ENROLLMENT STATISTICS

FALL 1983

Fall Semester 1983 regular on-campus enrollment at Colorado State University is 18,295 students, a decrease of 614 students or 3.2 percent below Fall Semester 1982, when enrollment was 18,909 regular on-campus students.

This fall, men represent 52.2 percent of the on-campus enrollment, and women represent 47.8 percent. This is a 0.3 percentage point rise in the percent of men from last fall.

On-campus students represent all 50 states, as well as the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, Guam, and 82 foreign countries. Sixty-two of the 63 Colorado counties are represented by the regular on-campus students.

Colorado residents make up 80.3 percent of the on-campus enrollment and nonresidents, 19.7 percent. The percentage of Colorado residents increased 1.8 percentage points over the 78.4 percent of Fall 1982.

This fall 88.4 percent of the students are attending full time, and 11.6 percent are attending part time. There was no change in the ratio of full-time to part-time students between Fall 1982 and Fall 1983. Of the resident students, 88.4 percent are attending full time, and 88.1 percent of the nonresident students are attending full time. (The definition of a full-time student is an undergraduate taking 12 or more credits, a graduate student taking 9 or more credits, or a professional-level student taking 15 or more credits.)
