August 13 to 19, 1902.—For the week the river has still further decreased. The average has been but 152 feet as against 338 for the normal. The corres ponding week in 1898 was still lower, and in 1889 practically as low, so that the low stream is not unprecedented. This year, however, about one-third has come from the ditches on other watersheds.

The reservoirs have been drawn on for some weeks, and have been important sources of water for the later crops. Nearly all the reservoirs have been drawn down considerably. Exchanging has been active and some new exchanges have developed from the new reservoirs and the strenuous conditions of this summer.
