We hereby certify that the balance chargeable to the Treasurer of State at the close of business, November 30, 1926, in the amount of $\$ 16,771,515.95$, was found to be correct and is properly accounted for. The books and records of the office are in excellent condition and the accounts are neatly and accurately kept.

## GASOLINE TAX <br> (Sehedule 19)

The reeeipts from Gasoline Tax for the two fiseal years ending November 30th, 1926, was $\$ 4,009,239.62$. As required by law, 50 per cent of this tax, less refunds, etc., or $\$ 1,960,689.57$, was apportioned to the State Road Fund for the construction and repair of State roads. The remaining 50 per cent was apportioned to the various counties for maintenance and repairing of County roads.

## INHERITANCE TAX <br> (Schedule 3)

The balance to the credit of the Inheritance Tax Fund on November 29, 1924, was $\$ 497.33$. Receipts during this biennium were $\$ 1,787,219.84$. Transfers made to the General Revenue Funds totaled $\$ 1,763,305.55$, and warrants paid amounted to $\$ 23,425.04$, leaving a balance on November 30th, 1926, of $\$ 986.58$.

## INSURANCE DEPARTMENT

(Schedule 4)
On November 30th, 1924, there was a balance of $\$ 7,285.85$ to the eredit of the Insurance Fund. Reeeipts show $\$ 1,347,218.70$. Transfers to General Revenue total $\$ 1,134,210.15$ and to the Firemen's Pension Fund, $\$ 132,196.30$. Warrants drawn in the two ycars amounted to $\$ 82,246.50$, leaving on November 30th, 1926, a balanee of $\$ 5,851.60$.

## REVENIE FROM INTEREST (Schedule 5)

The difference between the interest paid to the State and the interest paid by the State, during this biemial period, ineluding the interest on bank deposits and the interest accruing to the various State institutions and department investment funds, amounts to $\$ 195,315.16$ in favor of the State.

## STATE OFFICE BUILDING

(Schedule 6)
The General Assembly in 1919 authorized a levy of twelvehundredths of one mill for the years $1919,1920,1921,1922,1923$, 1924 and 1925 to provide funds to pay for the construction and furnishing of the State Office Building. This levy resulted in the colleetion of $\$ 1,330,497.50$, leaving a balance unpaid of $\$ 163$,877.34, the total cost having amounted to $\$ 1,494,374.84$. In order to retire the warrants now outstanding covering this unpaid balance, together with the interest on same, which outstanding war-
rants bear $4 \%$ interest annually, it is recommended that the Legislature provide a .13 of a mill levy on the general valuation of the State for the year 1927.

# SHORTAGES IN THE STATE TREASURER'S OFFICE 

## (Scherdule 7)

Shortages in the accounts of the State Treasurer's office, extending from the year 1901 to 1911, involving five administrations of the office and totaling $\$ 41,186.50$, were disclosed by the Public Examiner's department in 1915. Upon discovery of such shortage, suits to recover were instituted against these former Treasurers of State, and, with the payment of $\$ 8,500.33$, marle to this office in 1925, same being the balanec due, the entire shortage was fully adjusted and paid.

## CLOSED BANKS

During this biennium a number of both State and Nationa? banks over the State in whieh were deposited State funds, closed their doors by order of the State and National examiners. By reason of having good and ample Surety Bonds covering all State deposits, the entire deposits, together with interest to date of payment, were fully paid and no loss whatever was sustained by the State hy reason of such closing.

## (OLORADO STATE HIGHWAY BONDS, ACT OH 1923

Under the provisions of the Constitutional Act, November, 1922, there was voted an additional $\$ 6,000,000.00$ to be expended on public highways. $\$ 3,000,000.00$ worth of these bonds were issued and sold during the years 1923 and 1924 , realizing a premium of $\$ 52.584 .50$, and the remaining $\$ 3.000,000.00$ worth were issued and sold during the years 1925 and 1926, realizing a premium of $\$ 118,234.65$, or a total of $\$ 170,819.15$.

In this connection, it may be noteworthy that, in conjunetion with the State Industrial Commission, satisfactory arrangement was made to permit the said commission to buy for investment in the State Compensation Insuranee Fund, from the Treasurer of State direct, $\$ 400,000.00$ worth of these bonds, rather than be required, as heretofore, to buy same in the open market, thus saving to the said fund approximately, $\$ 2,500.00$.

## THE S'ATE'S INDEBTEDNESS

At the close of the biemnial period, 1923-1924, the total indebtedness of the State was $\$ 13,194,017.52$. On November 30th, 1926, the total indebtedness stands at $\$ 13,767,969.97$, as per table following, and shows an increase of $\$ 573,952.45$.

## SOLDIERS' LOANS

The Twenty-Sccond General Assembly, 1919, appropriated $\$ 200,000.00$ and anthorized the loan therefrom, on five-year promissory notes, an amount, not to exceed $\$ 200.00$ in any one case, to soldiers and sailors for the purpose of assisting in the payment of their expenses for vocational edncation or other training in any school or educational institution of the State.

Interest was waived for the first three years and was fixed at $8 \%$ per annum for the ensuing two years.

Of this $\$ 200,000.00$ appropriation, there was so distributed
$\$ 199,525.00$. The total amount of such notes outstanding on Nov. 29,1924 , was $\$ 194,050.00$. The total outstanding on November 30,1926 , is $\$ 171,424.31$. Interest in the amount of $\$ 3,188.49$ was colleeted during the past two fiscal years.

It is recommended that the interest rate on such notes as are outstanding on June 1st, 1927, be reduced to $6 \%$ per annum.

## EsCHEATS FUND

During the past two fiscal years the amount aceruing to the Escheats Fund was $\$+3,329.08$. This funt is derived from the estates of deceased Colorado eitizens, whose heirs are unknown or unfound, and remains in the custody of the Treasurer of State, pending the loeation of heirs. On November 29, 1924, the total amount in the fund was $\$ 138,239.83$. I pon orders of Court, $\$ 17$,531.81 was paid to heirs and attorneys, leaving a balance of $\$ 164,-$ 037.10 on November 30th, 1926. Of this balance, $\$ 96,869.13$ is invested in Liberty and State bonds and warrants, as per statement meluded in schednle 20. The interest accruing by reason of this fund is diverted to the General Revenue Fund.

## REFUND TO STATE COMPENSATION INSURANCE INTEREST FUND

The receipt by this office, in September, 1925, of checks for $\$ 13,759.40$ and $\$ 13,759.39$ from the Fidehty and Deposit Company and the ITnited States Firlelity \& Guaranty Company, respeetively, and the transfer of same to the credit of the State (ompensation Insurance Interest Find, brought to a close the suit instituted by the Industrial Commission of Colorado agamst Mr. A. M. Stong, former Treasurer of Colorado (1921-1922). Said suit, based upon the Treasmrer of State's failure to purchase at once certain [nited States Liberty Bonds on the orders of the Industrial Commission, was earried to the State Supreme Court, and resulted in a verdiet holding the then Treasurer of State, and the surety eompanies. liable in the amount equalling the difference between the price of said bonds at the time of the orders of the commission to purchase, and the price paid for sume when actually purchased by order of court.

## LEGISLATIVE APPROPRIATIONS, 1925-1926

With appropriations made by the 25th General $\Lambda$ ssembly for the biennial period, 1925-1926, totaling $\$ 5,297,575.01$, it at once hecame apparent that without exercising the most rigid economy and eare, and obtaining the full co-operation of the various State departments and institutions in these respects, the State Auditing Board wonld be eonfronted with a more than usnally serious deficit. The estimated revenues for the biennimm were far below the legislative appropriations. However, a complete representation of
this situation was laid before those departments and institutions of the State most vitally eoneerned and beeanse of their ready and amicable co-operation, an estimated saving of a quarter million dollars was aceomplished. This saving, together with the faet that the revenue derived from the inheritanee tax and other sources exceeded all early estimates, has made every neeessary portion of the legislative appropriations available and same was paid.

## INVESTMENT FUNDS

(Sehedule 20)
The various investment funds, embracing the Agrieultural College. Publie Sehool, State Compensation Insurance and the State University, of which the Treasurer is the eonstituted enstodian, are insested, by order of the institutions and departments in charge, in Colorado State and United States bonds, Colorado County and Mumicipal bonds, Colorado School District bonds, Colorado State warrants and Colorado farm loans. The revenue accruing in the two fiseal years to these funds from interest on same, totals $\$ 929.262 .27$. the rate of interest extending from $3 \%$ to $5 \%$ per annum.

On November 29th. 1924. the total of all Investment Funds was $\$ 9,979,512.40$. Additional investments during the present liennium amounted to $\$ 5,0+8.295 .25$. while maturing investments amounted to $\$ 4,269,011.22$, showing an increase in invested funds of $\$ 779.2-4.06$, or a total of $\$ 10,758,796.46$ Investment Funds on November 30th. 1926.

Agrieultural College Investment Fund
Inresments November 29th. 1924, were $\$ 325,536.40$. Additional investments were $\$ 104,64$ s.00, maturing investments were $\$ 61.500 .00$. showing an increase of $\$ \$ 3.180 .00$, or a total of investment funds of \$368,684.40 on November 30th, 19:6.

## Public School Permanent Investment Fund (Schedule 21)

Investments November 29th. 192.t, were $\$ 7,7+8,636.86$. Aclditional investments were $\$ 3,979,691.18$, maturing investments wero $\$ 3.55 .560 .96$, showing an increase of $\$ 294.130 .22$, or a total investment of $\$ 8.042 .767 .08$ on Norember $30 t h, 1926$.

## Public School Ineome Investment Fund

Investments November 29th, 1924. were $\$ 150.000 .00$. Additional investments, none. Maturing investments, $\$ 1.50,000.00$, total investment November 30th, 1926, none.

State Compensation Insurance Investment Fund
Inrestments November 29th, 1924, were $\$ 1,644,211.96$. Additional investments were $\$ 937,683.32$, maturing investments were $\$ 413,769.43$, slowing an inerease of $\$ 523,913.89$, or a total inrestment of $\$ 2,168,125.85$ on November 30 th, 1926.

## State University Investment Fund

Investments November 29th, 1924, were $\$ 80,270.00$. Additional investments were $\$ 80.00$, maturing investments, none, showing a total investment of $\$ 80,350.00$ on November 30th, 1926.

## Fort Lewis Endowment Fund

Investments November 29th, 1924, were none. Investment November 30th, 1926, $\$ 2,000.00$.

The Public School Permanent Fund, inchnding investments and cash on hand, shows an increase in amount of $\$ 920,234.43$, the balances on November 29th, 1924, being $\$ 7,950,249.75$ and $\$ 8,870$,484.16, on November 30th, 1926.

## PUBLIC SCHOOL INCOME FUND

(Schedule 22)
Cash balance in the above fund, on November 29, 1924, was $\$ 345$,238.00. Receipts during the present biennium were $\$ 1,832,722.19$. Of the total of $\$ 2,177,960.19, \$ 1,873,717.96$ was distributed, embracing the apportionments made to the connties and expenses of the Department of Education.

## FARM LOANS, ACCOUNT PUBLIC SCHOOL INVESTMENT FUND

(Schednle 24)
Outstanding Farm Loans, on November 29th, 1924, were $\$ 1,-$ $055,060.00$. On November 30th, 1926, there was outstanding $\$ 1,-$ $035,965.00$, a decrease of $\$ 19,095.00$.

## COMPENSATION INSURANCE FUND

(Schedule 25)
The balance to the credit of the Compensation Insurance Fund, on November 29, 1924, was $\$ 1,677,998.06$. Receipts during the two fiscal years were $\$ 1.13 \geq, 766.09$, including $\$ 85,000.00$ transferred from the Compensation Insurance Interest Funds. Disbursements were $\$ 607,465.68$, leaving a cash balance of $\$ 2,203,298.47$ on Norember 30 th, 1926.

## COMPENSITION INSLRANCE INTEREST FUND <br> (Schedule 26)

On November 29,1924 , the balance in this fund was $\$ 6,165.09$. Receipts were $\$ 191,0 \because 2.75$. Disbursements were $\$ 194,760.51$, showing a cash balance of $\$ 2,427.63$ on November 30th, 1926.
