Mission



Student Engagement

Career Development

The center's relationships with companies and firms both locally in Colorado and nationally helped connect students to internships in-house at technology companies, in private practice at firms, and in public service and policy at governmental agencies.



IETC

On February 19, 2022, the Daniels Fund Ethics Initiative Collegiate Program at Colorado Law, the Collegiate Program at Leeds School of Business, and Silicon Flatirons hosted the fifth annual Interdisciplinary Ethics Tech Competition. Graduate students from across campus — in disciplines including law, business, engineering and communications — came together in teams to tackle a case problem involving a fictional gathering of decision makers working on the possibility of developing a process for contract tracing in the US. Students considered issues such as regulation, privacy, voluntary participation, equitable distribution of testing and medical care, and the use of technology.

Startup Summer

Startup Summer 2021, served 20 students. Over 20 guest speakers from across the Front Range contributed their time and expertise to advise participants on how to build a company. Student participants gave effusive feedback, both in anonymous exit surveys and on the record, about the program's value. At the outset of last summer, the program had 50% job placements, and by the end of the summer, 85% placement was achieved.

Spectrum Policy Initiative Welcomes Keith Gremban as New Co-director

In fall 2021, the center welcomed Dr. Keith Gremban as a new co-director of its Spectrum Policy Initiative. Gremban has been a long-time community member with Silicon Flatirons, and was appointed as a Senior Fellow with the Spectrum Policy Initiative in 2020. He is a nationally recognized expert on wireless communications systems and joined Dale Hatfield, longtime Spectrum Policy Initiative co-director and distinguished advisor, in his new role.

Gremban replaced JP de Vries, who announced his new role as director emeritus and distinguished advisor of Silicon Flatirons. De Vries became a fellow of Silicon Flatirons in 2008 and co-director of its Spectrum Policy Initiative in 2012.

Silicon Flatirons Scholars Influence FCC Receivers Proceeding

In April 2022, the FCC unanimously started a proceeding that will explore ways to promote, in its words, the efficient use of spectrum through improved receiver interference immunity performance.

The Notice of Inquiry reflects the pioneering work that JP de Vries and especially Dale Hatfield have been doing on this topic for many years. The NOI cites several Silicon Flatirons reports and describes five FCC Technological Advisory Council (TAC) white papers that included Hatfield and/or De Vries as authors. Receiver issues were addressed in several Silicon Flatirons events, including a summit in 2009 and a conference in 2010.


