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## ENROLLMENT STATISTICS

SUMMER 1983

The 1983 Summer Session regular on-campus enrollment at Colorado State University is 5,471 students. This is a decrease of 412 students, or 7.0 percent, from Summer Session 1982 when 5,883 students were enrolled.

This summer 50.5 percent of the on-campus enrollment are men and 49.5 percent are women.

The 5,471 students enrolled represent 49 states and the District of Columbia, 65 foreign countries, and 58 of Colorado's 63 counties. Colorado residents make up 82.6 percent of the on-campus enrollment and nonresidents, 17.4 percent. This represents an increase of 1.0 percentage points in Colorado residents over Summer 1982.

A fewer number of students enrolled for Summer 1983 are taking less than 9 credits than did in Summer 1982; the decrease being at both the undergraduate and graduate levels. The proportion of students enrolled for 9 or more credits is 17.8 percent. This is the same percentage as that of Summer 1982.

Enrollment by classification is shown below.
