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REPORT.

TO HIS EXCELLENCY,

JOHN L. ROUTT,

Governor of Colorado.

SIR—I have the honor to submit herewith the Eighth Biennial Report of the State Treasurer, for the two fiscal years ending November 30, 1892, showing in detail all receipts, disbursements, and balances of the various funds.

The net State debt, November 30, 1892, as estimated by the State Auditor, is—

Deduct Capitol Building bonds	600.000 00
And there remains	

Represented by outstanding warrants and accounts not audited, but included in his estimate as amounting to \$63,300.00.

As the resources of 1891 and 1892 are more than sufficient to meet the outstanding warrants of those years, it follows that this amount is practically represented by the outstanding warrants of 1887, 1888, and 1889. No provision for their payment has been made.

Of the outstanding warrants issued in 1887, 1888, and 1889—

The Public School Fund holds	\$444,517 46

If it can be lawfully done, the State Treasurer should be authorized to use any unexpended balance of the general fund of any year to pay outstanding warrants of previous years; and I recommend that this question be submitted to the Legislature.

As to the balance of the warrant debt then unprovided for, there seems to be only two ways out of the difficulty. One is to secure an amendment to the Constitution, under which the debt could be funded, and the other is to econo-

mize in the administration of the government and apply any savings to the extinguishment of the debt. If the first plan can be legally carried out, it is preferable, because 4 per cent. State bonds can be placed at par, while State warrants bear 6 per cent. per annum, and a material saving in the annual interest charged would result. No argument is necessary to demonstrate the sound business sense of any course, the tendency of which would be to fortify and strengthen the credit of the State. In addition to the obligation to the general public, which holds so many of the warrants, there is the special obligation to preserve the School Fund. The amount of warrants held by that and other funds is large, and contributes to the preservation of the State credit; but so long as there is no practical revenue looking to their redemption, it cannot be said that the sacred trust imposed by the Constitution has been observed.

My predecessor, Hon. W. H. Brisbane, called for payment about \$145,000.00 of 1889 warrants, but when they were presented, payment was refused by him, on the advice of the Attorney General, upon the ground of their illegality. A suit was instituted in the District Court of Arapahoe county, and his action was sustained. Another suit has been commenced, and the question is now pending in court.

The balance of the first issue of Capitol Building bonds (\$150,000) was sold by my predecessor to the School Fund, at par, on January 1, 1891. The second series of \$300,000, bearing interest at the rate of 4 per cent. per annum, was sold to Simon Borg & Co., of New York City, at $101\frac{1}{4}$, in March, 1892.

The State money has been kept on deposit in various banks of the State, and in each case a good security bond was exacted. The sum of \$10,000 was deposited with the Bank of Pueblo—a private institution—which failed May 30, 1892. On June 24, 1892, the bondsmen paid the entire amount of the principal and interest due, under the terms of the bond. There was no other failure of a bank where State funds are on deposit.

All the money on deposit at the various banks has earned interest at the rate of 4 per cent. per annum, computed on daily balances, and payable quarterly. The total amount collected, up to November 30, 1892, a period of one year ten and a half months, is \$65,165.31. Under advice of the Attorney General, this amount has been credited to the several General Revenue funds, as shown in the detailed statements.

I desire to call your attention to the law which created local treasurers for several State institutions. If this law should be repealed and the money allowed to remain in the State Treasury until drawn by warrants, from time to time, as the needs of the institutions might require, the fund could be made to earn interest and the expense of a local treasurer saved. The Penitentiary, the Insane Asylum, the Industrial School and the Reform School are without local treasurers.

I also recommend that the law be amended so that all collectors or receivers of State revenue be required to pay such moneys into this office monthly, under the same penalties that are prescribed in the case of county treasurers. The law requires the insurance department to make monthly payments to the State Treasurer, but no penalty for failure to do so is imposed. Prior to March 1, 1892, monthly payments were made by that department, varying in amount from \$2,000 to \$12,000 per month. But between March 1, 1892, and November 25, 1892, no payments were made. On the latter date, the sum of \$24,960 was paid in, and on November 30, 1892, a further payment of \$4,805.31 was made.

The bank laws of the State should be amended so as to require all State and Savings banks to make a report to this office, on call of the State Treasurer, at least three times each year; and some State officer should have authority and be required to examine, or cause an examination to be made, into the affairs of all State banks, at least once in each year.

On November 21, 1892, the Supreme Court of the State declared the bounty laws unconstitutional. Since that time I have declined to receive any bounty certificates or affidavits from county treasurers.

I recommend that the question of relieving county treasurers from any loss they may have sustained by payments under said laws, between the date of their last reports to the State Treasurer and the date of said decision, be submitted to the Legislature.

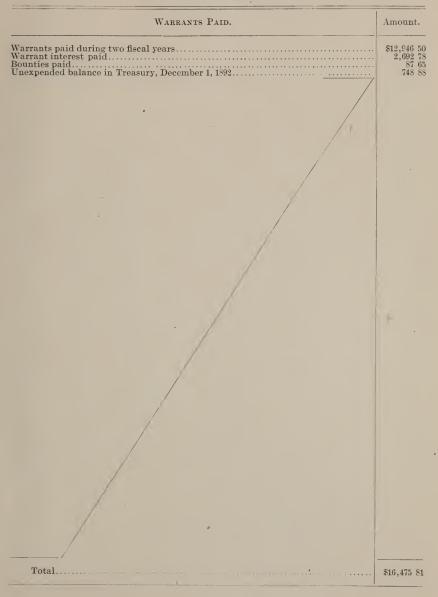
