Subject: Fourth Budget Supplement - FY 2017-2018

#### Road X

\$12,000,000 – CDOT Connected Vehicle Ecosystem – **Highway Safety Improvement Program** (HSIP). This request is to utilize the HSIP funding that was part of the Section 164 Penalty related to DUI laws for multiple offenders. These funds would be allocated to the RoadX Program and would be used for developing the framework, systems requirements, and a working demonstration of a Connected Vehicle Ecosystem. The project is being requested for Transportation Commission approval per PD703.0, as the project is currently not on the approved HSIP list, or within typical program metrics for the amount being requested.

### Region 1

\$1,500,000 - I-25/ARAPAHOE RD INTERCHANGE- RAMP Partnership Contingency, Regional Priority Program (RPP) — In summary, \$1.5 million additional funds for ROW acquisition within this project are being requested in two parts; (1) requesting the TC approval of using the remaining \$119,839 of RAMP contingency funds (which, if approved, will bring that fund balance to zero), and (2) a notification that Region 1 is prepared to provide the difference of \$1,380,161 from their RPP pool.

#### Region 4

\$7,500 - US 34 Hydraulic Modeling – **TCCRF** – Region 4 is requesting State funds needed to provide 20% match to a recent \$30,000 grant received from Federal Highway Administration for "Hydraulic Engineering of Highways in the River Environment - Floodplains, Extreme Events, Risk, and Resilience."

#### Informational Only

During the FY 2016-17 budget building cycle, Staff projected and allocated revenue from miscellaneous sources, including damage claims. While reconciling after the close of FY 2016-17, Staff realized that some of this miscellaneous revenue was credited to cost centers as they were received during the year. As these funds were already allocated at the beginning of the fiscal year, this created an over-allocation. Staff is working to ensure that this does not occur in subsequent years. This adjustment impacts the Transportation Commission Program Reserve Fund by \$4,953,007.
