## BIENNIAL REPORT

OF THE

## TREASURER OF STATE of COLORADO

Denver, Colorado, December 1, 1910.

## To His Excellency, <br> JOHN F. SHAFROTH, Governor of Colorado.

Dear Sir: In compliance with law I have the honor to submit herewith a report of the Financial Department of State for the biennial period ending November 30, 1910, and beg to add some suggestions that if enacted would be beneficial.

APPROPRIATIONS.
The Serenteenth General Assembly appropriated a total of $\$ 3,911,737.87$, divided as follows:

Making a total of . $3,911,737.87$

Adding to this total the Statutory charges, such as Interest on Public Debt, Expense of Assessors' Bonds, Expense of Examining, etc., amounting to $\$ 21,004.20$, making a total obligation of $\$ 3,932,742.07$. the General and Internal Improvements appropriation exceeded the former period $\$ 1,214,221.21$, and exceeded our estimated revenue over $\$ 500,000.00$.

The unusual heary appropriations were caused chiefly by the very urgent needs of expansion and improvements in buildings at the various State Institutions, together with the new Normal School at Gunnison and the Home for Mental Defectives near Denver, a total of $\$ 939,672.38$ of above going into buildings.

The large amount over the anticipated revenue made it appear almost impossible to extend beyond the third class in our biyments, but though concerted artion in the practice of econonn by the varions departments, and a substantial increase in the State tax, with a large increase in the Inheritance tax over the estimate, I am pleased to inform you all appropriations will be paid, together with the cost of the Special Session, which amonnted to $\$ 81,463.76$. The observance of a recent decision from the Attorney General, wherein insettled Inheritance tax applies to the period wherein the death ocenred instead of the period when payment is mate. shonld, on atcount of the many unsettled rases, not only disclarge all obligations of the period, but leave also some surplus.

## LIQUOR LICENSE DEPARTMENT.

For the period we have collected $\$ 110,525.00$, which is about $\$ 20,000,00$ less than the former period, and $\$ 4,000.00$ less in 1910 than in 1909, and this proportionate shrinkage will appear in the next bieunial period owing to the spread of the Local Option law.

We lave saved from onr $\$ 6,000.00$ allotted for expense of this Department $\$ 2,623.68$, this amount going back into the General Fund. I wonld recommend further retrencliments in the Department, owing to conditions explained above.

## DETECTIVE AGENCIES LICENSE.

This law was enacted in 1887 and is poorly drawn, inasmuch as it does not designate anthority for enforcement to any Department, and conseqnently has been unenforced, the state only receiving license from one agency who volunteered to pay. I have, through the Liquor License Departinent, called upon all agencies and iusisted upon their romplying with the law, and have succeeded in every instance, collecting a revenue of $\$ 900.00$.

This act should be amended or abolished.

## INTEREST ON STATE FUNDS.

Interest on State Funds for the perion amounted to $\$ 84$,697.32, an increase of $\$ 19,459.34$ over the preceding period. The funds are deposited in banks throughout the State, who pay 3 per cent per annmin, payable quarterly, on Demand Certificates.

I have maintained one open or checking account, and on this received $21 / 2$ per cent on daily balance. Depositories furnish a bond to amount of deposit and 20 per cent additional; premium on bonds costing $\$ 6.00$ per $\$ 1,000.00$, making a total cost on depositories of $3 \pi 2 / 100$ per rent. No depository has shown a weakness or has liad any trouble, and all of the State's funds can be assembled on sliort notice.

## PUBLIC SCHOOL FUND.

The Public: School Fund has increased rapidly during the period on account of the unusual activity in State lands. I have
increased the investments in this fund $\$ 500,000.00$, having opportunity to purchase some of the 1909 issue of 3 per cent. State bouds, and have bought same on a 4 per cent. earuing basis; this find now holding $\$ 168,900.00$ of these bonds, costing $\$ 40 \cdot 4$, 731.70 .

I would recommend, by legislative action, authority be given the Treasurer to extend the investments in this fund to inchade District School bonds of this State at a fixed rate of 4 per cent. The investments are now restricted to State bonds and warrants.

## 1909 issue of insurrection bonds.

The Serenteenth General Assembly passed an act authorizing the issue of $\$ 950,000.00$ of 3 per cent. State londs for the purpose of redeeming the outstanding certificates and other evidence of indebtedness emanating from the insurrection of 1903 and 1904. The Treasurer was authorized to sell this issue at not less than par, and call the certificates, or if unable to sell the bonds to exchange same for the certificates. After making an effort to sell the bonds and failing on account of the low rate of interest, I mailed all known holders of certificates the form of exchange, and we have exclianged bonds for certificates amounting to $\$ 691$,176.23 in principal, leaving outstanding at the present time $\$ 66$, 561.57 in certificates. There being no terminating date for this exchange, it is uncertain as to when this will be closed.

INCIDENTAL FUND.
This Department was allowed $\$ 2,500.00$ for Incidental Expense for the period. We have used $\$ 1,280.89$, leaving a balance of $\$ 1,219.11$ to be turned back into the General Fund.

## CUSTODIAN OF GIFT FUNDS.

My predecessor turned a legacy of $\$ 1,000.00$ left by E. C. Howe, dereased, over to me to be used for the purchase of toys, etc., during the holiday season for the Children of Dependent Home, with the approval of the board of trustees of said Home.

I have invested this legacy in a good school bond bearing 5 per cent., and this annual income of $\$ 50.00$ is used for the purposes designated by the legatee.

Two hmodred and fifty dollars was placed in my hands by the Auditor, same being gift from a beneficiary of our State Insane Asylum, and desired the amount to be used as a means of relief and entertainment for the inmates. I have directed the board regarding the donation and request.

## FLAT TAX FEES HELD BY FORMER OFFlClALS.

Early in my administration I discovered Flat Tax, designated as "Protest Fees," amounting to $\$ 31,810.49$, same being collected by officials during their term and not turned into the treasury. On February 2, 1909, I made demand upon the various officials for surrender of this money, and on their failure to comply, I directed the Attorney General on February 11, 1909, to commence proceedings to recover the amount. Suit was commenced, and on September 25, 1909, former Secretary of State O'Connor called upon me and paid in amount leld by him, viz., $\$ 16,546.31$ principal, and $\$ 808.57$ interest, thus discharging the obligation against him. The claims against Messrs. Cowie and Holmberg are still in court, and on this date are pending on plaintiff's demurrer to the amended answers. I feel this will soon be settled and the State will recover the amount with interest.

## FUNDING OUTSTANDING WARRANTS.

At the General Election, 1910, a Constitutional Amendment was submitted providing for a bond issue to fund the outstanding warrants of 1887 and subsequent years. At this writing, the amendment appears to have been carried by a small plurality, and it is gratifying to believe this matter will be cleared up and the long outstanding State paper be cancelled. In this connection I would advise, by legislative action, authority be given the Treasurer to call and pay out of the Surplus fund any outstanding warrants of former periods, calling same in order in which they were issued. This will be a safeguard in the future against long standing warrants by reason of excess or otherwise, and leare a surplus only when all our obligations lave been discharged.

## AUDITOR'S OFFICE.

I am pleased to add a few words of commendation for the manner in which the Auditor's office has been conducted during the past two years. Auditor Kenehan and his assistants have been most careful and painstaking in their duties and should command public approval for their zealous care of the public welfare. The relations between the two departments have been most pleasant.

I desire to acknowledge my sincere appreciation of the courtesies shown me by my fellow officials during the term, and
also the able and conscientious assistance rendered me by my department force, led by Deputy Treasurer J. L. Davidson and Chicf Clerk. J. H. Clark. The conscientious and courteous manner in which they have discharged their duties has been a great aid in attaining any success this department may be credited witli.
