\$1,174,594— Sheridan Resurfacing Hampden to Arizona- Surface Treatment Program-This project will be for curb ramp replacement and paving operations on Sheridan Blvd between Hampden and Arizona. Staff is requesting additional funding in order to award this project. The increase to the budget is due to night work and limits imposed on night time milling with noise restrictions in the City of Denver. These restrictions caused bids to come in higher than originally anticipated. (19644)

RAMP

Region 3

\$1,897,109 – Glenwood Canyon Variable Speed Limit Signing – RAMP

Operations- Request to utilize RAMP Operations Contingency funds to re-initiate previously shelved RAMP project. The project was previously shelved in order to move forward with a separate RAMP Operations project due to increased cost estimate. Additional funds from RAMP Operations, ITS, and Highway Safety Improvement Program funds for total project cost of \$4,800,000.

Per PD703.0 this project is being brought to the Commission as it requires RAMP funds from the RAMP contingency pool. If there are bid savings upon award, the additional RAMP funds are to be returned to the RAMP contingency fund. Refer to the Program Management Office informational memo.

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Transportation Commission Contingency Reserve

Division of Highway Maintenance (DHM)

\$747,000 – Staff is requesting a transfer from the *Transportation Commission*Contingency for Snow and Ice to the Durango, Alamosa maintenance sections along with the Durango Traffic sections. DHM is projecting a shortfall of \$2.4M if Maintenance continues to spend snow removal funds at the current rate. DHM is requesting 60% of the projected shortfall amount be transferred to keep these maintenance and traffic sections solvent for the winter season. (PST-TCS-17)

Region 3

\$1,500,000 – **Frost Heave Remediation on Vail Pass** – Staff is requesting a transfer from the *Transportation Commission Contingency Reserve Fund* to the Region 3 TCC pool. In recent years frost heaves on the west side of Vail Pass have progressively worsened over the years in winter creating a huge safety issue. Thirteen frost heaves were present this winter between I-70 MP 183-190. The requested funding will be used to remediate the frost heave issues at each of these locations. (PST-TCC-17)

SUBJECT: FY17 Snow and Ice Contingency Request

Purpose

The Division of Highway Maintenance is requesting \$747,000 from the Transportation Commission Snow and Ice Contingency funds.

Action Requested

Approval of requested additional funds.

Background

As shown in the table below, DHM is projecting a shortfall of \$2.4 million if Maintenance continues to spend snow removal funding at the current rate. DHM is requesting 60% of the projected budget shortfall to keep the Durango and Alamosa maintenance sections and the Durango Traffic section solvent for the winter season.

Details

The projected shortfall in these sections is as follows:

Durango Maintenance - projected shortfall \$1,063,942, requesting \$532,000

Alamosa Maintenance - projected shortfall \$406,623, requesting \$203,000

Durango Traffic - projected shortfall \$24,171, requesting \$12,000

Total Funding Request at 60% of projected shortfall: \$747,000

Frost heave repair on I-70 on the west side of Vail Pass

Purpose

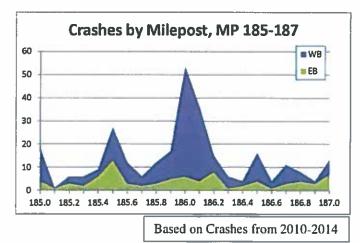
This memorandum is requesting action from the Transportation Commission (TC) to fund the repair of frost heaves on I-70 on the west side of Vail Pass between MM 183-190 using Transportation Contingency funds in the amount of \$1,500,000.

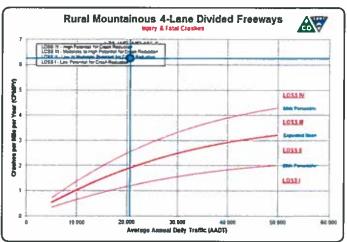
Action

CDOT Region 3 requests that the TC evaluate the use of Transportation Contingency funds for this project. It is our concern that without remediation prior to Winter 2017-2018 the frost heaves will further worsen creating additional safety issues.

Background and Details

In recent years frost heaves on the west side of Vail Pass have grown progressively enlarged in winter creating a safety issue. Thirteen frost heaves were present this winter between I-70 MP 183-190 with the majority on I-70 WB between MP 185.8- MP186. The location of the heaves exacerbate a section of I-70 which already has well documented safety issues with an LOSS of IV: speed differentials, substandard curves, steep grades up to 7%, wildlife conflicts and significant occurrences of inclement weather.





The heaves typically occur during the winter months then pavement settles as the weather warms. The cause of the heaves is a combination of frost susceptible soils, freezing temperatures and groundwater that is not draining fast enough to prevent freezing. There is also very shallow bedrock which prevents downward drainage.



Development of a proposed solution was initiated in 2016. Two geotechnical site investigations have been completed in August 2016 and January 2017 when the frost heaves were at their worst. The proposed remediation at each of the thirteen frost heave locations is to construct trench drains perpendicular to the road (traversing across the travel lanes) to drain the groundwater. The perforated pipe would connect into a drain system that would run parallel to I-70 to daylight or to connect into an existing cross drain under the highway.

The cost and complexity to repair these issues is beyond the scope of typical maintenance at this time. The more severe heaves (elevation change in the roadway surface) is up to 10" at any given time during the middle of winter. Patching, milling or leveling these frost heaves in the winter is not feasible. The project to construct major drainage improvements includes open cutting of I70 drive lanes while under traffic, and working in and around the Fiber Optics Vault along on the inside shoulder. Maintenance has tried to make minor drainage improvements over the years, but the frost heaves continue to return causing major safety issues. There have been documented accidents (specifically with vehicles pulling trailers) that are directly attributed to the major elevation changes at the frost heaves. Maintenance has placed "Roadway Damage" signs in the winter, but with the higher speeds and higher volumes of traffic on I-70 this has been identified as a severe safety hazard.

Our goal is to accelerate project development and construction such that remediation to the frost heaves will be completed prior to Winter 2017-2018. Project development for the repair is being led by the Resident Engineer, Karen Berdoulay and Design Team Manager, John Kronholm, has been assigned as the Project Manager for this work. The Project Manager will develop contract documents for an accelerated Design-Bid-Build delivery with internal CDOT design staff and minor consultant support from a geotechnical consultant who had completed the geotechnical investigation.

The anticipated duration of this construction work is estimated at this time to be approximately three months. The traffic control will maintain at least one travel lane in each direction for the work with concrete barrier protecting the deep excavation. With your support of this request, Region 3 intends to issue a NTP to a successful bidder by July 31, 2017
