To His Excellency,

BENJAMIN H. EATON,

Governor of Colorado:

SIR:

In compliance with section 17, article 4, of the Constitution of the State of Colorado, I have the honor to submit herewith the Fifth Biennial Report of the State Treasurer for the two fiscal years ending November 30, 1886.

The first table shows a summary of receipts, disbursements and balances, and is supplemented by exhibits giving a more detailed statement of the transactions of this office during the fiscal period.

The total debt of the State on November 30, 1886, was as follows:

Outstanding warrants bearing six per cent.
interest
Outstanding certificates of indebtedness

To offset this debt, there is \$22,236.43 to the credit of the General Revenue Fund, and warrants sufficient to cover this amount have been called. Uncalled and delinquent taxes, 1880 to 1886, \$667,822.97, of which the State Auditor estimates eighty per cent. will be collected, viz.: \$534,258.38, leaving \$110,379.30 unprovided for. It may be well to state why the disbursements are slowly but steadily exceeding the receipts: First, taxes uncollected, Auditor's estimate, \$133,564.59; second, bounties paid during the past six years, \$181,687.41; third, interest

paid during 1885–86, on warrants and certificates of indebtedness, \$68,302.40; fourth, and since becoming a State, something near a half million dollars in warrants have been drawn on the General Revenue Fund, to pay for the erection of the different State institutions, and for grounds connected therewith; for instance, the insane asylum alone costing \$180,000.

In most of the younger States, these State institutions have been erected from proceeds arising from the sale of lands granted them by the general government for agricultural colleges, State universities, penitentiaries, public buildings and internal improvements, or from sale of bonds secured by these grants, payable when the lands were sold. Whenever the lands granted the various institutions of this State are sold, it would seem proper to reimburse the General Revenue Fund to the full amount drawn on said fund, for the erection of buildings and purchase of grounds. In compliance with section I, page 298, Session Laws, 1885, the proceeds arising from the leasing of school lands, now amounting to over \$80,000, are invested in State warrants. Heretofore, the moneys so arising have been distributed semi-annually among the several counties, in proportion to the number of children of school age. I would recommend that this part of the above section be repealed, and in lieu thereof recommend the passage of an act requiring the State Treasurer to invest in warrants or bonds of the State of Colorado the proceeds arising from the leasing of all lands granted to the State for all purposes except school and university.

There has been, since February last, a large amount of money in the treasury uninvested. When the Legislature adjourned in April, 1885, sufficient warrants were purchased at par to exhaust the funds in the treasury belonging to the public school and other land funds, in accordance with section 1, page 298, Session Laws, 1885. During the first quarter of this year large remittances were received from the various county treasurers, and over \$300,000 in State warrants were called in and paid off, materially reducing the different investment funds. Since that time I have purchased at par all warrants offered for the public school and

other land funds, and there still remains at the present time uninvested over \$125,000. This amount could not be invested in warrants at par, as required by the above section, because holders refused to sell them unless they could get par and accumulated interest to date of sale.

Exhibit 43 shows reports of the condition of banks incorporated and doing business under our State laws, in compliance with section 277 of the General Statutes, 1883. The law as it now stands requires semi-annual statements from incorporated banks only. I think the law should be amended so as to apply to all private, as well as incorporated banks, and requiring statements quarterly, instead of semi-annually.

In concluding my report, I desire to make public acknowledgment of the kindly courtesies received at your Excellency's hands during my administration of the affairs of this office. The very harmonious association with yourself, and all other officers connected with the State government, has made the discharge of my duties a very agreeable trust.




