SUBJECT: Addition to R2 FY 17 Maintenance MLOS Budget- \$250,000 Contingency Funds.

#### **Purpose**

After the Junkins Fire in Custer County, 10 miles of fence that borders SH 165 were burned. Risk Management will cover half of the \$500,000 cost to replace the fence. The remaining request is for \$250,000 Transportation Commission Contingency Reserve funds to complete the cost for construction of 10 miles of fire damaged fence in FY 17.

#### Background

On October 17<sup>th</sup> 2016 the Junkins Fire started in Custer County. It quickly spread to Pueblo and Fremont counties. During the course of the fire, CDOT incurred several miles of damage to the ROW fence. The existing fence is built over 30 years ago with wood posts that were damaged. The integrity was compromised due to extreme heat. Currently no livestock is being contained behind the fence due to the season, starting sometime in April or early May 2017 livestock will be returned to the summer grazing area.

Per CRS 35-46-111, (1) (a) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection (1) and subsection (4) of this section, it is the duty of the department of transportation to maintain right-of-way fence constructed as of June 1, 1994.

While Risk Management is covering \$250,000 the addition this request for additional funding will allow removal and replacement of all fence on State Highway 165 mile post 1 to 8, Northbound (Eastside) of the highway and mile marker 5 to 7 on Southbound (Westside) of the highway.

#### Options:

- 1. Fund the remaining cost of the ROW fence \$250,000 from Transportation Commission Contingency (staff recommendation)
- 2. Region 2 fund the remainder from the MLOS budget which will cause elimination of other fencing or maintenance.
