Poudre River Bulletin.

Sept. 10 to 16, 1902.—During the week the discharge of the river has remained nearly constant. The average of the week has been 78 cubic feet per second, a decrease of 18 cubic feet from the average of the previous week. This includes about twenty cubic feet per second from over the range.

The precipitation at the college has only amounted to a trace so far this month. A severe freeze of the morning of the 12th, occurring about one month earlier than usual will materially decrease the need of water for growing crops.
