SUBJECT: SIXTH BUDGET SUPPLEMENT - FY 2017-2018

Region 1

\$ 1,400,000 - Project 20848 Geo-Hazard Clear Creek Canyon Phase 4 - Rockfall Mitigation (RFM) - This project initially went to ad on 9/7/2017. Bids came in above the approved budget so the project was not awarded. Additional funding in the amount of \$1,400,000 is being requested for the construction phase to get the budget in line with contractor bids. This increase is 42% of the original approved amount. Due to traffic volumes, rock fall work cannot be done between May 1st and October 1st, so all of phase 1 needs to be completed by May 1st. Phase 1 will mitigate the riskiest sites and is 40 working days or 2 months of work with no bad weather. If we advertise 11/30 and all goes smoothly with bids, award, NTP, weather etc. we can start work late January/early Feb and finish beginning of April. This allows us to account for weather days.

SUBJECT: HPTE RAMP DEVELOPMENT FUNDS FOR THE I-25 SOUTH "GAP" PROJECT

Purpose

Region 1 is requesting approval to allocate \$4,000,000 in HPTE RAMP Development Funds for the I-25 South Gap Project for final design, independent cost estimating (ICE) and Construction Manager/General Contractor (CMGC) preconstruction services. The HPTE Development Fund balance is approximately \$36 million.

<u>Action</u>

Per P.D. 703, staff is requesting Transportation Commission (TC) approve \$4,000,000 in HPTE RAMP Development Funds for the I-25 South Gap Project for final design, ICE and CMGC preconstruction services. Funding approval will allow the project to remain on schedule to execute a construction contract no later than November 2018.

Background

The I-25 South Gap project has been identified as a statewide priority to improve safety, mobility and trip reliability along the 18 miles between Castle Rock and Monument. In recognition of project importance, the TC previously approved \$15,000,000 in HPTE Development Funds to initiate NEPA and preliminary design in July 2017. The project team has developed an extremely aggressive project delivery schedule with the goal of executing a construction contract no later than November 2018. CMGC has been selected as the project delivery method as desired to facilitate construction contractor input during the preconstruction phase. As design packages are completed, the same construction contractor has the opportunity to price the work without further competition. Independent cost estimating (ICE) support services are provided to ensure contractor pricing is based on fair market value prior to award of construction packages.

In February, 2017 the TC approved \$20,000,000 in project design funds to set up a high priority preconstruction pool. The pool was intended to allow the achievement of significant preconstruction milestones in order to advance future projects and each region received a \$4,000,000 allocation. In the case of Region 1, this request includes a redirection of \$3,000,000 of those funds to the I-25 South



Gap Project. As detailed in the table below \$4,000,000 in HPTE RAMP Development Funds are requested:

Key Benefits

The South I-25 Gap project will:

- Address the 4 lane bottleneck between Castle Rock and Monument
- Improve safety by improving substandard shoulder widths and cross slope of the roadway and also providing wildlife crossings at some high impact locations within the corridor.
- Improve trip reliability likely via a managed lane in each direction.
- Leverages local commitments of \$35 million for the project construction.

Options

- 1. Approve the request to allocate \$4 million of HPTE Development Funds for final design, CMGC preconstruction services contract and independent cost estimating contract. (Staff Recommendation)
- 2. Approve the full \$7 million current need be derived from the HPTE Development Fund to preserve the \$3 million in design funds for other region projects.
- 3. Request additional information

Next Steps

Upon approval of the funding request, the Region will complete the necessary steps to complete final design, execute a contract with a CMGC contractor for preconstruction services and initiate a task order for independent cost estimating services.
