## Sir :

In compliance with Chapter 98, Session Laws of 1929, altering the fiscal year of the State, I have the honor to submit herewith the report of this department, covering the transactions for the period beginning December 1, 1928, and ending June 30, 1930.

The cash and investments on hand November 30, 1928, was $\$ 17,669,353.71$. The receipts for the period were $\$ 46,458,371.54$, the disbursements $\$ 44,964,460.11$, including transfers, leaving a balance on hand of $\$ 19,163,265.14$, cash and investments, on June 30, 1930.

Included in this report is the account showing in detail the receipts, disbursements and the balance on hand in each of the funds at the end of the period.

It is my pleasure to report that, at this date, figures indicate the estimated revenues of the State will more than pay all necessary appropriations made by the legislature, and that, with the revenues yet to come, there will remain, at the end of the present fiscal period, June 30, 1931, an unexpended balance of approximately $\$ 700,000.00$. In this connection, it might be well to state that varions State institutions will have contracted indebtedness in excess of their appropriations, which must be paid from the estimated surplus of $\$ 700,000.00$, and that deficiency appropriations to cover will be necessary.

## Conclusion

My sincere appreciation is duc the other departments of State for their fine co-operation and the many personal courtesies shown me during my incumbency in office. My fellow office workers, because of their efficient assistance, loyalty and uniform courtesy, I shall always gratefully remember.

## STATEMENT OF OUTSTANDING BOND INDEBTEDNESS

On June 30, 1930, the four issues of State Bonds still outstanding were, as follows:

## Funding Bonds, Series 1910

Authorized, $\$ 2,115,000.00$; actually issued, $\$ 1,997,800.00$. Interest, $3 \%$. Due December 1, 1960. (Iptional after December 1, 1920. During the period November 1, 1928, to June 30, 1930, $\$ 72,200.00$ was redeemed, leaving still outstanding $\$ 1,533,200.00$. In sinking fund on June 30, 1930, \$17,440.59. Interest and sinking fund provided by tax levy.

## Insurrection Bonds, Series 1914

Authorized, $\$ 1,000,000.00$; actually issued, $\$ 725,900.00$. Interest, $4 \%$. Due July 1, 1944. Optional after July 1, 1934. These bonds are all outstanding. Interest and sinking fund provided by tax levy.

Highiway Bonds, Series 1921
Authorized, $\$ 5,000,000.00$; issued, $\$ 5,000,000.00$. Interest, $5 \%$. Due $\$ 2,000,000.00$ in 1951, $\$ 3,000,000.00$ in 1952. Optional, $\$ 2,000,000.00$ in 1931 and $\$ 3,000,000.00$ in 1933. During the period, $\$ 60,000.00$ was redeemed, leaving $\$ 4,940,000.00$ outstanding. In sinking fund, $\$ 814,347.01$. Interest and sinking fund provided by tax levy.

## Highway Bonds, Series 1923

Authorized, $\$ 6,000,000.00$; issued, $\$ 6,000,000.00$. Interest, $5 \%$. Due serially, commencing June 1, 1934. Subject to call commencing December 1, 1924. Interest and principal payable from proceeds of motor vehicle registration license fees. During the period November 30, 1928, to June 30, 1930, $\$ 1,390,000.00$ was redeemed, leaving still outstanding $\$ 1,810,000.00$. In redemption fund, \$75,308.64.

In addition to the above, there was redeemed during the period, $\$ 44,100.00$ of the outstanding 1909 Funding Bonds, and $\$ 229,000.00$ of the outstanding 1917 National Defense Bouds, thus retiring all of both of these issues.

## SOLDIERS' LOANS

The Twenty-second General Assembly, 1919, appropriated $\$ 200,000.00$ and authorized the loan therefrom, on five-vear promissory notes, an amount not to exceed $\$ 200.00$ in any one case, to soldiers and sailors for the purpose of assisting in the payment of their expenses for vocational education or other training in any school or educational institution of the State.

Interest was waived for the first three years and was fixed at $8 \%$ per annum for the ensuing two years.

Of this $\$ 200,000.00$ appropriation, there was so distributed \$199,525.00.

Comprising interest and principal, there has been repaid to the State on account of these loans $\$ 42,021.05$, including $\$ 2.450 .40$ repaid to the State during the period from December 1, 1928, to June 30, 1930.

# FARM LOANS, ACCOUNT PUBLIC SCHOOL INVESTMENT FUND 

Outstanding Farm Loans on November 30, 1928, were \$957,730.00. On June 30, 1930, there was outstanding $\$ 988,217.00$, an increase of $\$ 30,487.00$.
