ENROLLMENT STATISTICS

SPRING 1981

Spring Semester 1981 regular on-campus enrollment is 17,125 students, an increase of 61 students, or 0.4 percent over Spring Semester 1980, when enrollment was 17,064 students. Enrollment in Continuing Education and SURGE courses will be reported at the end of the semester.

This spring men represent 52.6 percent of the on-campus enrollment and women 47.4 percent. Last spring men represented 53.3 percent and women 46.7 percent of the enrollment. Enrollment of men decreased by 82 students, or 0.9 percent, and the number of women enrolled increased by 443 students, or 5.6 percent, compared to Spring 1980.

On-campus students represent all 50 states, as well as the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, Virgin Islands, and 72 foreign countries. All of the Colorado counties are represented by the on-campus students.

This spring 89.1 percent of the students are attending full time and 10.9 percent are attending part time. The percentage of full-time students as well as the total number are smaller than last spring. (The definition of a full-time student is an undergraduate taking 12 or more credits, a graduate student taking 9 or more credits, or a professional-level student taking 15 or more credits.)

This spring 77.5 percent of the students are Colorado residents and 22.5 percent are nonresidents. The percentage of residents increased almost 3 percentage points over the 74.7 percent of Spring 1980.

Also, the numbers and percentages of levels I and II graduate students are up this spring.

Enrollment by classification with percentage change from Spring 1980 to Spring 1981 is displayed below. The largest change in undergraduates occurred in the sophomore class with a decrease of 260 students from Spring 1980. The senior class increased by 234, or 5.3 percent, and the graduate level I students increased by 105, or 6.0 percent, over Spring 1980.

The change in enrollment from Spring 1980 to Spring 1981 is shown below by college. The College of Professional Studies had the largest increase in enrollment in both number and percentage, while Home Economics, Natural Sciences, and Veterinary Medicine and Biomedical Sciences also increased substantially. The College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences had the largest decrease in actual number of students and the College of Business had the largest percentage decrease.

Enrollment by registration type is shown in the following table for Spring 1980 and Spring 1981. New transfers and new and readmitted graduate students increased the most in percentages of the total enrollment. Overall the percentage of students at the undergraduate level declined by 0.8 percentage points.
