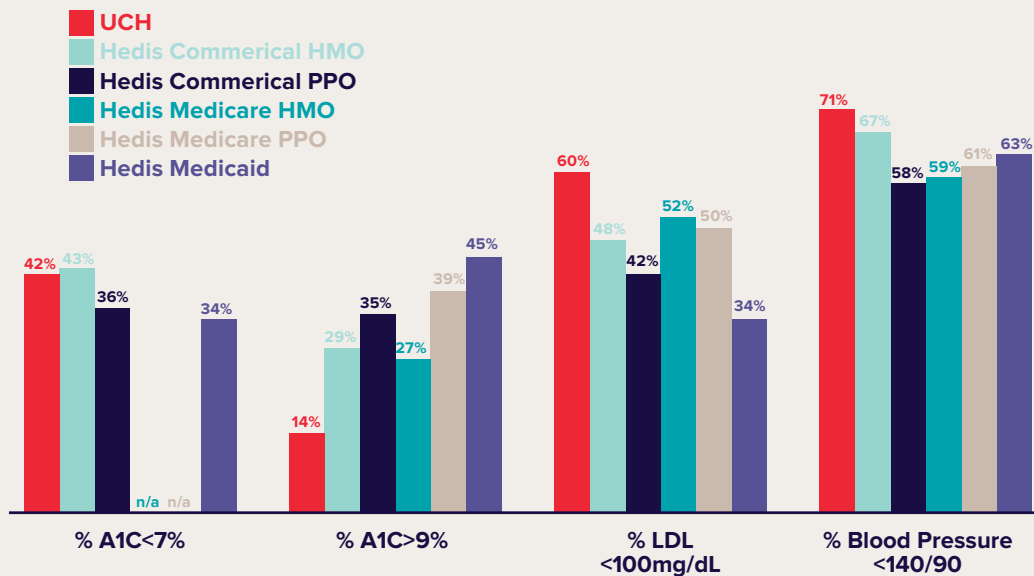

Comparison to 2010 HEDIS Report National Committee for Quality Assurance (NCQA)



UCH patients consistently rank far better in their disease management and control. 73% of UCH patients have an LDL of <100 and 54% have good control over their glucose levels.
