

Percent Change in Freshmen by Application College from Fall 2015 to Fall 2023








First-Year CSU GPA Distribution - Number of Students





Percent Change in Transfer Undergraduate by Enrollment from Fall 2015 to Fall 2023




















Freshman Retention by Residency - Comparison with Total





Freshman 4-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total





Freshman 4.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total





Freshman 5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total





Freshman 5.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total





Freshman 6-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total





Freshman 6.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total





Transfer 2nd-Fall Persistence by Residency - Comparison with Total





Transfer 3-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total





Transfer 3.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total





Transfer 4-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total





Transfer 4.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total





Transfer 5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total






History of All University Employees¹


History of Tenured Faculty Employees²


History of Tenure-Track Faculty Employees³


History of CCA Faculty Employees⁴


History of Transitional Faculty Employees⁵


History of Admin Professonal Employees⁶


History of State Classified Employees⁷


Fiscal Year 2023 Graduate Assistant Employee FTE by Unit¹⁴

Fiscal Year 2023 Tenured and Tenure-Track Faculty FTE to Graduate Assistant FTE Comparison¹⁵




