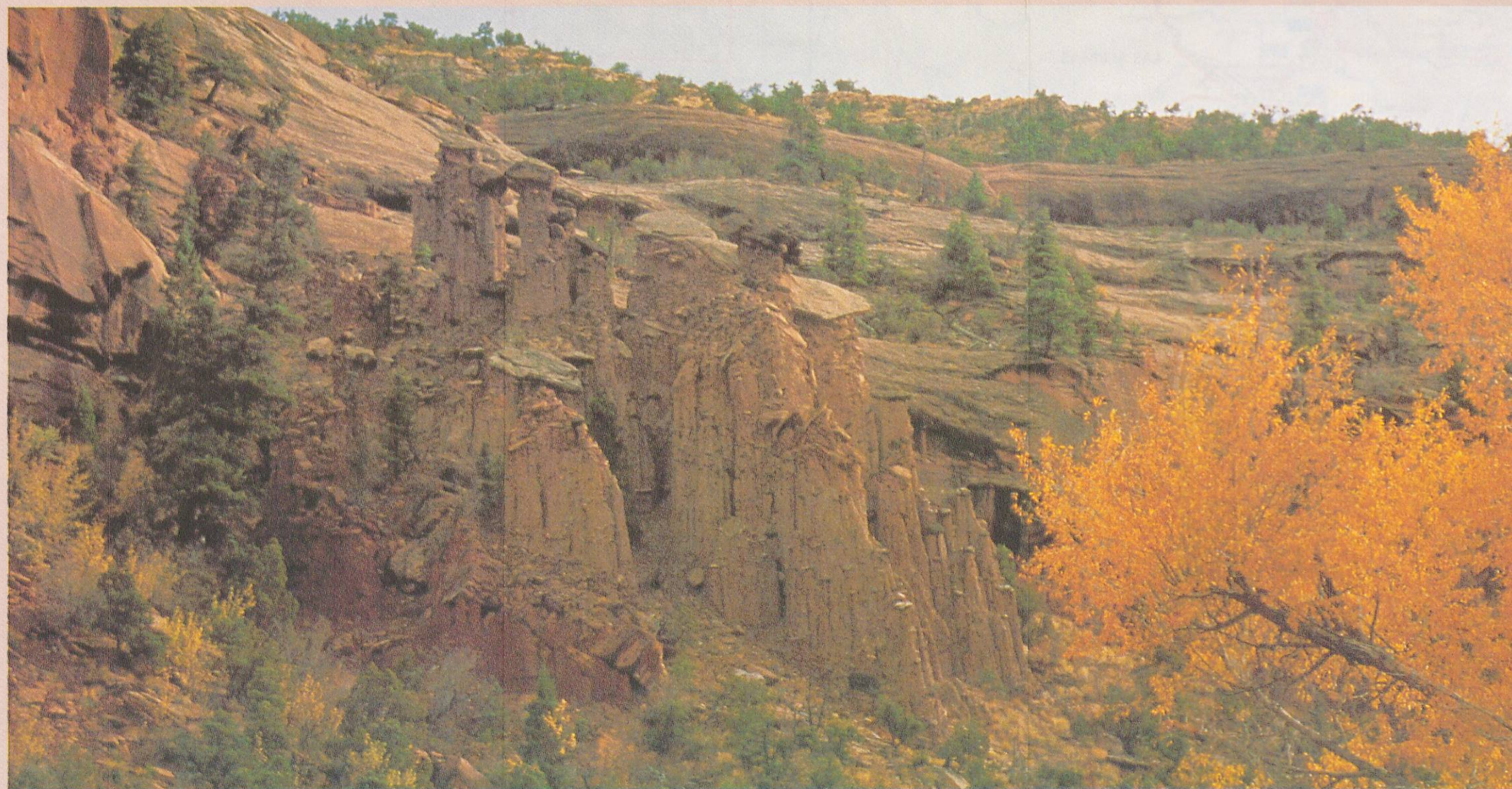
South Platte River Trail - Travels between Julesburg and Ovid.

Top of the Rockies - Connecting Leadville, Minturn, Twin Lakes, and the Copper Mountain Resort.

Trail of the Ancients - Connecting the Utah state line near Hovenweep and the Four Corners through the city of Cortez.

Unawep/Tabeguache Byway - Between Whitewater and Platteville.

West Elk Loop - Between Carbondale, Hotchkiss, Gunnison, and Crested Butte.

NATIONAL PARKS AND MONUMENTS

Bent's Old Fort - Reconstructed, after careful archeological research, 1830s fur-trading fort, built by the Bent brothers. It was a major commercial stop along the historic Santa Fe Trail. The fort has been refurbished with period reproductions, antiques, and artifacts excavated at the fort. ----- L-23

Black Canyon of the Gunnison National Monument - This is one of the most spectacular, steep-walled canyons in North America with a 2,000 foot chasm cut by the Gunnison River over a span of two million years. ----- J-6

Colorado National Monument - The forces of nature have sculpted this land filled with sheer-walled canyons, magnificent monoliths, and uniquely shaped spires and columns. ----- H-2

Curecanti National Recreation Area - Over 60 miles long, this area includes Blue Mesa Reservoir (the largest body of water in Colorado) and two other lakes. ----- K-8

Dinosaur National Monument - The 211,085 acres of the monument offer some of the best sandstone canyon scenery, along with a world-famous fossil quarry. ----- B-1

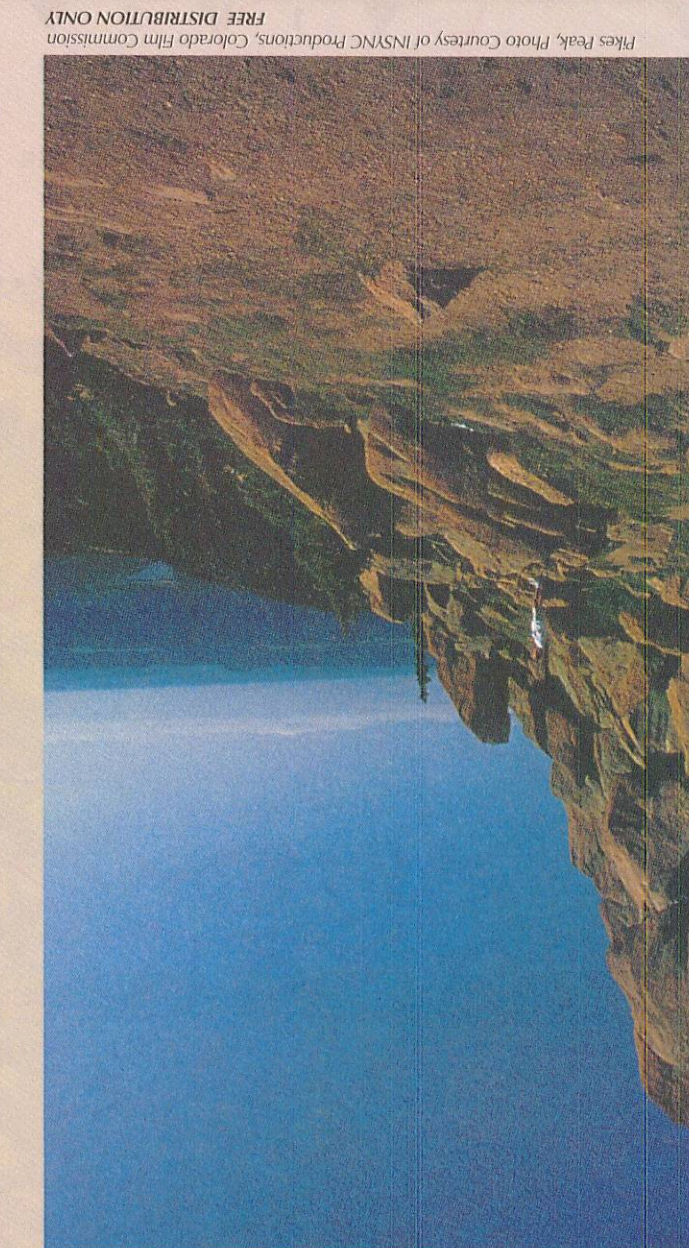
Florissant Fossil Beds National Monument - A massive volcanic eruption 35 million years ago buried a large lake and the surrounding countryside, preserving some of America's finest insect, plant, and fish fossils. Large fossil tree trunks and stumps have also been preserved here. ----- I-16

Great Sand Dunes National Monument - Covering more than 565 square miles, the monument has towering mountains of sand more than 1,000 feet high. ----- N-14

Hovenweep National Monument - Unique stone masonry towers line canyon heads within the six separate and remote clusters of dwellings built at the climax of the Pueblo Indian culture nine hundred years ago. ----- O-1

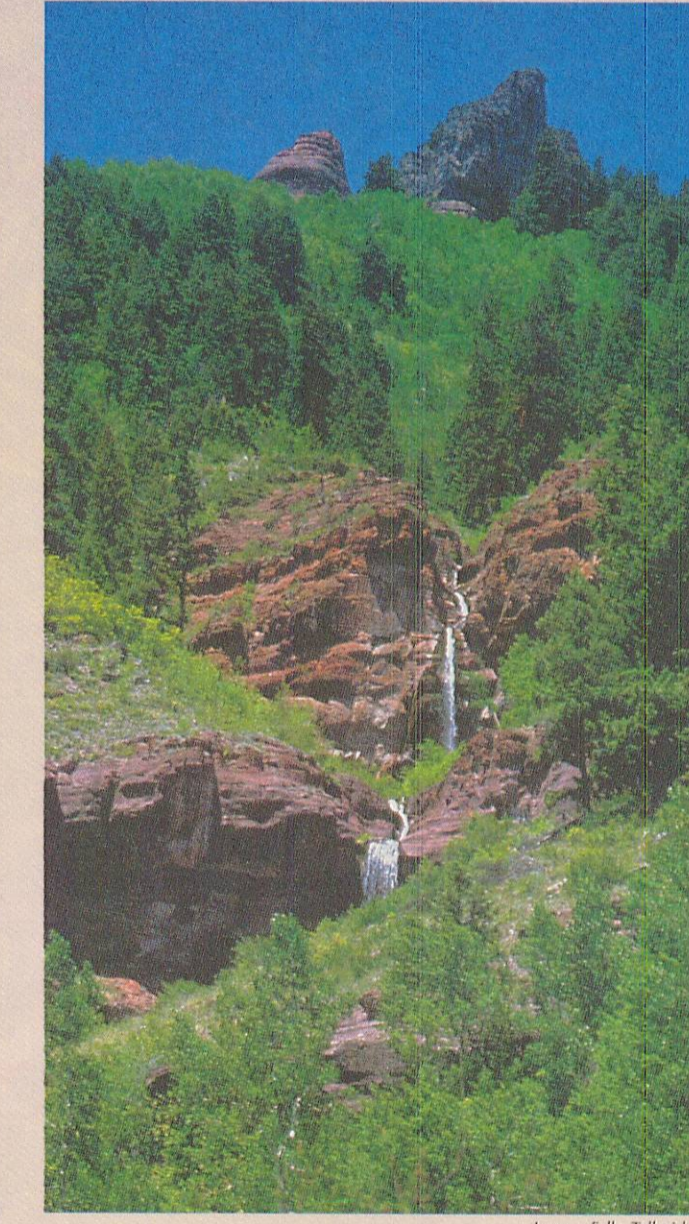
Mesa Verde National Park - The 52,000 acre park contains over 4,000 archeological sites, some dating back thousands of years. More than 600 cliff dwellings line the canyon walls. There are five walking tours open to the public. ----- P-3

Rocky Mountain National Park - Colorado's largest national park has streams, valleys and mountain lakes, 113 peaks more than 10,000 feet above sea level, and 78 peaks over 12,000 feet above sea level. ----- C-14

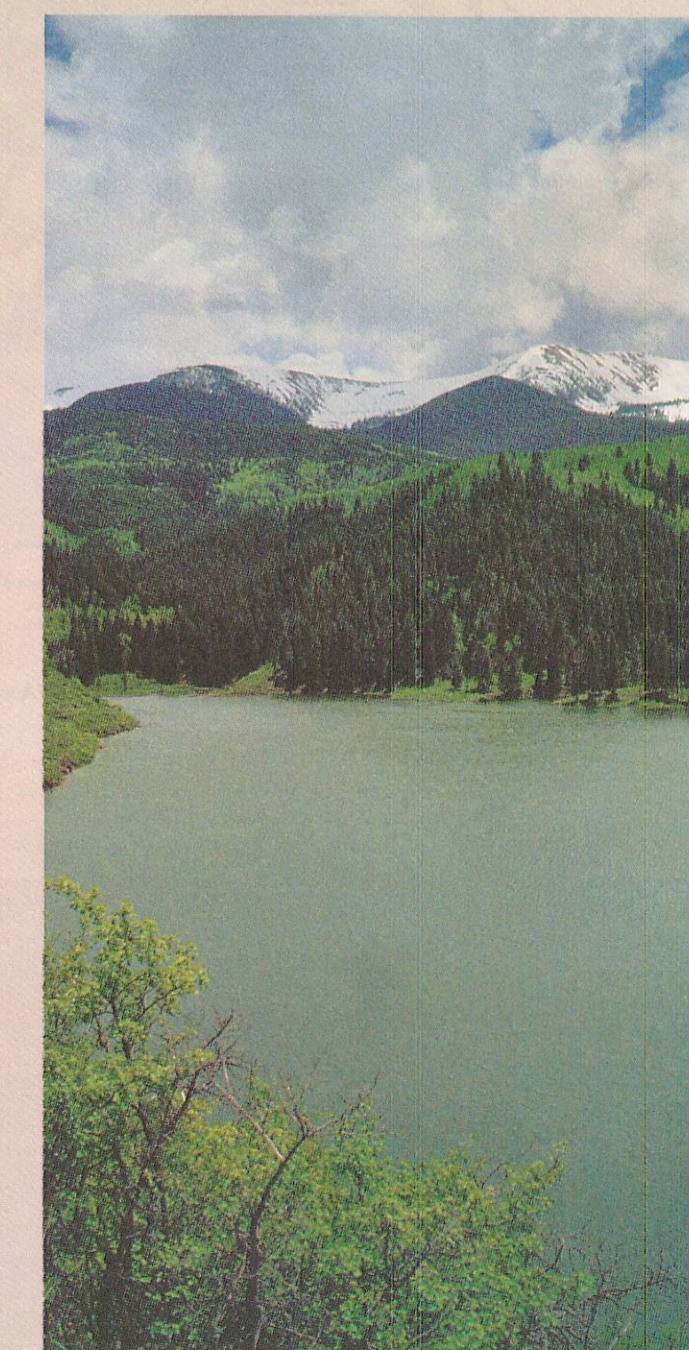


COLORADO STATE MAP
