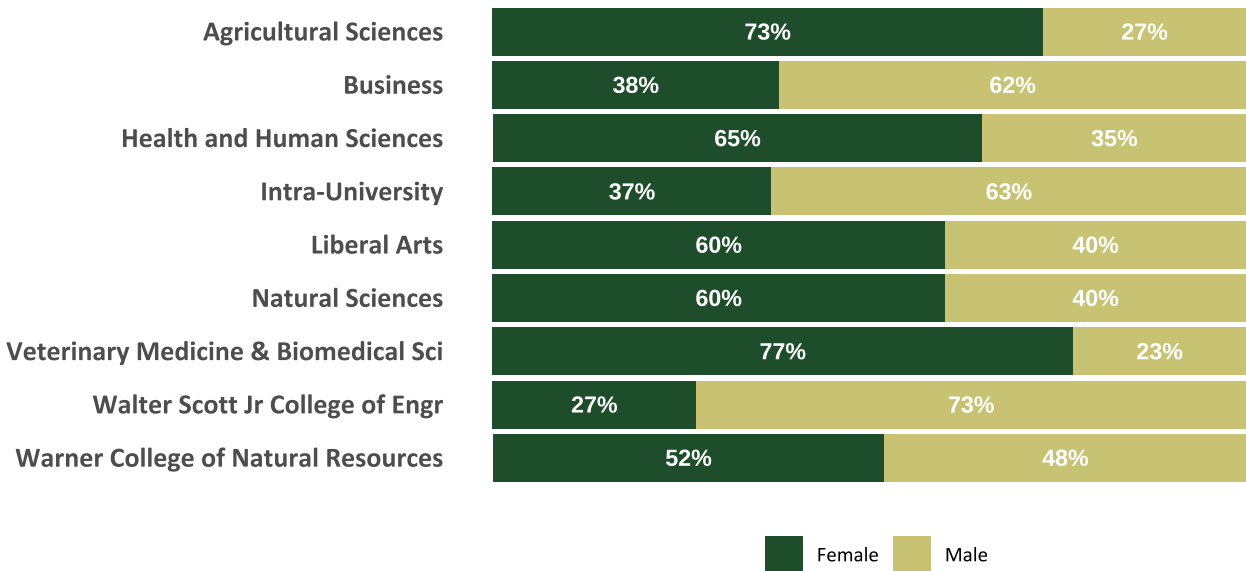

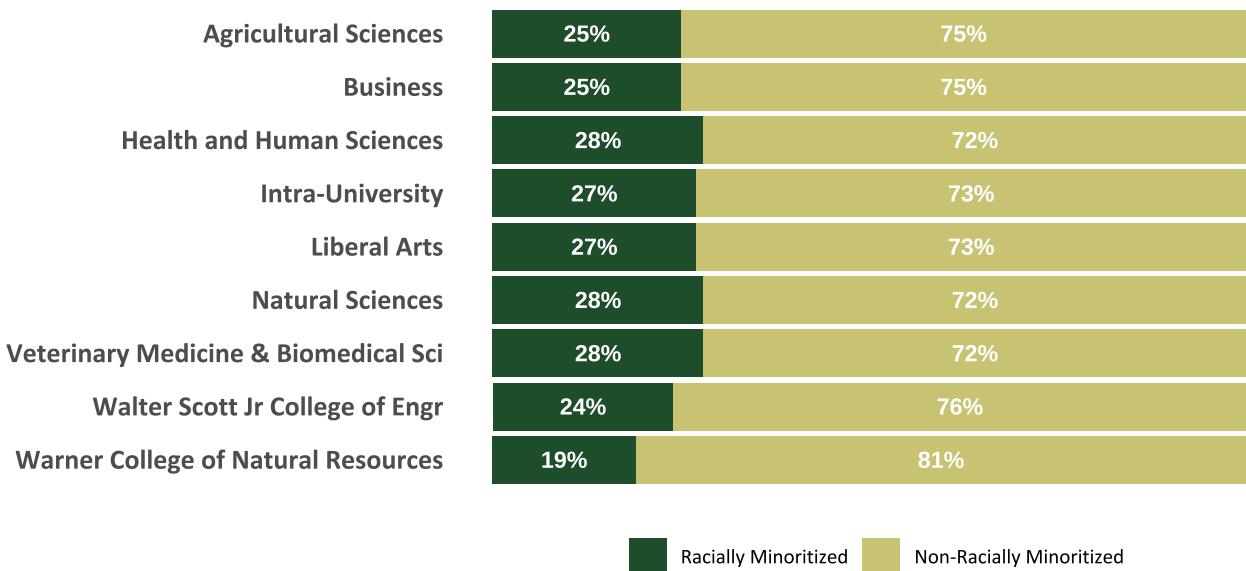

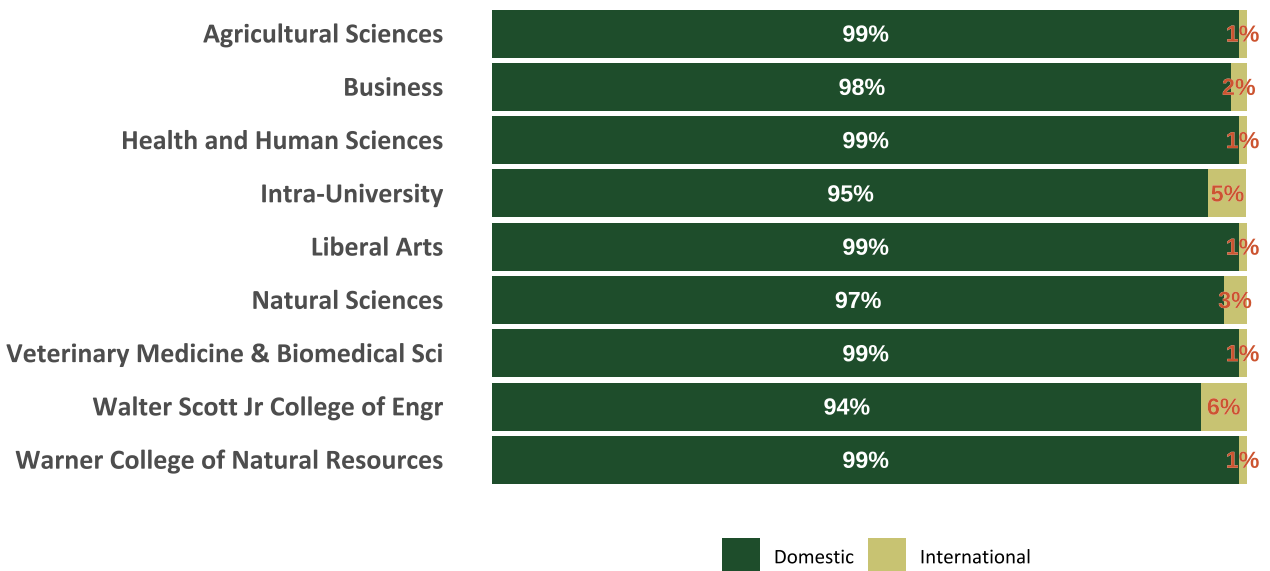

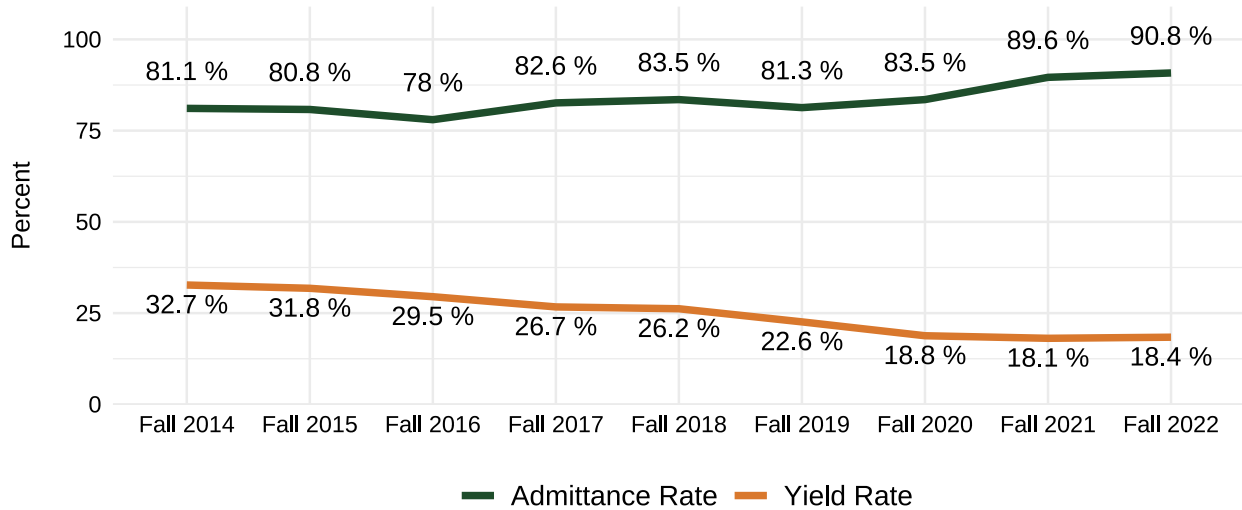
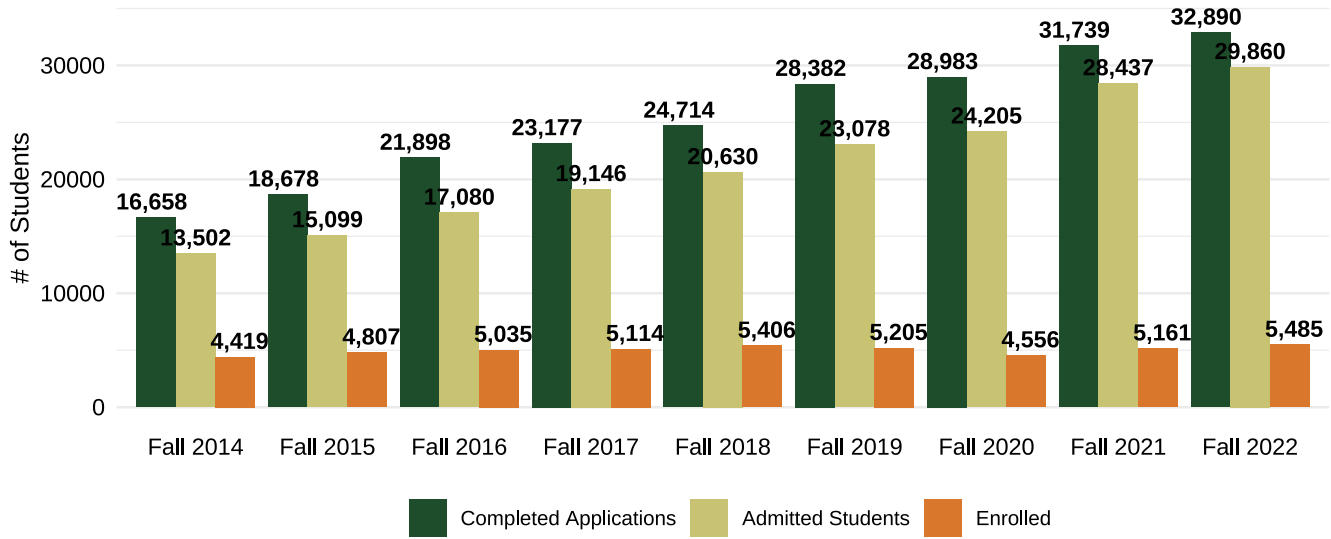
Percent Change in Freshmen by Application College from Fall 2014 to Fall 2022

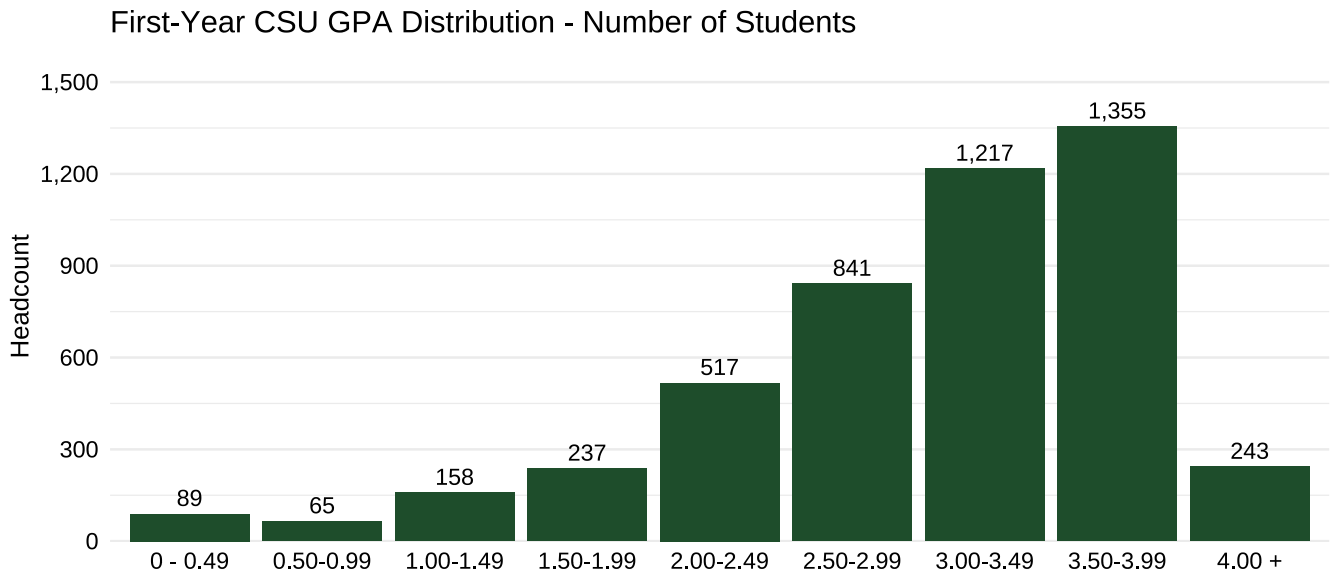

Fall 2021 Entering Freshman First-Year CSU Grade Point Average (including summer starts)⁵

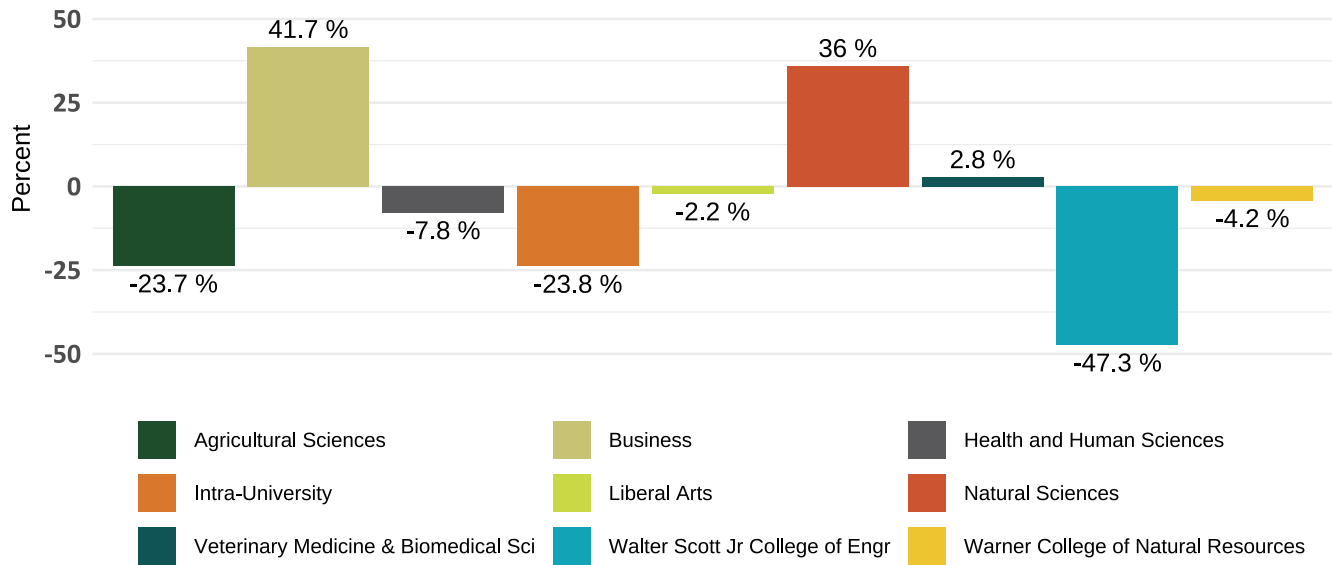

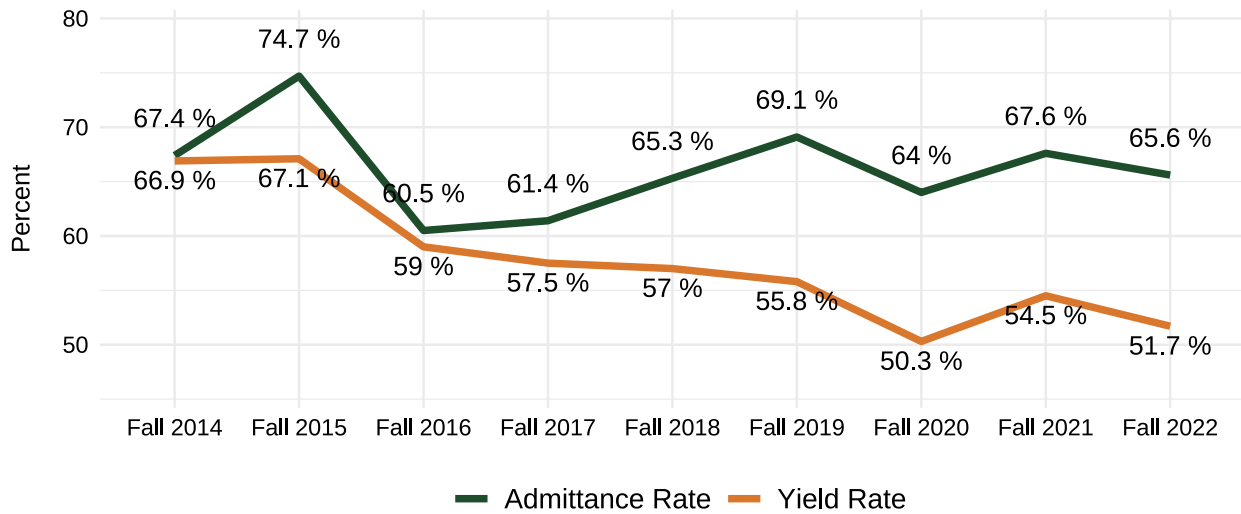
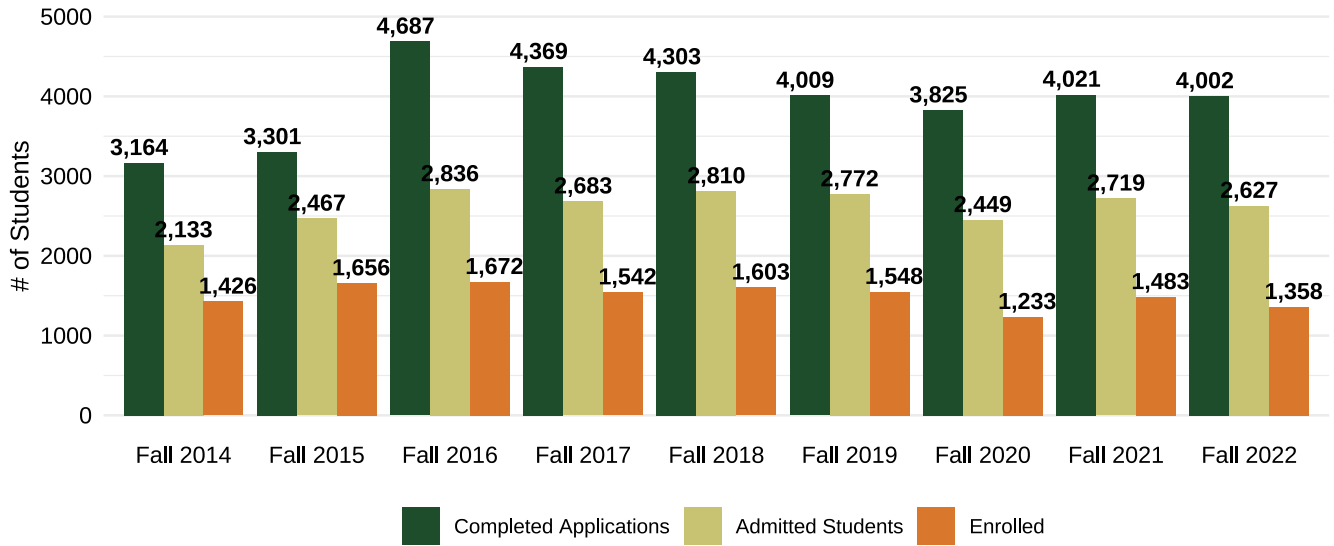
Percent Change in Transfer Undergraduate by Enrollment from Fall 2014 to Fall 2022

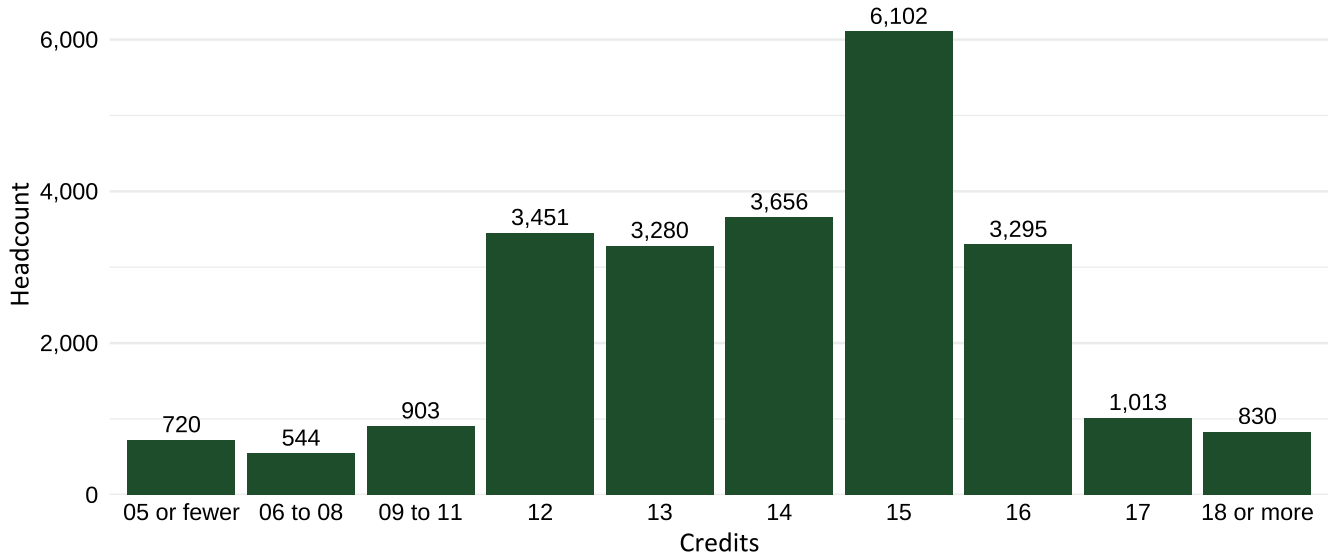

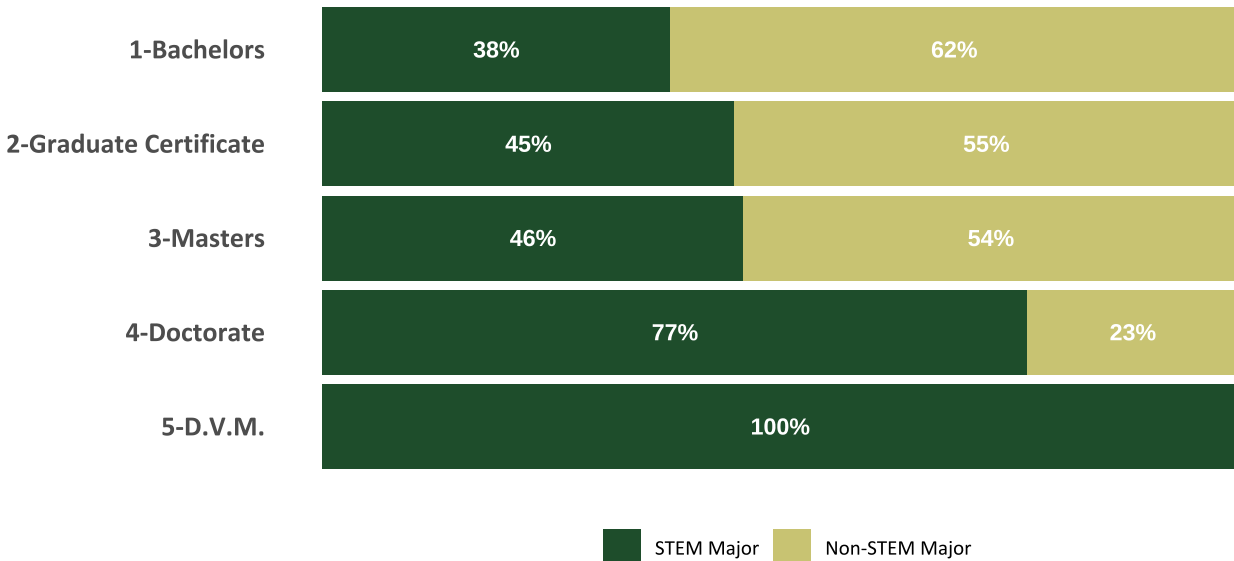

Percent of Degrees



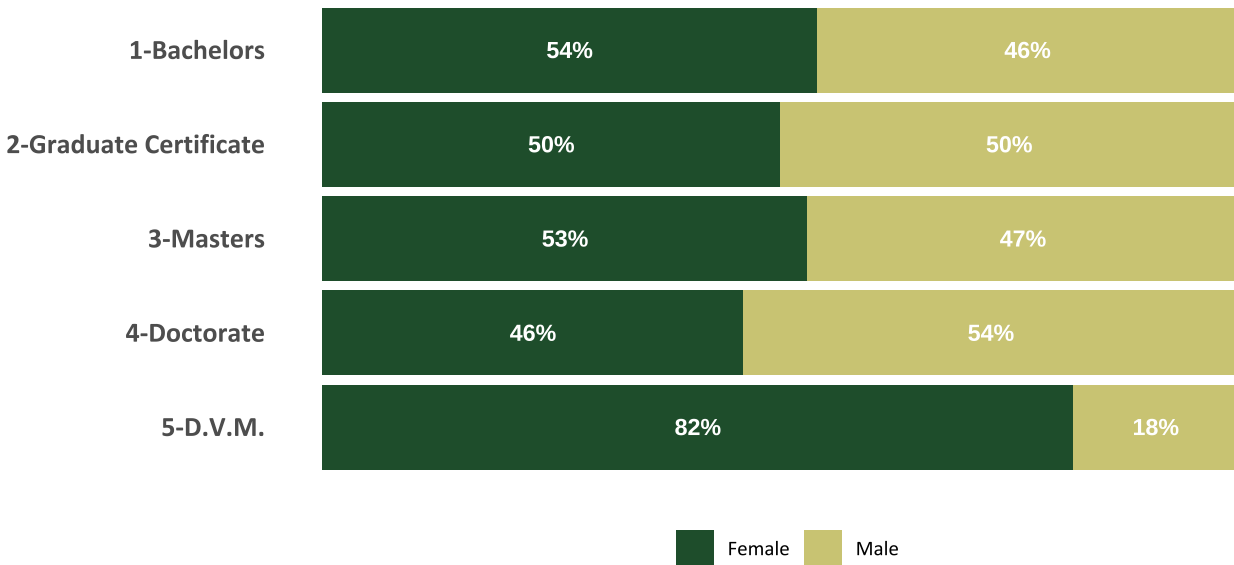

Percent of Degrees



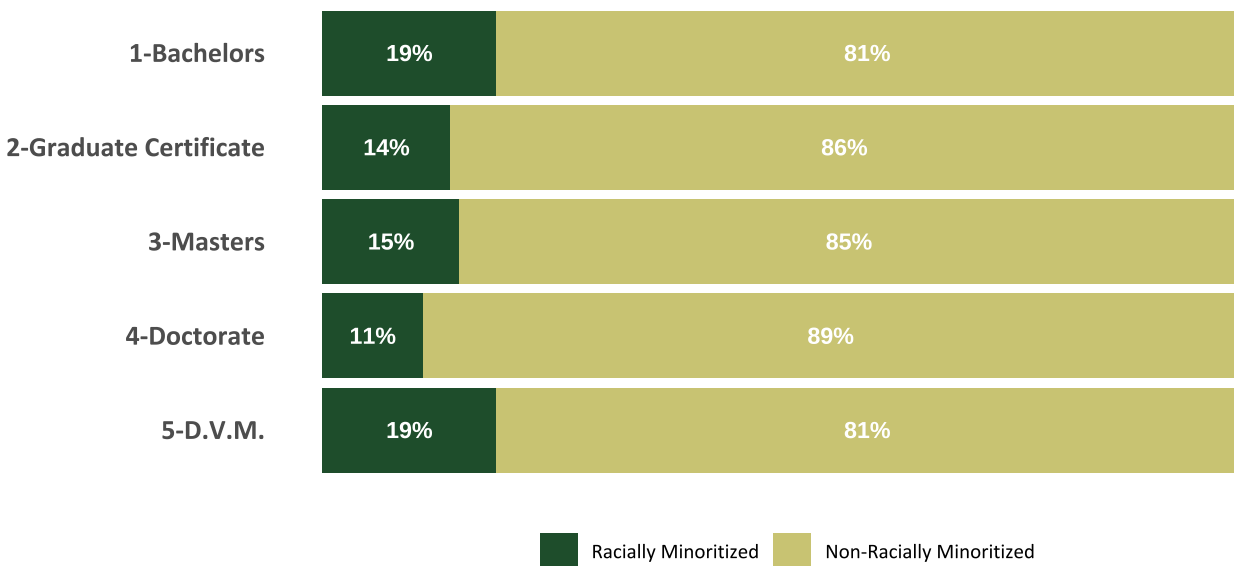

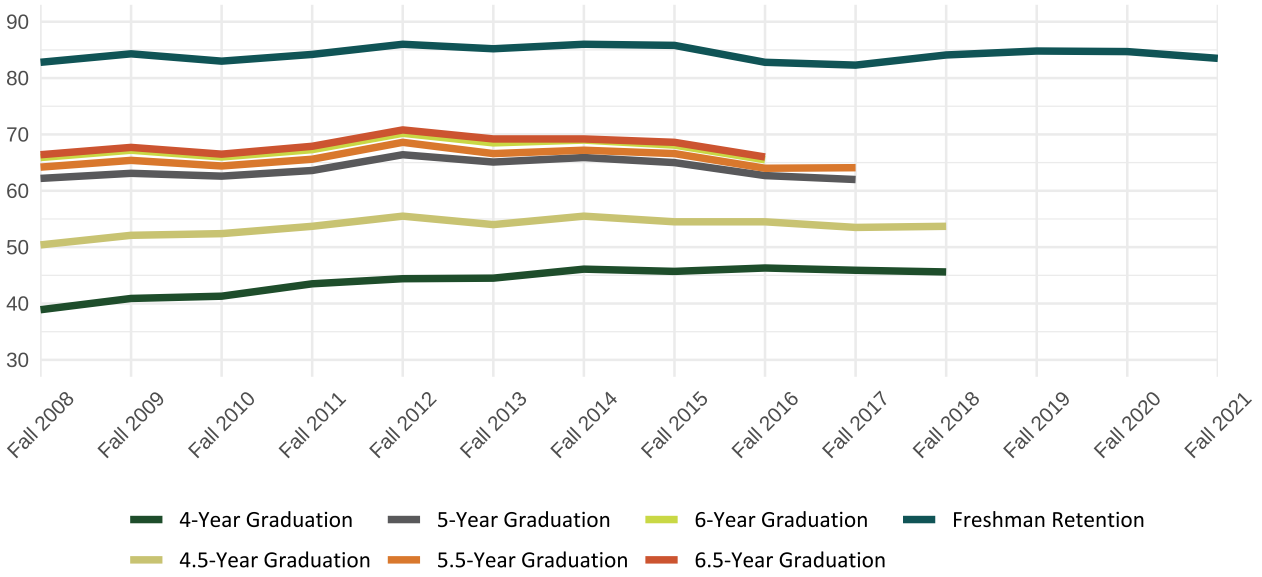

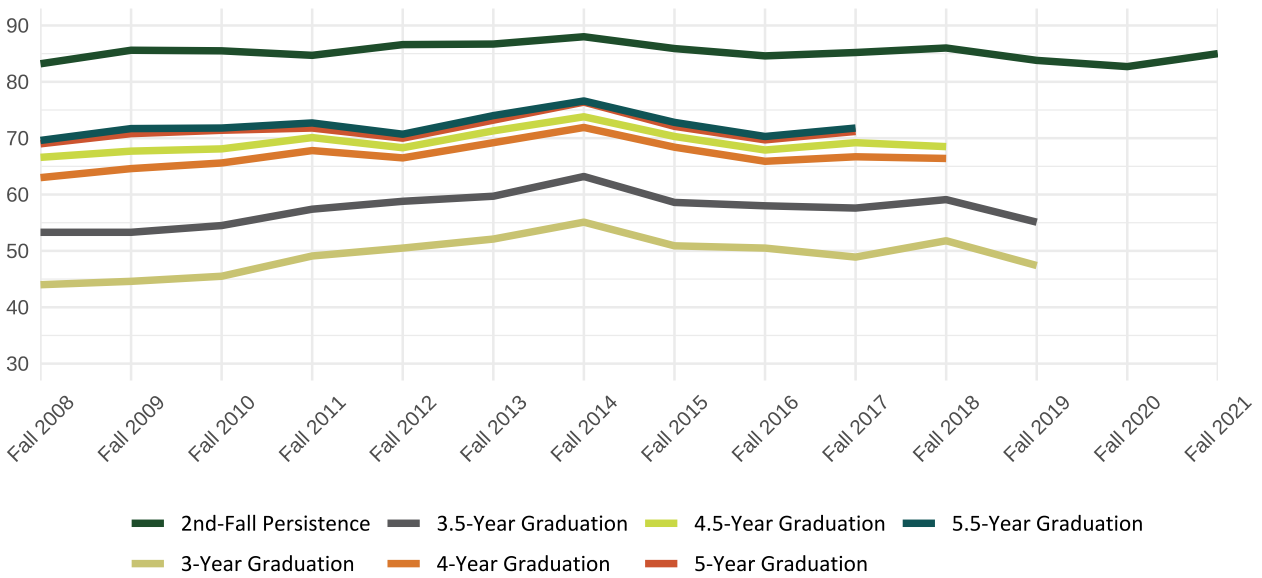

Transfer Students 2nd-Fall Persistence and Graduation Rates History²



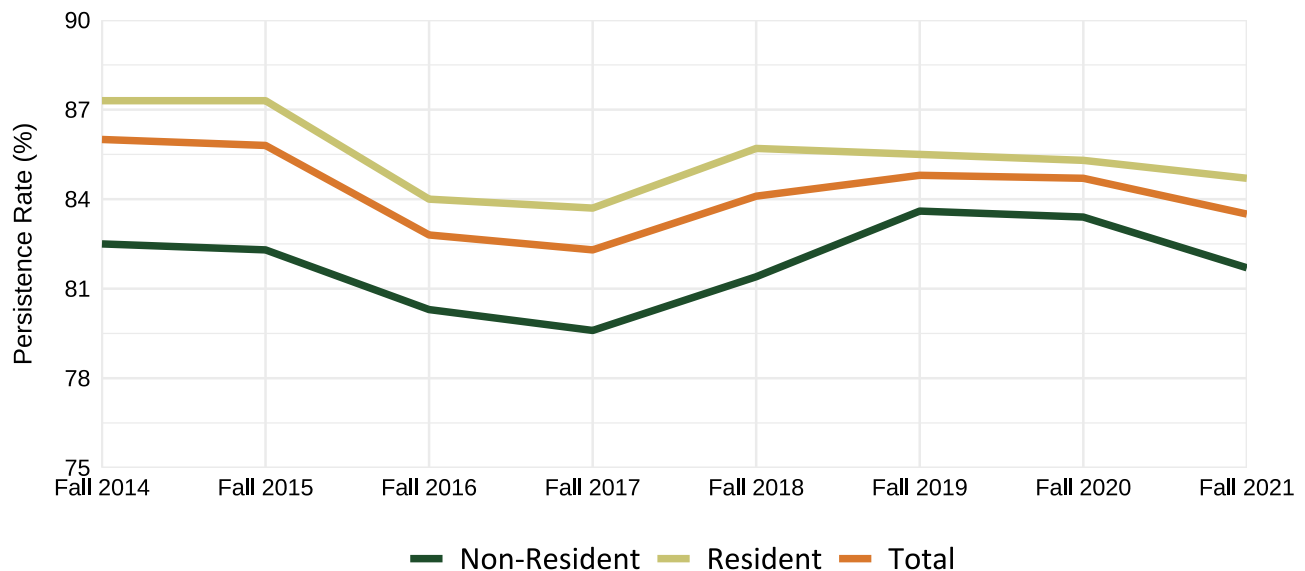

Freshman Retention by Residency - Comparison with Total

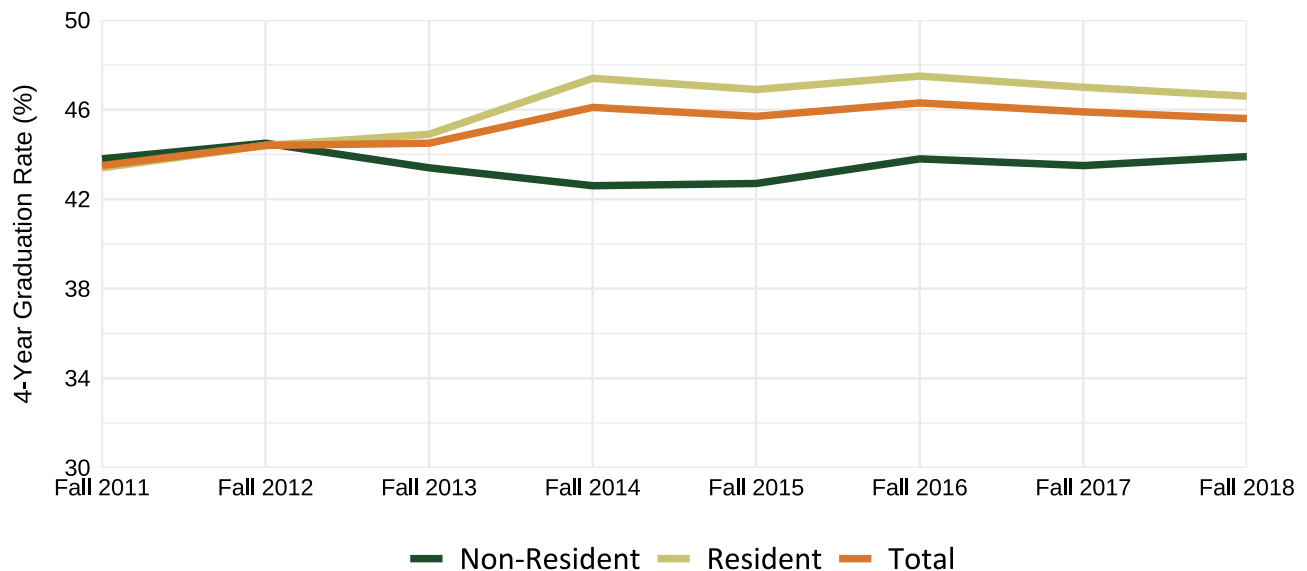

Freshman 4-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

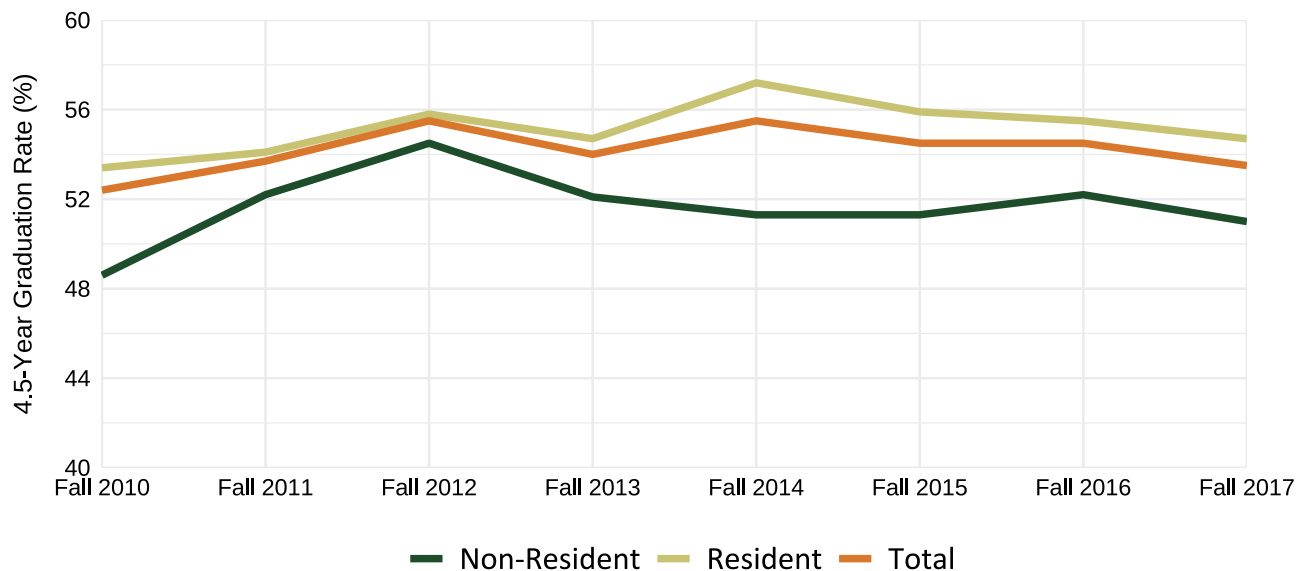

Freshman 4.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

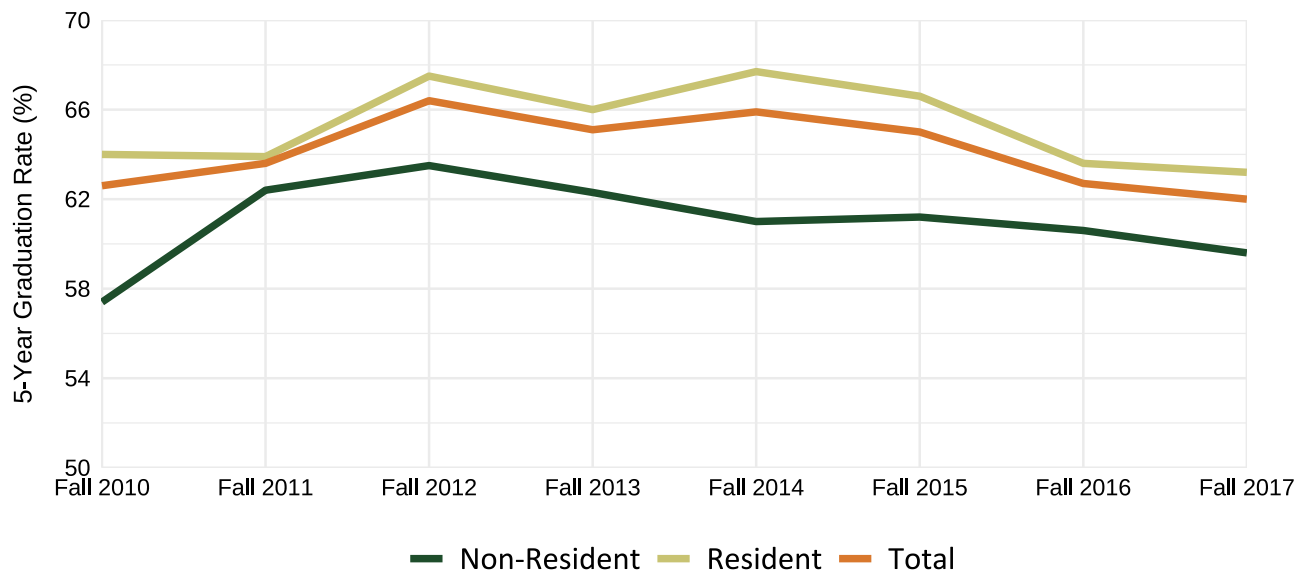

Freshman 5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

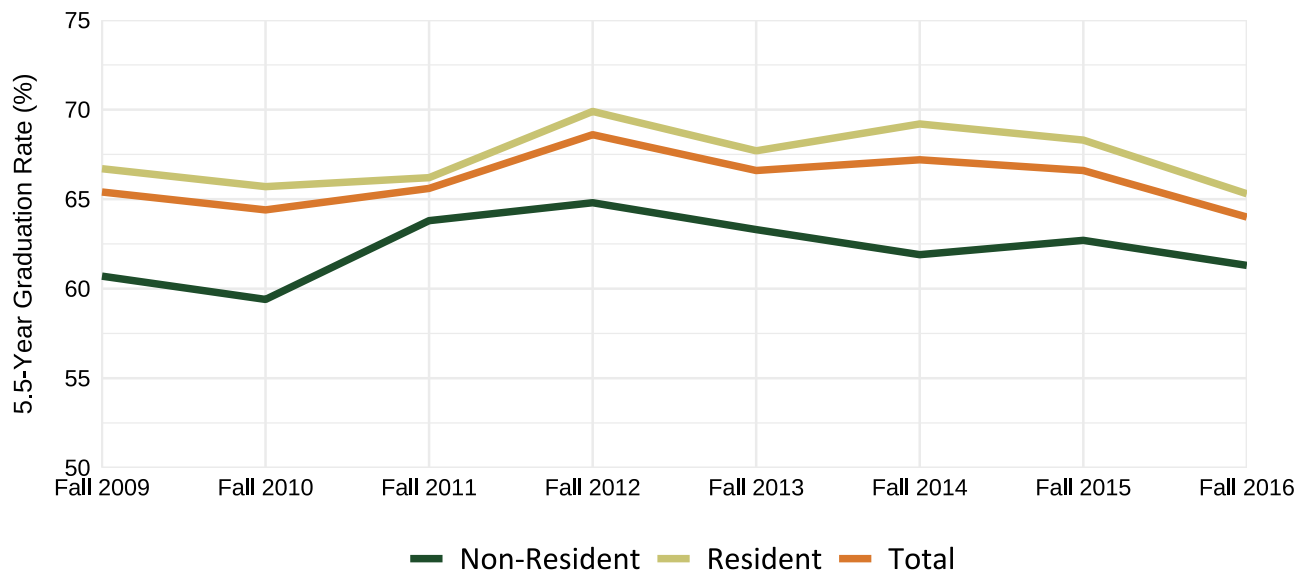

Freshman 5.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

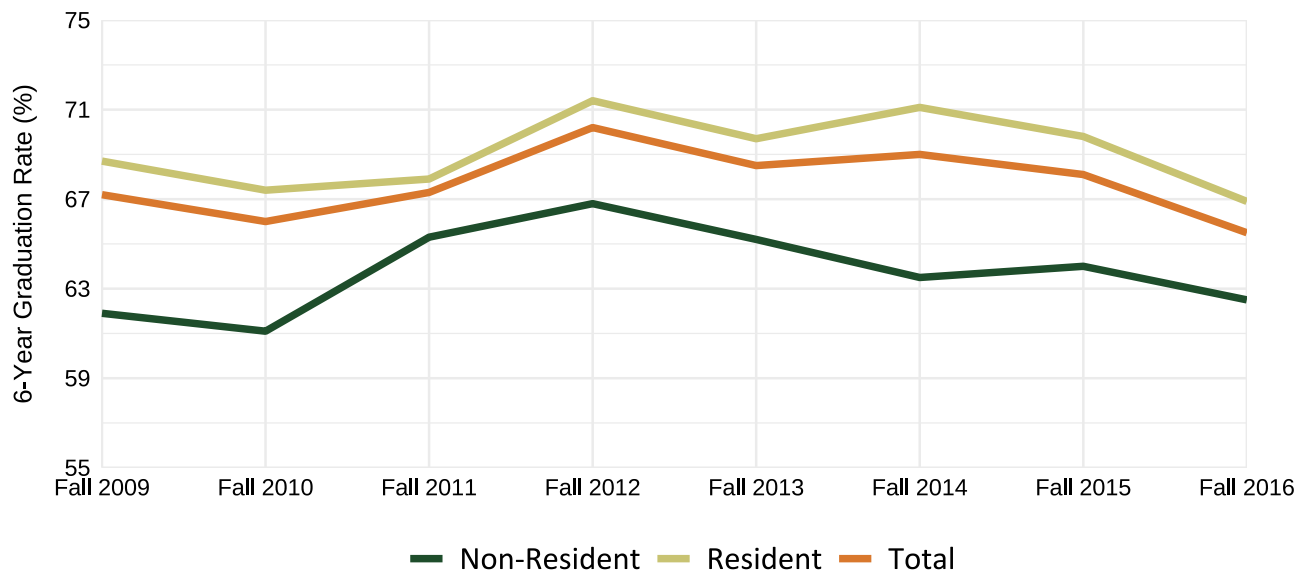

Freshman 6-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

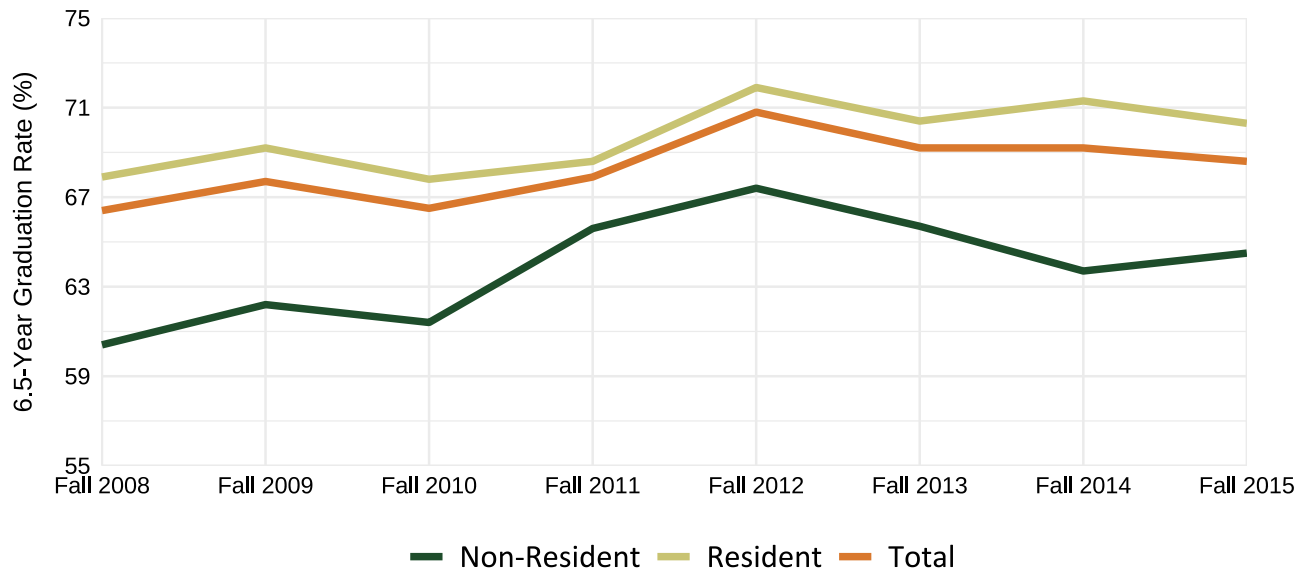

Freshman 6.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

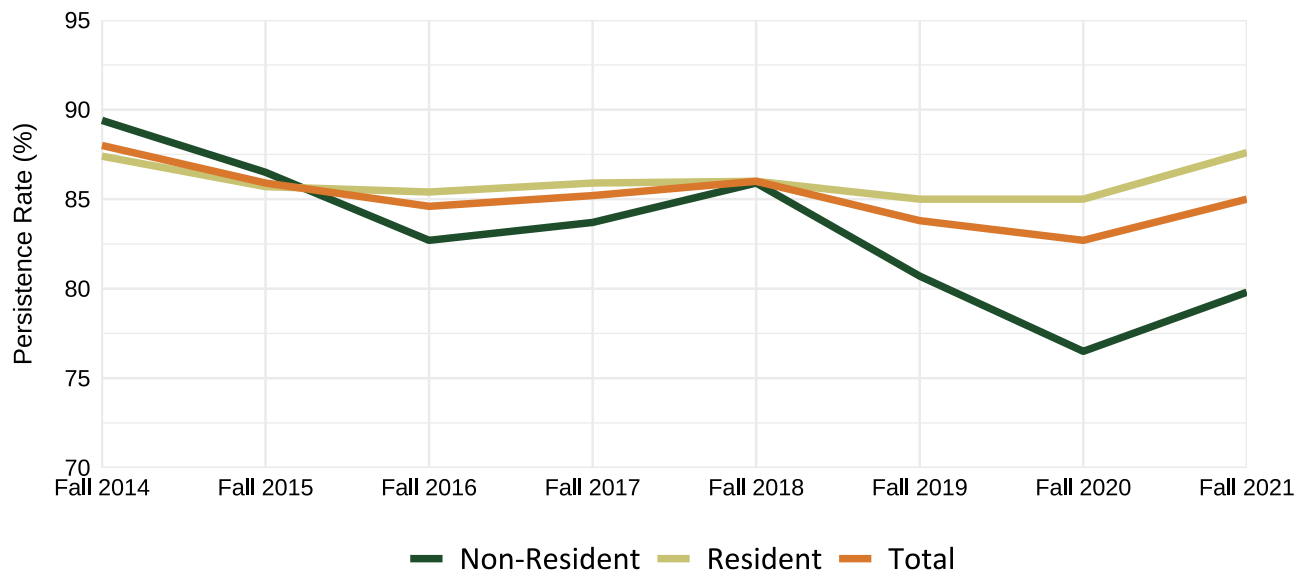

Transfer 2nd-Fall Persistence by Residency - Comparison with Total

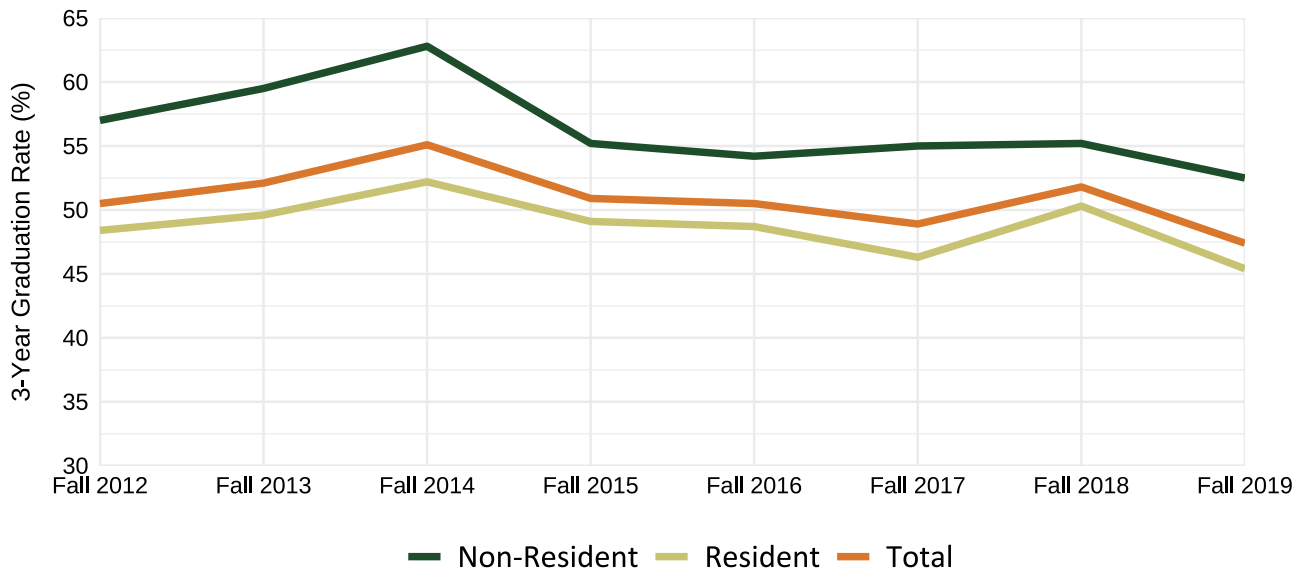

Transfer 3-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

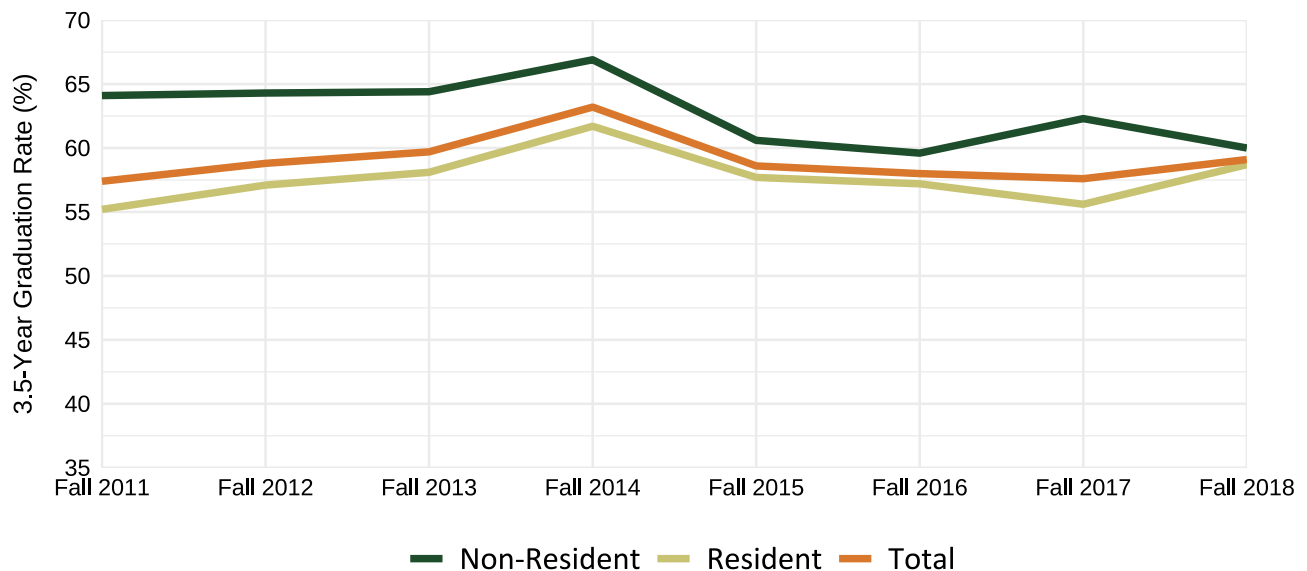

Transfer 3.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

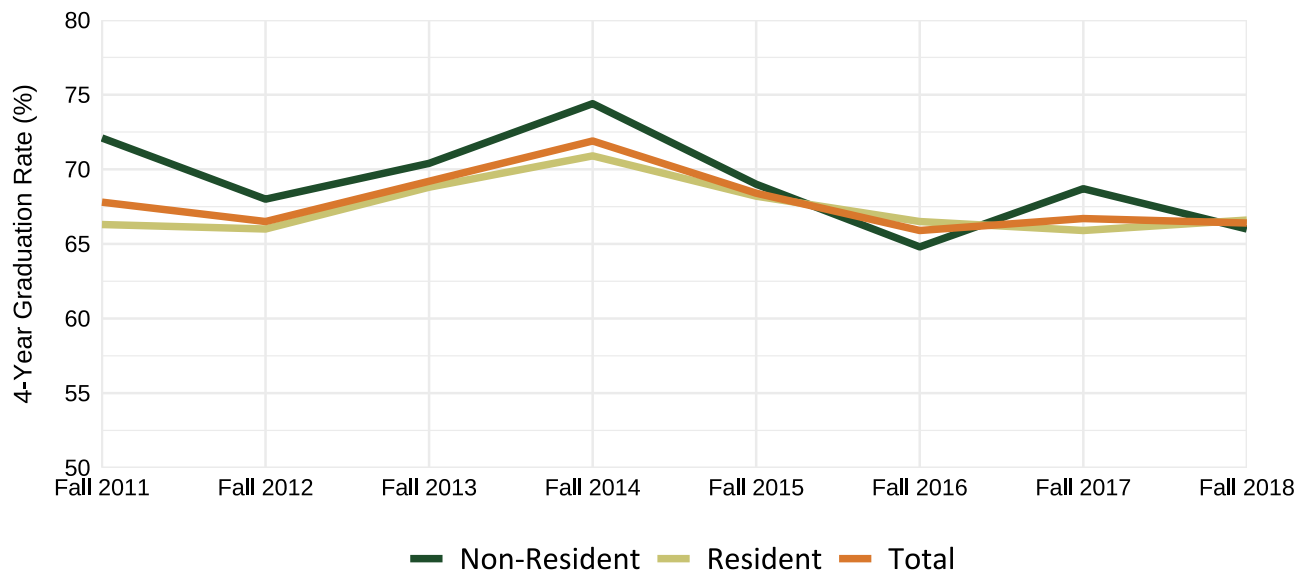

Transfer 4-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

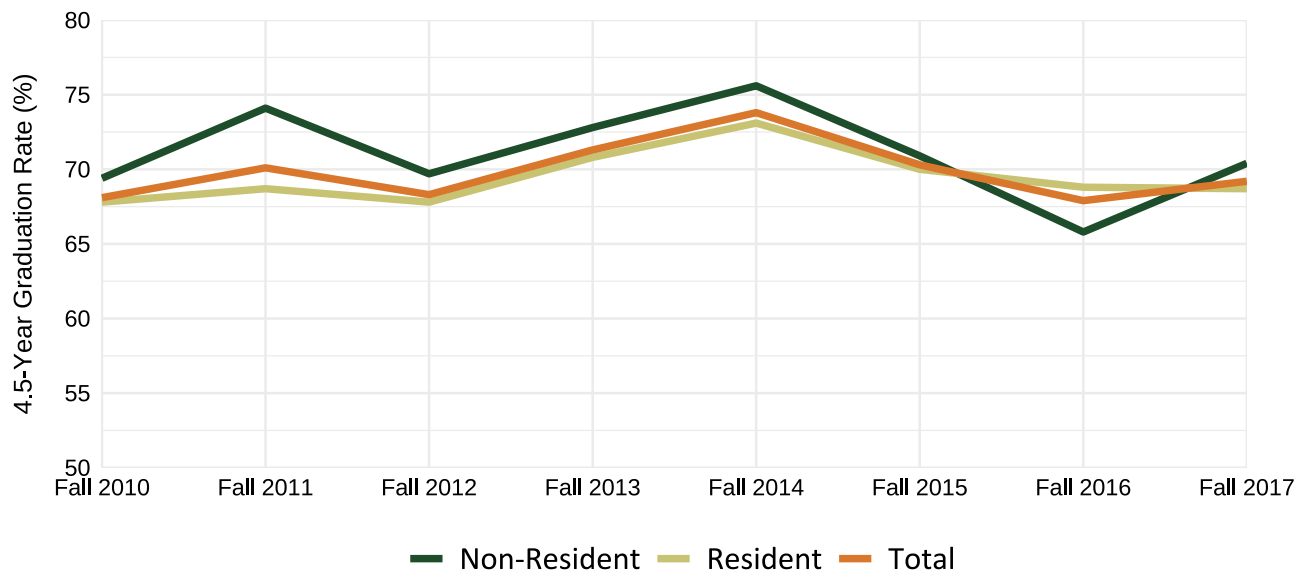

Transfer 4.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

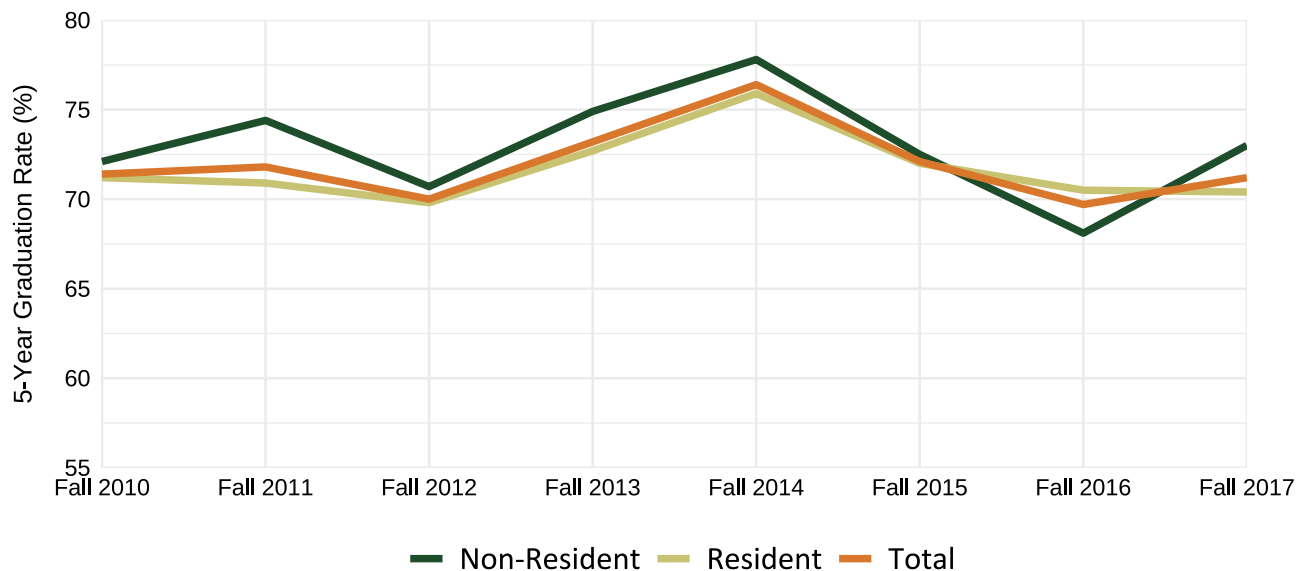

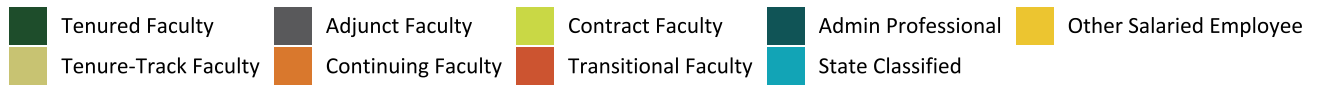

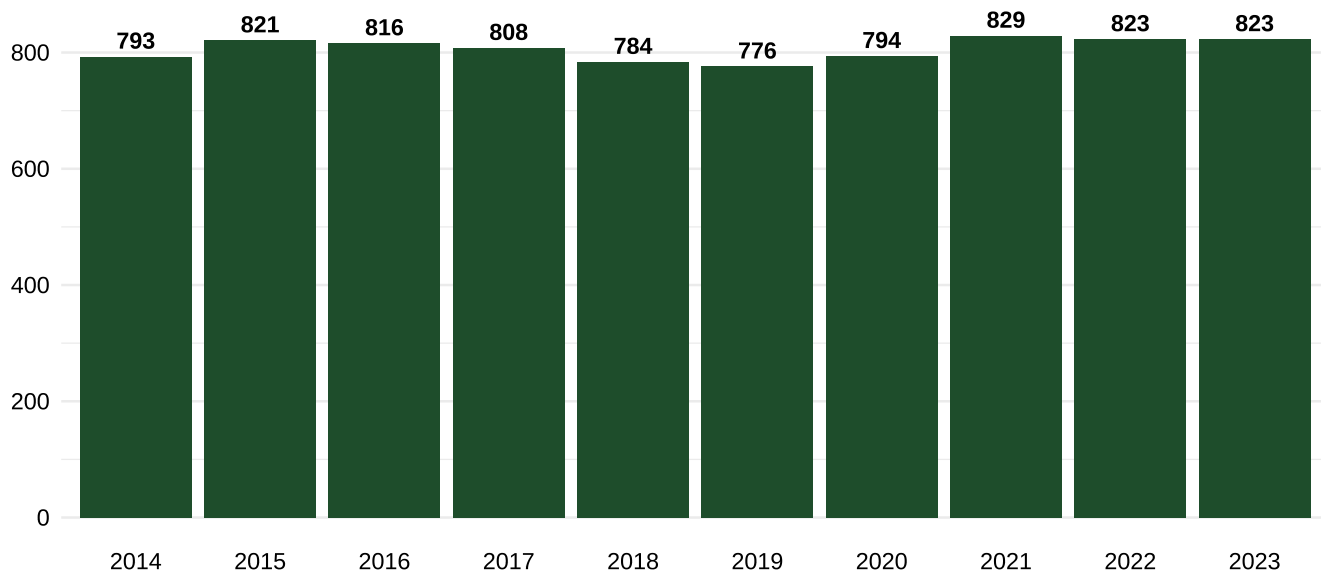

History of Admin Professional Employees⁶



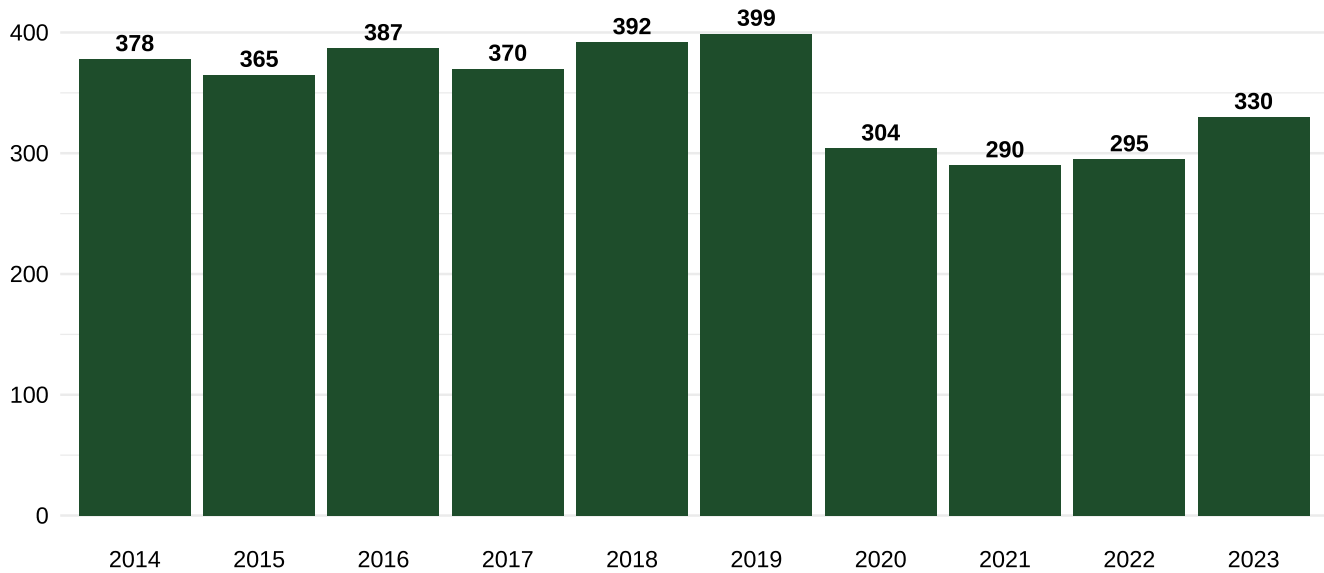

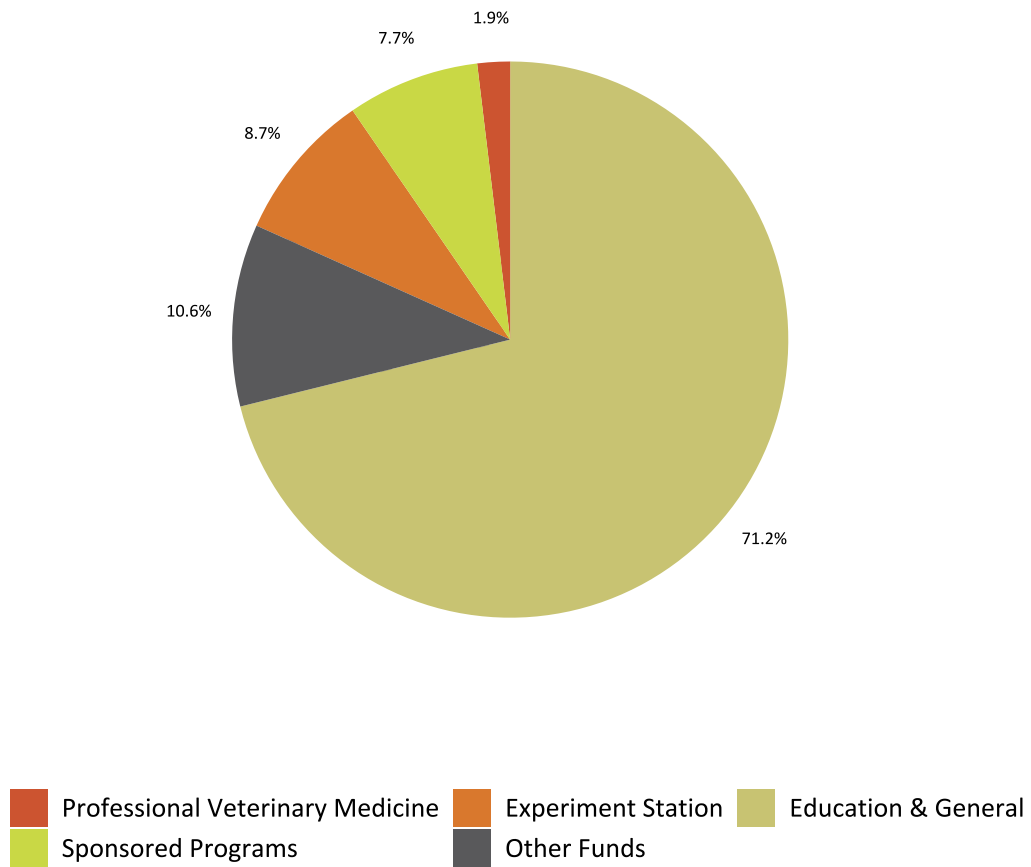

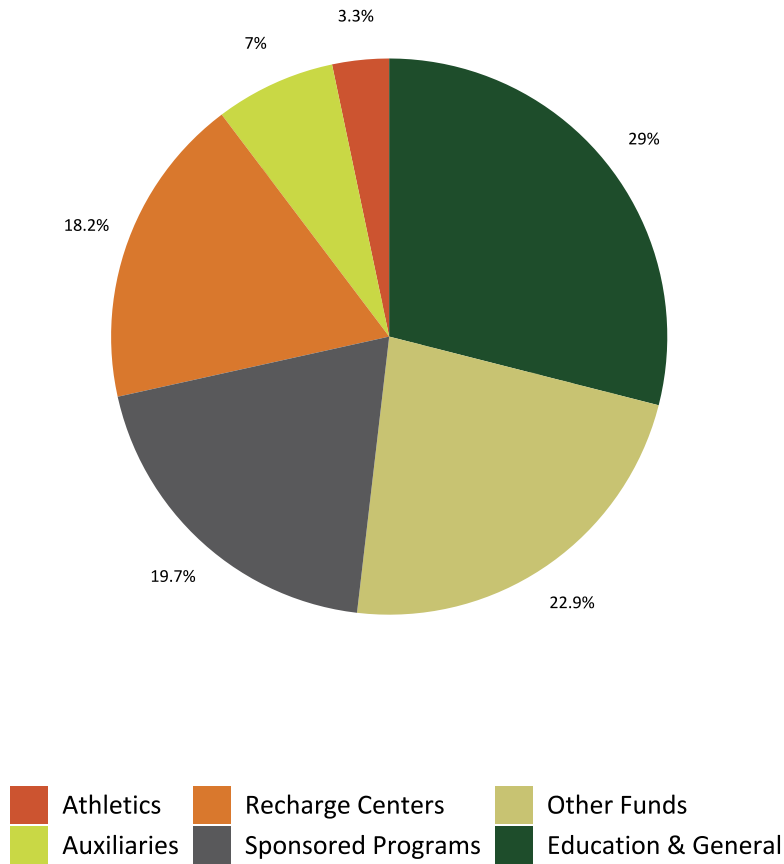

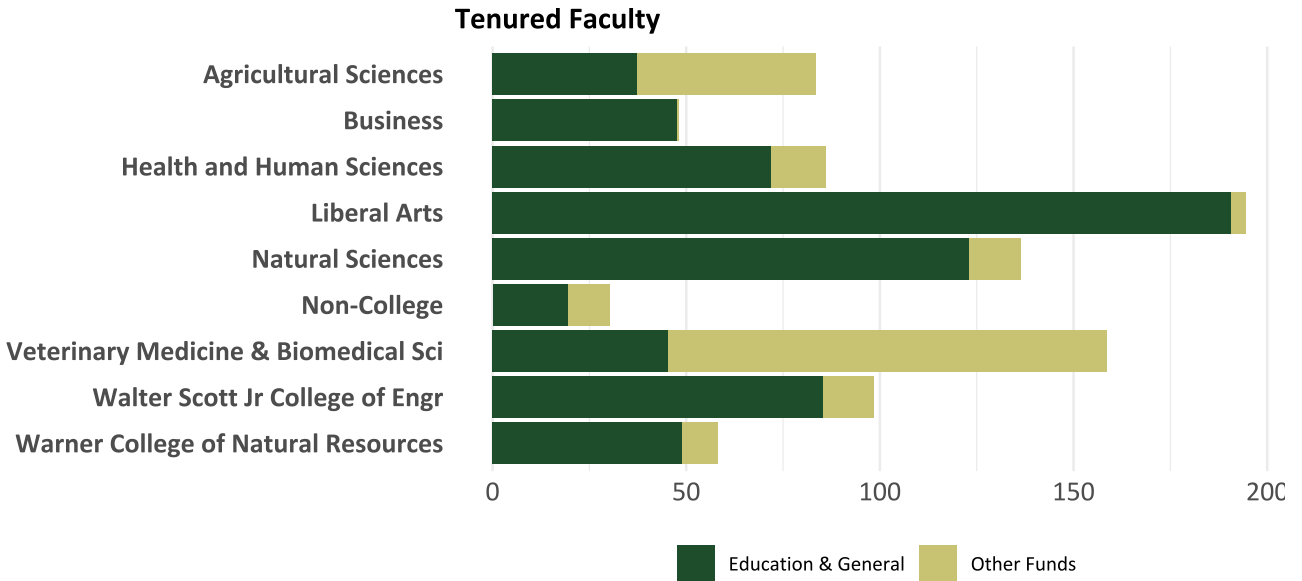

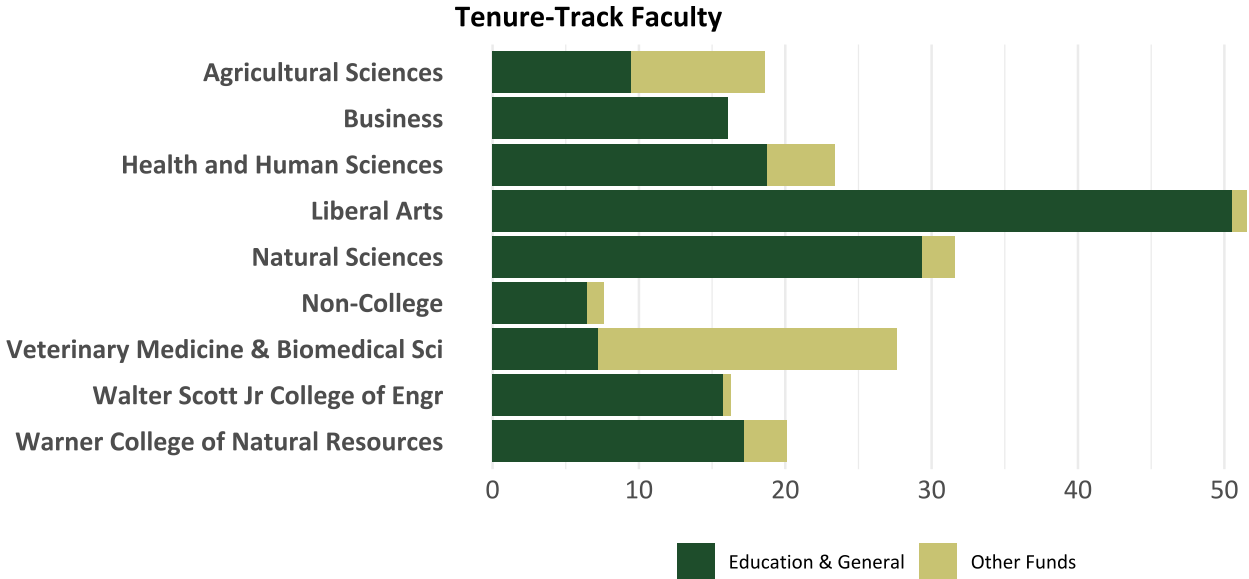

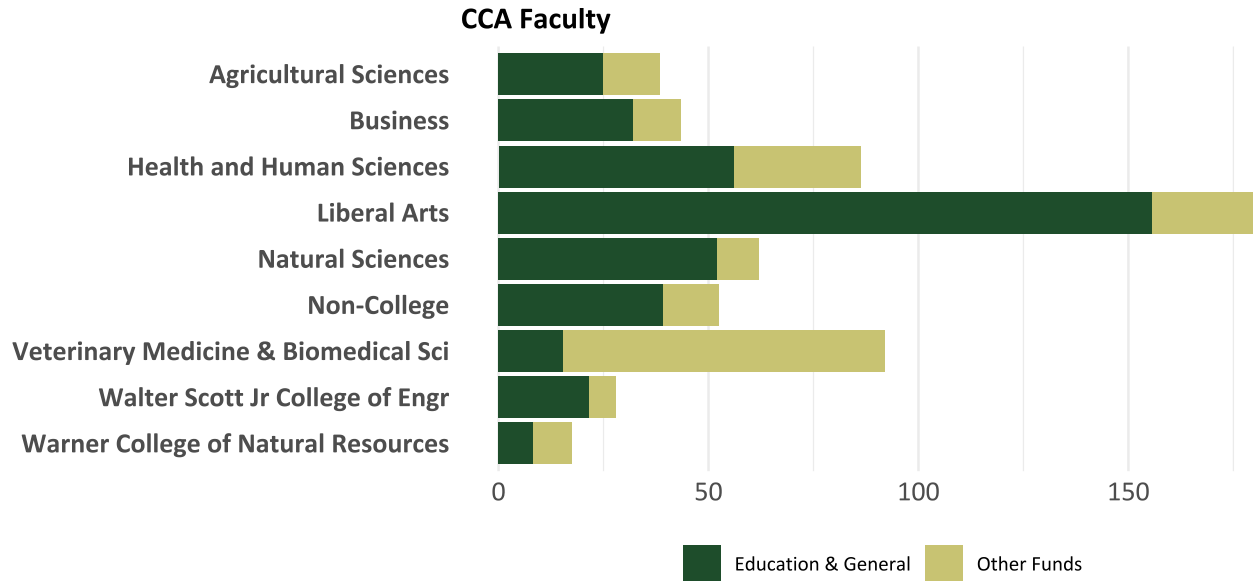

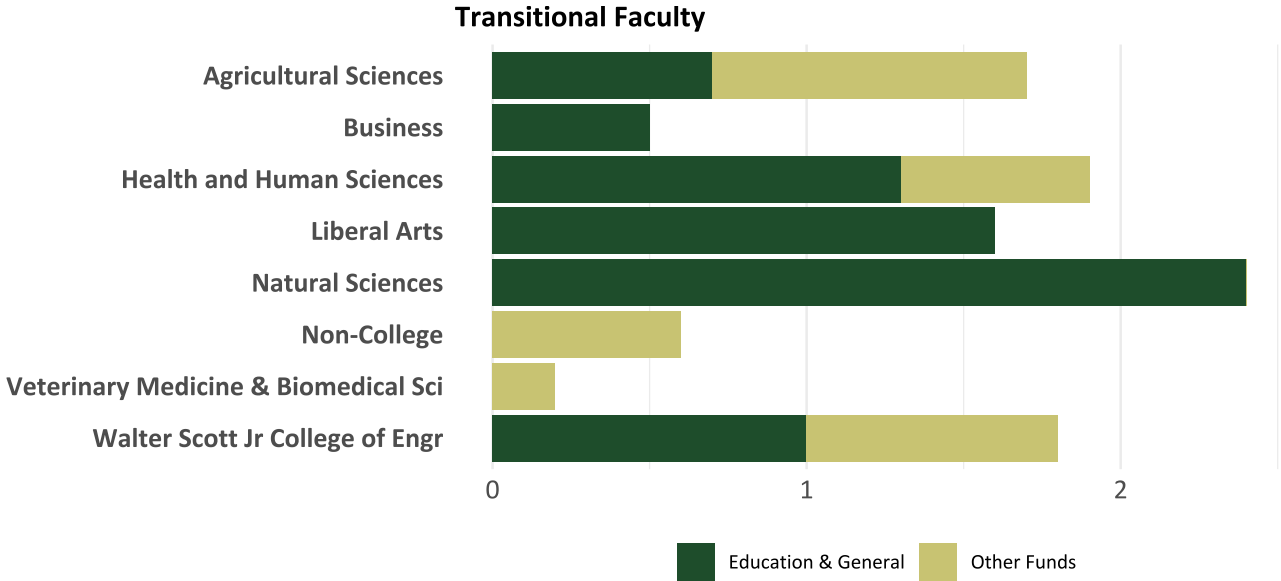

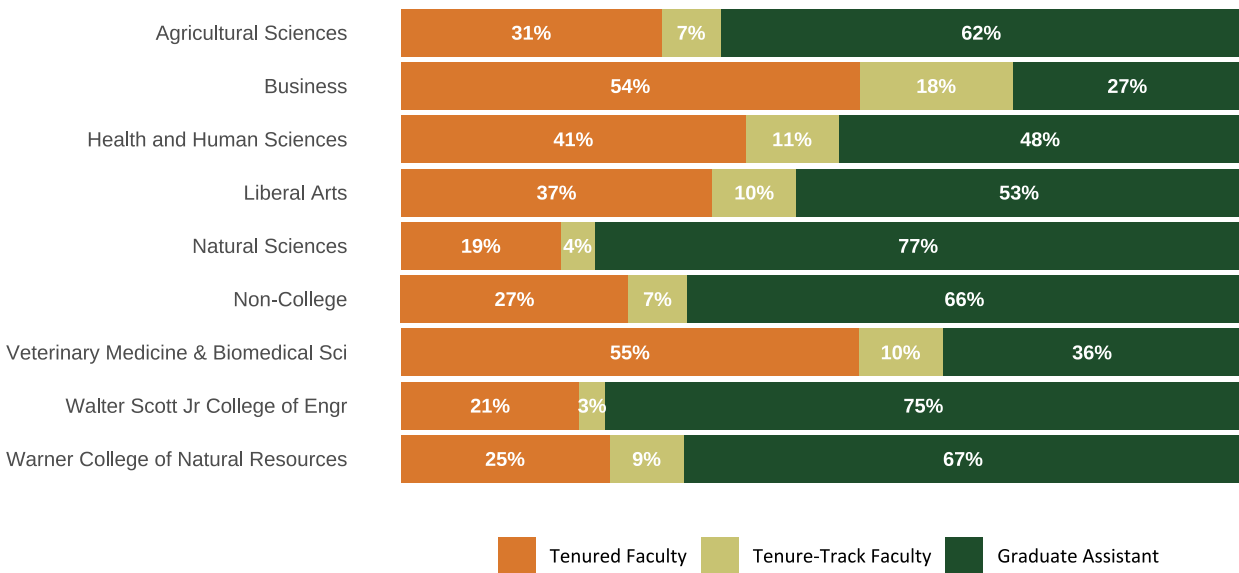

Fiscal Year 2022 Tenured and Tenure-Track Faculty FTE to Graduate Assistant FTE Comparison¹⁵



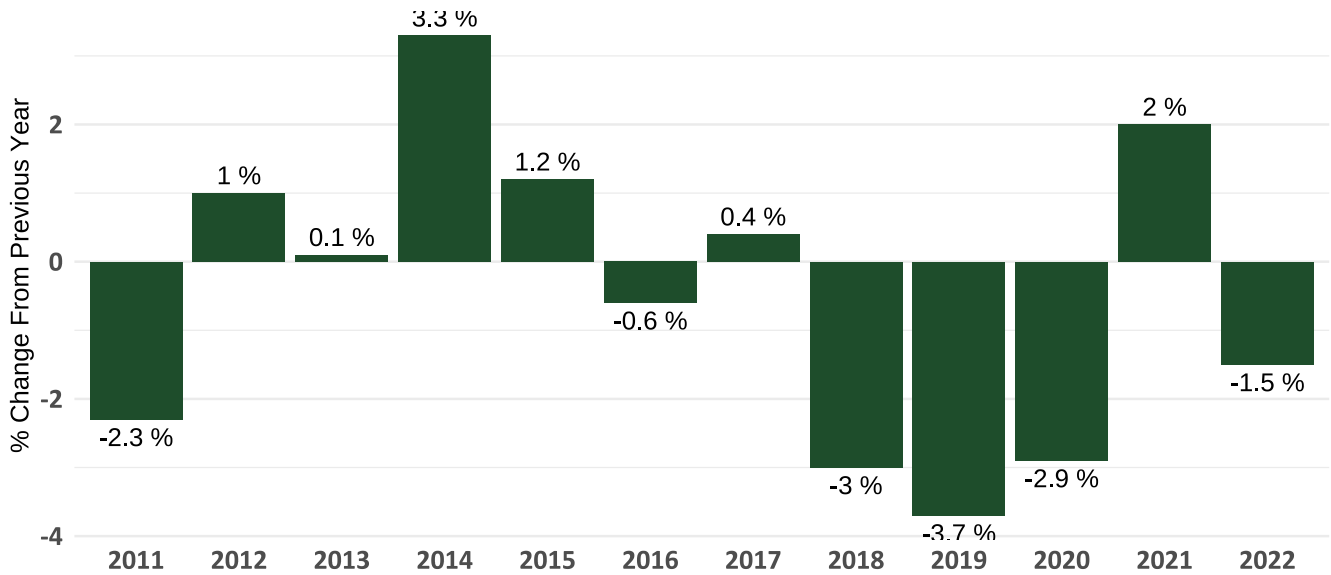
