The project scope consists of the Colorado Department of Transportation, Region One (CDOT) performing design and construction work for Comprehensive Environmental Response, Compensation and Liability Act (CERCLA) remediation on behalf of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment (CDPHE).

To maximize efficiencies, CDPHE anticipates it will have CDOT bid and construct the mine drainage pipeline, prepare the treatment site, and run utilities to the site. With regard to the North Clear Creek improvements, CDPHE anticipates it would contribute construction funds to assist with improvements, relocation, and reconstruction of the channel. Improvements would include removal and disposal of mine waste from the site per CDPHE recommendations. CDPHE understands such construction would be performed by CDOT and its hired (subcontracted) construction firm(s). The budget for CDPHE participation in project costs is up to \$4,800,000.

Supplemental Statewide Cost Allocation Plan (SSWCAP)

 \$246,006 – Interagency Transfer (IT) of state highway funds (TCCRF) to the State Controller's Non-Operating account for ARRA indirect cost recovery, per the SSWCAP agreed upon amounts. (1000068814/69025)

ARRA authorized states to use up to .5% of ARRA money to pay for indirect costs they incur due to the need to meet ARRA reporting and accounting requirements. Since the State Controller decided to assess state agencies for their shares of these costs "up front" and CDOT only receives its ARRA funds on a reimbursement basis, the Department elected to pay its ARRA indirect costs from the State Highway Fund and leave all ARRA funds available for projects.

Since ARRA implementation was primarily done using existing resources (as a result of hiring freeze and lack of up front funding from the ARRA), the actual total costs incurred for statewide indirect expenses have not in total increased. Consequently the regular SWCAP allocation amount will be adjusted proportionally by the ARRA allocation in FY10, FY11 and FY12. The Department should expect approximately \$246,006 credit (\$738,019/3) in the regular SWCAP that is based on actual cost starting with FY10 the reconciliation is completed.

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Statewide

Discussion of adjustment to damage claim process and analysis to-date.

<u>Damage Claims</u> occur when a "Third Party" (a <u>Non-CDOT</u> or person or contracted entity such as private citizen or company) damages CDOT property. The claim for reimbursement of expenses for loss, repair and/or replacement is made against the third party and/or their insurance company. A detailed report from the CDOT Accounting unit addresses these incidents and funds for review and action in the supplemental process. (1000068805/69026)

• \$480,000 – Transportation Commission Contingency Reserve (TCCRF) funds – Emergency Repairs on I-70 in Glenwood Canyon - Damage to the roadway and structures and the need for additional work for rock fall mitigation have increased the overall cost of this project. Specifically: The majority of the additional work is for the draped rockfall mesh that was added by CMO following an incident with a vehicle after the original rockfall. The worksite turned out to be much more vulnerable to additional rockfall than it was during mitigation work performed after the 2004 project, and more precast portable has been utilized, as well as more resets of the portable precast to keep workers and the traveling public safe. The damage to the steel bridge girder was also more extensive than originally estimated in the limited time in which the initial estimate was performed. In addition to the new funding request, the region requests to transfer \$500,000 of savings from the cleanup phase to partially cover \$200,000 of the additional construction work as well as to fund a \$300,000 design study for the permanent repair project.
