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

GOVERNOR OF COLORADO.

Sir—In submitting this, the biennial report of the business transacted by this department from December 1, 1900, to December 1, 1902, I deem it proper to preface the same by briefly citing a few important facts, which I think are of public interest.

I received from my predecessor \$1,881,716.20, and have received from all other sources during this biennial period \$4,038,572.65, which is itemized in the following pages, making the total received \$5,920,288.85, and disbursements, \$3,833,294.27, leaving a balance on hand of \$2,086,994.58.

I have collected for interest on the state funds \$29,670.58.

I have collected for liquor licenses \$105,350.00, and from court and license fees, \$28,302.65, as required by the new revenue law.

There are over 1,500 persons selling liquor in the state at this time who have not complied with the law with reference to state license, owing, I believe, to the negligence of those whom the law designates as the proper persons to enforce it. I have done everything in my power to collect this tax in full, but with only partial success, as I was not clothed with power in the matter to force the same.

Contrary to the expectation of many, the result has proven the wisdom of the Thirteenth General Assembly in reducing the interest on general revenue warrants from 6 to 4 per cent. and on Capitol building warrants from 6 to 5 per cent., which has made a saving to the state of about \$35,000, in the difference in the rate of interest which the warrants bear for this period. Prior to this reduction about 40 per cent. of the interest-bearing warrants issued were diverted to private investment channels by speculators who were securing money in the East at 4 per cent. for that purpose. The change in the rate discouraged this, in consequence of which over 90 per cent. of the interest-bearing warrants have been presented and invested in the Public School and other funds, thereby enabling an earning of 4 per cent. upon these invested funds, instead of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent., had the money remained in the bank, resulting in an additional saving or earning for the state of about \$10,500, or a total of about \$45,500, and notwithstanding the fact of so large a reduction in the rate of interest on the warrants named, we have been able to maintain them at par during my entire term of office, and for the first time in many years there will be a surplus revenue of about \$200,000, after paying all appropriations; that is a result we may all be proud of.

During the first quarter of my term of office I very carefully investigated the question of the disbursement of the money turned over to me by my predecessor from the revenue of 1889, the retiring Governor having called especial attention to it in his message to the Thirteenth General Assembly; a joint committee being by them appointed on the matter, met with me, and agreed that the money should be paid out in

redemption of such warrants as were found to be legally issued and registered. Mr. Calvin E. Reed, for 6 years assistant attorney general, was requested to meet said committee, and after a full discussion of the question, was instructed to investigate for them, and report to me his conclusions, which I was instructed to follow; his decision being confirmed by the Attorney General and other legal advisers to whom I submitted the question. I made the disbursement accordingly. The state saved by that action $3\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. per annum on the amount (or, in figures, over \$3,200 per year), the difference between the interest of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. the money was drawing and the 6 per cent. the warrants were drawing, and while this action caused some criticism at the time. I believed then, and do now, that I was acting for the best interest of the state in the redemption of the warrants to which I applied this money.

I would recommend that the incoming legislature appropriate all surplus money from the revenues of 1901 and 1902 to the payment of all outstanding deficiency claims, certificates of indebtedness and the warrants of the years 1891, 1892, 1893, 1894 and 1897, respectively. This would only leave the 1887, 1888 and 1889 warrants outstanding and unpaid. My successor will, I think, have a surplus of at least \$500,000, which can be appropriated to the payment of those warrants. The state's finances are now in splendid shape, and with economy every state warrant and claim can be redeemed within the next 5 years; especially is this true if the inheritance tax law is sustained, from which source at least a half million dollars will be paid into the treasury.

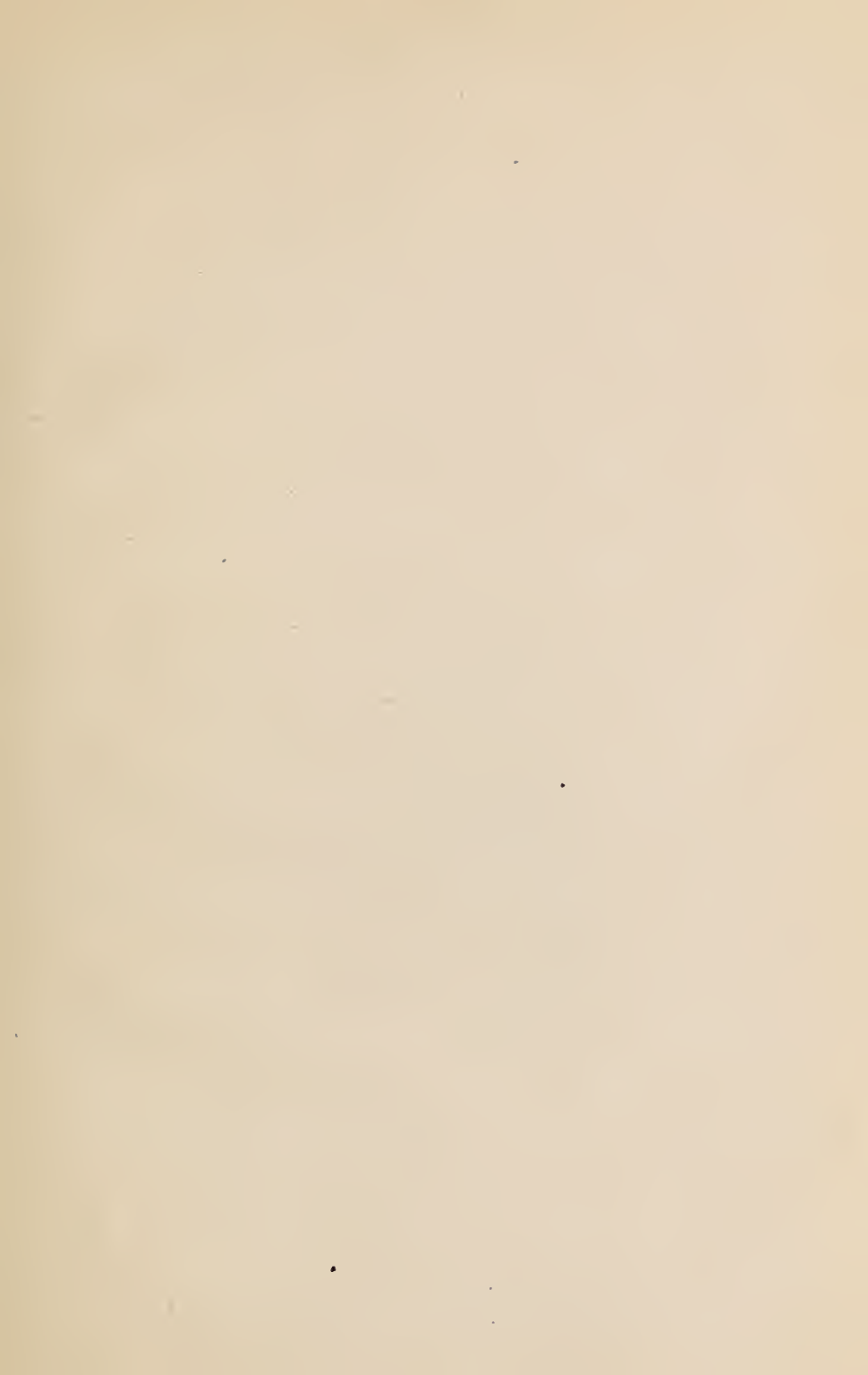
