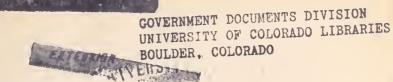

BIENNIAL REPORT

STATE OF COLORADO OFFICE OF THE TREASURER

Denver, Colorado, December 1, 1924.

To His Excellency,

WILLIAM E. SWEET, Governor of Colorado.

Sir:

I have the honor to submit to you my official report of the Treasurer Department of the State of Colorado for the biennium commencing December 1, 1922, and ending November 30, 1924.

In submitting this report, I am giving you full and complete information of all of the investments, funds and activities of the department during this biennium, as well as some recommendations.

Since taking over this department on January 9, 1923, the credit of the State has been 100%; notwithstanding the fact that State warrants bear but 4% interest, not one of them have had to be discounted. In order to obviate this, the department has cashed all warrants when presented and saved the interest to the State, thereby enabling all departments and institutions to purchase their supplies at a much lower price than heretofore, and in consequence the various institutions are not hampered with a deficiency of revenue and the incoming Legislature relieved of the necessity of passing relief bills to cover. The amount of interest saved on these warrants approximates \$36,000.00, and the saving through purchases of supplies, etc. for all divisions is \$100,000.00, totaling \$136,000.00.

BALANCE SHEET

The statement giving the balances at the close of business November 30, 1922, receipts and transfers, disbursements and transfers, shows the Treasurer to be chargeable at the close of the fiscal period in the sum of \$15,386,092.57, all of which is accounted for in the statement showing the custody of funds in banks, investments, State warrants and cash in vault. The volume of business transacted, including receipts, disbursements and transfers, was \$89,320,690.77.

INTEREST ON DEPOSITS IN BANKS

We have collected the sum of \$259,681.50 interest on deposits of State funds from banks during the two years. This is a much greater sum than ever collected before during a like period.

STATE BONDED INDEBTEDNESS

The outstanding bonded indebtedness of the State at the close of the period is \$11,699,000.00, owned as follows:

PUBLIC SCHOOL PERMANENT FUND

The Public School Fund amounted to \$7,235,268.78 on November 30, 1922, and on November 30, 1924, \$7,950,249.73, an increase of \$714,980.95 during the two years. Statement is rendered showing how this fund is invested.

PUBLIC SCHOOL INCOME FUND

The statement pertaining to the School Income Fund shows that on November 30, 1922, there was a cash balance of \$311,586.28. The receipts are \$1,816,809.73, totaling \$2,128,396.01 of which was

The above expenses are in addition to the appropriation made for the office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

INVESTMENTS OF STATE WARRANTS

During the past four years, it has been difficult to persuade the State Board of Land Commissioners to authorize the Treasurer to invest revenue warrants in the Public School Permanent Fund over which said board has control under the law. I would suggest that the law pertaining to this matter be amended, making it plain that State warrants have preference over all other investments, there being a difference of opinion by two attorney generals with reference thereto. I refer to Section 8298, Revised Laws of Colorado, 1921. Through these investments, the State can be kept on a cash basis, the interest on the same passing to the credit of the Public School Income Fund which is allocated semi-annually to the various counties for school purposes.

INHERITANCE TAX FUND

On November 30, 1922, there was a balance to the credit of the Inheritance Tax Fund of \$795.32. The receipts amounted to \$1,567,899.86, totaling \$1,568,695.19. The disbursements and transfers to the general revenue were \$1,568,197.85, leaving a balance of \$49,733.00. I estimate about \$300,000.00 more to be collected for this biennium.

INSURANCE DEPARTMENT

The receipts of the Insurance Department during this period amounted to \$1,113,865.15, the balance November 30, 1922, was \$9,620.64, totaling \$1,123,485.79. There was transferred to the General Revenue and Fireman's Fund \$1,033,501.27. Disbursement and expense, etc., was \$82,698.67, leaving a balance of \$7,285.85 November 30, 1924.

STATE COMPENSATION INSURANCE FUND

The balance to the credit of the State Compensation is \$1,677,998.06 and that of the Compensation Interest Fund \$6,165.09. Statement is rendered as to the investment of this fund.

STATE OFFICE BUILDING

The Legislature authorized a tax levy of twelve-hundredths of one mill for the years 1919, 1920, 1921, 1922, 1923, 1924 and 1925 to provide revenue to pay for the construction and furnishing of the State Office Building at the corner of Colfax Avenue and Sherman Street. Certificates of indebtedness in the sum of \$1,494,374.84 were issued for the ultimate completion and furnishing of the same bearing interest at the rate of 4% per annum.

The revenue derived from these levies will not be sufficient to retire these certificates together with the interest on the same. In my opinion it will be necessary to extend this levy to the year 1926, or so much thereof as will be necessary.

INTEREST

The total amount of interest earned by the office during the biennium from all sources as shown by the tabulated statement is \$1,257,763.08, and the amount paid on the bonded and other indebtedness is \$957,716.79, a net earning of \$300,046.29.

HIGHWAY BONDS SOLD

During the period the Treasurer has sold \$3,000,000.00 of Colorado State Highway bonds. As an evidence of the splendid credit of the State, these bonds brought a higher return than any like securities ever sold in the West. The last delivery, December 31, 1924, with an optional period of eighteen months, were disposed of at a 2.95/100 per cent per annum basis.

THE STATE'S INDEBTEDNESS

On November 30, 1922, the outstanding uncalled State interest-bearing warrants amounted to \$1,857,836.78. On November 30, 1924, the amount was \$1,479,997.48 divided as follows:

This shows a decrease of \$377,839.30. There are also outstanding certificates of indebtedness issued by the State Hospital amounting to \$15,020.04. The total indebtedness is as follows:

STATE ROAD

The receipts for the department during the biennial period, November 30, 1922, to November 29, 1924, were \$7,535,626.53.

Of the amounts 32% were received from taxes

38% were received from Federal Government 5% were received from State Highway Dept.

17% were received from Gasoline Tax

6% were received from Motor Vehicle License

2% were received from Other sources

The cost of operation was practically similar during the fiscal years 1923 and 1924—the total disbursement during the biennial period being \$6,826,502.20.

COLORADO STATE HIGHWAY BOND, ACT OF 1921

The amount of money expended on State Roads under the act during the biennial period was \$2,248,845.53. Of this amount, 95% was spent in 1923, and 5% was spent in 1924.

SINKING FUND, FUNDING BONDS 1897

These bonds have all been retired and there is left in the fund \$3,422.08. I recommend that a bill be passed transferring this amount and any future collections of this fund into the surplus account.

COLORADO STATE HIGHWAY BONDS, ACT OF 1923

\$3,000,000.00 worth of these bonds were issued during the years 1923 and 1924, \$1,500,000.00 during each fiscal year. Of this total issue \$500,000.00 of bonds were redeemed during 1924.

Of the total amount paid for road making, during the biennial period, 13% was expended in 1923.

87% was expended in 1924.

MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE FUND

The Motor Vehicle License fund of 1923 has been closed by the transfer of the unexpended balance to the Redemption Fund of State Highway Bonds of 1923. Of the receipts of the Motor Vehicle License fund of 1924, \$566,000.00 have been transferred to the Redemption Fund of State Highway Bonds of 1923. The receipts shown under this fund for 1925 represent licenses paid for that year, prior to November 29, 1924. Tabulated statement shows the amount of receipts and disbursements.

SOLDIERS' LOANS

The session of the Legislature in 1919 made an appropriation to loan \$200,000.00 to ex-service men to assist them in securing

an education. These loans were made for five years, interest waived for the first three years and then to be at the rate of 8 per cent. These notes will become due in the fall of 1925. Inasmuch as many of these young men have not yet completed their education, while others are just entering on their business careers, I recommend that the Treasurer be authorized to extend their notes three years and that the interest be reduced to 6 per cent.

GASOLINE TAX

The receipts from the Gasoline Tax during the years

The other 50 per cent of the total receipts is apportioned to the various counties of the State for the maintainance, repairing, etc., of roads in their respective counties. The amount of \$47,416.81 was refunded to buyers of gasoline who had previously paid the tax, but who proved that a certain portion of their purchases was used for purposes other than the propelling of motor vehicles.

SHORTAGES IN TREASURER'S OFFICE

I render you statement herewith showing the amount collected from former State Treasurers, because of shortages in accounts in this office. These cover the fiscal periods of 1901-'02, 1905-'06, and 1907-'08, totaling \$32,754.62. These settlements were made out of Court by the Attorney General. The money paid in has been credited to the various funds from which it was taken.

I am pleased to report that the relations of this office with all the various departments of the State and with all the banks, and others with whom we have come in contact, have been most cordial.

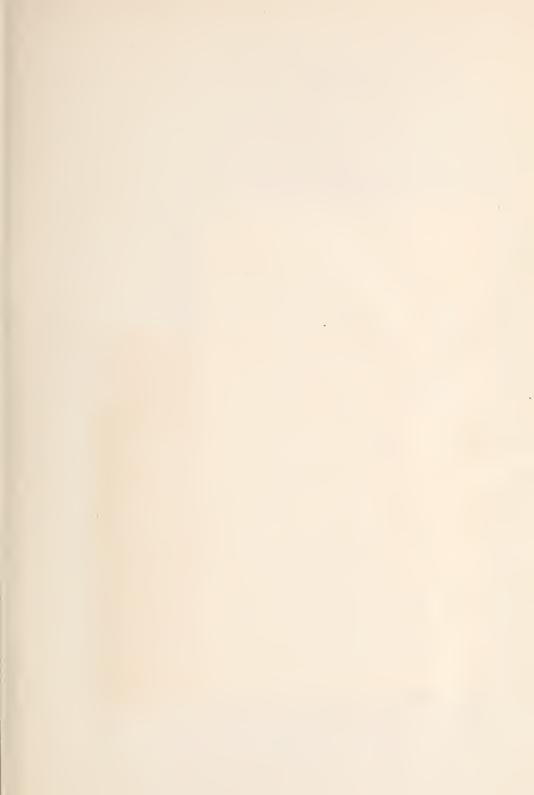
