Poudre River Bulletin.

July 2 to 8, 1902.—The river has shown a steady decrease during the week from an average of slightly over 600 cubic feet on July 2, to 430 cubic feet on July 9. This includes approximately 100 cubic feet from other watersheds. This is slightly better than the corresponding week in 1896. With the exception of that year, this is the lowest given by our record. The rainfall for the week has been .18 inch.
