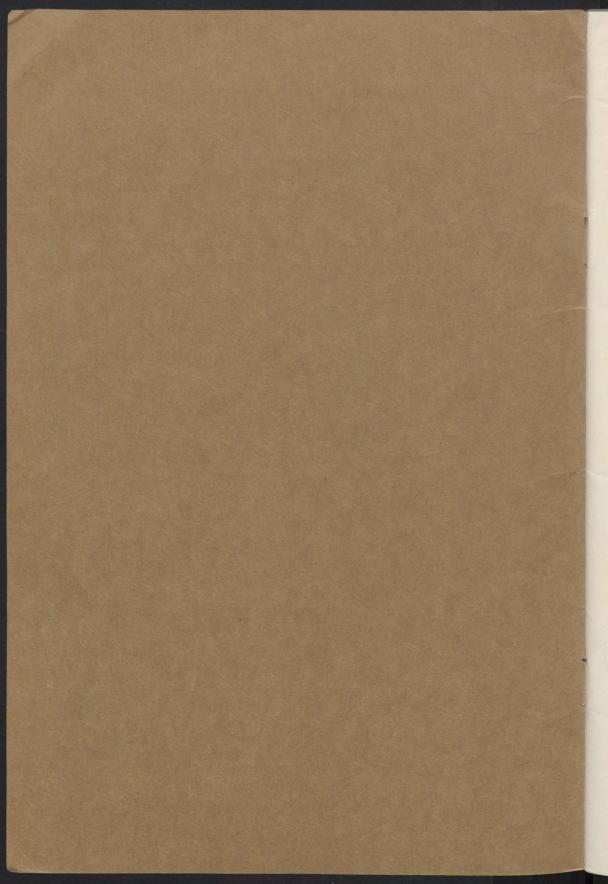

#### LETTER OF TRANSMITTAL

Honorable Dan Thornton Governor of the State of Colorado Denver, Colorado

Sir:

Submitted herewith the 38th Biennial Report of the Treasury Department for the period July 1, 1950, to June 30, 1952.

At the request of the State Treasurer, the Legislature passed a measure authorizing the redemption of the remaining \$436,900.00 of the 1910 Funding Bonds. The Bonds were promptly retired and thus saved for the State several thousands of dollars in interest payments.

The Treasurer also requested and was granted the passage of an Act (House Bill No. 266) authorizing the State Treasurer, in his discretion, to enter into contracts with banks in the State of Colorado for deposits of State funds at an interest rate of not less than one per cent per annum, for periods of six months to two years; and to invest public funds in Anticipation Warrants issued by the State of Colorado against mill levies.

Investments in United States Government short-term securities for the period January, 1951, to June 30, 1952 (18 months) have earned for the General Fund in interest the sum of 354,490.00 As of this date, June 30, 1952, this office has invested in United States Government short-term securities \$22,902,980.00, which, as of December 31, 1952, will earn in interest the further sum of not less than 90,000.00

 The balance of all Cash Funds deposited with the State Treasurer at the close of business on June 30, 1952, amounted to \$56,967,365.59.

On May 13, 1952, the Daily Cash Balance reached an all-time high of \$60,750,505.49.

Our State is in a very healthy financial condition and, by due diligence on the part of those holding supervision over expenditures, it can be kept so.

The opportunity to serve as Treasurer of this great State of Colorado has been a pleasure and a challenge to operate the Department on a business basis. All my fellow workers have rendered invaluable assistance. The cooperation extended by the Executive Office and all departments of the State and their employees is deeply appreciated.
