## To His Excellency

## HON. WM. H. ADAMS,

Governor of the State of Colorado, and to the Members of the Senate and House of Representatives.

Gentlemen:
In compliance with the law, I have the houor to submit herewith the biemial report covering the transactions of this department for the fiscal years 1927 and 1928.

I assumed the duties of State Treasurer on November 9th, 1927, by appointment of the Governor, succeeding the greatly lamented Harry E. Mulnix who died November 5, 1927. Mr. Mulnix was serving his fourth term as Treasurer, and was known and trusted and loved by the people of the State to a remarkable degree.

Upon Mr. Mulnix's death, the Governor, acting under the provisions of Scetion 94, Compiled Laws of Colorado 1921, appointed a committee of three to make a careful inventory of the money, securities and equipment of the office. This committee consisted of Messrs. Chas Armstrong, J. M. Wood and IFiram Hilts. These gentlemen spent several weeks in the performance of their duties and made a voluminous report to the Governor and received my receipt for the moneys and securities as shown to be on hand by the books of the office.

This report shows in detail the receipts and disbursements for the biemial period ard the balance on hand in each fund at the present time. It also contains other tables of interest to the tax payers of the state.

In 1912 the sum of $\$ 45,000$ was advanced by the state to the University of Colorado under the authority of the appropriation for $\$ 90,000$ made by the Eighteenth General Assembly (Chapter 72, Session Laws 1911). The amount appropriated was to enable the State University to complete the Mackey Auditorium without
delay and the general fund of the State was to have been reimbursed from the amount due from the Mackey Estate as the same should become available. No part of the indebtedness has been paid and an insistent effort to eollect was made this year. In justiee to the Regents and other offieers of the L'niversity it shonkd be said that the debt was either not known to them or had been forgotten. Efforts to eollect should be continued by my successor as I believe settlement of this loan ean be effected and payment in full seeured.

The inerease in the work of the Treasurer's office is shown by the number of eash warrants issued. In 1917 and 1918 these numbered 32,859 , and in 1927 and 1928 72,657. In 1917 and 1918 the total expenses of all departments of the State government were $\$ 11,657,398.30$ while in 1927 and 1928 they were $\$ 39,082,-$ 133.03.

The eash on hand November 30, 1926, was $\$ 6,012,719.49$. The receipts for the two years were $\$ 38,104,222.63$. The dishursements were $\$ 39,082.133 .03$, leaving a balance on hand, November 30, 1928, of $\$ 5,034,809.09$.

The General Revemue Fund was the subject of much controversy during this biennium. The estimated revenue for the period 1927-1928, made as required by law at the begimning of the period, was fixed at $\$ 4,501,786.00$. Appropriations made by the legislature totaled $\$ 5,956,275.98$. I am pleased to report that the program of economy inangurated by your Excellency early in the period has been fruitful and all of the more necessary appropriations have been paid. The commitments secured by you whereby the parious departments and institutions agreed not to spend a part of the funds appropriated have been lived up to in all instances with one exeeption and without injury to the departments or institutions. These eommitments or waiver's together with unused balanees aggregate approximately $\$ 750,000.00$. I am pleased also to report that our estimate of increased revenue for the period has been justified. The actual receipts of this fund up to the close of the period had reached $\$ 4.214,436.47$ with approximately $\$ 936,000.00$ yet to come from tax levy and Inheritance tax. This will bring the grand total to $\$ 5,150,000.00$.

Mr. J. S. Temple who was serving as Deputy under Mr. Mulmix, was retained by me on account of his unquestioned ability and knowledge of the State Treasurer's duties. He has proved a most faithful and loyal help to me during my term as Treasurer.

I desire to express my very sincere appreeiation of the many courtesies shown me by the other departments of state. and espeeially by the Auditor's office, with whom onr relations have been most cordial.

## GASOLINE TAX

The receipts from the Gasoline Tax for the two years ending November 30, 1928, were $\$ 7,093,601.94$. In the previous two years they were $\$ 4,009,239.62$.

## INHERITANCE TAX

The receipts from the Inheritance Tax for the past two years were $\$ 1,544.098 .08$. For the previous two years they were $\$ 1,787,219.84$.

## INSURANCE DEPARTMENT

Receipts for this biennial period were $\$ 1,447,142.57$ as against $\$ 1,347,218.70$ for the previous period.

## COMPENSATION INSURANCE

This department shows a fine and steady growth. The receipts in the last two years were $\$ 1,660,987.87$. In the previous bienninm they were $\$ 1,323,788.84$.

## C'ERTIFICATES OF INDEBTEDNESS

The only certificates issued during the past two years amounted to $\$ 209,349.63$. These were used to maintain order in the districts affected by the coal miners' strike of 1927.

## MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE FUND

Receipts for the two vears just closed were $\$ 3,389.721 .30$. In the two previous years they were $\$ 2.975,582.93$. Of the receipts $\$ 1,608,500.00$ were used to redeem 1923 highway bonds.

## FARMI LOANS

There were outstanding farm loans on November 30, 1926. amounting to $\$ 1,035.965 .00$. These have been reduced to $\$ 95 \overline{7}$,730.00 at the present time. The decrease is largely due to foreclosures by the State. The interest collected on these farm loans during these two years is $\$ 111.807 .37$, a considerable part of which was paid by the State when loans were foreclosed.

## SOLDIERS" LOANS

Of the $\$ 200,000$ originally appropriated by the Legislature to aid ex-service men to obtain an education. $\$ 199.525 .00$ was actually loaned. Of this there had been repaid up to Nov. 30, 1926, $\$ 3 \dot{1}, 279.18$. During the last two years we have received $\$ 8,291.47$, leaving still due $\$ 159,954.35$.

## STATEAENT OF BONDED INDEBTEDNESS OF THE STATE OF COLORADO. NOVEMBER 30, 1928

The law governing the ineurrence of bonded indebtedness is found in the Constitution of the State (Sections 3, 4 and 5, Article XI) and in subsequent amendments thereto. There are six issues outstanding as follows:

## Insurrection Bonds, Series 1909

Authorized, $\$ 950,000.00$; actually issned, $\$ 932.300 .00$, interest $3 \%$, due July 1. 1929. All of these bonds have been redeemed with the exception of $\$ 4.100 .00$, and there is money in the Sinking Fund to take eare of these whenever presented. Redeemed druring last biemial period, $\$ 338,100.00$.

## Funding Bonds, Series 1910

Authorized, $\$ 2.115,000.00$; actually issued, $\$ 1,997.800 .00$; interest, $3 \%$. Due Dec. 1, 1960; ontional after Dec. 1, 1920. Of these $\$ 93.900 .00$ were redeemed in the last bienmial period, leaving $\$ 1,605,400.00$ still outstanding, of whieh $\$ 1.466,600.00$ is owned by Permanent School Fund, $\$ 62,900.00$ by the State University $\$ 5,200.00$ by the $A$ gricultural College, $\$ 6,200.00$ by the Compensation Insurance Fund and $\$ 44,100.00$ by the general pnblic. In sinking fund, $\$ 9,801.36$. Interest and sinking fund provided by tax lery.

## Insurrection Bonds, Series 1914

Anthorized, $\$ 1,000,000.00$ : actually issued, $\$ 7.55,900.00$; interest $4 \%$; due .July 1, 1944; optional after July 1, 1934. These bonds are all outstanding. The Permanent School Fund owns $\$ 465,100.00$; the Compensation Fund $\$ 129,000.00$ and the general pnblie $\$ 131,800.00$. Intcrest and sinking fund provided by tax levy.

## National Defense Bonds, Series 1917

Authorized, $\$ 2,500,000.00$; actually issued, $\$ 1,966,000.00$ : interest $41 / 2 \%$. There have been redeemed in the last biennial $\$ 325,000.00$, and there are now outstanding $\$ 229,000.00$, all of which are held by the general public. The interest on these bonds, and the principal are paid by a tax levied on Domestic and Foreign Corporations.

## Highway Bonds, Series 1921

Authorized, $\$ 5,000,000.00$; issued, $\$ 5,000,000.00$; interest $5 \%$; due $\$ 2,000,000.00-1951, \$ 3,000.000 .00-1952 ; \$ 2,000,000.00$ optional 1931, and $\$ 3,000,000.00$ in 1933. Of these bonds $\$ 358$,350.00 are owned by the Compensation Insurance fund, the balance by the public. There is $\$ 480,871.62$ in that sinking fund. Interest and sinking fund provided by tax levy.

## Highway Bonds, Series 1923

Authorized, $\$ 6,000,000.00$; issued, $\$ 6,000,000.00$; interest $5 \%$ : due serially commencing June 1,1934 ; subject to call commencing Dec. 1, 1924. The interest and principal on these bonds are payable from proceeds of motor vehicle registration license fees. During the last biennial there have been $\$ 1,200,000.00$ of these bonds redeemed, and there are now outstanding $\$ 3,200,000.00 ; \$ 583,000.00$ are held by the Compensation Insurance Fund and the balance by the general public. There is now $\$ 140,035.79$ in the Redemption Fund.
