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## ENROLLMENT STATISTICS

SPRING 1980

Spring Semester 1980 regular on-campus enrollment is 17,064 students, an increase of 430 students, or 2.6 percent over Spring Semester 1979, when enrollment was 16,634 students. Enrollment in Continuing Education and SURGE courses will be reported at the end of the semester.

This spring men represent 53.3 percent of the on-campus enrollment and women 46.7 percent. Last spring men represented 54.8 percent and women 45.2 percent of the enrollment. Enrollment of men decreased by 26 students, or 0.3 percent, and the number of women enrolled increased by 456 students, or 6.1 percent, compared to Spring of 1979.

On-campus students represent all fifty states, as well as the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, Virgin Islands, and sixty-five foreign countries. All of the Colorado counties are represented by the on-campus students.

This spring 90.4 percent of the students are attending full-time and 9.6% are attending part-time. The percentage of full-time students as well as the total number are increases over last spring. (The definition of a full-time student is an undergraduate taking 12 or more credits, a graduate student taking 9 or more credits, or a professional-level student taking 15 or more credits.)

Enrollment by classification with percent of total enrollment is shown below for Spring 1979 and Spring 1980. The number and proportion of upper level undergraduates (juniors and seniors) was substantially higher for Spring 1980. The change in graduate level I and II student numbers can be largely attributed to the new classification of professional level students.

Enrollment by classification with percent change from Spring 1979 to Spring 1980 is displayed below. The largest absolute increases in undergraduates occurred in the junior and senior classes. Again, the change in classification of professional D.V.M. students accounts for most of the changes that occurred in the graduate student numbers.
