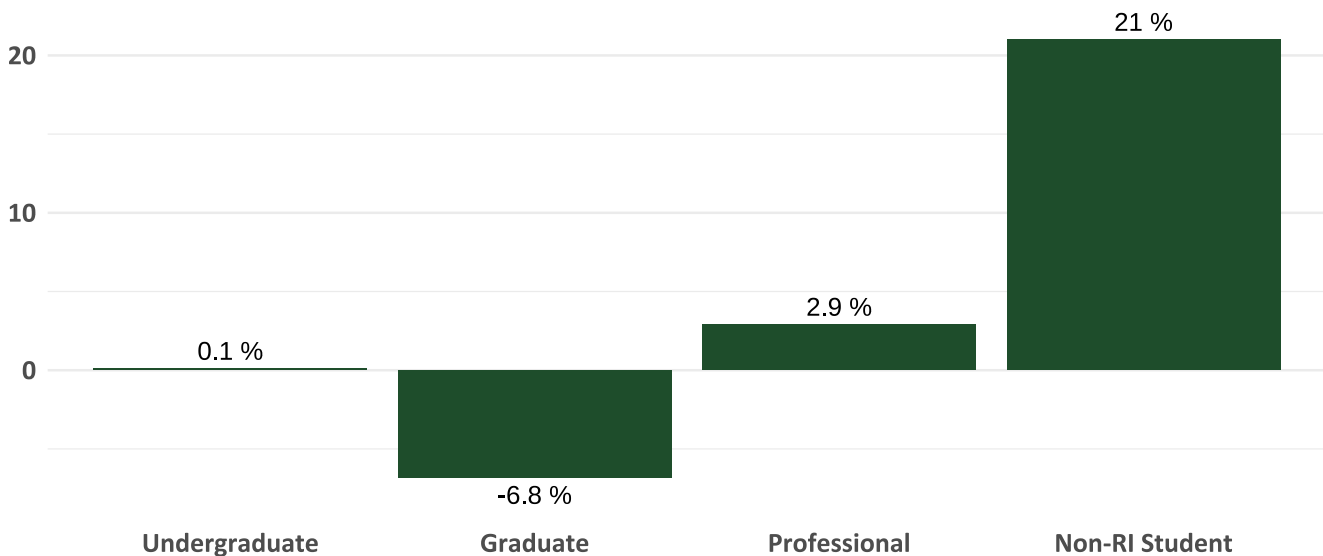

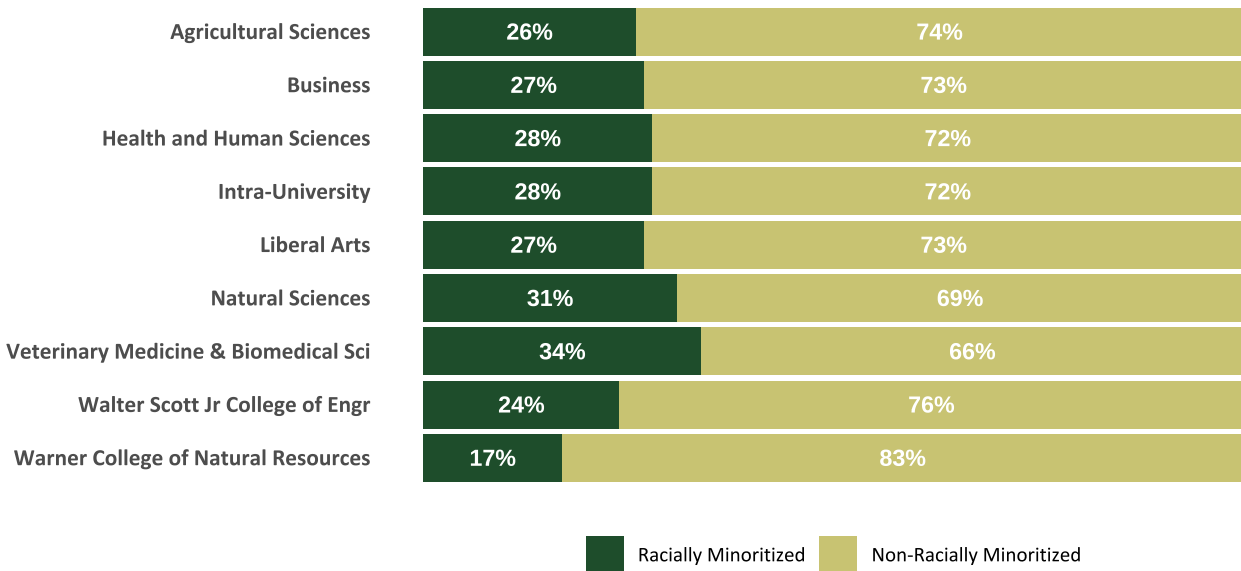

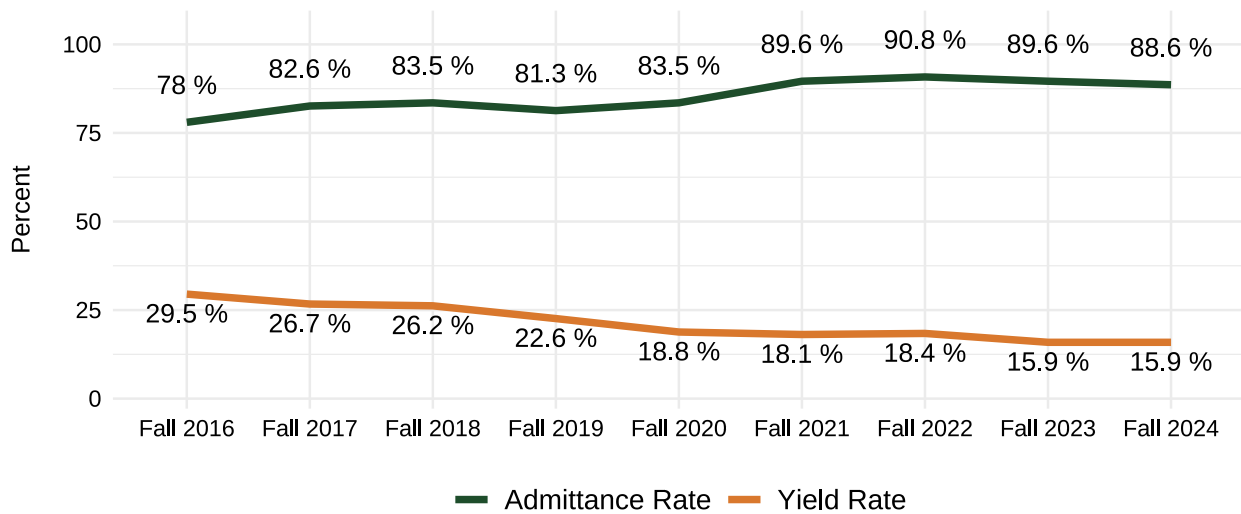
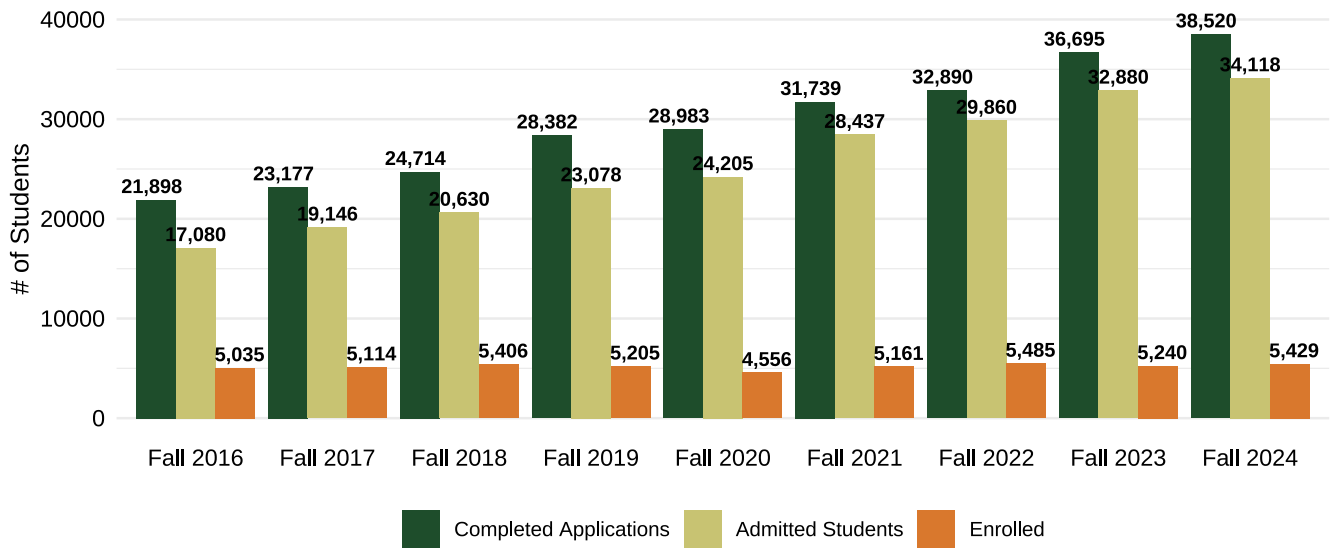
Percent Change in Freshmen by Application College from Fall 2016 to Fall 2024

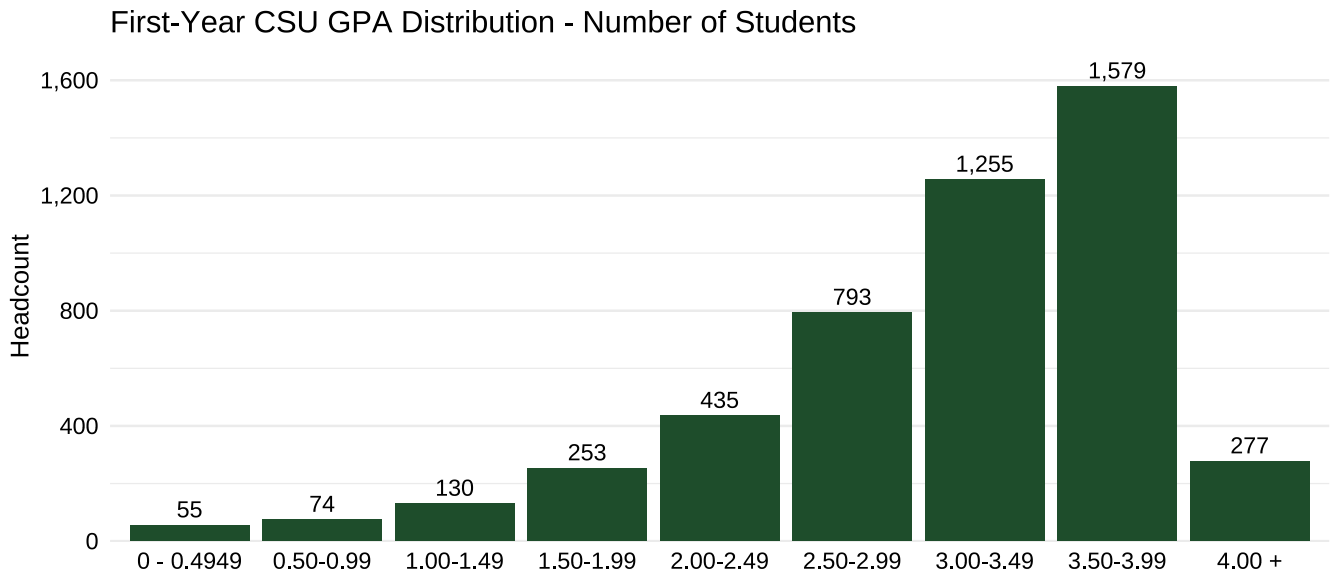

Fall 2023 Entering Freshman First-Year CSU Grade Point Average (including summer starts)⁵

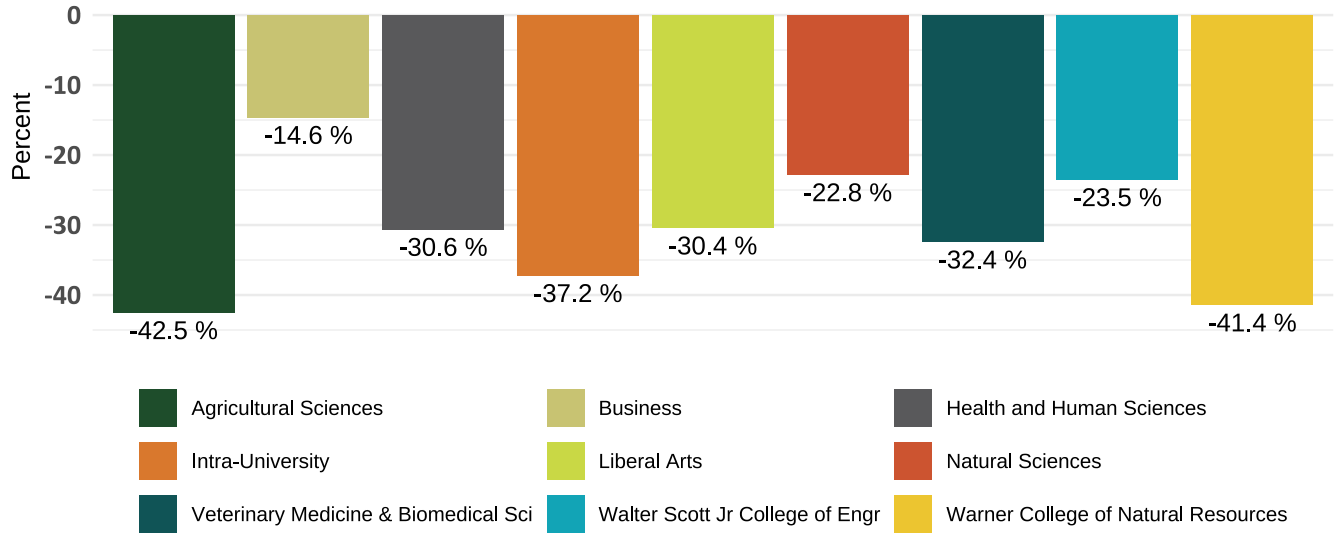

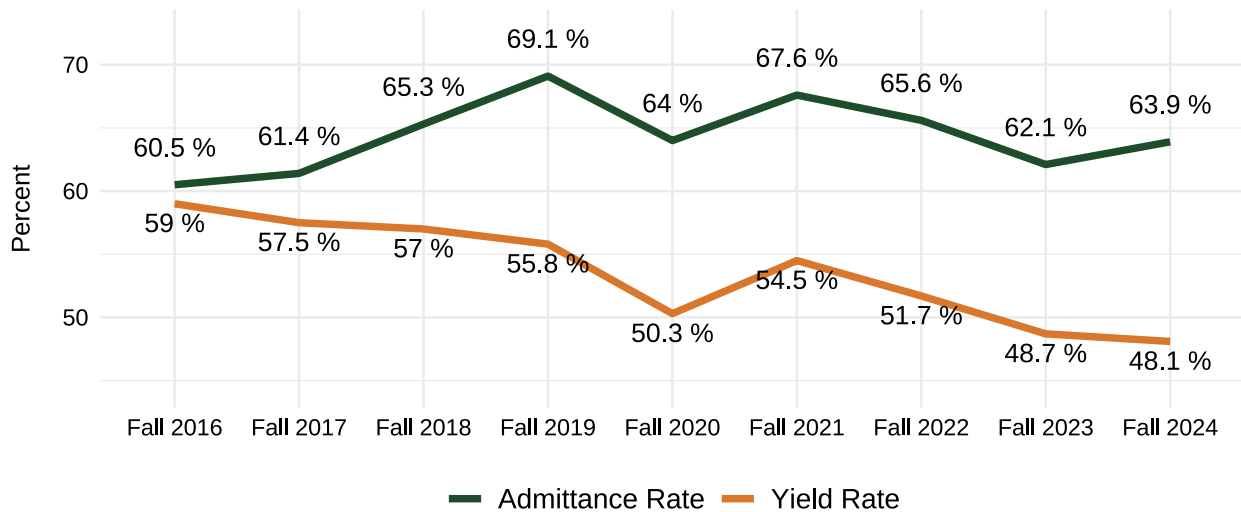
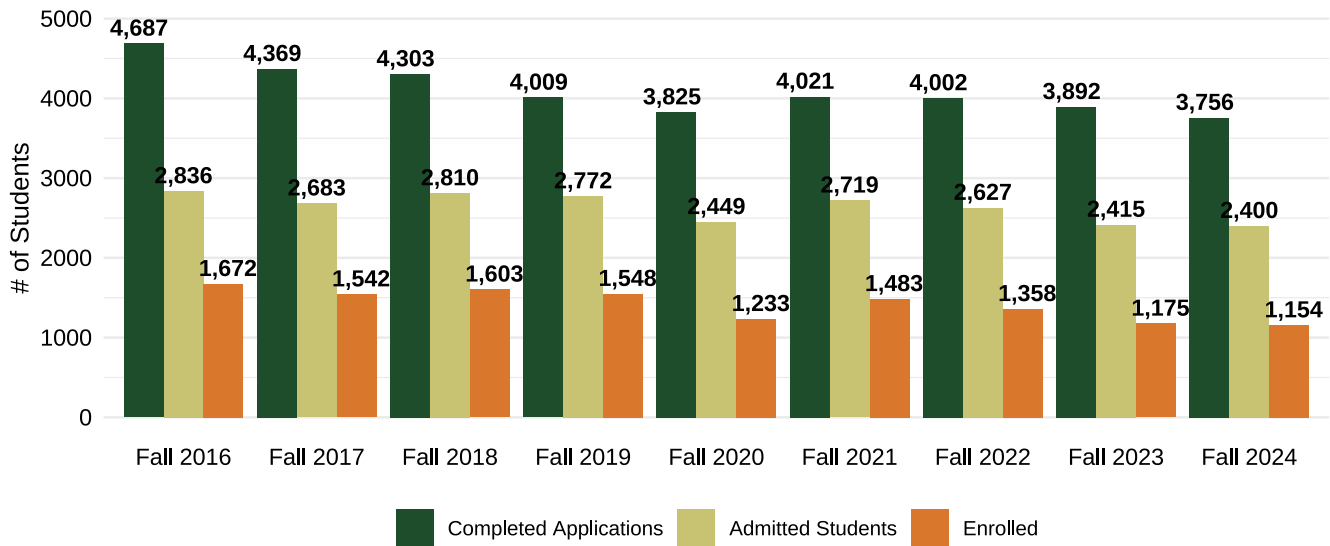
Percent Change in Transfer Undergraduate by Enrollment from Fall 2016 to Fall 2024

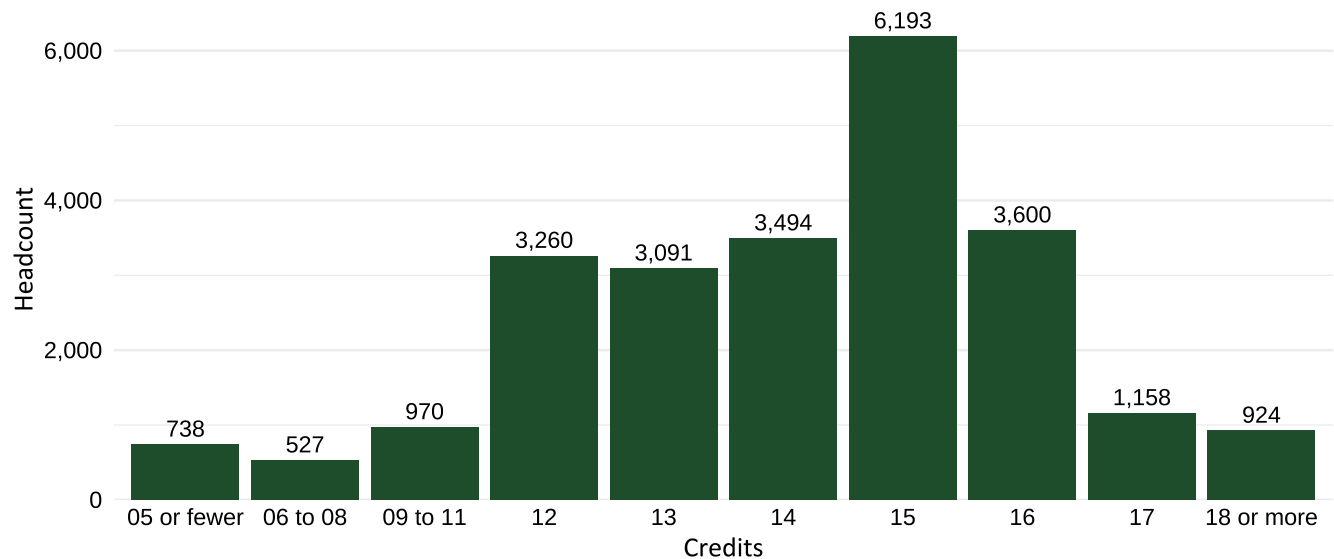

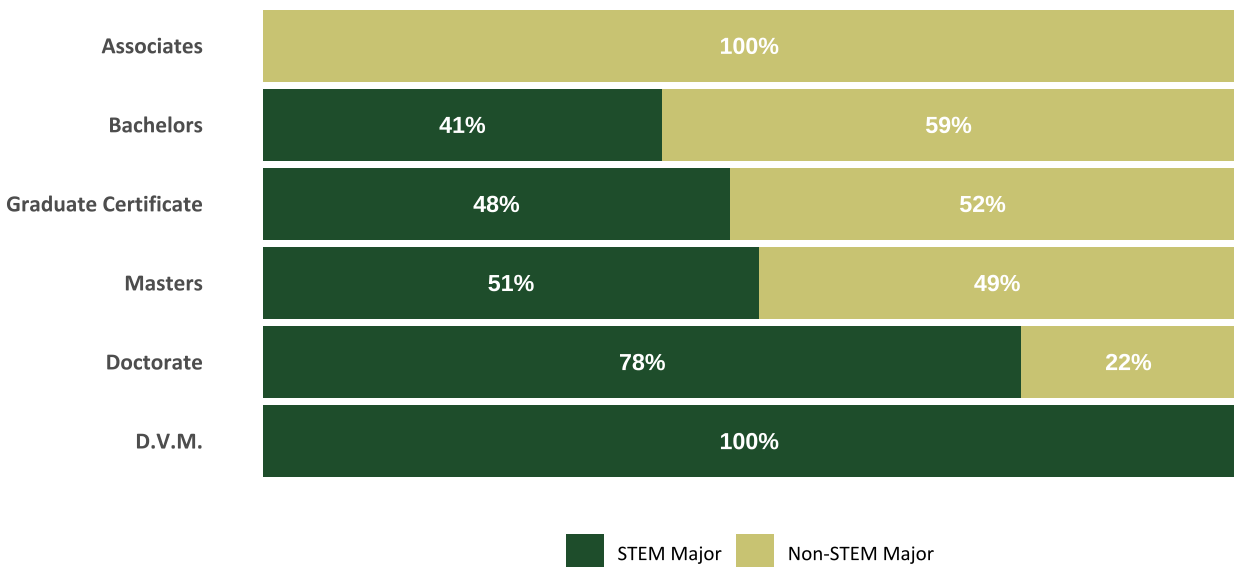

Percent of Degrees



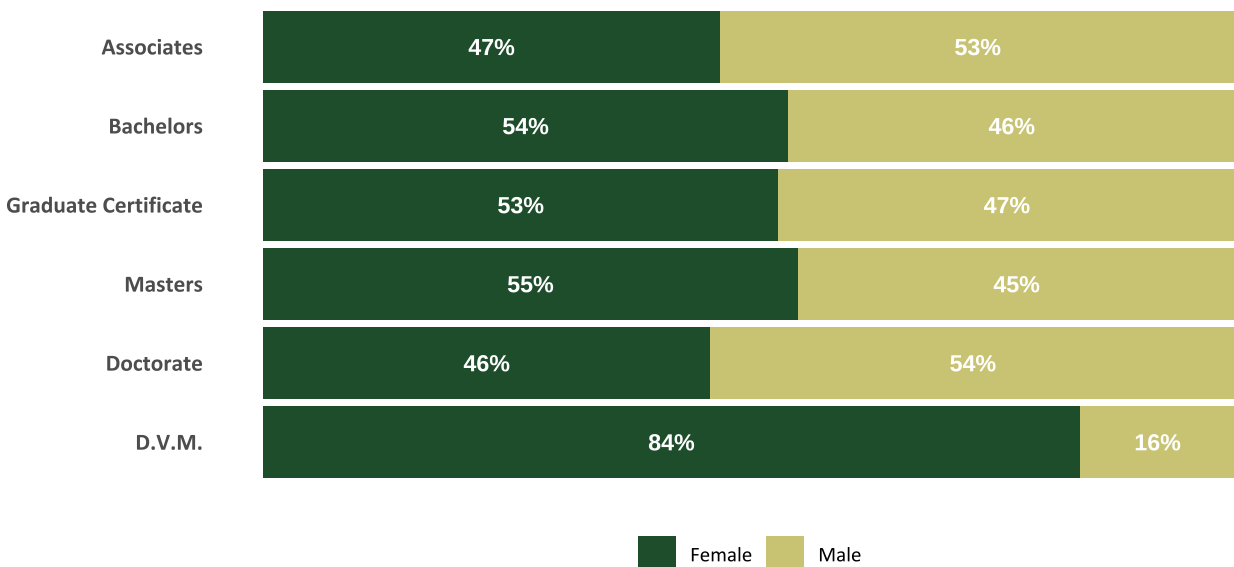

Percent of Degrees



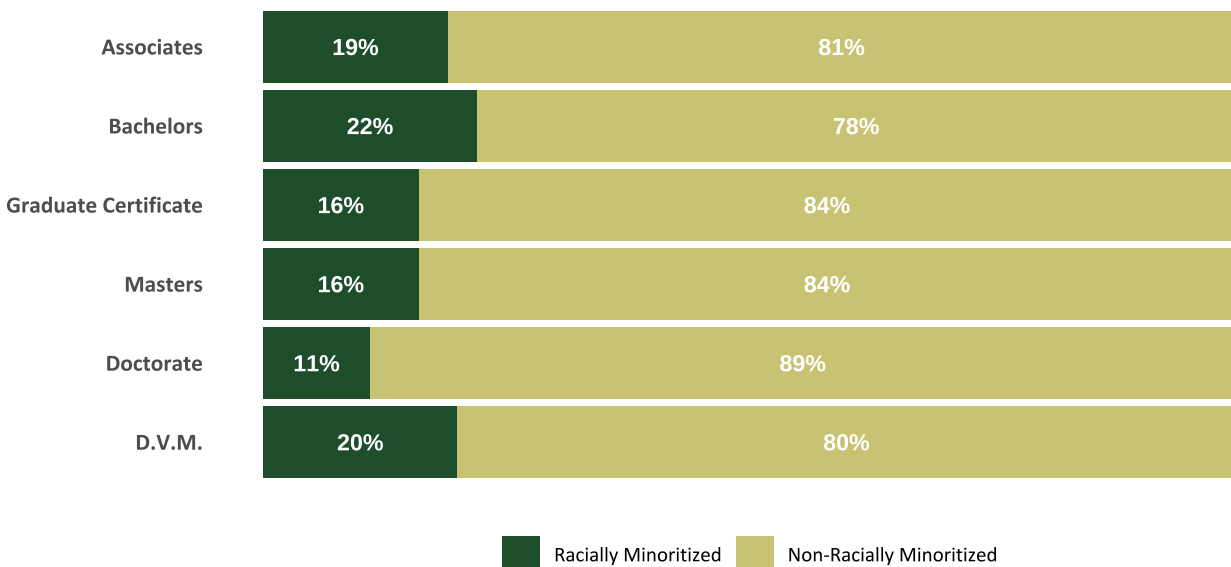

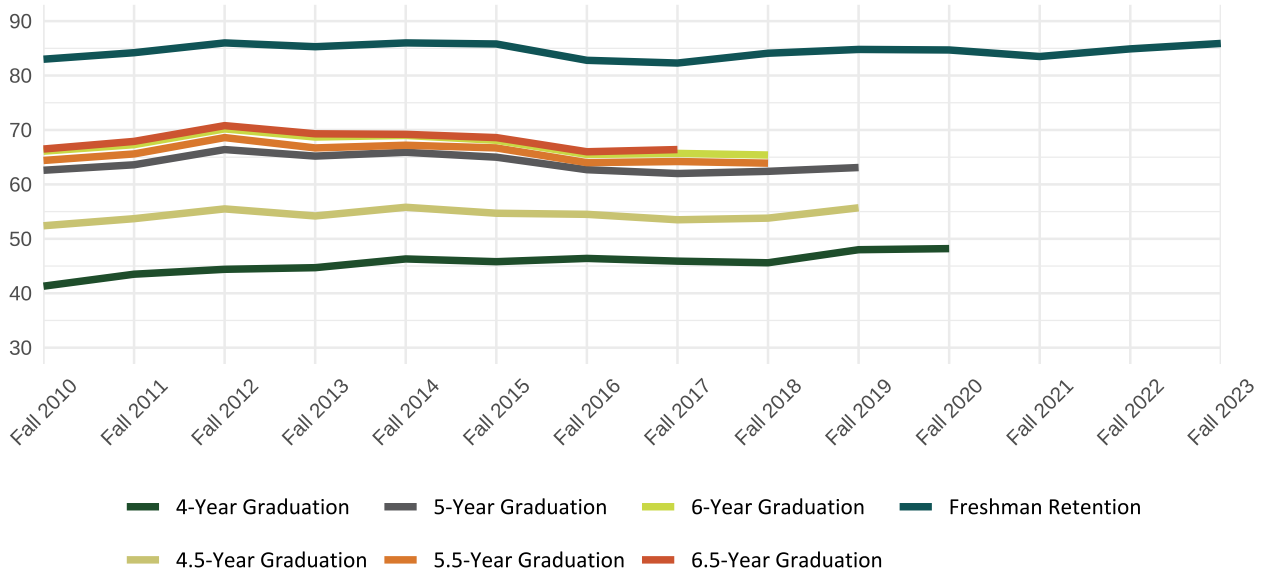

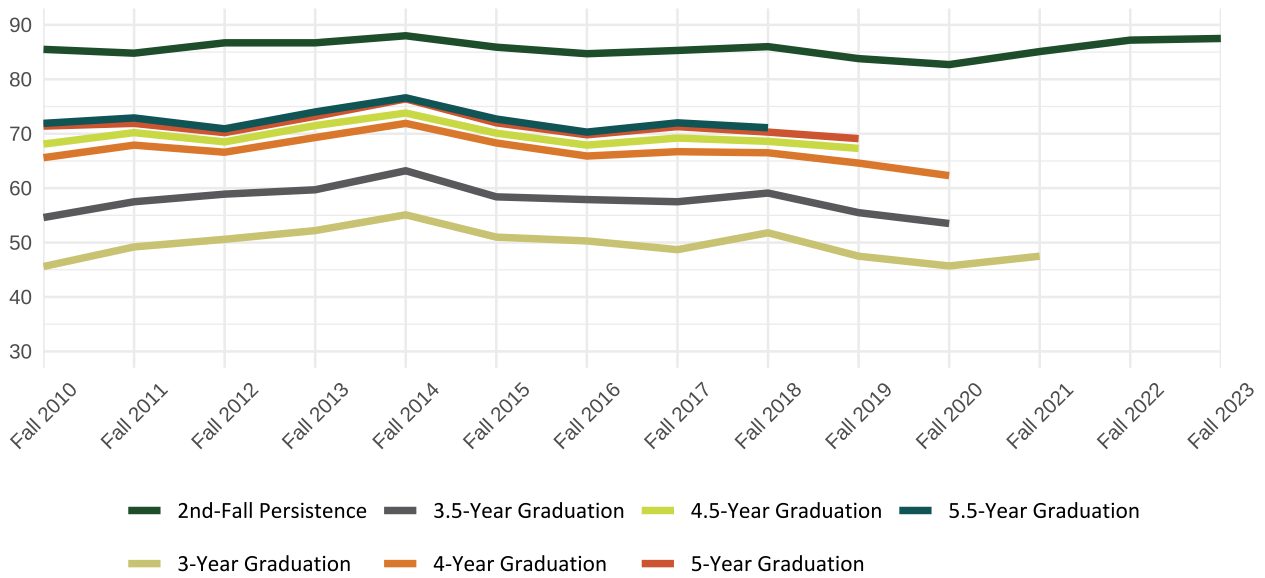

Transfer Students 2nd-Fall Persistence and Graduation Rates History²



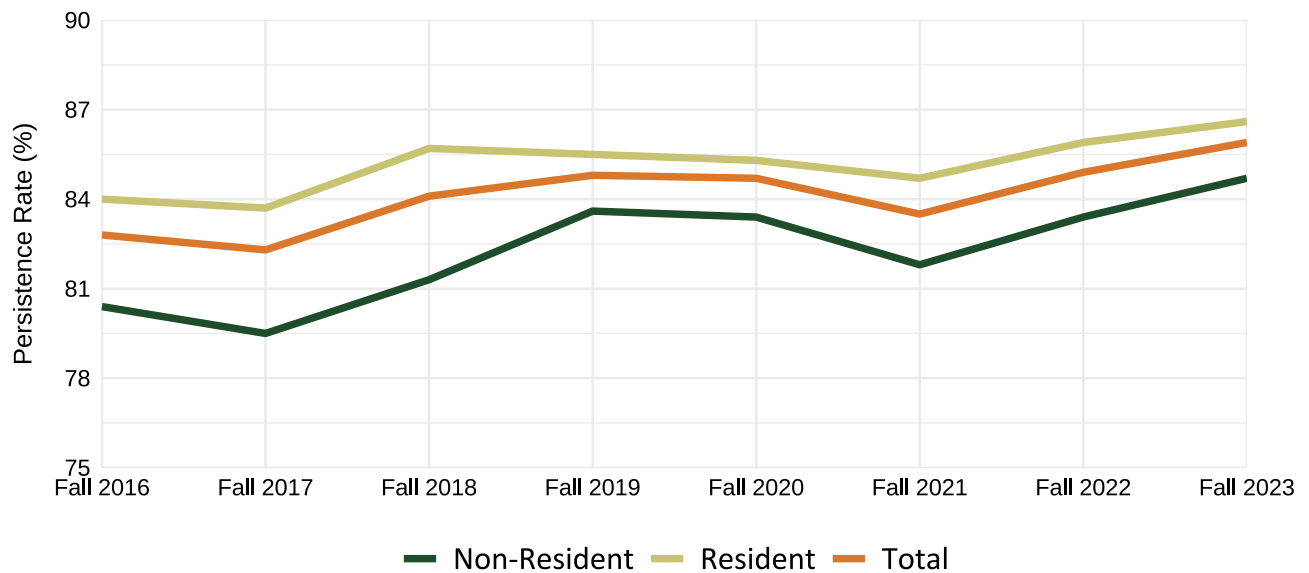

Freshman Retention by Residency - Comparison with Total

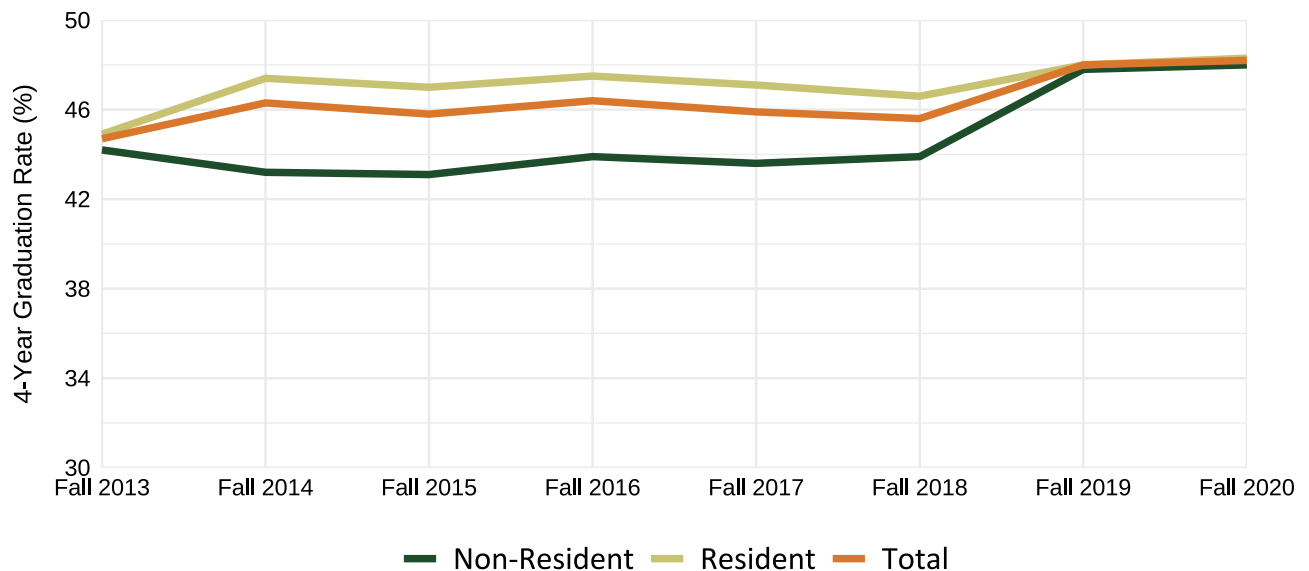

Freshman 4-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

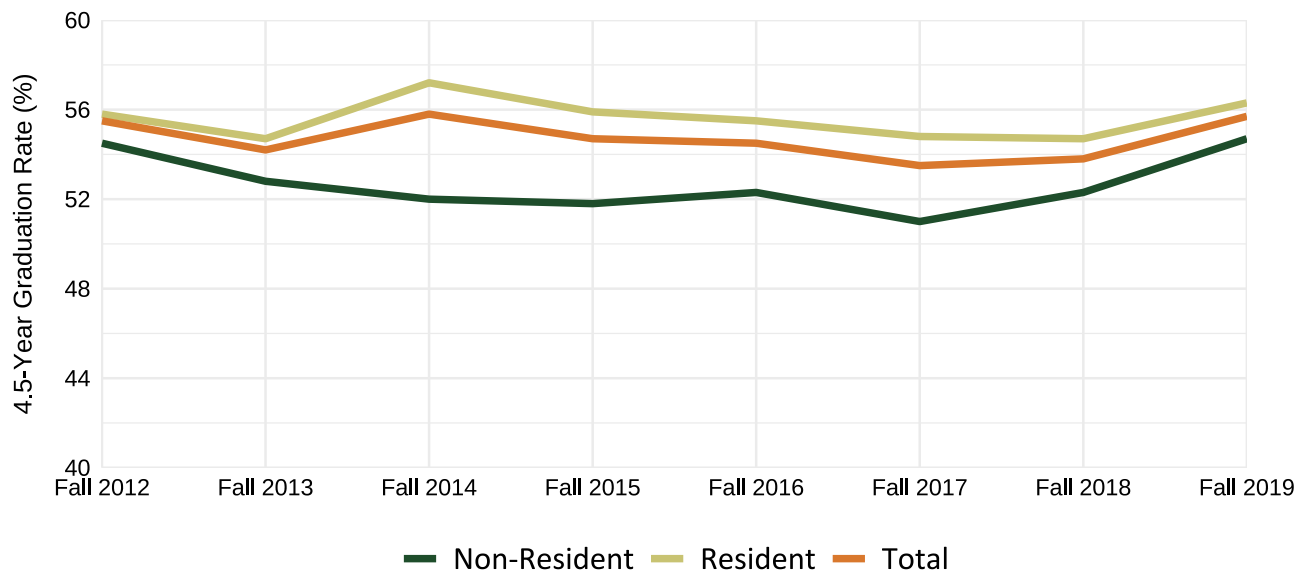

Freshman 4.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

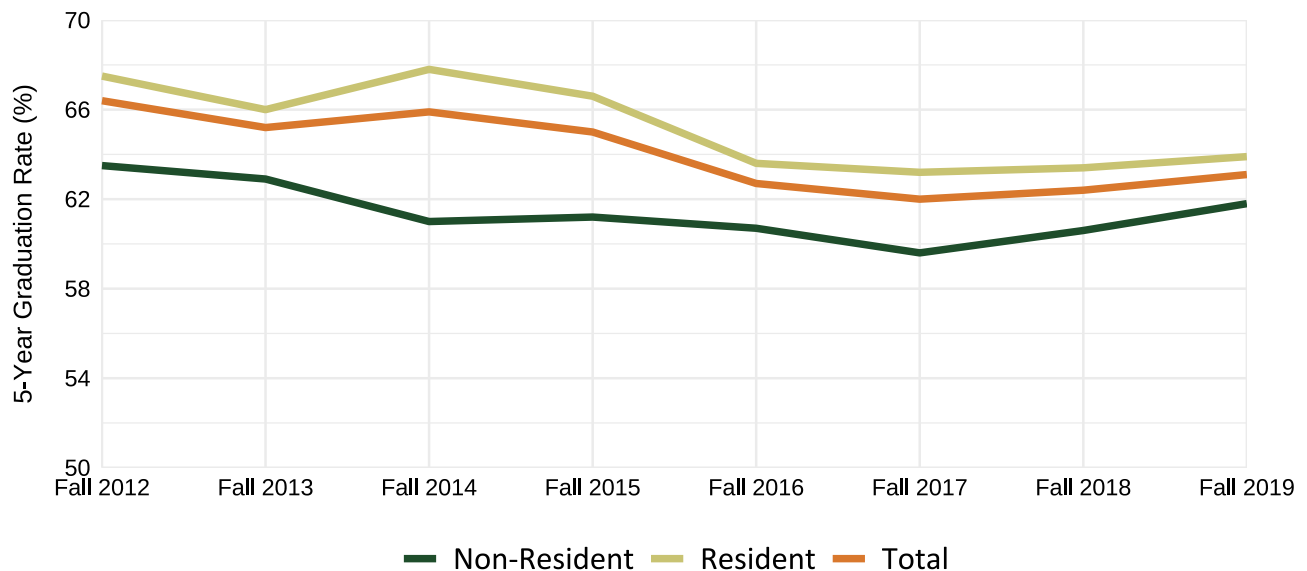

Freshman 5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

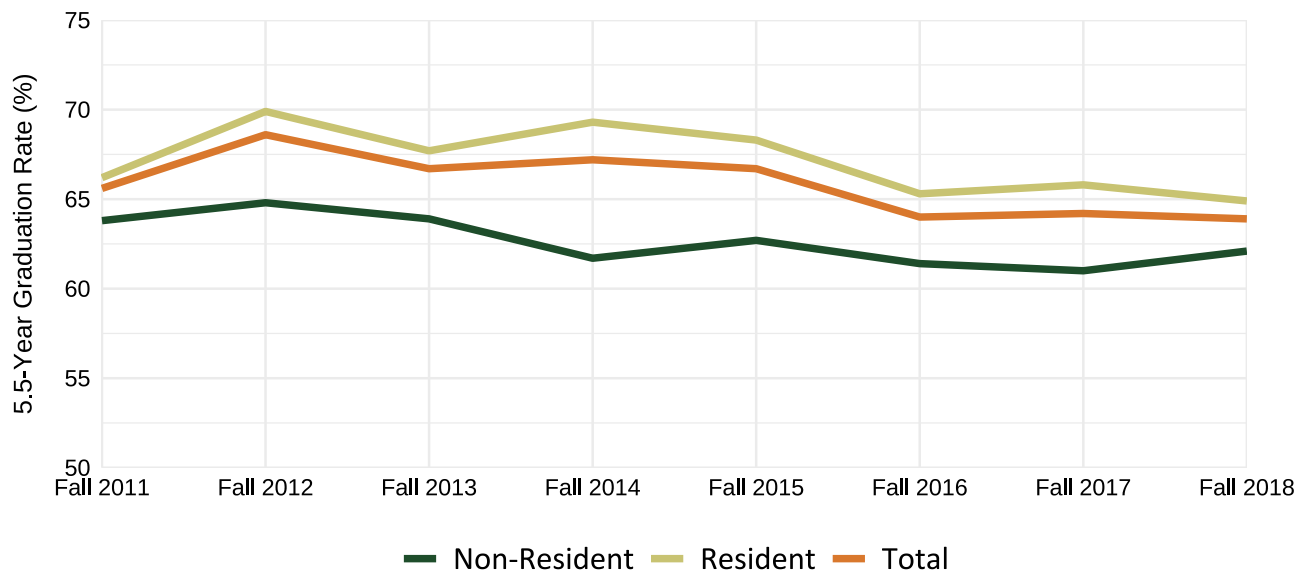

Freshman 5.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

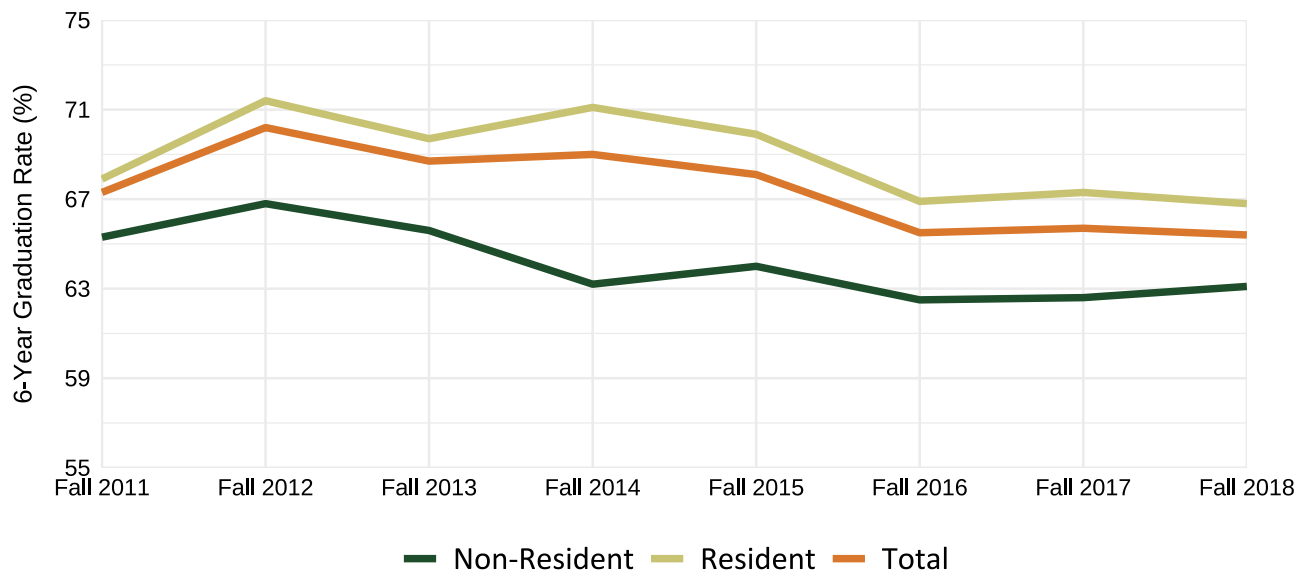

Freshman 6-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

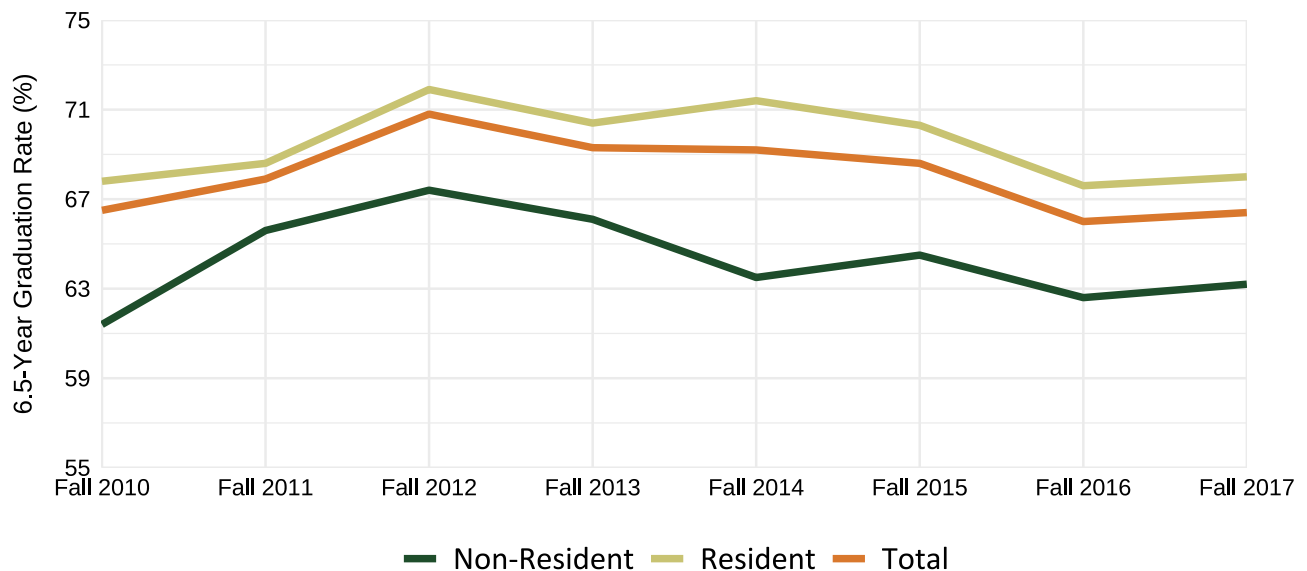

Freshman 6.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

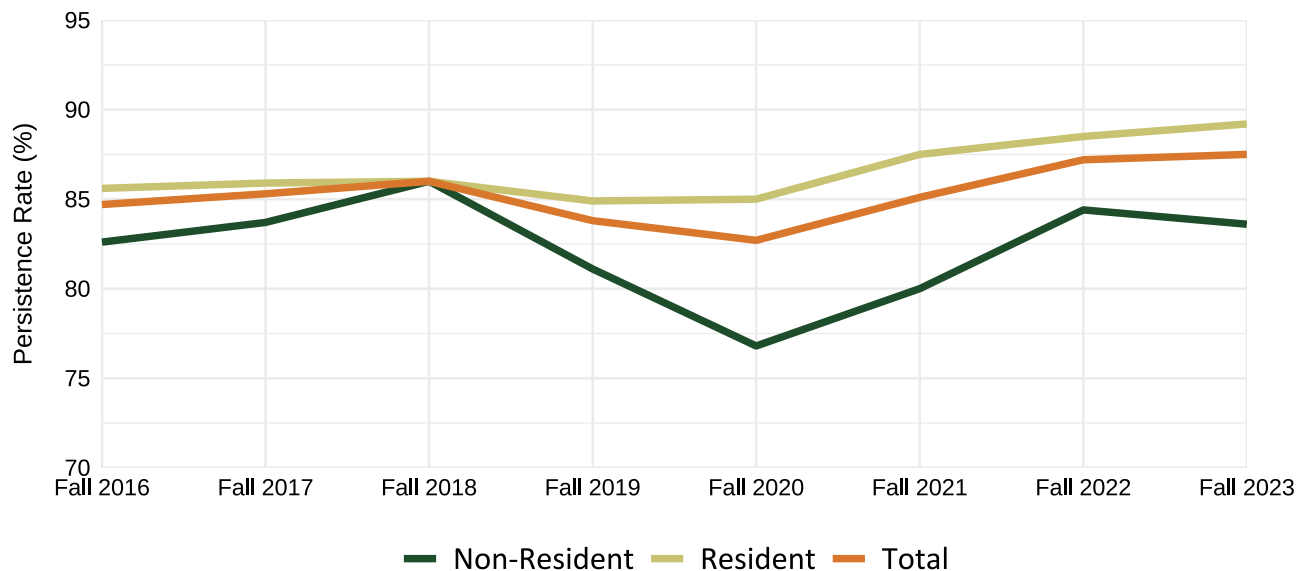

Transfer 2nd-Fall Persistence by Residency - Comparison with Total

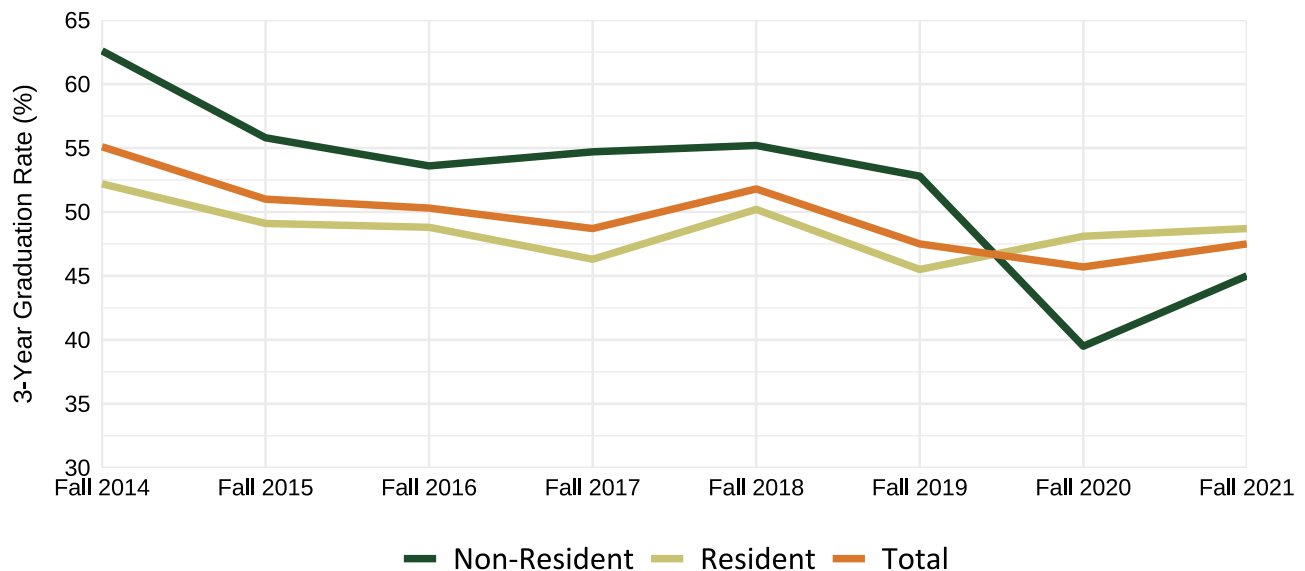

Transfer 3-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

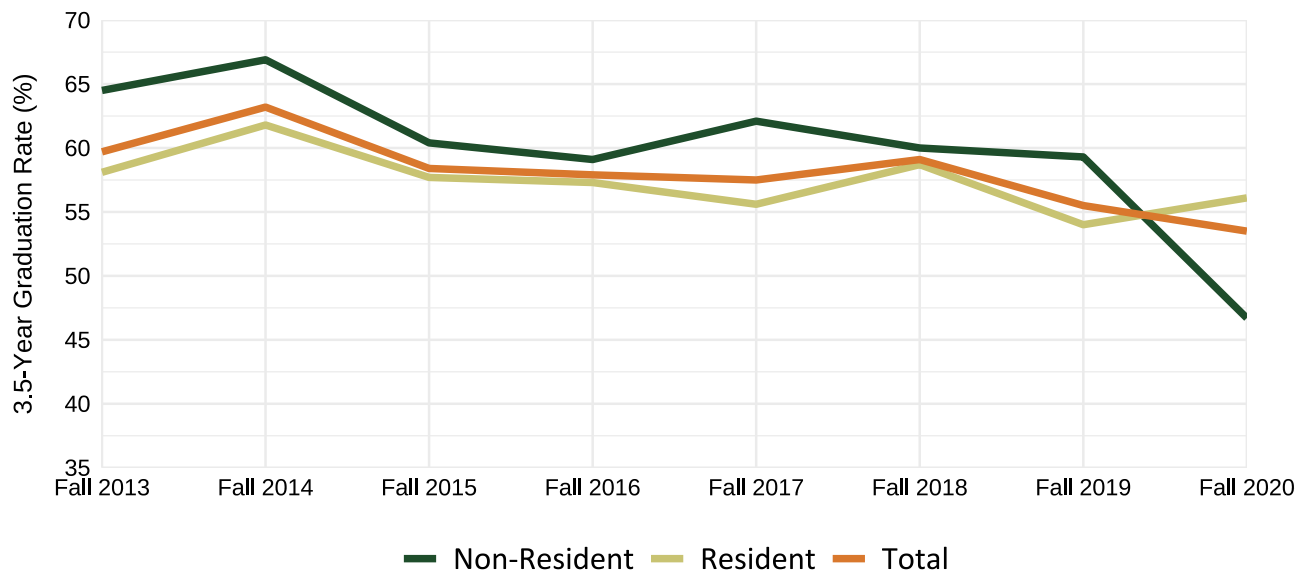

Transfer 3.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

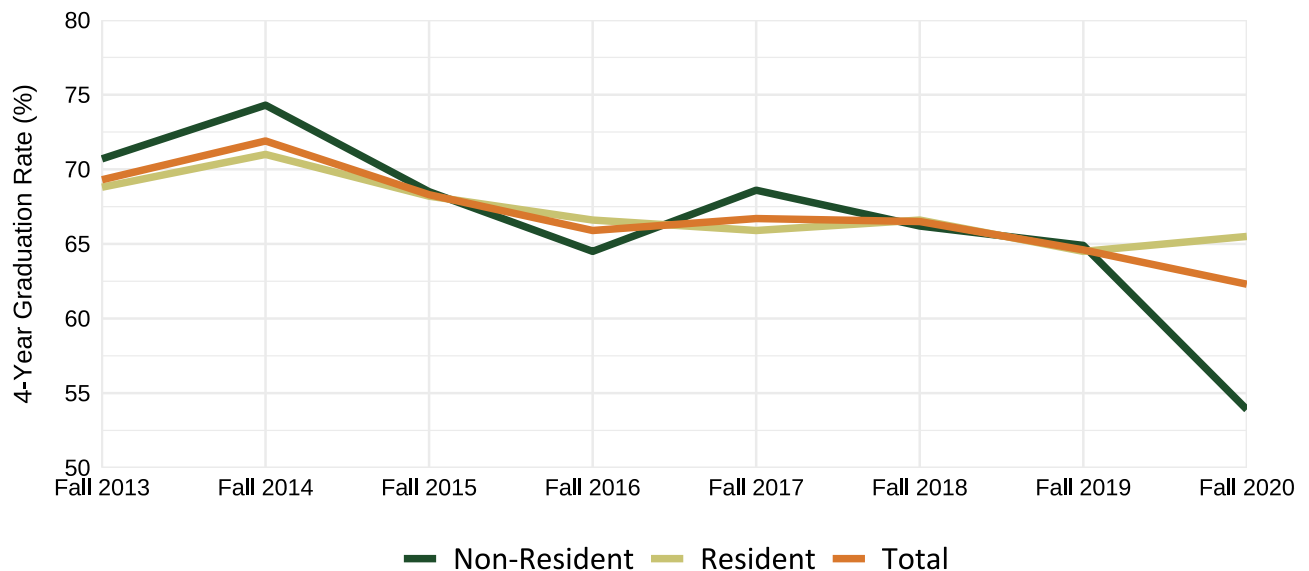

Transfer 4-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

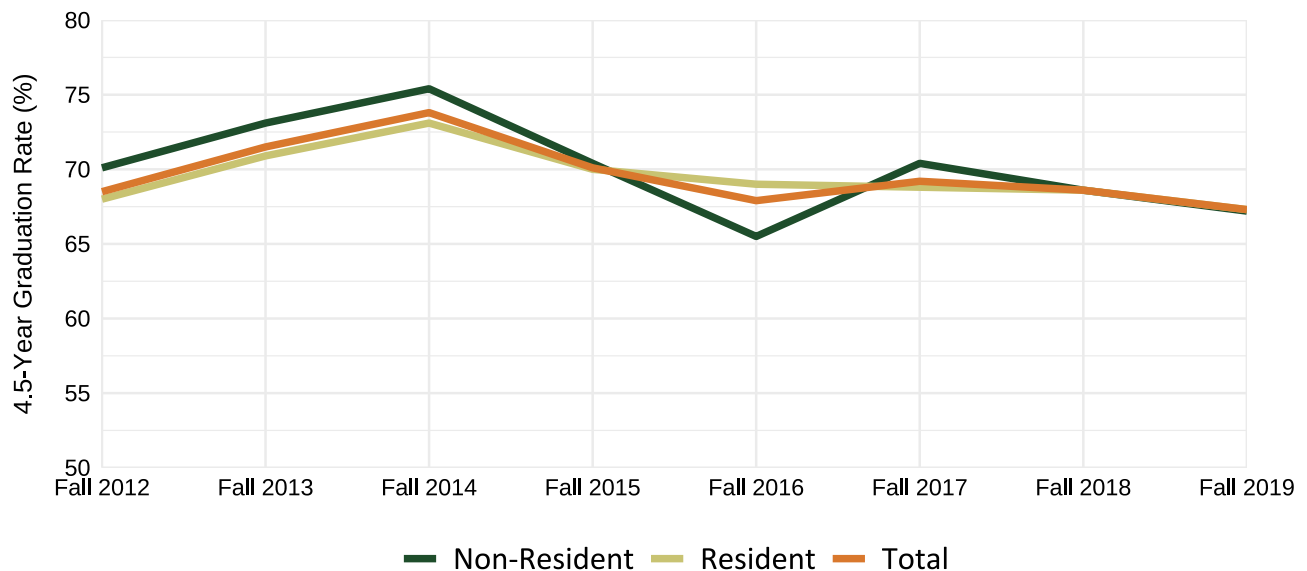

Transfer 4.5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

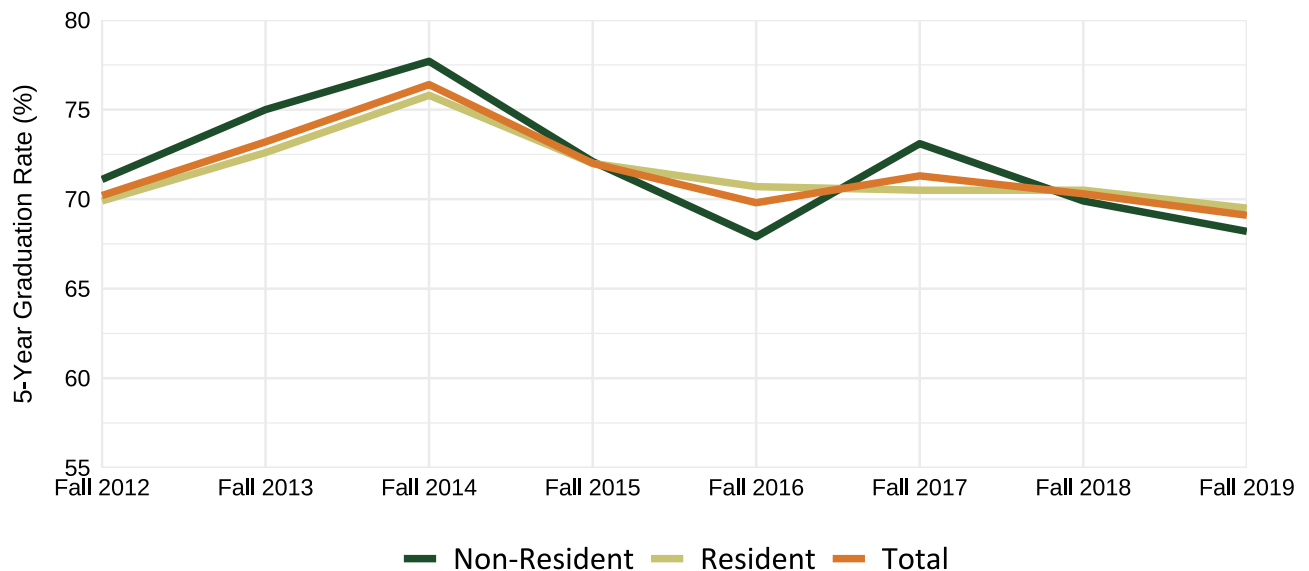

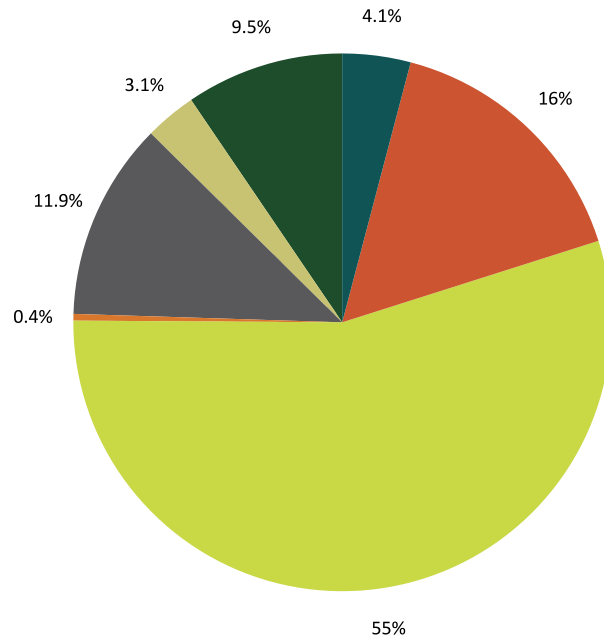
Transfer 5-Year Graduation by Residency - Comparison with Total

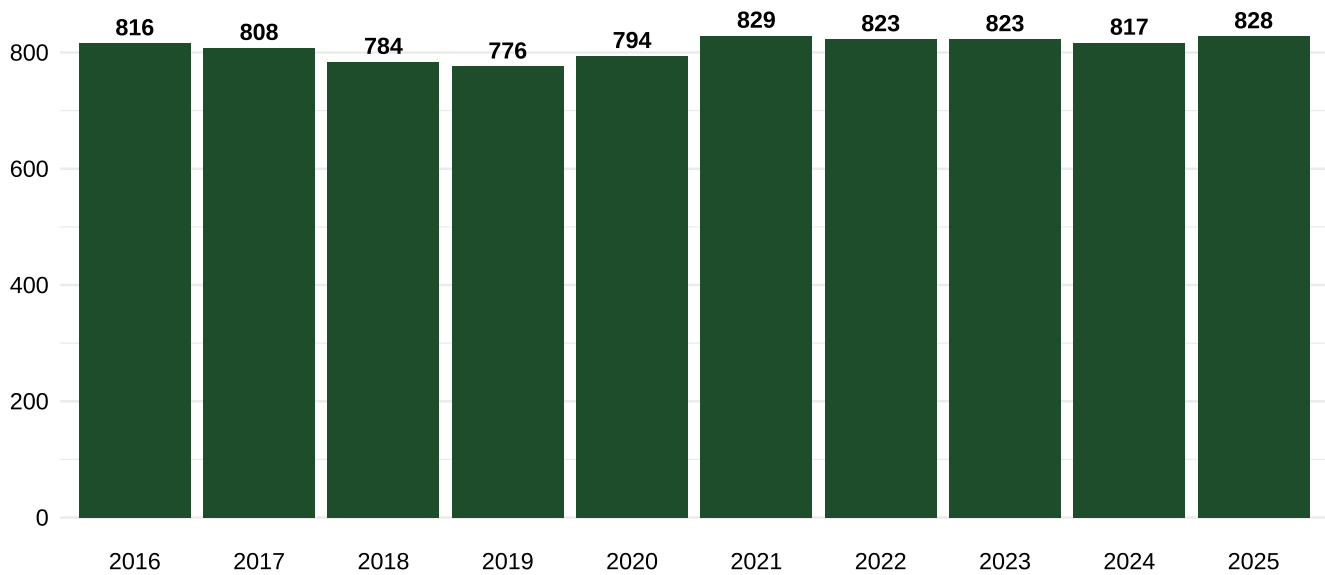

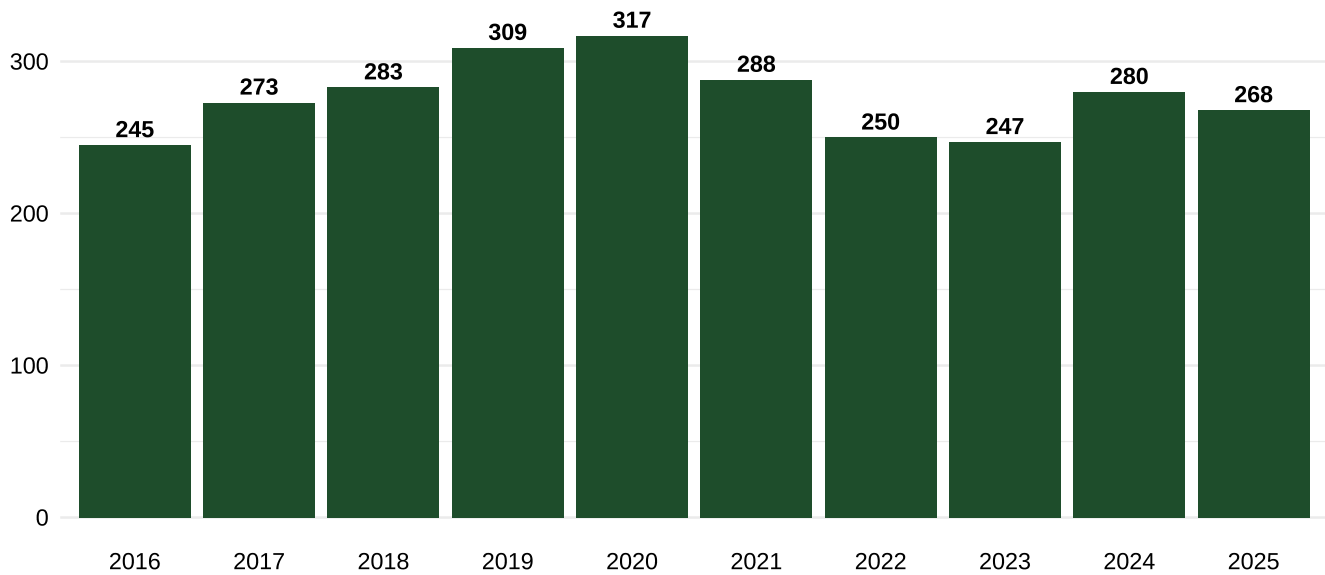

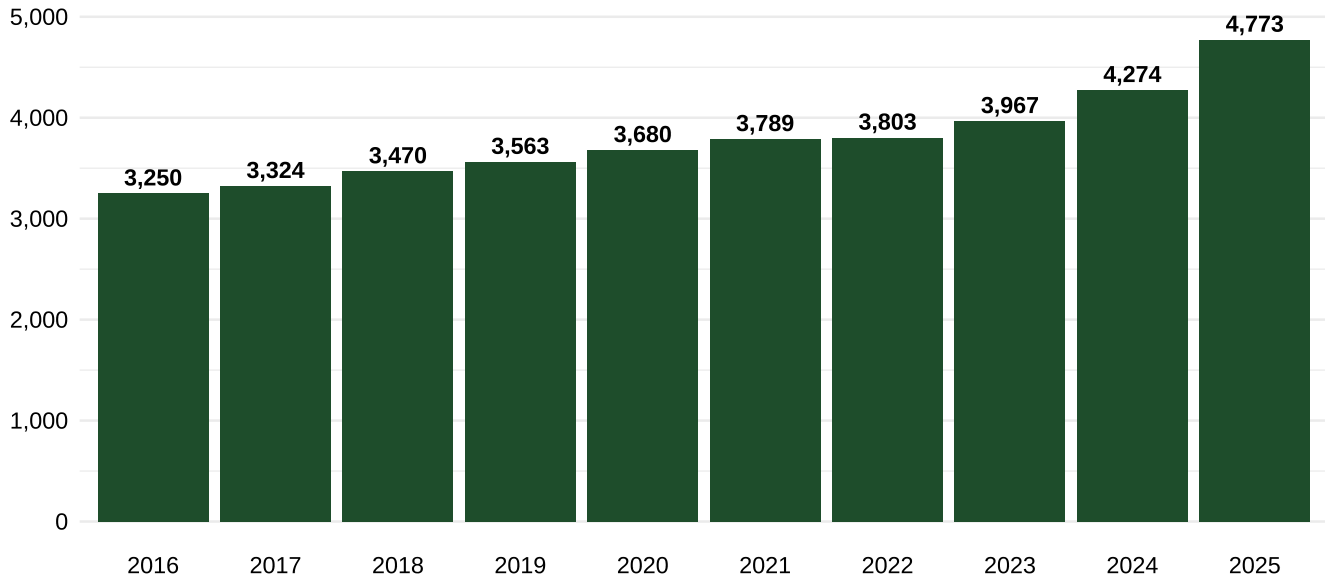

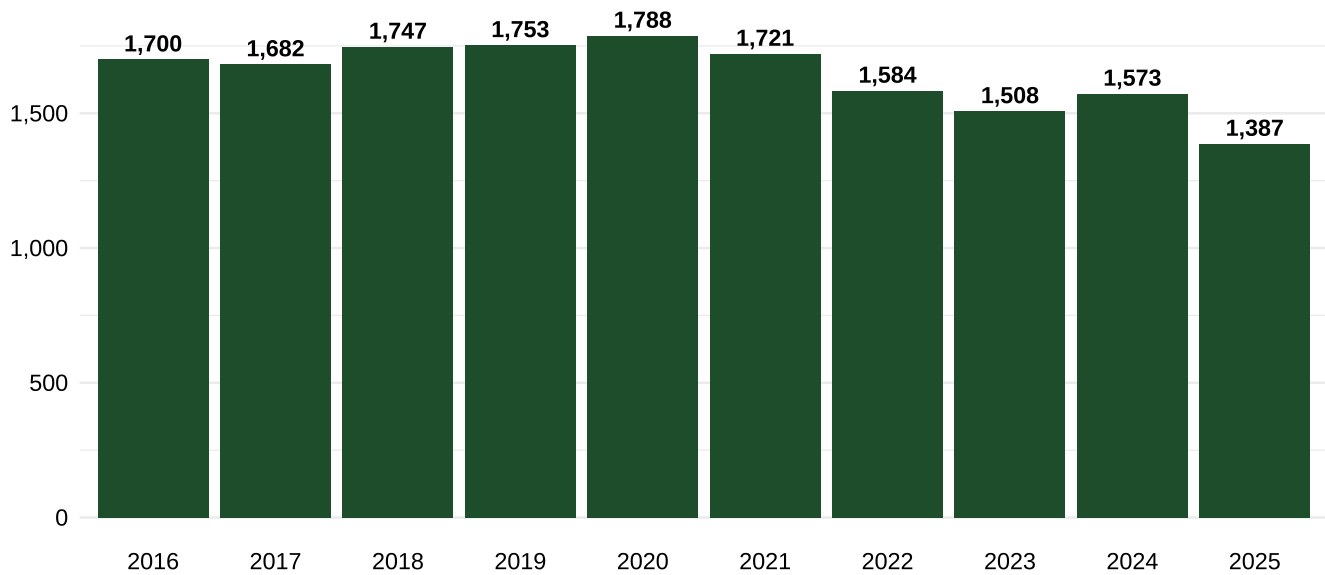

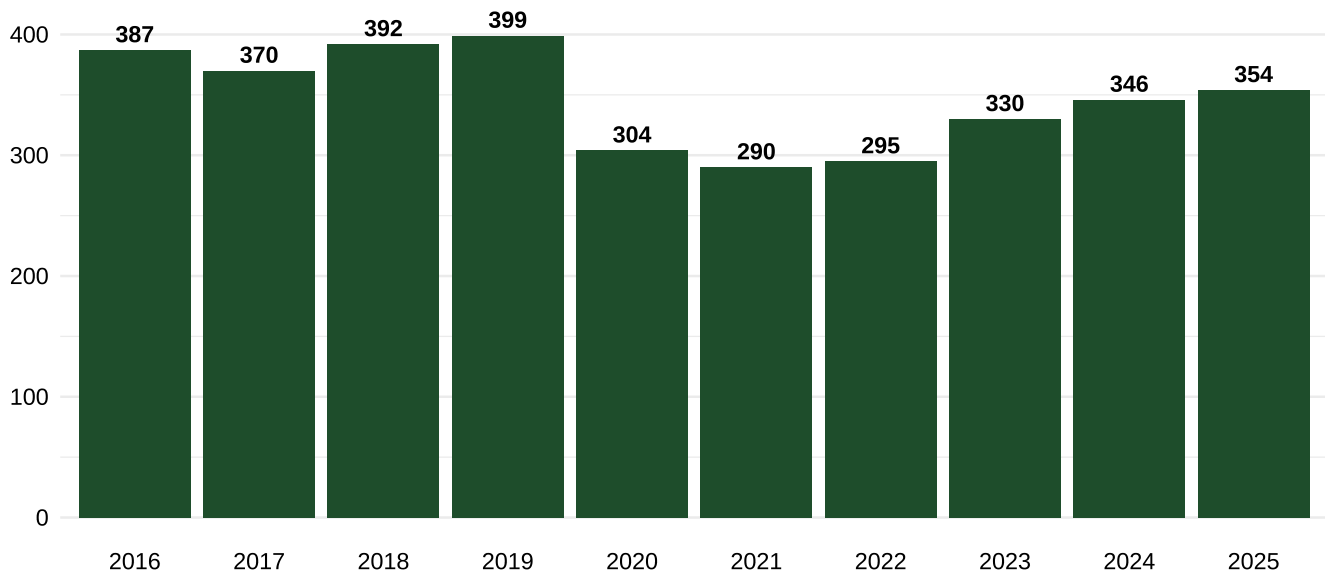
