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ENROLLMENT STATISTICS

SPRING 1984

Spring Semester 1984 regular on-campus enrollment is 17,114 students. This is an increase of 336 students, or 2.0 percent from Spring Semester 1983 when 16,778 students were enrolled. Enrollment in Continuing Education and SURGE courses will be reported at the end of the semester.

This spring men represent 52.4 percent of the on-campus enrollment, and women represent 47.6 percent. Last spring men represented 52.0 percent and women 48.0 percent of the enrollment. Enrollment of men increased by 239 students or 2.7 percent, and the number of women enrolled increased by 97 students or 1.2 percent compared to Spring 1983.

On-campus students represent all 50 states, as well as the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico, and Guam. Enrollment includes students from 86 foreign countries. All 63 Colorado counties are represented by on-campus students.

This spring 80.7 percent of the students are Colorado residents and 19.3 percent are nonresidents. The percentage of residents increased 1.8 percentage points over the 78.9 percent of Spring 1983.

This spring 88.2 percent of the students are attending full time and 11.8 percent are attending part time. The percentage of full-time students is slightly lower than last spring. (The definition of a full-time student is an undergraduate taking 12 or more credits, a graduate student taking 9 or more credits, or a professional-level student taking 15 or more credits.)

Enrollment by classification with percentage change from Spring 1983 to Spring 1984 is displayed below. The largest change in undergraduates occurred in the junior class with an increase of 272 students or 8.8 percent from Spring 1983. The senior class increased by 140 students or 3.0 percent, Graduate I level students increased by 53 or 2.9 percent, and Graduate II level students increased by 53 or 5.5 percent over Spring 1983.
