Colorado State University is a land-grant institution and a Carnegie Research University R1: Doctoral University (Very High Research Activity). CSU was founded as the Colorado Agricultural College in 1870, six years before the Colorado Territory gained statehood. It was one of 68 land-grant colleges established under the Morrill Act of 1862. The doors opened to a freshman class of 20 students in 1879. In 1935, the school became the Colorado State College of Agriculture and Mechanic Arts, or Colorado A & M, and was renamed Colorado State University in 1957.







Fall 2018 Undergraduate Enrollment by College and Gender - Percent of Students



Fall 2018 Undergraduate Enrollment by College and Minority Status - Percent of Students



Fall 2018 Undergraduate Enrollment by College and International Status - Percent of Students



Fall 2018 Undergraduate Enrollment by College and Registration Type - Percent of Students



Fall 2018 Undergraduate Enrollment by College and Residency - Percent of Students




Fall 2018 Graduate Enrollment by College and Residency - Percent of Students




Fall 2018 CCHE Index Distribution



Fall 2010 to Fall 2018 Percent Change in New Freshman by College








Fall Term New Freshman First-Year CSU Grade Point Average - Fall 2017 Entering Freshmen

First-Year CSU Grade Point Average and CDHE Index




First-Year CSU GPA Distribution - Number of Students








Degrees Awarded by Degree Category and STEM Status - Percent of Students


Degrees Awarded by Degree Category and Gender - Percent of Students





History of New Freshman Retention and Graduation Rates




History of Transfer Students 2nd-Fall Persistence and Graduation Rates


Freshman Retention by Residency - Comparison with Total














Transfer 2nd-Fall Persistent by Residency - Comparison with Total


Transfer Students 3-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total


Transfer Students 3.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total


Transfer Students 4-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total


Transfer Students 4.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total


History of University Employees - Tenure-Track Faculty


History of University Employees - Special Faculty














Institutional Support Expenditures as a Percent of Total Expenditures


Women Assistant Professors as a Percent of All Assistant Professors







- Almost nine out of ten undergraduates had secured a job offer or had plans for employment or further education.
- Over 1,600 unique employers hired Rams.
- Approximately 180 unique schools admitted CSU undergrads for further education.
- 75% of employed undergraduates secured positions in Colorado, while the rest found employment in 46 states and the District of Columbia.
- The average starting salary (full-time, permanent) reported by undergraduates across fields of study: \$49,262


- OURA facilitates customized research placements across all disciplines at Colorado State University

- OURA runs several research academies ranging from the Academy of STEM Scholars to the Academy of Historical & Cultural Research Scholars.
- OURA facilitates the transcripting of research and artistry experiences through the Mentored Research and Artistry Program.
- OURA is home to the prestigious Honors Undergraduate Research Scholars (HURS) Program.

Education Abroad by Country, 2017-18









Five-Year Tuition History






Five-Year Mandatory Fee History








