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ENROLLMENT STATISTICS

SPRING 1982

Spring Semester 1982 regular on-campus enrollment is 16,806 students, a decrease of 319 students, or 1.9 percent from Spring Semester 1981, when enrollment was 17,125 students. The decrease from Spring 1981 is due to the large enrollment from Fall 1981. In order to maintain the full-year FTE level, it was necessary to decrease student numbers for Spring 1982. Enrollment in Continuing Education and SURGE courses will be reported at the end of the semester.

This spring, men represent 52.1 percent of the on-campus enrollment and women 47.9 percent. Last spring, men represented 52.6 percent and women 47.4 percent of the enrollment. Enrollment of men decreased by 247 students, or 5.9 percent, and the number of women enrolled decreased by 72 students, or 0.9 percent, compared to Spring 1981.

On-campus students represent all 50 states, as well as the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, Virgin Islands, and 73 foreign countries. All of the Colorado counties are represented by the on-campus students.

This spring 89.7 percent of the students are attending full time and 10.3 percent are attending part time. The percentage of full-time students is slightly higher than last spring. (The definition of a full-time student is an undergraduate taking 12 or more credits, a graduate student taking 9 or more credits, or a professional-level student taking 15 or more credits.)

This spring 78.7 percent of the students are Colorado residents and 21.3 percent are nonresidents. The percentage of residents increased 1.2 percentage points over the 77.5 percent of Spring 1981.

Enrollment by classification with percentage change from Spring 1981 to Spring 1982 is displayed below. The largest change in undergraduates occurred in the junior class with a decrease of 359 students from Spring 1981. The freshman class increased by 162, or 5.3 percent, and the senior class increased by 148, or 3.2 percent, over Spring 1981.

The change in enrollment from Spring 1981 to Spring 1982 is shown below by college. The College of Professional Studies had the largest increase in enrollment while Business and Natural Sciences also increased. The College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences had the largest decrease in both number of students, and the College of Home Economics had the largest percentage decrease. The decrease in the College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences and increase in the College of Professional Studies is due to the moving of the Department of Social Work from the College of Arts, Humanities, and Social Sciences to the College of Professional Studies. There are 239 students in the social work major for Spring 1982.

The table below shows the change in enrollment by registration type from Spring 1981 to Spring 1982. Continuing graduate students had the largest percentage increase over last spring. Continuing undergraduates also increased while new freshman, transfer, and readmitted undergraduates all decreased substantially compared to Spring 1981. This decrease is due to the large Fall 1981 enrollment.
