Organization:


Structure: The Colorado State Forest Service (CSFS) is a center of the Warner College of Natural Resources at Colorado State University and provides staffing for the Division of Forestry at the Colorado Department of Natural Resources.

Facilities: Services are provided through the State Office in Fort Collins and 19 offices throughout Colorado.

Leadership: Mike Lester, State Forester and Director

Employees: 175 (93 full-time; 9 part-time; 73 seasonals)

Volunteers: 163 individuals for 1,708 hours, plus 75 youth volunteers for 727 youth hours



*This does not include a \$5.0 million Forest Legacy Grant to purchase a land conservation easement.

Focus:

Forest health, sustainability and stewardship through programs and services, such as:

- Technical assistance for landowners
- Forestry and fire mitigation outreach and information
- Urban and community forestry
- Forest health assessment, inventory and analysis
- Insect and disease surveying and monitoring
- Forest product marketing and utilization
- Forest management on state lands

- Watershed protection
- Wildfire mitigation and fuels treatment planning and implementation
- Seedling trees and shrubs grown for reforestation and conservation
- Other programs, such as:
- Forest Agriculture Classification
- Forest Legacy
- Forest Stewardship



2015 Accomplishments:

Private, state and local government acres treated: 17,821, to reduce wildfire hazards, produce wood products, protect watersheds and improve wildlife habitat

New, updated or reviewed forest stewardship plans: 75, developed to assist landowners to meet specific landowner objectives. Acres covered: 13,868

Seedling trees: 520,087 (FY 15), grown and distributed for conservation and restoration purposes Forested properties managed: 678, through the Colorado Forest Agriculture Classification program to produce tangible wood products, primarily to obtain a monetary profit

Educational programs: 379+, reaching more than 21,000 Coloradans on insects and diseases, wildfire mitigation, forest marketing and utilization, community forestry and environmental education

Landowners served by CSFS: 1,950, through the provision of technical forestry assistance Firewise Communities/USA[®] in Colorado: 128 communities, better prepared for wildfire through assistance from the CSFS. Colorado is the third state to have 100+ communities receiving this designation.

Community Wildfire Protection Plans: 228, to protect lives and property in Colorado

Tree City USA[®] communities in Colorado: 95, and 5 Tree Campus USA[®] recognitions
