To His Excellency,

ALVA ADAMS,

Governor of Colorado:

SIR:—In compliance with section 17, article 4, of the Constitution of the State of Colorado, I have the honor to submit herewith the Sixth Biennial Report of the State Treasurer, for the two fiscal years ending November 30, 1888.

This report shows the receipts, disbursements and balances, also a detailed statement of the transactions of this office.

The total debt of the State, November 30, 1888, was as follows:

Outstanding warrants bearing 6 per cent. interest	\$ 839,824 17
Outstanding certificates of indebtedness bearing 6 per cent. interest	86,879 10
Outstanding loco weed certificates, no interest	31,363 00
Total	\$ 958,066 27

To offset this amount there is \$5,511.86 to the credit of the General Revenue Fund, which leaves the principal of the outstanding State indebtedness \$952,554.41, from which amount there is to be deducted the uncollected and delinquent taxes, for which I respectfully call your attention to the estimate of the State Auditor.

Of the \$839,824.17 outstanding warrants, the State holds \$575,047.92 in the several investment funds, as per itemized statement in general summary of this report.

In compliance with section 285 of the General Statutes, incorporated banks only make a report to this office. I would suggest that the law be amended so as to include private banks, and that they report quarterly, instead of semi-annually; also that some State officer be designated, with full power to examine said banks, whenever he deems the same advisable.

Section 1,403 of the General Statutes makes the fiscal year commence on December 1, and end on November 30. With the increased amount of business on the books of the Auditor and Treasurer, it is impossible to make out the two biennial reports to Your Excellency, with an increased clerical force, as required in section 17, article 4 of the Constitution. I would therefore recommend the same be changed, and that the fiscal year commence on July 1, and end on June 30.

I would also call your attention to the office and safety-vault now used by the State Treasurer. There should be additional room provided for this department, as the room now used as the general office is poorly lighted, and much too small for the increased business.

This office should also be provided with a steel safe, as a great deal of inconvenience is caused by all valuables that have to be taken to the depository, at the First National bank, that is now being used for that purpose.

With the increased business in this office, there should be more clerical help, and the present salary of the Deputy State Treasurer is not sufficient to employ the services of a man able to fill that responsible position.

In concluding my report, I take this opportunity of extending to you my grateful acknowledgments, for the courtesies received at Your Excellency's hands. The

pleasant and harmonious association with yourself, and other officers connected with the State government, has made the discharge of my duties as Treasurer an agreeable task.

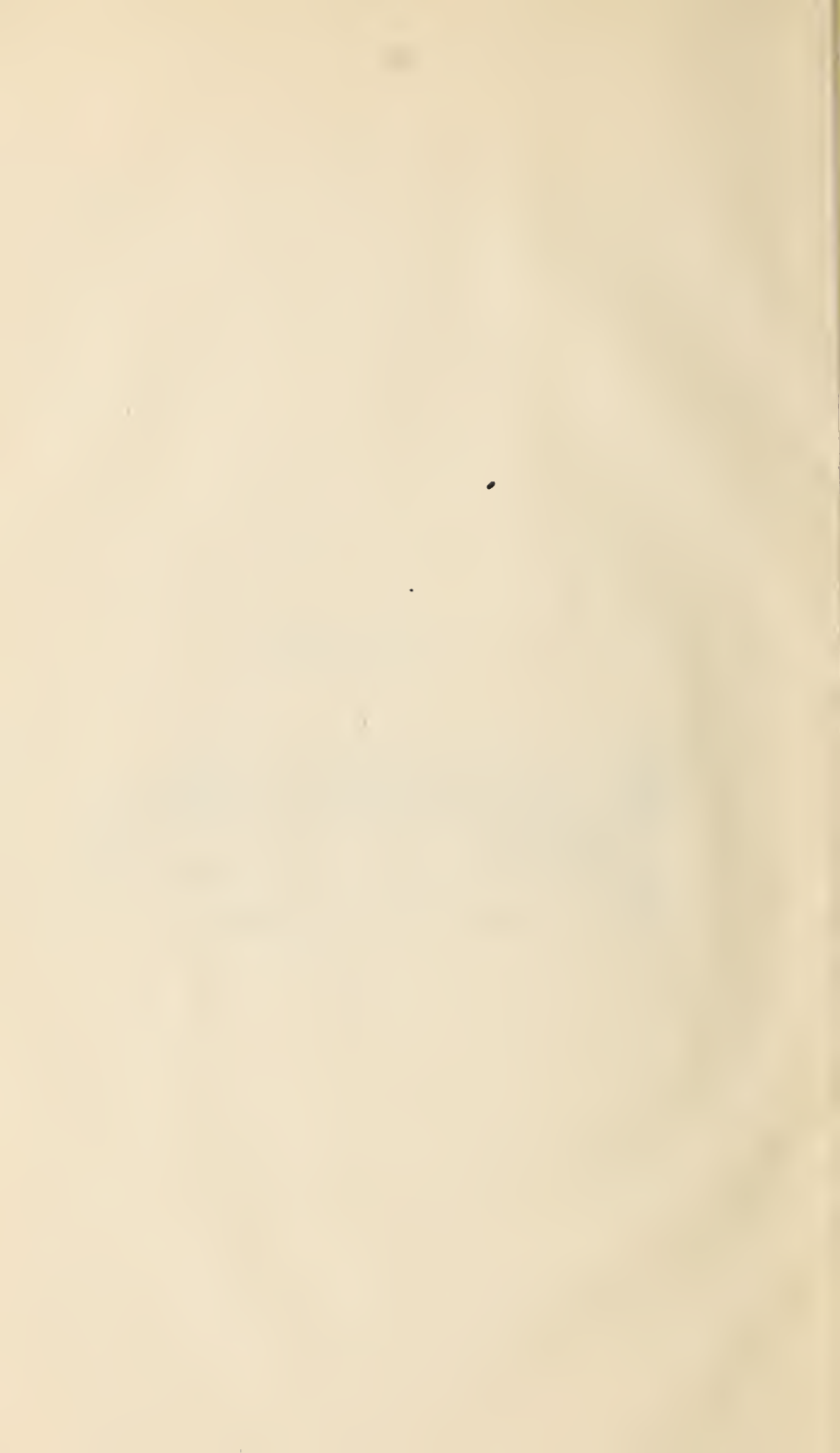
